





 - a. Synonsis. 93 hours of reconnaissance/surveillance resulted in 4 enemy signtings and no enemy contacts. A total of 2 to 4 VC were sighted and artillery was called in, resulting in 2 to 4 probable VC KIA.
 - b. Enemy.
 - (1) 310950H (YD 754088) 2 to 4 VC moving at the edge of the treeline, heading up the hill to the South (Hill 424). They were wearing white uniforms and coolie hats. The VC wore no packs, and weapons could not be observed. Artillery was fired for a total of 6 rounds with excellent coverage of the target. 2 to 4 probable VC KIA.



MERIAR SHEET

- (2) 020813H (YD 743104) 3 small boats, and one large one, were observed moving to the west on the river. The boats hold? people in all. They were wearing white PJ's and straw rain hats. No packs or weapons were observed.
- (3) 021020H (YD 747112) a small, covered, sampan was moving north on the river. It was carrying 2 coolies and one large man. The sampan was first observed at YD 748109, and moved to the village at ND 747112. The coolies were dressed in black PJ's and strew hats, the larger man wore khaki's. No packs or weapons could be observed.
- (4) C31ClOK (TD 747119) approximately 30 people, in 15 boats, were observed acving around the bend in the river heading south. They were first observed at TD 747119, and could be seen until they reached TD 735102. They were dressed in assorted black PJ:, khaki PJ:, and coolie hats. No packs or weapons could be observed.

c. Terrain:

- (1) The terrain in the OP areas consisted of 5 foot elephant grass, intermingled with small shrubs, vines, and thorns. Movement from one area to another was difficult and limited to about 200 meters an hour.
- (2) Map Corrections. Annex A (Operation Overlay).
 - (a) YD 738104. Huts indicated on map at this position are no lionger there.
 - (b) YD 736098. A large grass but was located next to the trail.
 - (c) YD 743104. A path running N-S was observed at this location. The path was 8 to 10 feet wide and well used. The grass along the trail was such that it appeared to cover the trail so that it could not be seen from the air.

d. Other Information.

- (1) One artillery mission of 6 rounds was called in support of this patrol. Coverage of the target was excellent. Probable 2 to 4 MC MIA resulted from this fire mission.
- (2) YD 755092. A large foxhole approximately 15 feet square with an earther parapet around it, about 3 feet high was located. This entire excavation was overgrown with grass and had not been used recently.



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- 6. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY. Negative contact.
- 7. CONDITION OF PATROL. Physical condition, good; morale, good.
- 8. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS,
 - 1. A force of approximately 20 men could, with the use of nets, establish a sheet point on the river. It would be practical for a period of no longer than 2k neurs.



 - (1) Canopy ranging from 30 to 60 feet was in the objective area. Growth along the ridgelines was light under the canopy and move-ment was easy. Off the ridges the undergrowth was heavy shrubs, thorns, and vines, which greatly is reded movement.



- (2) Map Corrections: Annex A (Fatrou Route Overlay).
 - (a) At YC 832990, one HLZ was located which will accommodate 1 H-34.
 - (b) At YC 823987, one trail approximately 3 feet wide was found. It hadn't been used recently and could not be observed from the air.

d. Other Information.

- (1) Olli30H (YC 810999) 3 huts with dimensions of h'x5'x3' were located. It appeared that the structures had been erected no longer than three days prior to discovery by the patrol. Each hut had 2 small fire places 6"x12". 15 holes 2'x2'x2' were located near the huts and appeared to be used for storage. Bundles of sticks in various configurations were near each hole. 3 bundles of firewood were found, also vines which were probably used for clothes lines. Also found were 9 playing cards which had printed sheets between them which seemed to be old newspaper.
- (2) Water presented no great problem in this area.
- (3) No artillery or air support missions were requested in support of this patrol.
- 6. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY. No contact was made.
- 7. CONDITION OF PATROL. Physical condition, good; morale, good.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

- 1. Another HIZ other than the 4th Marines should be used to reduce dust and sand accumulation on weapons before the patrol begins.
- 2. Communications in this area is marginal to negative, larger patrols should be used so that the platoon can work in the low ground and also maintain a communications relay at a height sufficient to communicate.
- 3. M-72's should not be taken on patrols due to the fact that in heavy terrain the weapon catches on foliage and comes open, exposing it to moisture. The rubber covering over the trigger and detent assembly, are easily torn by thorns and brush further exposing the weapon to moisture. Terrain was never suitable for employment of this weapon.

