PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. OPERATION. During the month of April the battalion continued its mission of providing general support for the 3d Marine Division. The numerous operations, heavy committments, and distance, required the battalion to keep an average of 45 vehicles in direct support of Task Force Robbie and the 1st & 26th Marine Regiments.

The battalion, in addition to supporting Operation Checker, was given the mission to move the 26th Marine Regiment and 1st Battalion, 13th Marines from Khe Sanh to Quang Tri and Wunder Beach. In accomplishing the mission the battalion made 8 Rough Rider Convoys carrying approximately 2, 269 tons of cargo and 2,951 personnel.

The Otter Platoon, in supporting units at Khe Sanh, Cam Lo, Quang Tri and Cua Viet, traveled 1, 810 miles, carried 248 tons of cargo and 1,578 personnel, made 95 medevacs and transported 7 PCW's.

Daily availability of battalion task vehicles averaged 81% and daily committments averaged 78%. Tonnage, mileage and personnel transported figures are shown in the table below:

2. CIVIL AFFAIRS. During the month of April this battalion began working in a new area in Quang Tri Province. The first project under way is participation in a 30 day MEDCAP Program being conducted in numerous hamlets around Quang Tri City. This program was started as part of an agreement by the Quang Tri Marine Base and Mai Linh District Officials to conduct civic operations in return for the speedy removal of gravesites within the perimeter of the base.

During the last week of April this battalion cunducted two MEDCAPS, one at Nhan Bieu School and the other at Tri Bua Church, treating a total of 135 patients.

Specific area assignments will be made during May when this battalion will receive a village near Quang Tri City in which to conduct all future civil affairs operations.

3. PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE PROGRAM. The battalion distributed leaflets which offered rewards for information on enemy mining activities and ammunition caches along convoy routes.

- 7 Apr- "Rough Rider" 25-68 arrived at Quang Tri carrying 129 tons of carge and 135 troops. To incidents occurred. Convoy Commander was 1stLt T. W. MUSSER.
- 8 Apr- "Rough Rider" 25-68 departed for Phu Bai with 27 tons of cargo and 117 troops. No incidents occurred. Convoy Commander was 1stLt T. W. MISSER.
- 9 Apr- Dispatched 3 M-76 Otters to Cua Viet.
- 10 Apr- "Rough Rider" 26-68 arrived at Quang Tri with 204 tons of cargo and 136 troops. No incidents occurred. Convoy Commander was 1stLt T. W. MUSSER.
- 11 Apr- "Rough Rider" 26-68 departed for Phu Bai with 2 tons of cargo and 90 troops. No incidents occurred. Convoy Commander was Capt R. R. PANZER.
- 13 Apr- "Rough Rider" 27-68 arrived at Quang Tri with 185 tons of cargo and 110 troops. No incidents occurred, Convoy Commander was Capt R. R. PANZER.
- 14 Apr- 4 M-76 Otters were sent to Cua Viet.
- 15 Apr- 2 M-76 Otters destroyed at Khe Sanh by enemy actions.
- 15 Apr- 35 M-35's, 2 M-543's and 1 M-105 were sent to Khe Sanh to support the 26th Marine Rigiment. The convoy carried 102 tons of supplies and 260 troops to Khe Sanh. No incidents occurred. Convoy Commander was Capt R. R. PANZER.

 - 23 Apr. Dispatched 5 M-76 Otters to Cua Viet and received 2 from Cua Viet for repairs. 22 Otters on location at Cua Viet.
 - 24 Apr- "Rough Rider" Convoy to Khe Sanh carried 122 Tons of cargo and 475 troons. No incidents occurred. Convoy Commander was 1stLt W. J. SCREWS.
 - 25 Apr- "Rough Rider" Convoy returned from Khe Sanh with 109 tons of cargo and 380 troops. No incidents occurred. Convoy Commander was 1stld W. J. SCREWS.
