## Part II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of January, 3d Shore Party Battalion participated in or supported 3d Marine Division tactical operations in the Marshall Mountain, Dawson River, Scotland II, Mai Loc, Kentucky, and Dewey Canyon AOs. In addition one Helicopter Support Group of the Battalion participated in Operation Taylor Common within the 1st Marine Division AO in support of the 3d Marines(-).

Helicopterborne logistic support was provided by the four Helicopter Support Groups from LSAs at Dong Ha Combat Base, Vandegrift Combat Base, Quang Tri Combat Base, and An Hoa. Units supported included the 1st, 3d, 4th, 5th, 7th, 9th, 11th, 12th Marines, Det 1, MASS 2, 1st of the 44th (USA), 6th of the 33rd (USA), 2nd ARVN Regt, and the 62nd ARVN Arty Bn.

Equipment, multiclass supplies and personnel were transshipped from LSAs to widely deployed infantry and artillery units. A total of 10,557, 450 lbs of all classes of supplies, 7,081 passengers, and 6 medevacs were transported by 2,409 helicopter lifts from the LSAs within the 3d Marine Division AO. In addition, Helicopter Support Group DELTA, located within the 1st Marine Division AO at An Hoa, assisted the operation of an LSA in cooperation with Company "B", 1st Shore Party Battalion. A total of 8,701,996 lbs of all classes of supplies and 3,956 passengers were transported by 2,045 helicopter lifts from the An Hoa LSA.

Special rigging teams comprised of Battalion SNCOs and/or Officers were dispatched daily to supervise the rigging and lifts of artillery pieces, radar equipment, bunkers, engineer equipment, and other high value or unusually configured end items both to and from LSAs, fire bases, and landing zones throughout the 3d Marine Division and the Taylor Common AOs.

Secondary missions accomplished included provision of security for a vital defense sector of the Quang Tri Combat Base perimeter and the furnishing of limited engineer equipment assistance. Marine enlisted personnel from the Battalion were deployed as part of provisional rifle companies, one under the operational control of Task Force Hotel and the other under the 1st of the 5th (USA).

## Part III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Mission. General support of the 3d Marine Division by:
  - a. Operating and maintaining Landing Zones within Logistic Support Areas for movement of equipment, personnel and supplies to organic and attached units of the Division and to U.S. Army and ARVN Units operating in the Division AO.
  - b. Providing Helicopter Support Teams to infantry and artillery units in the field down to the Company/Battery level.
  - c. Providing limited engineer equipment support to organic and attached units of the Division and to U.S. Army units in the Quang Tri Combat Base, Dong Ha Combat Base areas and to Marine units at Cua Viet.
  - d. Providing a Security Platoon and a Command Group for Sector G of the Quang Tri Combat Base perimeter defense and providing personnel for provisional rifle companies as required.
  - e. Providing direct support to the 3d Marines (-) participating in Operation Taylor Common within the 1st Marine Division AO.
2. Significant Operations Conducted
  - a. Helicopter Support Group ALFA (Company "A" (Rein)) operated a Landing Zone within the Logistic Support Area at Quang Tri Combat Base and maintained an average of nine HSTs in the field in support of 4th, 9th Marines, and 2/12 units in the Scotland II, Dawson River, and Dewey Canyon AOs.
  - b. Helicopter Support Group BRAVO (Company "B" (Rein)) operated a Landing Zone within the Logistic Support Area at Vandegrift Combat Base and maintained an average of fourteen HSTs in the field in support of 4th Marines, 2nd ARVN, and 62nd ARVN Arty Units in the Scotland II and Kentucky AOs.

c. Helicopter Support Group CHARLIE (Company "C" (-) (Rein)) operated a landing zone at Dong Ha Combat Base and had one HST in the field in support of a battery of 1/12 in the Mai Loc AO.

d. Helicopter Support Group DELTA (Detachment Company "C" (Rein)) operated in cooperation with Company "B", 1st Shore Party Battalion at the LSA at An Hoa. Also an average of nine HSTs were deployed in support of elements of the 3d Marines (-) on Operation Taylor Common.