- (2) Oh1745H (YD 858987) 4 huts, well constructed, with sleeping racks and storage areas, were found. They could possibly accommodate 20 men in each. They were located under the canopy and were all destroyed with WP.
- (3) 041800H (YD 859987) One small hut was located. It had not been used recently. This hut was left standing. It could not be observed from the air.
- (4) C50745H (YD 868988 870987) 10 panji traps were found. These traps were 2 to 3 feet deep, 3 to 4 feet long, and 1 to 2 feet wide. Each one had approximately 40 panji stakes in 1t. All of the traps were along the trail, the trail not being used to much. The first two were destroyed and the rest were uncovered. Leaves were used to conceal these pits.
- (5) YD 870990) one trap the same as the others, was located. This trap was destroyed.
- (6) 051030 (YD 869994) 4 huts were located. It appeared that these huts had been used very recently. The huts had the smell of smoke, and each contained rifle rags, rifle bags, and ammo cans. All were burned. 30 minutes after the patrol had departed, a shot was heard from the vicinity of the huts.
- (7) 051200H (YD 868997) 5 huts, unoccuppied, were found. There were clothes on a line outside of these huts. The clothes included; a khaki shirt, utility jacket, and some black PJ's. There were tunnels: in each hut. Each tunnel was checked out by the patrol with negative results. One hut also had a deep hole, negative results.

- (9) 061415H (YD 861003) 5 huts with fightings holes were located.

 None were used recently. The fightings holes also had tunnelse branching off.
- (9) All of the huts that were located are in a lone area along or close to streams and under a heavy canopy. None could be seen from the air.
- (10) H&I fires were called. There was no air support used in this mission.
- (11) I M-J4 rifle (serial number 1160068) was lost on this patrol, while trying to cross a river that had a very strong current.

 This river is very deep. It is very doubtful that the VC could ever find this rifle.
- 6. RESULTS OF INCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY. No encounters were made.
- 7. CONDITION OF PATROL. Physical condition, good; morale, good.
- 8. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.
 - 1. HLZ must be good for insertions and extractions. All insertions must be done in a landing zone with the chopper resting on the ground.

- 6. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY. No encounters were made.
- 7. CONDITION OF PATROL. Physical condition, good; morale, good.
- 8. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS
 - a. Artillery support was unsatisfactory. The shortest period of time between calling and receiving artillery rounds was thirteen minutes. It is important to note that one fire mission consumed forty minutes elapsed time between the first and second round. H & I's were fired past the time requested which could have seriously injured members of the patrol. The accuracy of the artillery fire was generally considered poor. Direct communications with supporting artillery was not established until the last day.
 - b. The M-49 spotting scope is not suitable for field use. The 7x50's are much easier to use with less eye strain.
 - c. An OP is mentally harder on the troops than patrolling. On a patrol a man is more cautious and alert.

This made movement very difficult in the lowground, especially in the river valleys. Movement in the area was limited to 75 to 100 meters an hour. The canopy was 12 to 15 feet high in this low ground. Along the high ground, movement was easier since the vegetation thinned out to a great extent. The canopy at the high ground was 75 to 100 feet high.

- (2) Map Corrections. Annex A (Patrol Route Overlay). It was noted that the stream at YC 323972 extended approximately 500 meters more into the valley, to YC 819975. This stream was approximately 1 to 3 feet deep with a rocky bottom in areas. This river was moving rapidly with a strong current.
- d. Other Information. One man had a nervous breakdown during this patrol. He appeared to be in shock and could not continue the mission. At 141515H, a Med Evac was requested and accomplished one half hour later without further incident.
- 6. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY: One fire mission was called on 4 VC. VC casualties are unknown. There were no friendly casualties.
- 7. CONDITION OF PATRCL: Physical condition, good; morale, good.
- 8. CONSTRUCTIONS AND DECOMMENDATIONS:
 - 1. It is recommended that the HIZ at YC 820997 not be used anymore for future insertions and extractions due to the fact that it is in a location where VC could set up an excellent ambush. Also it is hard for a helo to enter and exit this HIZ.

