NOVEMBER 1965 SUMMARY
PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

The Battalion's personnel posture continued at an acceptable level in relation to the M-Series T/O. The Battalion reached a peak strength on 30 November 1965 of 33 Marine Officers and 748 Marine Enlisted, together with 1 Naval Officer and 15 Naval Enlisted. While the Battalion's enlisted strength is favorable, the Battalion is 13 Marine Officers under T/O strength. As stated before, this shortage has necessitated some officers performing the duties normally accomplished by two or more.

There has been a substantial response from eligible Staff NCOs to the call for temporary commissioned officers and warrant officers pursuant to MCO 1040.25 (ALMAR 23) of 20 October 1965. Approximately 75% of the eligible Staff NCOs here submitted applications thus far, and more are expected.

The Battalion is presently experiencing a shortage in some occupational fields. The shortage of trained clerks (0141) continues to be a problem and has handicapped our administrative effort. The accuracy of personnel reports and other related administration continues to be satisfactory, but only marginally so. Replacements in this field are sorely needed but seemingly none are available. The Battalion has experienced a shortage of drivers (3531) in the Motor Transport Section. This shortage has caused us to administratively deadline motor vehicles due to the lack of operators. The Battalion is short 20 Tank Crewmen (1811). This problem has been partially alleviated through the substitution of Tank Drivers (1811) with Tank Repairmen (2141) in order to make full Tank Crews. This solution is only possible so long as the Battalion retains its slight overage in the 2100 Occupational Field, and in no instance should this expedient be interpreted as anything but the emergency stop-gap measure it is. Tank Crewmen who do not possess a qualified 1811 primary MOS are not considered desirable. The 20 Tank Crewmen (1811) are badly needed by the Battalion.

The Battalion has had one summary and one special court-martial in this reporting period. In both cases the offense was sleeping on post (Art 113 UCMJ). Aside from this, unit discipline is very good.

Morale remains outstanding. Continued improvement of living conditions was evidenced during the current period. The Battalion Special Services Officer continues to dispense a wide variety of items ranging from games to athletic gear. A Softball game is played every Sunday, weather permitting. R&R trips to Hong Kong, Bangkok, Okinawa and Saigon RVN are well received by the men.

INTELLIGENCE

The period 1 November 1965 to 30 November 1965 provided tanks with about the same type opposition and enemy tactics which have been employed throughout our stay in the Republic of Vietnam. Again the biggest problem has been mines and our inability to detect them. There have been no tanks hit by anti-tank fire during the reporting period. It is believed that this is due to a curtailment of Main Force Viet Cong activity in the Marine Corps held portions of the enclaves.

During the month of November the S-2 section of the Battalion Staff succeeded in increasing the functionality of the section. This was done by engaging in an active program of collection, evaluation and dissemination. The weakest point in the intelligence cycle for a separate battalion is the collection of information. The agencies available to the Battalion for collection are limited both in capability and use. The tank company is not in a very good position to collect and forward information to the Tank Battalion. This section has found in turn that it is increasingly important to rely upon the infantry regiments as collection agencies. Then in light of the particular EEI's which are important to the Tank Battalion the S-2 section evaluates and disseminates. This approach has been up to this point very successful.

During the month of November 1965 the three Marine Corps Enclaves saw a decrease in the efforts of the Viet Cong against Marine Units and a corresponding increase in their efforts against Regional Force and Popular Force units. This led to much less contact between tanks and Viet Cong. Generally the action involved the Viet Cong in a sniper/ambush role against infantry units with the tanks employed as the infantry commander's decisive weapon. As far as can be discerned the enemy did not attack tanks during this period with anti-tank weapons.

Mines again were a problem though less so than in the preceding month. Many reports of mines of large proportions were received by the units in the Danang Enclave. Prior to November it was estimated that the anti-tank mines being employed ran from 10-25 pounds of TNT, C-3, or black powder. During November the size as well as type was increased to a probable weight in excess of 35 pounds and rather than crude locally manufactured mines it is believed tanks have hit some well made Communist Block type anti-tank mines. These were of the pressure detonating type.