\*HSG DELTA (Detachment (Rein)) Company "C" cooperated with Company "B" 1st Shore Party Battalion in the operation of the LSA. Figures are not included in Battalion total shown above.

f. Special Equipment Lifts. During the month of January, Special Rigging Teams of the Battalion supervised the lifts of approximately 196 special items of equipment from LSAs, LZs and Fire Support Bases in the 3d Marine Division AO, and Operation Taylor Common in the 1st Marine Division AO. Items lifted included 155mm howitzers, 105mm howitzers, backhoes, TD-6 tractors, bunkers, trailers, generators, case 450 tractors, radio vans, howtars, a D-6 dozer and a searchlight unit.

3. Casualties Sustained. Non-hostile: 9; hostile: 0.

4. Command Relations. No significant change.

6. Civic Action

a. Medcaps were held in the village of Nanh Bieu and the Quang Tri City Hospital by Battalion Medical personnel. A total of 484 patients were treated.

b. The Battalion Chaplain conducted five English classes during the reporting period at the Thanh Mau School and at Quang Tri City. An average of 50 students attended each class.

c. One TL-16 scooploader was utilized on 9 days to load sand to be used for the Chieu Hoi Center in Quang Tri City.

d. One 550 grader was utilized for one day to clear a field for a new police compound and to grade the road into the Chieu Hoi Center in Quang Tri City.

7. Personnel

a. Transfer and Extensions. Sixteen enlisted Marines extended their overseas tour. Fifteen Marine enlisted were joined. One Marine Officer, forty four Marine enlisted, one Navy Officer and one Navy enlisted were transferred.

b. Awards. Purple Heart Medal (2), Navy Achievement Medal (1), Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Silver (1), Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Bronze (2), Meritorious Promotions to Sergeant (2).

8. Weather. Although seasonal monsoon type weather conditions prevailed throughout the reporting period there was no overall adverse effects on helicopter resupply efforts from LSAs to units in the field.

9. Significant Engineer Effort. None

10. Other Significant Event. On 17 January 1969, Shore Party Battalion placed into operation, at Quang Tri, what is believed to be the largest helicopter LSA in Vietnam. The Quang Tri LSA, presently being operated by Helicopter Support Group ALFA, encompasses a matted surface, measuring 400ft. by 600ft., a control tower, a Taclog Bunker, a passenger terminal, and 10,000 gallon water tower. This multi-regimental support area is capable of handling and transshipping 1.5-2 million pounds of multi-class supplies and equipment per day. Its traffic holding areas and working lanes and pads can accomodate both resupply and passenger helicopter traffic simultaneously.

1. SITUATION

a. Enemy Forces. Current Intentions.

b. Friendly Forces.

- (1) Quang Tri Combat Base defends against enemy sabotage, sapper probes, ground attacks, and artillery, rocket, or mortar attacks. Additionally it conducts limited offensive operations adjacent to the base.
- (2) Security Platoon, Hq Bn defends Sector F of the QTCB Perimeter.
- (3) A Battalion of the 9th Marines defends Sector H of the QTCB Perimeter.
- (4) Artillery
  - (a) 12th Marines and 108th Arty Group GS 3d MarDiv.
  - (b) 1st Plt, Btry "D", 1st Bn 44th Arty, DS QTCB.
- (5) Air Support. 1st MAW and 7th AF provide air support to 3d Marine Division.
- (6) Naval Gunfire. As currently in support of 3d Marine Division
- (7) Attachments. Annex A (Task Organization).

2. MISSION. 3d Shore Party Battalion (Rein), defends Sector G of the Quang Tri Combat Base Perimeter.

3. EXECUTION

a. Concept of Operation. 3d Shore Party Battalion (Rein) defends

CONFIDENTIAL

Sector G of the QTCB perimeter by manning multiple bunker positions and an observation tower; and by conducting frequent patrols/ambushes and maintaining LPs/OPs as required forward of the perimeter. Additionally, reaction forces are prepared to reinforce the perimeter sector on order.

b. Company A (Rein).

- (1) Organize a Perimeter Security Platoon, and with it as a nucleus, occupy, maintain, and defend Sector G of the QTCB perimeter. Annex B (Perimeter Defense Overlay).
- (2) Conduct patrols and ambushes, and maintain LPs/OPs as required forward of Sector G.
- (3) Effect continued liaison with adjacent perimeter defense units.

c. H&S Company (-) (Rein). Battalion Reserve

- (1) Be prepared each night to provide on order, with 15 minutes notice, a 14 man squad to reinforce the perimeter Security Platoon during conditions I and II.
- (2) Be prepared each night to provide on order, a reaction platoon on 20 minutes notice during Alert Condition II and on immediate call during Condition I.

d. Coordinating Instructions.