- 5. OBSERVATION OF ENEMY AND TERRAIN.
 - a. Synopsis. 70 hours of reconnaissance observation and patrolling resulted in (1) enemy contact with at least 12 VC. This resulted in 1 USMC KIA, 8 USMC WIA, 3 VC KIA confirmed, and 5 VC KIA probable. Patrol received moderate small arms fire while awaiting extraction. Helicopters received light automatic weapons fire from 3 positions. Gunships were called in to strafe and fire rockets in the VC positions.
 - b. Enemy. 190845H (ZC 007969) the patrol was moving to ZC 006963 to destroy huts that were found the previous day when, after only 125 meters from their harbor site, the point heard what sounded like 6 or 7 bolts go home. The patrol was immediately halted and the word was passed that VC were in the area. The platoon leader moved up toward the point and upon reaching him, one shot was fired. This was possibly the signal for the VC to open fire. A split second later, the patrol was taken under fire by a heavy volume of automatic weapons and small arms fire from the right, left front, direct front, and left. In addition, the VC were also all along the

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right flank of the patrol. The patrol immediately returned a heavy volume of fire into the direction of the VC positions. The heavy fire fight lastedapproximately 1 minute when the firing from the VC slowed down. The next two minutes, the fire slowed down to moderate and then finally, to single shots and automatic bursts. The initial return of fire by the patrol encluded the firing of an M-79 and the throwing of grenades. This canned the VC to break contact. Only (2) VC were actually seen by the patrol wearing black P J's and were observed carrying what appeared to be U.S. type carbines.

c. Terrain.

- (1) The terrain in the objective area was considered fairly thick around all streams and creek beds; brush, vines, thorns, and grass were encountered along the low ground. The canopy was approximately 8 ft high at the highest elevation. The secondary growth thinsed out to a great extent thus making traveling much easier. The canopy at this elevation was approximately 30 feet high. The average distance traveled in this area was 250 to 350 meters an hour; along creek beds traveling was cut down to 150 to 200 meters an hour. Generally, the terrain is considered to fair to good for troop movement.
- (2) Map Corrections. Annex B (Map Correction Overlay).
 - (a) 3 main trails were located in the objective area. All of these were at least 3 feet wide and very heavily used. It was noted that some of the foot prints may have been as recent as 4 to 6 hours; ago. None of these trails could be observed from the air.

d. Other Information.

- (1) 181055H (ZC 006963) the patrol came upon 3 huts, 6x8 feet in dimension and 1 cave. 9 fighting holes were found around the huts, all of them were partially camoflaged. All were checked out very thoroughly. Indications were that this area had been occupied as recently as 24 hours previously. These huts could not be observed from the air due to the heavy canopy. One hut that appeared to be used the most was booby trapped by the patrol with one M-26 grennade, prior to the patrol's departure from the area.
- (2) 190500H (ZC 009969) while the patrol was at this location in its harbor site, the patrol heard what sounded like a grennade going off from the vicinity of the huts previously found and booby trapped.
- (3) 190810H (2C 009969) the patrol was in the process of leaving the harbor site when the patrol heard (2) loud voices at a distance of approximately 75 to 100 meters away. It appeared to the leaving the leaving the harbor site when the patrol was in the process of leaving the

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rol that the shouts sounded like orders being given to other VC in the area. The patrol waited (5) more minutes and then when no more voices were heard the patrol departed the harbor site using the same general route, as used by the patrol the previous day to reach the harbor site.

