2. MISSION. To establish an observation post within RZ 3 and capture at least one VC.
3. TIME OF DEPARTURE/RETURN. 310800H/031230H August 1966.
4. ROUTE. Annex A (Patrol Route Overlay).
5. OBSERVATION OF ENEMY AND TERRAIN.
 - a. Synopsis. During 56½ hours of observation the patrol made 9 sightings and 7 fire missions were called in support of the patrol.
 - b. Enemy.
 - (1) 010930H (YD 756107) 5 VC were observed traveling Southeast. 2 wore gray uniforms, 2 with khaki shirts and black bottoms, 1 with black shorts and shirt, all had collie hats. Called fire mission. Called 1st round short and adjusted second, but the VC had departed the area.
 - (2) 011400H (YD 756105 to 749116) Patrol observed 6 VCS moving in a Southwest direction. 3 wore black PJ's, 3 in gray shirts and blue shorts, ~~two~~ had packs. No weapons were observed. These VCS were changing from white to complete black clothes. Called in fire mission. No damage assessment was made.
 - (3) 011000H (YD 724120) Observed 20 or more VCS walking down the road in a Westerly direction. 3 VCS came from behind bushes along the road and appeared to be guides. They also appeared to have a destination and were walking in a column of two's at a fast pace. They disappeared into a draw at YD 735120. The 3 VCS who appeared from the bushes had their backs to our position and they appeared to have weapons. All but the 3 who appeared from the bushes wore black shorts and white and blue shirts, these 3 wore all black clothes. A fire mission was called. 4 rounds were delivered. 8 of the VCS were observed running from the draw. Estimate 7 VC KIA (prob) and 7 VC WIA (prob).

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ENCLOSURE (2)

SEP 5 1966

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- (4) 011830H (YD 732121) Observed 2 VCS carrying what appeared to be a body. They were khaki shorts and black shirts, and were carrying the body from West to East. No weapons were observed. A fire mission was called, 2 rounds were delivered with good effect on the target. 1 VC KIA (conf), 2 VC KIA (prob).
- (5) 021800H (YD 748088) 10 or more VC were observed making noise breaking threw the brush at the top of Hill 424 approximately 500 meters from our OP site. All that were observed had weapons. These VC were wearing khaki shorts and no shirts. The patrol waited until dark before moving, then fired 4 claymores and threw 4 grenades to the front and flanks of our position and withdrew down side of the hill. There was screaming and noises that could be identified as the enemy. At the bottom of the hill a fire mission was called on the VC with good coverage of the target. Estimate 5 VC KIA (prob) and 2 VC WIA (prob).
- (6) 022310H (YD 747097) The patrol observed 25 or more VC coming down the side of the hill towards the patrols position. Could only identify the rain hats they wore due to the full moon. A fire mission was called on these VC, 4 adjustments were made before FSCC changed to high angle. No damage assesment was made.
- (7) 031200H (YD 755106) Patrol observed 9 VC with weapons. They were heading toward our position and were to close for artillery. The patrol moved to higher ground. Enroute to our emergency extraction LZ at YD 756102. The additional force of 10 or more were observed wearing khaki shirts and black shorts. All of these VC were carrying weapons.
- (8) 021210H (YD 752087) Observed 10 or more VC coming down hill 424 as the patrol was enroute to an emergency extraction LZ. They had weapons and were obviously trying to surround the patrol. A fire mission was called. Fired 1 round but, could not make adjustment due to our enroute position and no communications. HUEY's were called in to strafe the area. No damage assesment was made.

c. Terrain.

- (1) The terrain in the objective area consisted of rolling hills with shrub brush to the front and side. Vegetation was relatively knee in the low ground. The patrol could cover approximately 500 meters per hour.
- (2) Map Corrections. None

6. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY. There were no friendly casualties. Enemy casualties were 1 VC KIA (confirmed), 14 VC KIA (probable), and 9 VC KIA (probable), as results of artillery.

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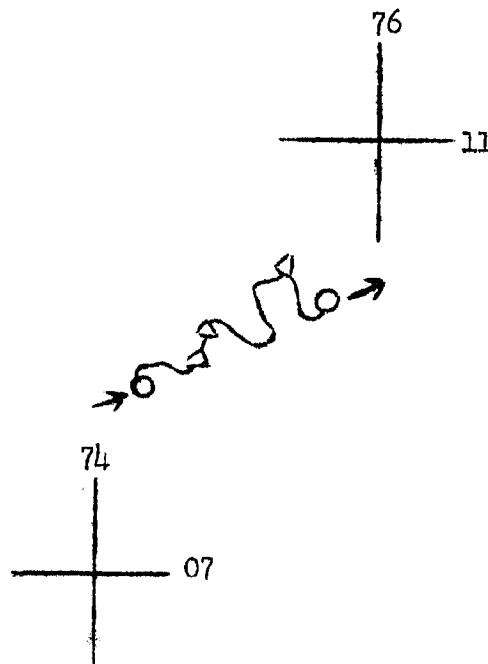

a. Synopsis. 104½ hours of patrolling and observation resulted in negative contacts and/or sightings of the enemy. There were no air strikes or artillery missions called in support of this patrol.

b. Enemy.