Within the immediate area surrounding the Battalion Command Post there were several unusual events. In broad daylight a Viet Cong carrying a carbine and North Vietnamese war bonds was caught and killed within 150 meters of the Battalion's close defensive wire. In conjunction with this another Vietnamese male was picked up alive and sent to Marine Corps ITT for investigation. Several times s/a fire was received in or very near the Battalion Command Post. This is something which had not occurred at all during the last reporting period.

TANK COMBAT OPERATIONS

Throughout the month of November 1965 the majority of tank operations were conducted by "B" Company in support of 9th Marines, on the coastal plain southeast of Danang. "B" Company participated in 17 offensive operations in which from two to ten tanks were committed. Patrol reaction force, patrols, blocking and reaction force in search and clear operations, support of company and battalion offensive operations are inclusive in the operations participated in. On one occasion "B" Company tanks were requested and were successful in extricating an infantry squad from an area infested with booby traps. Approximately 110 90mm, 1000 .50 caliber, and 4300 .30 caliber rounds were expended against enemy positions, destroying over 15 enemy emplacements. One Viet Cong was killed (body count) and estimated ten additional Viet Cong killed however no bodies were located.

"A" Company in direct support of 3d Marines occupied strong points along the MLR and supported two infantry company sized isolated strong points, and provided rapid reaction alert forces. One platoon protects the bridge at a strong point in the extreme north and west section of the TAOR.

"C" Company, attached to 4th Marines, continued to maintain positions at strong points along the Regimental MLR. The company provides one tank platoon as part of the alert force near the Chu Lai airfield, and participates in beach patrols along their sector of the perimeter. One hundred and fifty gallons of napalm was expended destroying enemy positions.

"B" Company, 1st Tank Battalion, attached to the 7th Marines, supported operations within the TAOR participating in sweep and clear operations and support of patrols. "B" Company conducted beach patrols in the TAOR and provides one platoon for the defense of the Chu Lai airfield.

Special operations were conducted by H&S Company during the month of November in areas adjacent to the Battalion CP. Seven patrols and five ambushes were conducted resulting in the capture of three VCS and the discovery of several holes and caves which were destroyed.

One sweep and clear operation covering one thousand meters between the southern perimeter of the Battalion CP and the Song Cau Do river was conducted.

On 19 November 1965 Marines manning positions along the CP perimeter observed a VC hiding a weapon 100 meters outside the perimeter. A patrol was dispatched and the VC was killed. Several documents were found on the body and were forwarded to Division G-2.

During the month of November the maximum degree of combat readiness was maintained and increased in all sections and subordinate units through realistic and practical general military and ~~and~~ technical training. All training was related wherever possible to combat operations in Vietnam.

Training of Battalion Recon and Liaison teams was completed and selected officers and staff NCO's attended instruction on familiarization and operation of the Seismic Intrusion Device. Plans have been made to further disseminate this information to subordinate units.

The medical instruction team continued to give bi-monthly instruction in first aid and personal hygiene.

The Battalion initiated and conducted weekly firing of individual and crew served weapons.

A syllabus on a complete course of indirect tank gunnery has been prepared and disseminated to subordinate units.

LOGISTICS

Providing Tank Support for the Division during November was most difficult from a logistic view point. The ever increasing demand for tank spare parts has resulted in a maximum effort being put forth by the tank maintenance sections, tank crews, and supply personnel. Tank units have been required to operate tanks with extremely worn track and sprockets, unservicable components, and with secondary firing and control systems. As a result many of the tanks can not be operated at their maximum capability. Tank Maintenance personnel have utilized all their professional ability and ingenuity to rebuild, fabricate, and jury-rig parts and systems. Requisitions, tracer action, and red ball procedures have been aggressively pursued on all Priority 02 and 05 requisitions.

B-23 had to be deadlined due to unservicable and unsafe track and sprockets, and connectors; were pulled apart, and rubber was pulled away from all the pads and pins. The sprockets were worn on both sides to a degree that the track would hang up on the teeth causing excessive stress on final drives and torsion bars. It is expected that many more tanks will be deadlined for the same reason unless track and suspension parts arrive immediately.