- (4) (20 007969) The patrol came acros a location where a camp fire had been built. It was estimated that the ashes were approximately 12 to 24 hours old.
- (5) (ZC 004964) Located an old VC harbor site along a main trail. The lacation was about (2) miters off the trail and could hold up to 4 to 5 VC.
- (6) 190845H After initial contact with the VC, the patrol lost radio contact with the relay station. A VC bullet stripped the radio operators handset radio cord. The radioman repaired this and after 45 minutes comm was reestablished with the relay station. The PRC-10 was checked out but comm could not be established with the radio due to the patrols location.
- (7) 191215H (ZC 013973) During the med evac of the seriously wounded, the helocopiters recieved a heavy volume of automatic weapons fire from 3 positions. The assistant patrol leader informed the pilots of this and med evac was postponed. The gunships were called and the VC position was fired on with machine guns and rockets. The patrol moved then to a better location to accomplish the med evac without further indicents.
- (8) (ZC 007968) UHL-E's were called to strafe change the PLZ since the patrol was recieving moderate small arms fire from unlocated positions.
- (9) There weren't any fire missions called in support of this patrol due to the closeness of the VC and USMC positions.
- (10) 191215H (ZC 013973) 6 USMC were med evaced by sling and two were picked up by basket.
- (11) It was observed by 4 members of the patrol that the platoon corpman aided 3 wounded fellow marines under heavy VC fire. He accomplished this even though he had been wounded himself.
- (12) As a result of this contact with the VC the patrol lost the below listed weapons.
 - (1) M-79 Grennade Launcher
 - (1) M-14 Rifle

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

This trail was approximately to 4 feet wide, and portions of this trail could be observed from the air. Due to the large number of woodcutters in the area, it is assumed that this trail is used mostly by these people.

d. Other Information.

- (1) One trailmarker was located at ZC 090947. This marker consisted of 2 sticks being placed upright into the trail approximately 1 foot apart and one stick about 20 feet away in the same position. The surrounding area was checked out with negative results.
- (2) One large HLZ was found in the valley along coordinates ZC 080965 to ZC 083967. This HLZ is large enough to accompany up to 50 H-341s.
- (3) 191411H (ZC 084950) the platoon suffered one non-battle casualty. This casualty was Med Evaced by hoist.
- (4) There was no artillery or air support missions requested in support of this patrol.
- 6. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY. None.
- 7. CONDITION OF PATROL: Physical condition, very good; morale, good.

8. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

c. Terrain.

(1) The terrain in the objective area was very mountainous with slopes ranging up to 70 degrees. These slopes were covered with thick underbrush making traveling very difficult. In the southern side of the operations area, the terrain was considered fair to good for movement. In the norther portion, the terrain was very difficult to move through. Movement was restricted to approximately 200 meters an hours. The canopy varies at locations but averages from 10 to 40 feet.

(2) Map Corrections.

- (a) One large road was noted from the valley leading into the mountains. This dirt road was large enough to accommodate a 6x6 truck with ease. Annex B (Map Correction Overlay).
- (b) Numerous trails were noted in the objective area ranging from 1½ feet up to 4 feet wide. All of them were heavily used. Trails could only be observed from the air at ceratain locations.

d. Other Information.

- (1) 222300H (ZC 075964) while the patrol was in the harbor site, they heard voices of about 3 people coming from the direction of the trail about 30 meters away.
- (2) 241930H (2C 065965) it appeared to the patrol that they heard some activity a short distance away from them. One large twig was broken and a large rock fell down the side of the hill from that location. No other sounds were heard after that.
- (3) 251620H (ZC 078980) as the patrol was extracted from this location, the helicopters received 2 rounds of sniper fire from an unknown location.
- (4) There were no air support or artillery missions called in support of this patrol.







 - 1 small stream branch was located at coordinates YD 661094. It was running parallel to the road indicated on the map, to coordinates ID 669092. The width of this stream was judged to be 10 feet, with a varing depth of $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 feet.
 - Numerous animal trails, including elephant tracks, were observed within the objective area. Signs of elephant dung were noted at intervals along several of the animal trails. Some of the trails observed were about 3 feet wide and could be observed from the air.

d. Other Information.

- 230900H (YD 669098) 1 round of 155mm was expended on suspected enemy position where noises were heard. Silence was established, area was checked out with negative results.
- (2) 240300H (YD 669098) while the patrol was at this location, it heard something move through the stream. The patrol was unable

to determine if it was an animal or a human being. No further sounds were heard.