(1) There were no contacts or sightings of the enemy.

c. Terrain.

(1) The canopy in the objective area was approximately 30 to 40 feet high. Maneuverability in the draws was almost impossible due to the secondary growth. In the draws and valleys, movement was limited to the trails and stream beds. The patrol could cover approximately 200 meters per hour. Intermittent streams were full due to recent rainfall and water was plentiful throughout the objective area.

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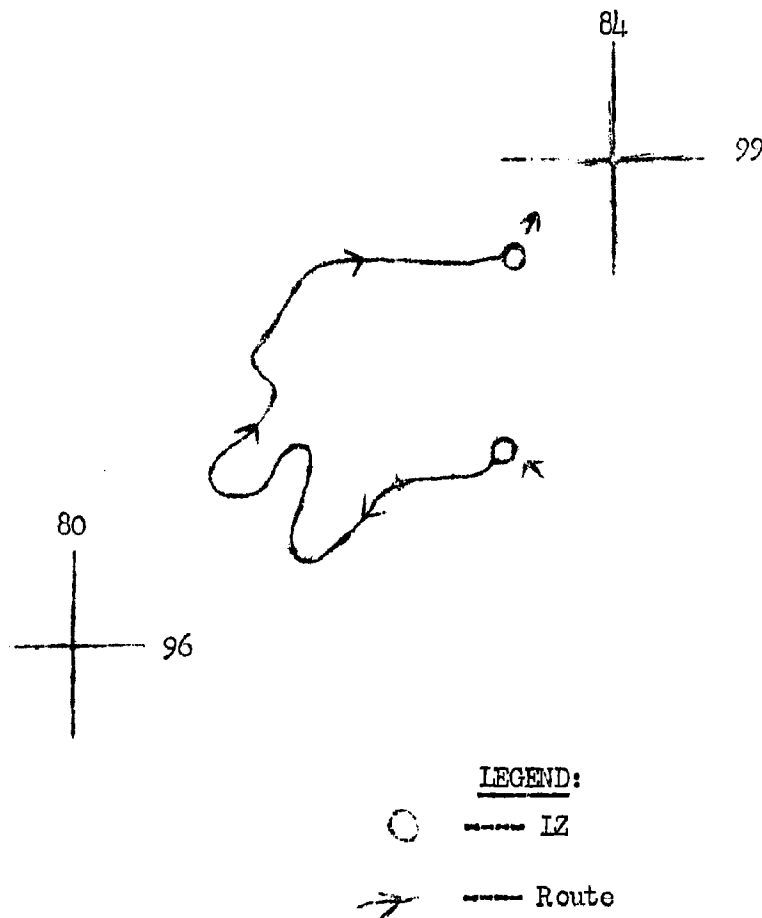

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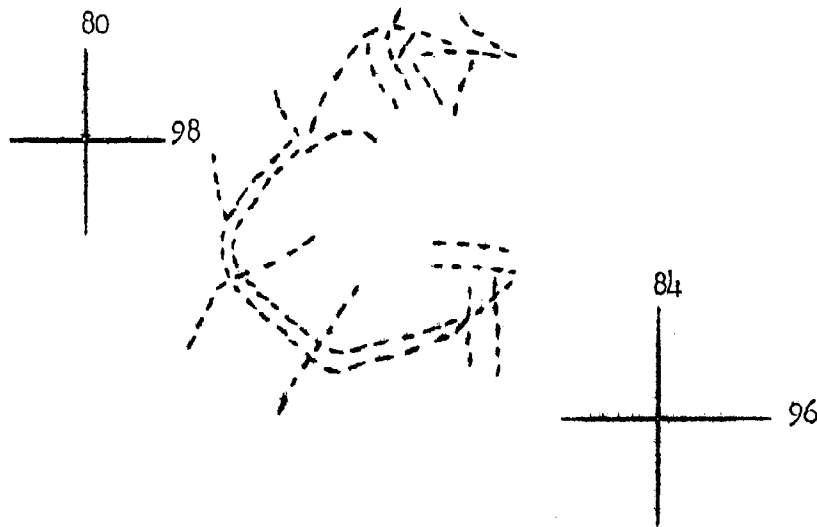