- (1) Alert Condition Codes; Annex C (Alert Condition Codes).
- (2) During Conditions I and II, defensive bunkers will be manned by four men with 50% alert during II, 100% during I.
- (3) At night during Condition III, defensive bunkers will be manned by three men with 33% alert.
- (4) In the daytime, during Condition III, a minimum of three bunkers and the observation tower will be manned and alert.
- (5) Reaction drills will be conducted at least twice a week on the perimeter, and once a week in the main Battalion area.
- (6) Construction/improvement of wire barriers, and supplemental fighting positions will be continuous.
- (7) Fire Support: Requests will be initiated by the Security Platoon Commander, the Sector Company Commander, or in their absence, the senior NCO present. Requests will be passed

directly to the Base Defense COC for approval and coordination. Annex D (On Call Fires).

- (8) Rules of Engagement: Annex E (Rules of Engagement).
- (9) Counterattack plan: Annex F (Counterattack Plan).
- (10) Reports
  - (a) Submit spot and incident reports upon occurrence to the Battalion COC, and the QTCB COC.
  - (b) Submit LP/OP and ambush or patrol overlays to this headquarters 24 hours in advance for submission to the Base Defense Coordinator.

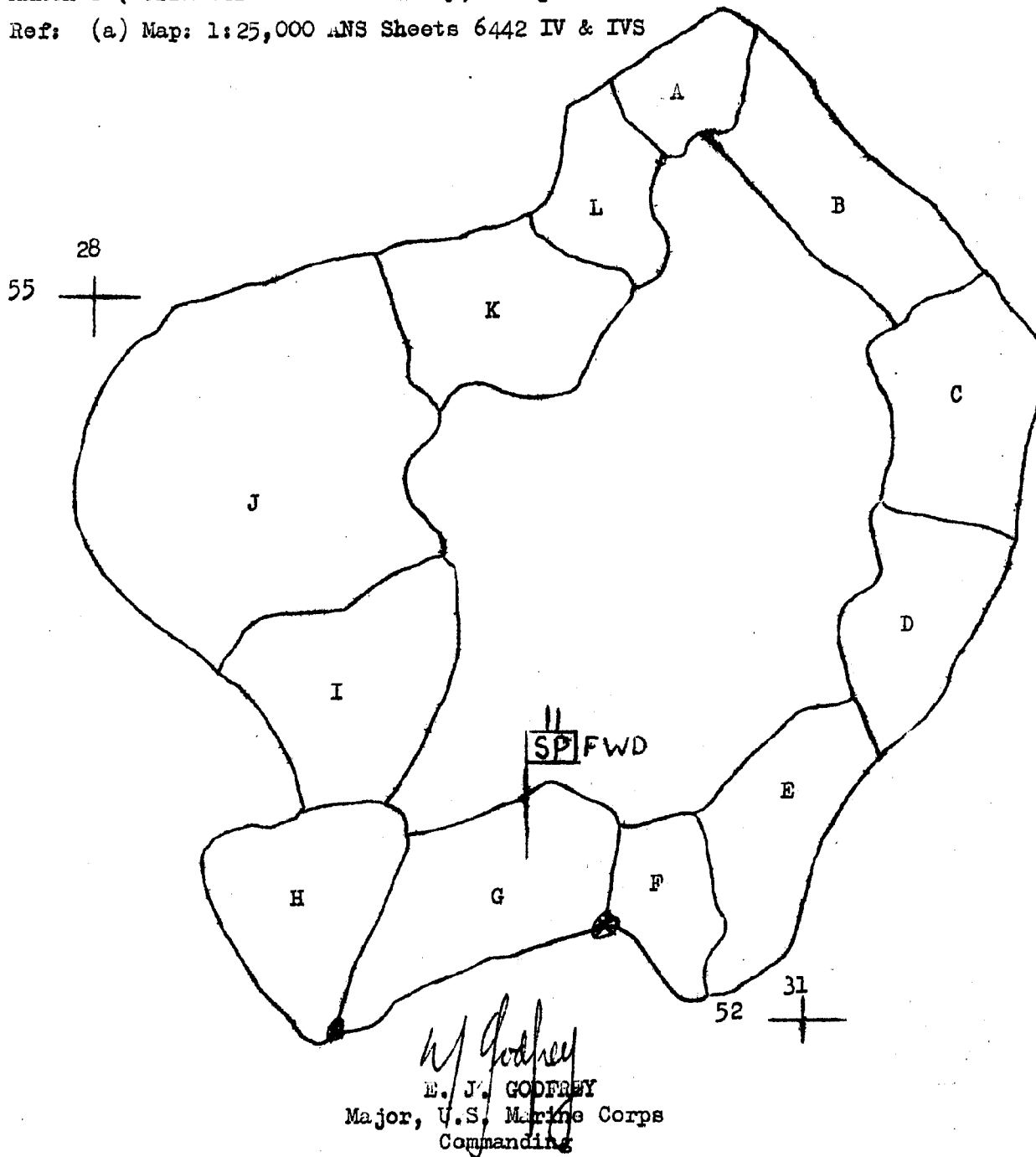

Annex C (Alert Condition Codes) to Operation Order 1-69

1. General. Minimum Alert Conditions are set for the individual or collective defense sectors as required, by the Base Defense Coordinator. Under normal conditions, unless otherwise notified, all sectors will be in condition III. It is the prerogative of this Headquarters, however, to set for Sector G a higher Alert Condition than that set by the Base Coordinator, should the Battalion Commander's judgment so dictate.

## 2. ALERT CONDITION CODES

Condition I - The highest condition of alert. All active and passive measures are initiated. Normally established when a ground attack is imminent, or being conducted against QTCB.

Condition II - There exists a strong possibility of enemy attack. Increased alert status and sector reinforcement activated. Other activities normal.

Condition III - No known threat of enemy attack. Normal activity.

