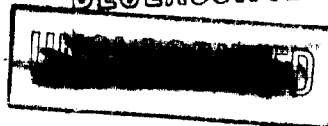

The Battalion joined 11 USMC Officers and 48 USMC enlisted during July.

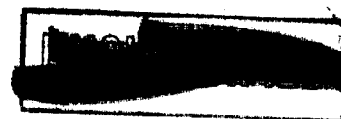
Current T/O shortages are: 2 Corporal 0141, 1 Sergeant 0121, 1 Sergeant 0431, 1 Gunnery Sergeant 0441, 1 Corporal 1316, 1 Lance Corporal 1441, 25 1811's, 2 Lance Corporal 2111, 13 2141's, 1 Master Gunnery Sergeant 2192, 2 PFC 2311, 6 2531's, 2 2841's, 2 3371's, 1 3516, 9 3531's, 5 5591. Of these shortages the 1811's, 2141's, 2531's, and 3531's are the most critical and affect the Battalion's ability to perform its combat mission.

One breach of discipline occurred which resulted in a Summary Courts Martial.

Morale continues to be excellent. R&R trips continue to be a major factor in maintaining morale. Swim call at China Beach is looked forward to by all hands and is a definite morale booster. Due to personnel shortages only an occasional Beach Party can be held.

The Battalion's program to voluntarily extend personnel overseas continues to have good results. Seven requests were submitted during July bringing the total since arrival in RVN to 107.

During the month of July, 1966, the 3d Tank Battalion experienced an increase in VC anti-tank efforts. Mining incidents reached a new high of ten (10) as compared to previous highs of six (6) incidents in the months of January and June, 1966. In addition, tanks received small arms fire ranging from one (1) to several hundred rounds on thirty-eight (38) separate occasions this month whereas only twenty (20) such VC initiated contacts were reported during June. Finally, on July 25th a tank was ambushed by VC firing RPG-2 rockets and small arms and, on 30 July, a tank-infantry patrol position was assaulted by VC armed, again, with RPG-2s and small arms. That the assault was primarily anti-tank in mission was evidenced by the far greater number of casualties sustained by the tankers.

The following is a chronological listing of anti-tank mines detonated by tanks during the month of July 1966:

- (1) On 2 July at (BT 078638) tank C-14, detonated a rudimentary type mine which caused moderate damage to the tank and left a crater three (3) feet deep and five (5) feet wide.
- (2) On 7 July at (BT 148614) tank C-51 detonated an unknown type mine estimated to have consisted of thirty (30) lbs of TNT. Moderate damage was caused to the tank.
- (3) On 8 July at (BT 003634) tank C-12 detonated an unknown type mine and received moderate damage.
- (4) On 9 July at (AT 890569) tank A-15 was moderately damaged when it detonated an unknown type mine triggered by a pressure type firing device. The resulting crater was two (2) feet deep and three (3) feet wide.
- (5) On 13 July at (AT 993577) tank B-31 received moderate damage when it detonated a rudimentary type mine.
- (6) On 14 July at (AT 911549) tank B-24 detonated an unknown type mine incurring moderate damage.
- (7) On 14 July at (AT 985584) tank B-34 received moderate damage when it detonated a rudimentary type mine.
- (8) On 21 July at (AT 961569) tank A-22 detonated a mine causing a crater one and one-half (1½) feet deep and two (2) feet wide. The tank was moderately damaged.
- (9) On 22 July at (YD 790117) tank C-24 received moderate damage when it detonated an unknown type mine.

(10) On 25 July at (AT 996567) tank B-35 detonated a ten (10) to twenty (20) lb. "shoe box" mine leaving a crater eight (8) inches deep and two (2) feet wide. The tank received only very light damage.

From June 1965 to July 1966, tanks have detonated a total of forty (40) anti-tank mines. According to Engineer estimates, the majority of these mines have been rudimentary (homemade) consisting of from twenty (20) to sixty (60) lbs. of TNT. Mining incidents often occur in concentrated areas as noted below for the month of July.

a. Route #14, bordered by North-South Grid Lines (AT 88 to 89) and (AT 97 to 00). Five (5) of the above listed anti-tank mine detonated during July were emplaced on or near these portions of Route # 14.

b. Anderson Trail, portion within Grid Square (BT 0063). One (1) LVT and one (1) tank detonated mines in this area during July. Also, one (1) tank and one (1) truck detonated mines here in June.

c. Junction of Anderson Trail and Route # 1 (BT 033644). Two (2) LVTs detonated mines at this position during July and one (1) tank in June.

d. Grid Square (AT 9154). One (1) tank and three (3) LVTs hit mines in this area during July. Moreover, one tank detonated a mine in the same location in June.

