 - b. Significant events during the month of November 1968
- (1) Personnel: The Navy enlisted staff which was at an unacceptable level during the previous month, is even at a lewer level for November.

Marine Corps staffing is adequate number wise; hewever, the MOS 3371 field for Marine enlisted personnel is undermanned by two cooks.

- (2) Six of the thirty corpsmen that were TAD to combined action groups 1, 3, and 4 are still TAD. These personnel lesses cause the personnel shortage to be even more acutely unsatisfactory than it appears on paper.

- 2. Awards: None
- 3. Administration:
 - (a) The total number of casualties processed and triaged was 1149
- (b) The administration of Companies A, B, and C were centralized into a battalien administrative organization thereby alleviating the submission of these companies Command Chronologys.

4. Legistics:

- (a) Lead time relative to both Medical and Organic Supplies is still considered to be excessive and the efficacy of the supply priority system is unreliable.
- (b) The hiatus of time between when third and fourth echelon maintenance items that require evacuation to authorized servicing facilities is too great between the time they are returned from repair as declared beyond economical repairs.
- (c) Routine items of supplies such as light bulbs, blank forms, stencils, etc. are continually in short supply and routine trips to Danang are made by the supply sections of this activity in order to mintain even a marginal level of supplies to meet the operational requests of this Battalion.
- (d) The work request for the treatment of the Soil around the nospital's helicopters landing zone is still pending and consequently, the dust and dirt continues to be a health and safety hazzard for patient and staff personnel.

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5. Nedical Support:

- (a) "D" Company is assigned in Support of the Dong Ha Combat Base and in support of units operating in the area. On 1 October 1968 D Medical Company facilities were dedicated as the "Third Marine Division Memorial Children's Hospital" Dong Ha Facility. This mission is in addition to the Dong Ha Combat Base Support mission of U.S. Military Forces. No additional personnel or assets were authorized.
- (b) MUST #2 is presently semi operational as temporary movement of these wards is now being effected in order to allow for the filling of depressed areas and the building of some semi permanent wards. A minimum patient load is presently being maintained; however, the Battalion's medical capabilities remain the same as previously when operational requirements dictate.
- (c) "C" Company Hims is assigned Medical Support responsibility for Task Force Hotel located at Landing Zone Vandegrift, RVN.