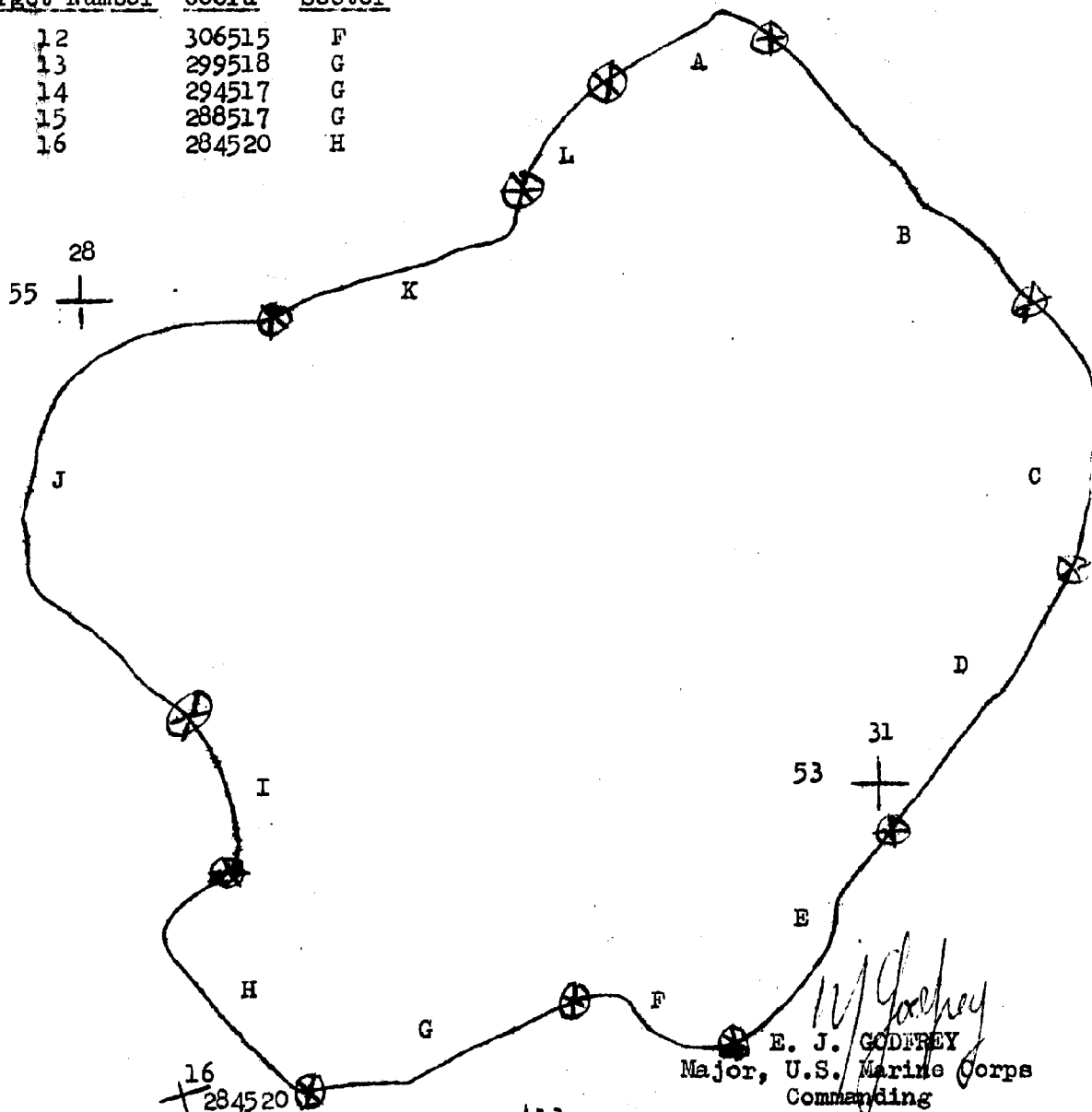

Annex E (Rules of Engagement) to Operation Order 1-69

1. General

- a. The subordinate unit commanders will ensure that the rules set forth herein are enforced. Troop indoctrination lectures will be held to emphasize the importance of preventing non-combat casualties.
- b. The Security Platoon Commander will ensure that all personnel understand these regulations prior to manning the perimeter.
- c. Nothing shall infringe on the inherent right of the individual Marine to defend himself against attack. In the event of an attack, the individual concerned may take immediate aggressive action against the attacking force by any means available.
- d. In order to avoid embittering the Vietnamese population against U.S. Forces in Vietnam, personnel will avoid the use of unnecessary force leading to non-battle casualties.

2. Rules of Engagement

- a. Rounds will not be chambered unless contact with the enemy is imminent. The senior officer present will determine if this measure must be taken to preserve the lives of friendly personnel. Initiation of any offensive or defensive action implies contact with the enemy.
- b. Magazines will not be inserted in weapons in a camp area or on the perimeter unless engaged in action with the enemy or on order of competent authority.
- c. Troops will fire only under the following conditions:
  - (1) When they observe or identify a person or persons as enemy.
  - (2) When fire is being delivered on friendly troops.
  - (3) When personnel are attempting, by hasty or suspicious acts, obviously to avoid contact with friendly troops.
- d. During the hours of darkness, the sequence of engagement will be:
  - (1) Challenge.