Tanks reported visually finding three (3) anti-tank mines this month and destroying another two (2) as a result of reconnaissance by fire with the tank 90MM gun. In addition, tanks reported detonating a total of six (6) Anti-personnel mines without producing casualties or damage to the tanks (note: often, such A.P mine detonations are not reported by tankers).

Finally, on the 25th of July, an unknown number of VC ambushed tank B-24 at (AT 968589) as the tank was moving South on Liberty Road toward "D" 1/9 patrol base. The VC, armed with small arms and one or two RPG-2 anti-tank weapons, fired at the tank from a range of 25 meters. Two RPG-2 projectiles were fired, the second striking and penetrating the tank through the turret ring causing light damage and minor injuries to one of the crewman.

Five (5) days later, on 30 July, again in the 1/9 TAOR at (AT 906551) an estimated twenty (20) VC attacked a squad size patrol base with small arms and RPG-2 anti-tank weapons. The enemy fire was concentrated on the two (2) tanks, B-13 and B-14. B-13 sustained two (2) hits from RPG-2 projectiles fired from close range (twenty-five meters) causing very light damage (no penetrations) to the tank. However, four (4) tank crewman were WIA (two medevac) and one was KIA.

In conclusion, the VC are continuing to increase their anti-tank actions and are exploiting even slight regularities in routes taken by tanks (see mine concentrations mentioned above) may be

assumed that the VC are aware that the damage their mines cause to tanks is not great, then it would appear that the VC prefer to temporarily deadline as many tanks as possible rather than saving their explosives for larger mines and thereby causing greater damage but to fewer tanks. In any case, the VC will probably continue to employ mines in much the same way since their tactics have proven successful.

Encounters with anti-tank weapons such as the RPG-2 could very possibly increase in the near future as tanks move across the Song Thu Bon into areas where Main Force VC units are located. Moreover, the occurrence of two RPG-2 attacks within a five day period North of the Song Thu Bon indicates that Company size VC units within the Da Dang TAOR proper have recently acquired this effective, easy to use weapon and will probably use it whenever possible against their main tracked enemy, the tank.

During July, cooperation between the 3d Tank Battalion S-2 and Civil Affairs Officer resulted in an almost constant inflow of reports regarding local VC activities. Village Officials, after some encouragement, would approach the Civil Affairs Officer with recently obtained information about VC movements and plans. The Civil Affairs Officer would, in turn, relay this information to the S-2. The Civil Affairs Officer, with his daily contacts with Vietnamese villagers and officials, is in a unique position to obtain information, and exploitation of this capability has proven very beneficial without bringing harm to the informants or damaging the image of the Civil Affairs program.

COMBAT OPERATIONS

Tank combat operations for the month of July reflected a significant increase in enemy contact and a resulting increase in enemy kills.

A total of 979 rounds of 90 mm, 2475 rounds of caliber 50 and 29,720 rounds of caliber 30 ammunition were expended during the month of July. Of the total rounds fired, 183 rounds of 90 mm were fired on H&I missions. Tank operations accounted for 145 VC KBGF confirmed, 95 VC KBGF probable, 20 VC WBGF, and 13 VCS apprehended. Additionally, tank action was responsible for the destruction of 48 buildings, 3 bunkers, and 2 boats.

The above figures increase the offensive operational data for the 3d Tank Battalion as follows:

OPERATION MACON

Within the Da Nang TACR, the majority of the operations were centered around the movement south of the Song Ky Lam and Song Thu Bon water way and into the Macon area. This operation involved the fording of a major river by 12 gun tanks, 3 flame tanks and a tank retriever to support the multi-battalion search and clear operation. The problem of finding a ford with a solid enough bottom that would support 52 tons at a point where the depth would not rise more than 4 feet was solved expediently by Company "B" personnel. This effort was not in vain as tanks demonstrated their inherent mobility and armor protected fire power with a telling effect on the enemy.

