

#### MARRATIVE SUMMARY

Durin this period, the Battalion remained deployed in the three segmenter TACRS of DeMany, Hue/Thu Bai and Dong Ha. The operations in the DaRang TACR consisted mainly of providing material handling equipment and onducting light engineering rojects for units in that area. Operations in the Dong Ha TACR consisted of offloading cargo from surface vessels and also furnishing helicopter support teams to Battalions operating in the forward objective area. Operations in the Hue/Phu Bai TACR consisted primarily of offloading cargo from surface vessels and continuing to operate a Logistics Support area for Operation Chinook. The number of daylight foot patrols was increased in order to conduct adequate surveillance of the adjacent areas prior to the TET holiday period.