## CONFIDENTIAL

- (2) If the challenged person makes an overt attempt to avoid apprehension, opens fire, or commits any other hostile act and thereby endangers the life of the challenger, the challenger may fire.
- (3) The requirements to challenge may be waived by the local commander if required by the tactical situation and friendly forces are known not to be in the area.
- e. M-79 grenade launchers and grenades should be used initially whenever possible to return fire against enemy activity forward of the perimeter.
- f. Weapons of .50 cal and larger will not be fired unless the perimeter is in danger of being over-run and/or permission is obtained from the Base Defense Coordinator.
- g. The Responsible Company Commander will insure that all individuals of the Battalion's sector of the perimeter are informed of all friendly operations and activities taking place forward of their respective positions.
- h. In areas exclusive of villages and hamlets, artillery fire and naval gun fire may be directed against enemy forces in accordance with normal fire direction procedures.
- i. In cases where defensive fire is undertaken, care will be exercised to insure that friendly or innocent personnel are not endangered.
- j. Destruction of dwellings and livestock
  - (1) Civilian dwellings will not be burned, nor will private property including livestock be destroyed except as an unavoidable consequence of combat actions.
  - (2) The destruction of Vietnamese dwellings and livestock as a means of denying their use to the enemy is left to RVNAF units. Requests from Vietnamese authorities for employment of Marine Forces to perform such destruction will be referred to the Base Defense COC.
- k. Restricted Targets. Every effort will be made to preserve religious, cultural, and public utility installations.