During operation Macon, tanks expended 212 rounds of 90mm, 150 rounds of caliber 50 and 8,330 rounds of caliber 30 ammunition. A total of 53 VC KBCF confirmed were credited to tank action. Tank units were credited with an additional 37 VC KBCF probable, 12 VC WBCF probable, and 15 VCS apprehended. Tank action accounted for 45 buildings destroyed and destruction of 2 fighting holes and bunkers. An ammunition cache containing 241 hand grenades and 18 claymore mines was discovered by tank personnel.

At the completion of the third phase of Operation Macon, the 2nd platoon of Company "B" was left in the Macon area and accompanied 3/9 to the An Hoa industrial area. All other tanks were extracted from the Macon area and continued operations north of the Song Thu Bon and Song Ky Lam.

2 July: While in support of F 2/3, two tanks fired 90mm on two booby trapped gates at the entrance of hamlets at coordinates (AT 859567). On each occasion, secondary explosions were observed. These two tanks while at (AT 838566) fired 90mm cannister at 2 VC located at (AT 838572), resulting in 2 VC KBGF probable. While in support of elements of 2/3 located at (AT 877574), one tank fired into suspected VC movement detected by AN/TIPSY-21. Tank 90mm gun, caliber 30 and caliber 50 machine gun fire was directed into the VC position at (AT 885552). Two secondary explosions were observed. Tanks then illuminated the area with white light and observed 7 VC bodies through the 10 power rangefinder sights. The area was not searched due to darkness. Results 7 VC KBGF confirmed.

3 July: While in support of B 1/3 at (AT 891772) a tank observed 3 VC 500 meters to its front. Tank fired its 90mm gun and 50 caliber machine gun, resulting 2 VC KBGF probable. Area was not searched due to darkness.

4 July: Tanks located at (AT 904717) in support of K 3/3 observed 2 secondary explosions resulting from their H&I fires in the vicinity of (BT 8771-8772). Tanks located at (AT 935660) in support of K 3/3 received heavy small arms fire. Tanks returned fire with main armament and the enemy fire was silenced. Area was not searched because of darkness. Tanks supporting E 3/3 at (AT 935660) received heavy small arms fire. Two tanks returned fire but did not search due to darkness.

5 July: While in support of F 2/3 at (AT 877574) a Seismic Intrusion Device picked up enemy movement at (AT 887554). Tanks directed both 90mm gun and caliber 30 machine gun fire at the VC position. A search of the area was not conducted because of darkness. Enemy casualties were not determined.

6 July: While in support of F 2/3 at (AT 877574) one VC in a boat was observed in the vicinity of (AT 861564). Tanks fired 90mm gun with excellent target coverage. Tanks illuminated area with tank mounted search light and the boat had disappeared. Results 1 VC KBGF probable.

7 July: While in support of D 1/9 VC were observed crossing the ~~river~~ in boats at (AT 964557). Tanks fired 90mm gun with excellent target coverage. Results 7 VC KBGF confirmed.

While in support of D 1/9 at (AT 923554) observed VC crossing river in boats at (AT 964557). Tank took boats under fire with 90mm gun. Results 3 VC KBGF confirmed.

9 July: While in support of 2/3 at (AT 890569) a tank engaged in a mine sweeping operation detonated an AP mine with damage to the tank. One crewman was WIA.

10 July: While in support of 1/3 in grid square (AT 7186) during a mine sweep tanks fired into a suspected mined area with 90mm HE and WP. Two large secondary explosions were observed.

12 July: At 0830 Company "A" tanks located at (AT 901718) in support of K 3/3 fired H&I fire in grid squares (AT 8670 and 8771). 40 rounds of 90mm HE and 20 rounds of 90mm WP were expended. Three secondary explosions were observed.

13 July: At 2030 Company "A" tank in support of C 1/3 fired 2 rounds of 90mm into (AT 873555) where movement had been detected on a Seismic Intrusion Device. Results of firing unknown as area was not searched.