The lack of Tank replacement parts still poses the most serious supply and Tank Maintenance problem. The excessive lead time for small mailable items and the non-supply of heavy Tank replacement parts has crippled our maintenance effort. Some replacement track has been received since the last report. However, of the replacement track received, there were 1224 shoes, assembly for the M48A3 Gun Tank (8 sets of track) and 1488 shoes, assembly for the M51 retriever (9 sets of track). It appears that the M51 excess track was erroneously substituted for M48A3 track. This error can be rectified by ordering M51 retriever sprockets and putting them on M48A3 tanks. Documents to accomplish this will be forwarded separately with an explanatory speedletter. Sprockets continue in critical short supply. New track cannot be utilized in many cases in this Battalion until new sprockets are received, since extremely worn sprockets will ruin integral pins on new track. In spite of repeated tracer actions, combined with a special telecon to FSI on Okinawa by DivOrdO regarding sprockets, no results have been achieved in obtaining these critically short items.

There are no problems concerning our Motor Transport Capability. Between one (1) and three (3) M54, 5ton are furnished daily for Division requirements. This has imposed no problem on our requirements.

Sanitation and preventative medicine has been actively pursued by our medical section. As a result there have been no problems in these areas. An emergency medical bunker has been completed. This bunker will be able to accomodate eight wounded and will contain facilities for emergency field medical aid.

The availability of Class I, III, and V materials has been excellent. The preparation of food has been very good and consequently has played an important part in maintaining the high state of morale existing within the organization.

The Critipak program has alleviated some shortages on light, non-bulky items for housekeeping. While the reasons for bulk and weight considerations are apparent, the weight limitation of 400 lbs has curtailed some of the benefits originally intended by the program. Many items requested initially now cannot be placed on Critipak.

COMMAND AND CONTROL

The 3d Tank Battalion is reinforced with B Company, 1st Tank Battalion. Two companies are attached to regiments in the Chu Lai enclave and one platoon is attached to the infantry battalion in the Hue Phu Bai enclave. The other two gun companies are in direct support of the regiments in the Da Nang enclave.

The battalion commander maintains administrative control of the reinforced battalion and exercises logistic control and/or supervision of all units regardless of location or support status. Tactical control of the gun companies are for the most part in the hands of the supported infantry commander.

The battalion commander, his staff and gun company commanders attempt to influence the tactical employment of tank units by keeping abreast of friendly and enemy situations in all enclaves, and then advising the infantry unit commanders on the employment of tanks to enhance the accomplishment of their missions. Frequent visits are made to all infantry units down to the rifle platoon level in order to better understand their situation and requirements and to suggest ways to improve the effectiveness of the supporting tanks.

The four gun companies committed outside of the battalion command post maintain daily contact with the battalion. Information is forwarded daily for inclusion in the battalion situation report. The two companies in the Chu Lai enclave submit consolidated weekly reports of all phases of their operations. The battalion maintains radio and telephone communications with all units in the Da Nang areas and between Da Nang and Chu Lai. All company commanders come to the battalion command post to attend the monthly battalion command and staff meeting.

COMMUNICATIONS-ELECTRONICS

A new main frame was completed to provide better distribution of wire lines in the CP area.

In performing preventative maintenance on the antenna RC-292 all the vertical and ground plane elements were taped, and plastic bags placed over the MP-68 to keep out water and dampness.

Interference has been experienced on two of our Battalion frequencies, 25.6 and 22.2 MC intermittently by friendly Vietnamese stations.

Parts have been ordered in accordance with TI-0247A-35/1 for replacing present antenna lead-in assembly with improved version that features a quick - disconnect mechanism.

All communications items requested under the Criti Pak program were received with the exception of Mono-Blocks.