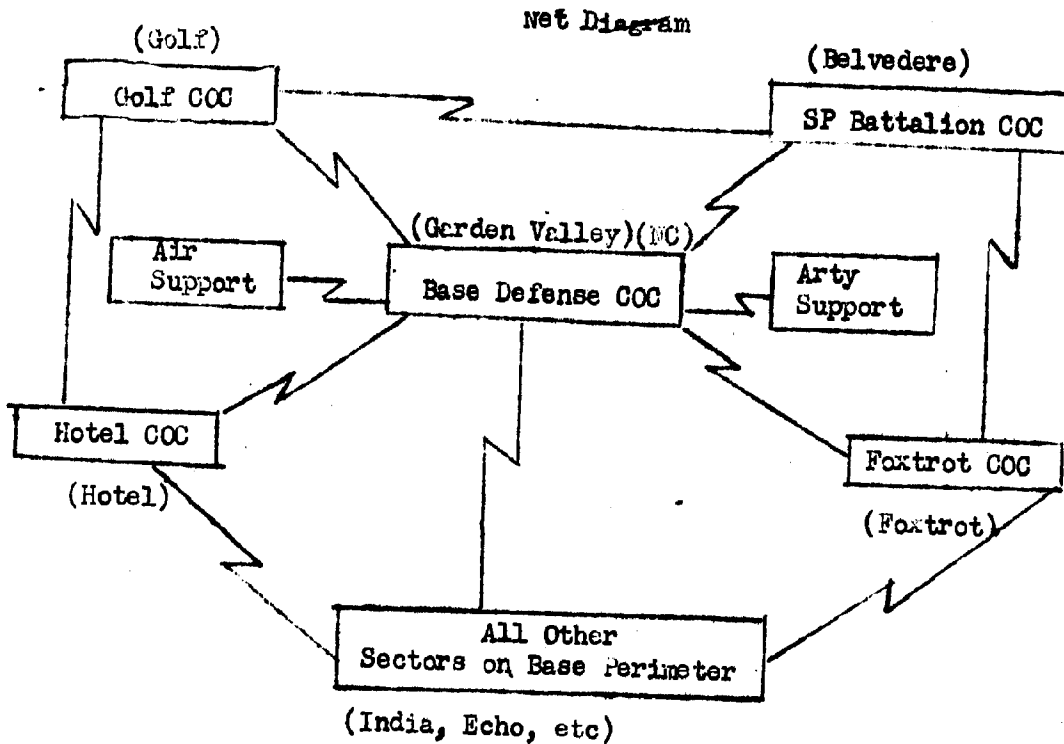

QUANG TRI COMBAT BASE DEFENSE NET

