1. OPERATIONS: During the month of September 1969, Third Motor Transport Battalion continued to give general support to the Third Marine Division although all support was confined to residents of Vandergrift and Elliot Combat Bases which included the Third and Forth Marine Regiments. The Battalion also provided water and fuel and trucks for area mine sweeps. Also during the month of September, the Battalion continued in support of Operations Georgia Tar and Arlington Canyon in the Northern I Corps Tactical zone.

On 23 September, Company B, started stand down procedures in preparation for debarking with RLT-3 in the near future.

On 27 September, the Battalion moved from its location at Vandergrift Combat Base to Quang Tri Combat Base and began operations in that area.

During September, daily availability of task vehicles was 75%. Daily commitments averaged 95%. In addition, daily deadline averaged 25%. Total miles traveled was 16,341, a total of 2239 tons of cargo and 18,674 personnel were transported.

2. CIVIL AFFAIRS: During the month of September all Civil Affairs action was suspended because of Battalion reassignment and relocation.

Company "C", 3d Motor Transport Battalion initiated the establishment of an effective SOP during the month of September. Personnel were instructed concerning their conduct while serving on Okinawa. CMS were instructed, traffic courts were held, and 7.82 gear was issued. The Company participated in the Regimental Change of Command Ceremony.

2. OPERATIONAL RESULTS

During the month of September, weekly convoys were run from Camp Schwab to NTA and Naha along with routine daily commitments in support of 9th Marines.

3. LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

a. Supplies. Requisitioning procedures were continued and follow-ups were being made on previous orders. Our inventory of equipment/supplies on hand was somewhat updated due to gear acquired from 5th Motors. Efforts were being made to replace the T/E and operating stock deficiencies.

b. Equipment. Equipment and vehicles were being returned from rehabilitation at 3d FSR for 3d/4th echelon maintenance as required. Some equipment was acquired from 5th Motors to help bring our Company up to T/E, while the remaining equipment deficiencies were still on order.



PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. OPERATIONS: During this reporting period, 3d Motor Transport Battalion was involved in many aspects of Division support. On 1 October 1969, the Battalion relocated from Vandergrift Combat Base to the Quang Tri Combat Base, RVN. The Battalion at this time consisted of H&SCo and Company B. Companies A and C had previously deployed with RLT-9. On 3 October, Company B with 1 Officer and 23 enlisted personnel and 13 trucks deployed to the United States. The remaining personnel and equipment were intergrated into H&S Company. Although the purpose for the relocation to Quang Tri Combat Base was in preparation for Battalion deployment to Okinawa, however, Third Motor Transport Battalion continued to support the 3d Marine Division. This support was primarily in removing the 4th Marine Regiment from Vandergrift and Elliott Combat Bases. October 15 was declared the stand down date and on 21 October, 3d Motor Transport Battalion embarked aboard the LST Hampshire County at Cau Viet, RVN and sailed for Okinawa. On 28 October the Battalion debarked at Kin Red Beach, Okinawa and the Battalion colors placed at Camp Schwab. At this time Companies A and C were reunited with the Battalion. 3d Motor Transport Battalion at this time was operational control of the 9th Marine Brigade. On 9 November 1969 the Battalion was again under operational control of the 3d Marine Division. Although the Battalion began a rigid equipment rehabilitation program, Division support was still maintained. This support is primarily the 9th Marine Regiment. On 1 December 1969, a platoon from Company C embarked with Special Landing Force Bravo. This makes a total of two platoons on Special Landing Forces. A platoon from Company A previously deployed with Special Landing Force Alpha and reported on an earlier Command Chronology. On 5 December 1969, a detachment from Company A consisting of 15 personnel and 10 trucks embarked for Camp Fuji, Japan in a TAD status. On 6 December 1969, a detachment from Company C returned from Camp Fuji, Japan training area.

During the time that 3d Motor Transport Battalion was still in Vietnam during this reporting period, there were no injuries, deaths or loss of equipment due to combat situations.

Average daily availability of task vehicles was 75%. Daily commitments averaged 60%. The 15 days in support in the Republic of Vietnam, commitments averaged 100%. In addition, daily deadline averaged 25%. Total miles traveled was 72,830. A total of 402 tons of cargo and 7470 personnel were transported.

3. On 5 December 1969, a detachment from Company A embarked for Camp Fuji, Japan in support of a 4th Marine Regiment unit.
4. On 6 December 1969, a detachment from Company C returned from the Camp Fuji training area.
5. On 1 December 1969, a Platoon from Company C employed with Special Landing Force Bravo.
6. 3d Motor Transport Battalion maintains a critical shortage of qualified personnel in all MOS's. This shortage effects the readiness rating.
7. During this reporting period, a total of 80 hours of General Military Subjects was given and a total of 35 hours on MOS training. A complete new training SOP has been processed.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY1. GENERAL

During the month of October, Company "C", 3d Motor Transport Battalion initiated requalification on the Rifle Range by sending its first detail. Five vehicles and 13 personnel accompanied "I" Co. 3/9 to Fuji, Japan. An investigation of one "C" Company vehicle was initiated after an accident which occurred just south of NTA. An area, quarters and personnel inspection was held by the Regimental CO. The Battalion Headquarters and H&S Company arrived at Camp Schwab on 28 October 1969.

2. OPERATIONAL RESULTS

During the month of October weekly convoys were run from Camp Schwab to NTA and Naha along with routine commitments in support of 9th Marines.

3. LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

a. Supplies. Requisitioning procedures were continued and follow-ups were being made on previous orders. Our inventory of equipment/supplies on hand was somewhat updated due to supplies that were acquired through normal supply channels. Efforts were being made to replace the T/E and operating stock deficiencies.

b. Equipment. One truck, M35A2C was wrecked near NTA; an investigation is presently being conducted to determine final disposition. Other equipment deficiencies are still on order. With the arrival of H&S Co. and BN H&S we will acquire the proper amount of vehicles to bring "C" Company up to T/E.