The Battalion maintains a 24 hour radio net with committed units on the Battalion Tactical Net in the Danang area, also a SSB circuit, AN/PRC-47 provides a reliable circuit to Chu Lai. This circuit is activated two times daily, 0800 and 1800. All radio and telephone circuits are operated from an under ground bunker which affords protection to men and equipment. The Division Tactical and the Battalion Tactical Nets are remoted to the Battalion S-3 for monitoring.

A AN/PRC-41 radio is on hand at all times for Medical Evacuation. The helo landing site has been reworked. Night marking for the helicopter landing point has been accomplished by using three ammunition cans filled with rocks and sand and placed at the apex of the triangle. For illumination the cans will be ignited by a mixture of diesel fuel and gasoline.

Radio operators participated in six patrols and seven civic action programs. Good short range communications were maintained.

MEDICAL AND DENTAL

1. During November 1965, sick call produced only complaints of a routine nature. There were 193 treatments, with most common disorder being skin disorders.
2. Buddy Aid training to all tankers of the Battalion was conducted, the forementioned training included the use of Morphine for the wounded. The tank first aid kits were brought up to date and Morphine has been made available to the Tank Commanders. They have custody of 5 syrettes of Morphine and are held responsible for accountability.
3. In connection with civil action, medical treatment was given to 449 residents of Phong-Bac village. Most common disorder being skin and respiratory disorders.
4. New villages seen in conjunction with 1st An Trac Battalion were Nai-Nam, Hoa-Ban and Thuan-Hoe of the sampan fleet. Most prevailing complaint being skin and respiratory disorders. 385 were treated during this month.
5. Work has continued throughout November to complete an underground hospital. When finished it will provide the Battalion Surgeon a safe and adequate place to treat casualties. There is sufficient room for 8 stretcher cases and 10 to 15 ambulatory at one time. During a sustained attack, once a casualty is sheltered in the hospital he will no longer have to fear being re-injured.

After viewing for many months the plight of the fishermen of the "Sampan Fleet", it was decided that some form of aid should be given them. With the approval of the 9th Marine Regiment, who has cognizance over the area, 3d Tank Battalion with the help of 1st Amphibian Tractor Battalion began on November 15, 1965 to send four Amphibian Tractors with doctors, corpsman, and civic action people down the Song Han River to the hamlet of Hai Nam coordinates (BT 040755), Hoa Ban coordinates (BT 038757), and Thuan Hoc coordinates (BT 035759). The first trip produced tremendous results with about 200 people receiving relief aid and some 75 receiving medical aid. The medical aid included a life saving operation on a baby whose head had a boil the size of an egg which was putting pressure on the child's brain.

From this initial contact and the warm reception with which it was received, it was decided that the team would return bi-weekly to carry on the program of aid.

On the second trip to the same area important liaison was made with several chiefs from these hamlets. Discussions took place concerning the establishment of a school--theirs had been lost in the 1964 flood. Also the Viet Cong situation was mentioned as a tentative subject for the next meeting. All villagers and chiefs seemed extremely receptive to the Marines.

The Battalion medical team has trained two nurses from Phong Bac to aid them in their work and to carry on after the Battalion leaves the area. In addition these nurses along with the doctor and corpsman are training nurses in the "Calm Seas" project.

Since the security problem in rear areas still exists, the 3d Tank Battalion Civic Action Officer has had lengthy talks with Mr. KHOAI the village chief of Hoa Tho village and Mr. HUE, the hamlet chief of Phong Bao hamlet, concerning the security of their area (AT 995705)--(AT 995715). It was decided that any information received by the chiefs of Viet Cong activity in or around their village would be relayed to 3d Tank Battalion. In addition it was agreed that we would send help to the village if the Viet Cong come.

The results of our Civic Action Program have been (1) and increase in trust by the villagers; (2) an increase in information exchanged between the Battalion and the villagers; (3) a better life, health wise, for the villagers; (4) more education for the children; (5) an improved awareness of the Government of Vietnam.