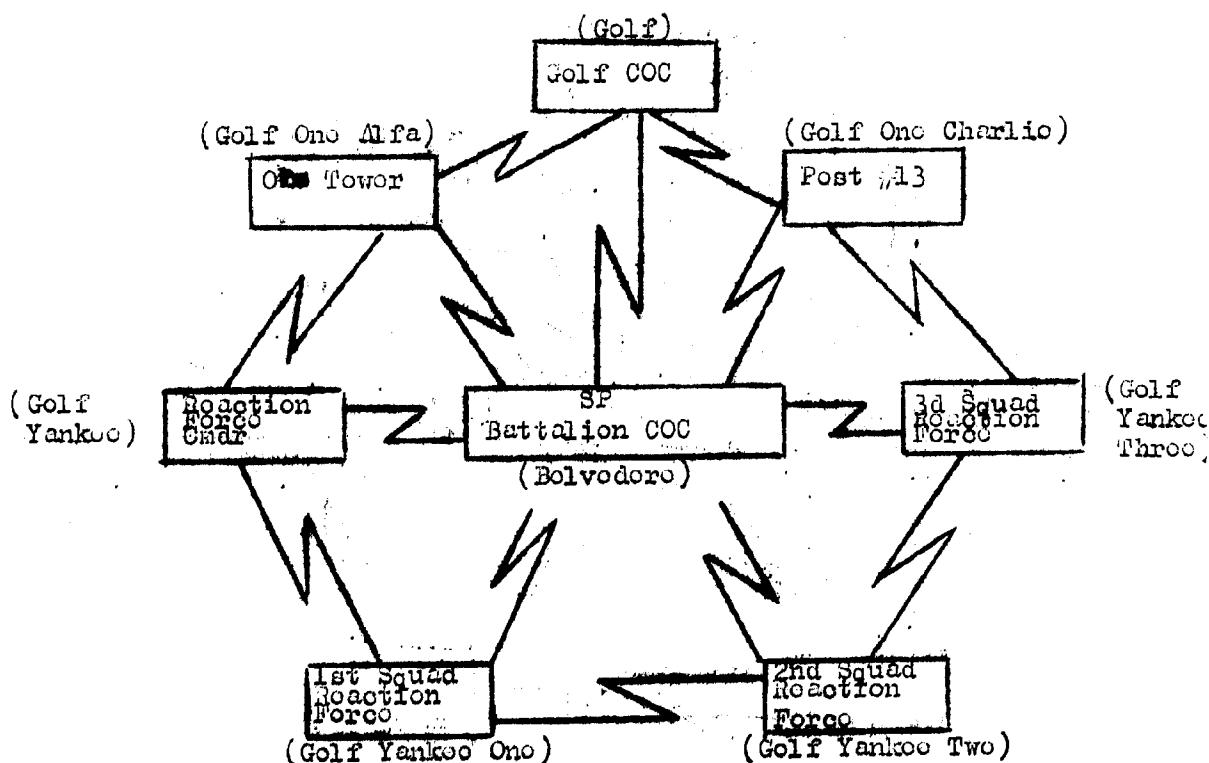