- (3) 251800H to 252000H. The patrol communications received what seemed to be a jamming of the radio with sounds of "clicking" heard over the receiver. Contact was finally established after 2 hours.
- (4) At 252000H, one of the H&I rounds apparently hit an elephant. We heard screaming sounds of an elephant. We know there were elephants in the area as when we were inserted at 221700H, the UH1-E's spotter an elephant in our zone and fired on it. Our location when H&I round hit elephant was YD 665098 (Diamondhead). This particular H&I round hit the elephant approximately 500 meters west of us on a 270 degree azimuth.
- (5) (YD 665090) main monad located at indicated coordinates, appeared to be heavily used. This is a main road leading from east to west.
- 6. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY. None.
- 7. CONDITION OF PATROL. Physical condition, good: morale, good.
- 8. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS. None.







- 5. OBSERVATION OF ENEMY AND TERRAIN.
 - a. Synopsis. During 11½ hours of patrolling, the company made contact with approximately 20 VC which resulted in 5 VC KIA confirmed, 1 USN KIA (DOW), and 7 USMC WIA. Artillery was called and 18 rounds of 155mm was expended on target with excellent coverage. UHL-E's were called in to strafe and fire rockets, which silenced 3 VC firing positions. The mission was accomplished by recovering the body lost on the previous patrol.
 - b. Enemy. 201145H (ZC 006969) the patrol arrived at the stream and set up a perimeter defense and security. This time was used to plan further action and select a location to cross the stream. The patrol was at this location for 10 minutes when one member of the patrol observed one VC dressed in khaki's crossing the stream and walking towards the patrols position. This VC was observed to be

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marning a Thompson Submachine gun. One man fired lis M-79 towards the VC killing him. The VC was approximately 50 meters away from this man. It was noted that the VC had linked ammunition across his chest. A split second after the M-79 round was fired, the patrol observed 4 VC across the stream in the open. It appeared that these VC were in the process of recovering the body of the VC KIA. All of these VC were also dressed in khaki's. One of the patrol members stated that one of the VC were carrying a Chinese Communist Assumbt Rifle, Type 56. At this time, the patrol received automatic and semi-automatic small arms fire from all around their position. Fire was returned by the patrol immediately. The actual fire fight lasted approximately 1½ to 2 hours when the VC broke contact.

c. Terrain.

- (1) The terrain in the objective area was considered fairly thick around the creek and stream beds; brush, vines, thorns and grass were encountered along the low ground. The canepy was approximately 8 to 12 feet high at the low ground and up to 30 feet at higher elevations.
- (2) Map Corrections. Numerous small trails were located throughout the operation area. Some were noted to be 3 feet wide, several were heavily used. Only limited portions of the trails could be observed from the air.

d. Other Information.

- (1) During the initial contact, the patrol heard what appeared to be the scands of machine gun fire coming from an unknown location across the river.
- (2) No VC bodies were physically located by the patrol after crossing the stream.
- (3) After the stream was crossed, the patrol found at various locations, items such as a single sock (belonging to the dead Marine killed on previous day), a clip of 5 rounds of M-14 ammo, a bandage, a sock, and other items left belind by the VC at small intervals along the trail leading into the general direction of the body. This indicated that the VC would possibly lead the patrol into an ambush.
- (4) The body was located approximately 200 meters from the ambush position. It was noted that the Marines weapon and equipment was missing. However, all his clothing was still worn by the Marine. The body was not mutilated.

- (5) Two places were found near the body with blood stains on the ground.
- (6) 4 fire missions were called in support of this operation, 3 of which were called on suspected enemy positions; 8 rounds of 155 were expended at coordinates YD 997974, 6 rounds at coordinates ZC 004973, and 10 rounds at coordinates ZC 001496.
 - (a) One of these 4 fire missions was called in direct support of the patrol during contact. A total of 18 rounds were expended with excellent coverage on target. Damage assessment was made, revealing that at least one VC was severely wounded, based on an excessive amount of fresh blood located some 20 feet from the impact on artillery round. It was observed by the patrol that 3 automatic weapons positions were silenced by the artillery.
- (7) UHL-E's were on station and called in by the patrol to support this mission. Rockets and machine guns were fired by the UHL-E's with excellent coverage of the target.

6. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY.

- a. VC Casualties. 5 KIA confirmed, 3 KIA probable, 1 WIA confirmed.
- b. Friendly Casualties. 1 USN KIA, died of wounds, 7 USMC WIA, 5 of which were superficial schrapnel wounds.
- 7. CONDITION OF PATROL. Physical condition, good; morale, excellent.

8. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

- a. It appeared to the patrol that the VC did not know the actual location of the patrol at the time of the initial contact with the first VC. The initial contact was made by the patrol.
- b. The uniforms and type of weapons observed by the patrol, indicated t that they were from a larger force. Also, it was observed that the VC had excellent fire description and delivered low grazing fire during contact.
- c. It was noted that the VC employed the tactic of first firing from positions on the front, then stopping fire from that location and a group would open up from the flank or rear of the patrol.

- d. Request. TPQ missions at coordinates ZC 007964 to C07967. The area should be covered for at least 200 meters wide. Also TPQ at coordinates ZC 013966 and ZC 008969.
- e. It is suspected that the VC probing each flank and rear were not a part of the initial contact; rather, it is suspected that these VC were located in the vicinity of the huts located at ZC 006963 and joined in the contact approximately 30 minutes later.

- 1. This is the first time that good fire discipline and excellent general military tactics were utilized by the VC against recon units in the HUE/PHU BAI area.
- 2. The following expended cartridges were found in the general area where contact was made:

- 3. During the artillery mission, the patrol had at least 4 to 6 duds. In addition, all of the 155mm HE ammo was expended before the VC broke contact. There were still VC gun positions to be fired upon.
- 4. 7 rounds of M-79 ammo were observed to be duds during the contact.
- 5. During contact, the patrol observed in addition to khaki uniforms, 2 VC with green and 1 in a camouflaged uniform.



One round of the last volley exploded directly over the platoens harbor site, about 60 to 70 feet in the canopy. During the initial action, the patrol threw 4 grenades and fired approximately 100 founds of M-14 ammunition at the suspected enemy locations. No fire was received from the VC and no VC were actually sighted. It appeared to the platoen leader, that the VC were cautious in approaching the patrols location and they did not know exactly where the patrols location was.
 - c. Terrain. Slopes in the objective area are very steep, at places up to 60 degrees were encountered. Most of the valleys are covered with 6 foot elephant grass intermingled sparsely with vines and thoms. Very few trees were encountered at the low ground. At the higher terrain, thick underbrush, intermingled with vines and thorns was encountered. Trees were 60 to 80 feet high with a very thick canopy.
 - d. Map Corrections.
 - (1) One dirt road was located running from east to west at YC 872992 to YC 884996. This road was large enough for a 6x6 to travel up on it. Heavy brush was noted along this dirt road at the south east side and sparce. on the north side.





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(2) Numerous small trails were located in GS YC 8798. Most of these seemed well used. One trail noted was exceptionally well used and it was estimated as recent as two hours prior to the patrol arriving at that location. This trail could not be observed from the air (Annex A, Patrol Route Overlay).

e. Other Information.

- (1) YC 867988, the patrol observed 4 foot stakes planted into the ground. These stakes were about 4 inches in diameter, seven of these were located along both sides of the trail.
- (2) There was one artillery fire mission called in support of the patrol. However, as a result of this fire mission, one round of 155 exploded in the canopy just over the patrols harbor site, killing one USMC and wounding 3 others.
- 6. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY. 1 USMC KIA and 3 USMC WIA as a result of friendly artillery fire. 4 VC KIA (Prob) and 2 WIA by the patrol. 3 VC KIA (Prob) and 4 WIA by the artillery.
- 7. CONDITION OF PATROL. Physical condition, fair; morale, good.
- 8. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS. None.



- (3) An ideal OP site was located at YC 987986. From this site, the valley west and terrain to the east can be observed.


