SPECIAL OPERATION

Lb December through 19 December 1969 - The second platoon of Company "C", mounted out to support a training exercise conducted by Field Medical Service School in their training area at Camp Pendleton. NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Company "C", Third Medical Battalion, Fifth Marine Expeditionary Brigade was established on 16 October 1969 from elements of the deactivated Fifth Medical Battalion. Location of the Company in 43 Area, Camp Pendleton, California under the Administration and Operational Control of Provisional Service Battalion was established by Brigade Orders.

Operation of the 43 Area Dispensary was assigned by the Area Commander. All medical blocks were consolidated and stored in the 43 Area. Mount out blocks were reorganized and supply computerized for ease of movement.

Company "C", consisting of two Clearing and Collecting Platoons, continues its combat service mission in the Brigade as a mobile unit with a primary mission to provide for collection, emergency treatment, temporary hospitalization and evaluation of casualties as required in support of field operations.
