- 4. Average monthly strength:
- a. Third Motor Transport Battalion, 11 Officers and 304 Enlisted personnel. Attached Company "C", 1st Motor Transport Battalion, 4 Officers and 77 Enlisted personnel.
- 5. TRAINING: (Refer to par 4b.(4) of ref (a))
- a. Ninety per cent (90%) of the Battalion received ten (10) hours of instruction on operation of the .50 Cal. Machine Gun and familiarization firing was accomplished. All .50 Cal. Machine Gun's are mounted on designated trucks.
- b. Personnel have been in training under the contonement program (strongbacking tentage) and improving existing living conditions.
- c. Personnel have been trained in the erection of fortifications for interior and exterior security.
