

4. AVERAGE MONTHLY STRENOTH


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PART II

MARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the reporting period, Third Shore Party Battalien provided combat support for operations Mecche, Scotland, Lancaster, Kentucky, Oscoela, and Napoleon. A total of 5,662,890 peunds of resupply, lifted by helicopters, was provided to units participating in these operations. Operation of a BSA at the mouth of the Cus Vist River was centimed. Harbor and dredge security was provided for Thuan in Island complex. Within the Beng Ha area of operation, assistance was provided to FIEU-1 and other units. This assistance consisted of providing material handling equipment and light engineer support. Within the Phu Bai area of operation, assistance was provided to units of the Third Marine Division in the form of material handling equipment and light engineer support. Security was provided for portions of the Phu Bai and Dong Ha area of operation. Daylight foot and mechanised patrols were conducted as well as night patrols and the establishing of ambush sites.

- (a) Conducted foot and mechanised patrols in the vicinity of their base camp at Thuan Island. Also executing Operation Order 4-67 for harbor dredge security.
- (b) Operated a Beach Support Area at Cum Viet in support of Operation Dyemarker.

UNCLOSURE (1)

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- (a) Provided Legistical support for the Third, Fourth, Minth, Twelfth, and Twenty-Sixth Marine Regiments, and also provided helicopter resupply of the combat base at the Sank. This support included providing those units with helicopter support teams. There were a total of SSL helicopter lifts from the Landing Zene which resulted in 2,195 passengers, and 1,30k,130 pounds of resupply in support of testical operations Hapoleon, Osceola, Lancaster, and Kentucky.
- (b) Provided security for LCU Ramp at Bong Ha, which entails meaning two (2) posts during the daylight hours and four (4) posts at night.
- (e) Continuing the responsibility of operating a 400 man mess hall at Dong Ha Combat Base.
- (4) Providing personnel for manning a portion of Sector V Base Defense.
