



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

### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the reporting period, Third Shore Party Battalion provided combat support for Operations Ardmore, Kingfisher, and Fremont. A total of 3,63h,62l pounds of resupply lifted by helicopter was provided to units participating in these operations. Operation of a BSA at the mouth of the Cua Viet River was continued. Provided security for Thuan An Island, to include three (3) pipeline dredges, two (2) houseboats and three (3) crane barges. Within the Dong Ha TAOR, assistance was provided to FISU-1 and other units, this assistance consisted of providing material handling equipment and light engineer support. Within the Phu Bai TAOR assistance was provided to units of the Division in the form of material handling equipment and light engineer support. Provided security for portions of the Phu Bai and Dong Ha TAOR. Daylight foot and mechanized patrols were conducted as well as night patrols and the establishing of ambush sites.

- a. Combat missions assigned throughout period;
  - (1) General support of 3d Marine Division by:

  - b. Significant Operations conducted:

# (1) Company "A"

- (a) Operated a Landing Zone within the LSA at Khe Sanh in support of Operation Ardmore. Providing a total of 766,20h pounds of helicopter lifted supplies.
- (b) Operated a Landing Zone within the ISA at Camp Evans in support of Operation Fremont. Providing a total of 207,700 pounds of helicopter lifted supplies.

### (2) Company "B"

- (a) Conducted foot and mechanized patrols in the vicinity of their base camp at Thuan An Island. Also executing Operation Order 4-67 for harbor dredge security.
- (b) Operated a Beach Support Area at Quan Trieu Phong, (mouth of the Cua Viet River) in support of Operation Dyemarker.

# (3) Company "C"

(a) Provided logistical support for the 1st, 2d and 3d Battalions, 9th Marines; 1st and 3d Battalions, 3d Marines; 2d and 3d Battalions, 4th Marines; 3d Battalion, 26th Marines and 2d Battalion, 12th Marines.

This support included providing these units with helicopter support teams and operation of helicopter resupply points. There were a total of 691 helicopter lifts from the Landing Zone which resulted in the total of 2,660,717 pounds of supplies in support of tactical operations.

- (b) Provided security for LCU Ramp at Dong Ha, which entails manning two (2) posts during the daylight hours and four (4) posts at night.
- (c) Assumed responsibility of operating a 400 man mess hall at Dong Ha.
- (d) Moved on 8 October 1967, into a new billeting area in the Dong Ha Combat Base, which necessitated assumption of responsibility for manning a portion of sector 5 base defense vice sector 1.
  - c. Casualties inflicted on the enemy: None
  - d. Casualties sustained: (2) WIA Hostile
    - (7) Non-hostile
- e. New techniques employed: Helicopter resupply requirements are submitted by Battalion S-h's in the field to their Battalion rears. This replaces the old system whereby the HST called in the resupply requirements to the Landing Zone personnel who in turn submitted the list to the Battalion rear.



h. Logistics: Sixty-four per cent of the monsoon requirement items were received, and shipments were made to each of the other areas in which elements of the Battalion were located. Company "C" located at Dong Ha received 10,151 pounds of supplies and equipment which, included monsoon, seasonal and general supply items.

#### i. Civic Action

- (1) Phu Bai
- (a) MED CAP Team administered treatments to 1,226 local villagers.
- j. Administration: Companies "A" and "C" administrative control returned to their parent units at Camp Evans and Dong Ha respectively. Companies "A" and "C" have received an estimated 40% of their publications, directives etc. that were destroyed by enemy artillery fire 3 September 1967.
- k. Personnel: Four Marines enlisted extended their overseas tour. Four Marine Officers, seventy-two Marine enlisted and five Navy enlisted were transferred. Two Marine Officers, seventeen Marine enlisted, and six Navy enlisted were joined. Personnel strength remains marginal at condition 2, with 82% of manning level actually on hand.
  - (1) Promotions to: CySgt 1, Cpl 43, LCpl 60, Pfc 1.
  - 1. Intelligence: None
- m. Communication: Primary communication by radio with secondary communication by wire and intergrated wire/radio maintained with all companies except "B" Company, which is radio only, as are Landing Zones of Operations Kingfisher, Ardmore, and Fremont.
  - n. Weather: No adverse effect on operations.
- o. Fire Support: Direct support provided by one section, 81mm morter platoon, of H&S Company, 2d Battalion, 26th Marines to Company \*B\*. In the Phm Bai TAOR general support to H&S Company is provided by H&S Company, 4th Battalion, 12th Marines. On call direct dual 40mm fires are available to H&S Company from 1st Battalion, 44th Artillery, USA.