CIVIC ACTION

For the period 1 November 1965 through 30 November 1965, this Battalion, in accordance with the overall effort of the division increased their Civic Action activities a considerable amount. The Civic Action Officer attended the USOM Advisor School in Saigon, Republic of Vietnam, from 15 November 1965 through 23 November 1965. The school was excellent and lends a great amount of help to the Civic Action Officer.

In addition the 3d Tank Battalion with the 1st Amphibian Tractor Battalion initiated project "Calm Seas" on the Song Han River and continued on a bi-weekly basis to administer aid to the people of the "Sampan Fleet."

The Battalion worked on one construction project ie. floor for Phong Bac School, and initiated another ie. Medical Aid Station for the hamlet of Phong Bac. This was in addition to our regular program of medical assistance and relief in which we distributed clothes and food to the people of Phong Bac.

During November the Battalion continued the Civic Action support of Phong Bac hamlet. In terms of relief was distributed a total of 585 pounds of food of which 150 pounds was beef. Most of the total was in the form of diet supplement foods and candy for the children. In a continuing program of encouraging personal hygiene 1165 bars of soap was distributed. In distributing the soap we always have cut these bars in half to discourage resale and encourage personal use by the people of the hamlet. The success of the program is self-evident. The Battalion doctor reports a decrease of 50% in skin diseases and other problems attributed to lack of personal hygiene.

The MEDCAP program continued with the Battalion doctor and corpsmen giving 628 treatments to people in Phong Bao and the people of the "Sampan Fleet." This figure of 628 is lower than the previous month due to the curing of many skin diseases and illnesses.

The Battalion distributed 170 school kits through the Village Chief of Hoa Tho village for use in the Phong Bac school. The children there have not had the advantage of paper, pen, and ink in such a long time that the teacher actually had to show them how to use the various utensils. They were overjoyed with this gift.

The most interesting and perhaps vital aspect of the month's Civic Action program was the initiation by Captain John DONOVAN of project "Calm Seas" in conjunction with the regular Civic Action Program.

We have learned many things over the past month. First a Vietnamese cannot be rushed and direct talk will get very minimal results. Secondly the peasant in the field has no concept of central government what-so-ever. Third, without training, the people know nothing of personal hygiene. Fourth if a secure area is provided, the people are very willing to cooperate with the rightful Government of Vietnam.

This project received publicity in both the Pacific Stars and Stripes (see enclosure 12) and in the television program Huntley-Brinkley Report. See enclosure 12 for report.

COMMAND CHRONOLOGY

1-30 November 1965

Section XII

1. Problems encountered and lessons learned by supporting units.

a. On 13 November, the 1st Platoon was attached to BLT 3/3. There was no adherence to normal administrative procedures necessary in the attachment of a supporting unit to a BLT. This platoon physically effected attachment in accordance with the operation order. When the time came for the necessary administrative transfer of personnel and the establishment of a system for casualty reporting, BLT 3/3 told attachments that they (BLT 3/3), would have OPCON and parent units would retain ADCON.

Lessons Learned - The Dictionary of United States Military Terms for Joint Usage defines "attach" as follows:

"The placement of units or personnel in an organization where such placement is relatively temporary. Subject to limitations imposed by the attachment order, the commander of the formation, unit or organization receiving the attachment will exercise the same degree of command and control thereover as he does over units and persons organic to his command."

In instances where supporting units are attached in combat zones and are deployed at any great distance from their parent unit, it is extremely important that the unit to which they are attached have administrative control over them. This is necessary to ensure proper personnel accounting and casualty reporting. If a supporting unit is under OPCON only of the supported unit, the order must so state. Proper use of terms defining a unit's status or mission is extremely necessary for accomplishment of the mission.

b. On 27 November, the Viet Cong established a roadblock on route #1 at the northern edge of the TAOR. The railroad bridge across the Song An Tan River (BT 498067), has not been reinforced to accomodate tanks.

Lessons Learned - All bridges within a TACB should be reinforced to accommodate passage of the heaviest combat vehicles. In this instance a platoon of tanks with Infantry aboard could have arrived at the roadblock within 20 minutes of notification if the bridge on the Song An Tan River had been reinforced.