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- (2) 101000H (YC 905995) The patrol sighted approximately 20 VC, 10 of which were women. The first 6 VC in the column had weapons. One of these 6 wore a pack with a ChiCom RP-46 strapped to the pack. The rear point also had a weapon and was wearing a pack. All others were carrying very large homemade type packs which appeared to contain rice. The VC were moving North along a stream, then turned and headed Northwest toward highway 14. Several VC wore black PJ's. All others wore a combination of black and white clothes. All VC observed were wearing HO CHI MINH sandals.
- (3) 101010H (YC 903995) The patrol called in a fire mission. The VC started moving towards the high ground when the rounds were delivered. The patrol adjusted artillery, moving it to the East, while the patrol moved to the west, catching the VC in between. Artillery flushed out 4 of the VC towards the patrol's position. The patrol fired on these 4 with small arms fire killing 3 instantly. 1 VC escaped the contact. 2 weapons and other equipment were captured, Annex B (List of Captured Weapons and Equipment).
The patrol continued to call in artillery. Several screams were heard coming from the target area. The patrol made a partial physical damage assessment, but due to the helicopters being on station for their extraction and the dense brush on the high ground they could not assess the artillery damage. The patrol moved to an IZ in the vicinity of YC 903995. The patrol was extracted at 101145H without further incident.

c. Terrain.

- (1) Terrain in the objective area was relatively open and movement was virtually unrestricted.

- (2) 080920H (YD 715104) the patrol sighted 5 VCS loading unknown items into a boat on the SONG HUU TRACK. No weapons were observed. Patrol called a fire mission with good coverage of the target. 4 VCS escaped in the boat. Patrol check out the area with negative results. All 5 VCS wore black PJ's.
- (3) 080935H (YD 709109) the patrol observed 6 VCS, wearing black PJ's, moving on line to the West, then changed direction and went South towards the SONG HUU TRACH. No weapons were observed.
- (4) 081430H (YD 715104) the patrol set up an ambush on the North side of the SONG HUU TRACH when approximately 2 hours later 11 to 14 VC appeared on a sandbar at the South side of the river. The point VC was carrying an unidentified automatic weapon. All other VC were carrying their weapons slung over their shoulders and backs. The patrol initiated the ambush, killing 4 instantly and wounding 4. The VC tried to escape up the bank of the river which was approximately 25 to 35 feet high, but were unable to get away. The patrol continued to fire on the VC killing 2 and wounding one more. The patrol expended 600 rounds of 7.62 ammo during the contact. The patrol then moved back and called in artillery. RZ 3.

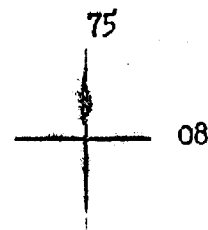

At least eight hours of concurrent training will be conducted by each platoon between operations unless otherwise directed.

Conduct reconnaissance operations within RZ 3 and along theroute as indicated on Annex A (Operations Overlay), during the period 25 to 29 August 1966, inclusively. Establish successive OP's in the vicinity of YD 706102, YD 717106, and YD 729108. Establish ambushes of opportunity. A maximum effort will be devoted to capturing at least one prisoner.

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- c. 3rd Platoon, Co "B". Conduct reconnaissance operations within EZ 3 and as indicated on Annex A (Operations Overlay), during the period 26 to 30 August 1966, inclusively. Provide a 6 man team to establish a communications relay site in the vicinity of YD 675156 and YD 680157 while the remaining elements of the platoon conducts a recon of the area as indicated on Annex A-2 (Operations Overlay). Establish ambushes of opportunity. A maximum effort will be devoted to capturing at least one prisoner.

c. Terrain. Consisted of many open trails and high canopy approximately 400 meters per hour. Water was plentiful through out the patrol route.

d. Other Information

(1) Map Corrections At (YD 670153) indicated finger does not correspond to the contours of the map. It drops severely from the 200meter elevation.

(6) RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY. Action at (290930H) resulted in 4 VC KIA's (confirmed) and 3 VC WIA's (confirmed. Weapons and equipment were captured and all destroyed by fire.

(7) CONDITION OF PATROL. Physical condition, good; Moral, good.

(8) CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS. Have reason to believe, due to the build up in the area, that a probable battalion occupies the same area. No security was maintained by the VC, leaving evidence of a probable large force.

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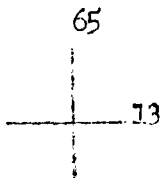
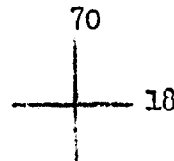