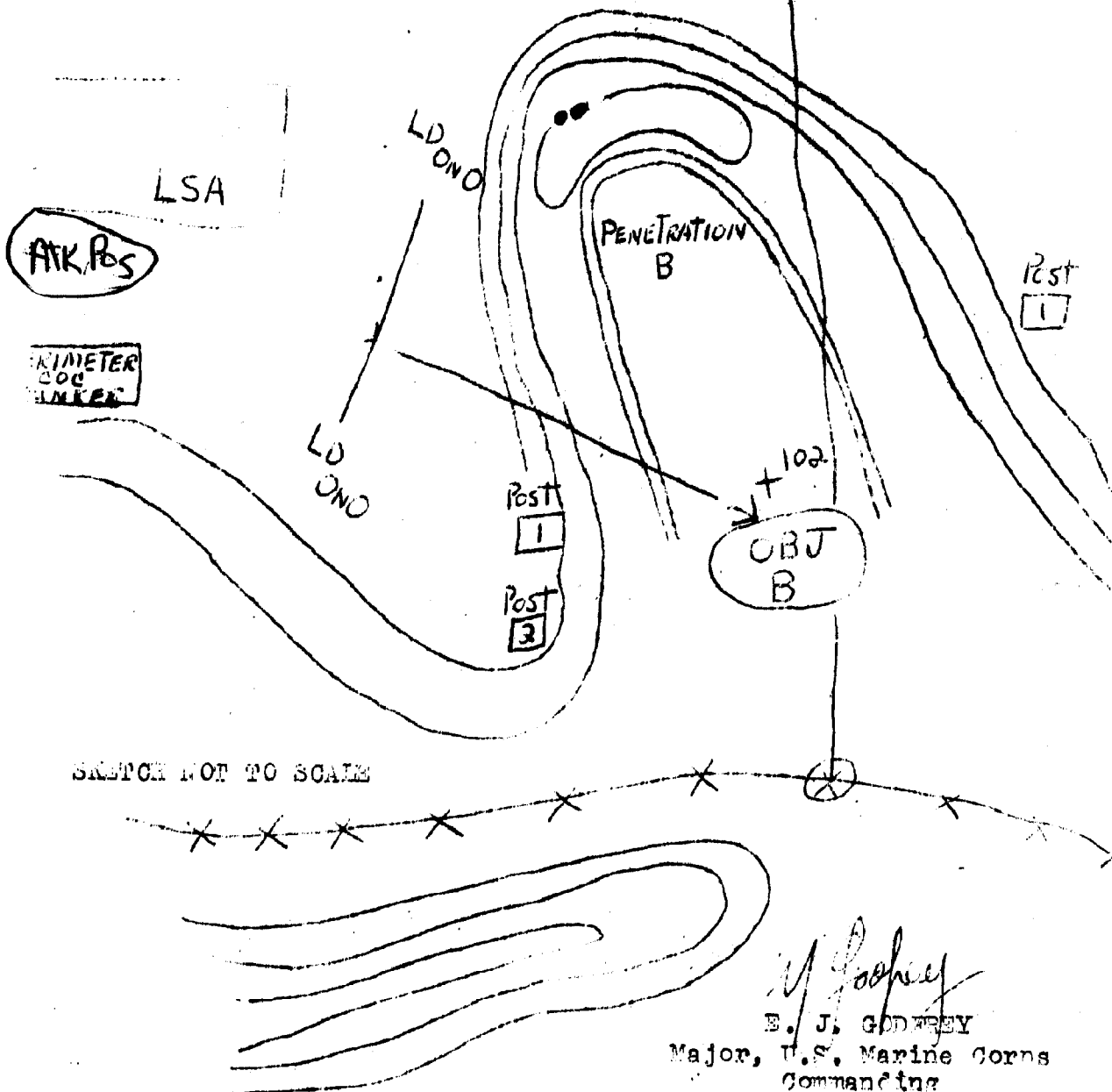

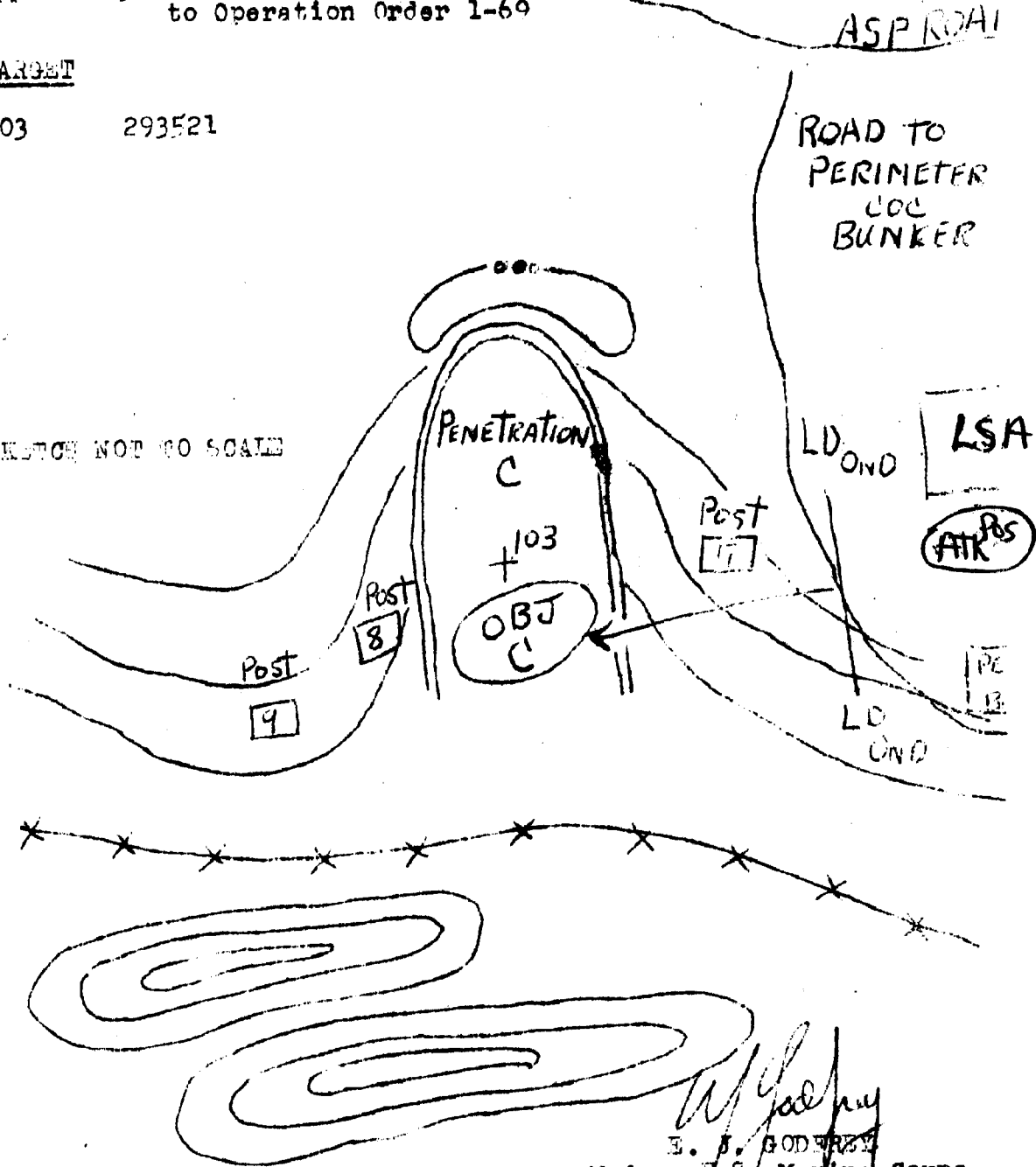