14 July: Tanks in support of C 1/3 at (AT 877574) fired 90mm HE and WP into (AT 873555) when movement was heard by a Seismic Intrusion Device operator. No search was conducted because of darkness.

Company "A" tanks OPCON Company "B" in support of elements of 3/9 at (AT 833524) observed a VC in a treeline at (AT 945523). Tank fired caliber 30 machine gun. No search conducted, results unknown.

15 July: Tanks in support of elements of 3/9 at (AT 953552) observed 2 VC carrying weapons crossing the beach at (AT 964583). Tanks fired caliber 30 machine gun with good target coverage, results 2 VC KBCF confirmed.

16 July: H&I fire conducted in grid squares (AT 8577, 8378, 8676, 8677, 8470, and 8674). All fires were unobserved, 30 rounds of 90mm HE were expended.

While in support of G 2/9 tanks received sniper fire from a hamlet located at (AT 839567). Tanks immediately returned 90mm HE and WP fire with good target coverage. The area was not searched, results unknown.

18 July: H&I fires fired into grid squares (AT 8871 and 8770). Twenty rounds of 90mm HE and 10 rounds of 90mm WP were fired. Two secondary explosions were observed.

20 July: Two tanks in support of 2/3 elements at (AT 839508) fired 21 rounds of 90mm at VC who were observed in the vicinity of (AT 842500). No search of area, results unknown.

21 July: A tank detonated a mine at (AT 961569) sustaining moderate damage to the tank's suspension system. There were no casualties.

22 July: Tanks located at (AT 880770) in support of elements of 1/3 fired H&I fire in grid squares (AT 8677, 8678, and 8679). Tanks expended 4 rounds of 90mm HE. All fires were unobserved.

Tanks conducting a mine sweep in support of G 2/3 detonated an AP mine at (AT 886574). Engineer personnel estimated the charge to be approximately 1/2 pound of TNT. No casualties nor damage to the vehicle resulted.

23 July: Conducted a mine sweeping operation from (AT 877574) to (AT 918598). No incidents.

24 July: From 2100 to 2200 a Company "A" tank in support of elements of 1/3 at (AT 885772) fired H&I fires into grid squares (AT 8677, 8678). All fires were unobserved.

25 July: In support of elements of 1/3 tanks fired H&I fires into grid squares (AT 8678, 8667, and 8678). All fires were unobserved.

At 0955H in support of elements of 2/3, conducted a mine sweep from (AT-877574 to AT 924606). No incidents.

28 July: From 0630 until 0750 tanks from the 1st platoon conducted a mine sweep with engineer elements from (AT 877574 to 924606). No incidents.

31 July: At 0800 a Company "A" tank fired H&I fire into (AT 858777, 85774, 857768, and 862772). A total of 6 rounds of 90mm HE were fired. All fires were unobserved.

At 0815H Company "A" tanks conducted a mine sweeping operation with engineer elements from (AT 877574) to (AT 924606). There were no incidents.

COMPANY "B"

1 July: While supporting G 2/9 at (BT 024576) tank crewman sighted 20 to 30 VC 150 meters from their position. This observation was reported to CO G 2/9. Permission to engage VC was denied because of the close proximity of a friendly patrol. After a period of approximately 30 minutes, twenty rounds of mortar fire was received in the G 2/9 CP. Tanks fired in the direction of gun flashes with 90mm gun, caliber 30 machine gun and caliber 50 machine gun fire. Results of this action are unknown as area could not be searched due to darkness. One tank crewman was WIA.

2 July: While in support of G 2/9 at (BT 024576) tanks observed 4 VC with weapons in boats traveling south in river at (BT 020566). Tanks fired 90mm fire and 50 and 30 caliber machine gun fire resulting in 1 VC KBGF confirmed, 1 VC KBGF probable.

While in support of G 2/9 at (AT 982552) tanks received 25 rounds of 60mm and 81mm mortar fire. Tanks immediately fired into suspected mortar sites with 90mm 30 and 50 caliber machine guns. Results unknown as area could not be searched due to darkness. One tank crewman was WIA.

3 July: Two tanks in support of G 2/9 at (BT 019599) sighted 1 VC at (BT-026555). Fired 90mm gun and observed a direct hit, resulting 1 VC KBGF confirmed.

While in support of G 2/9 at (BT 030560) three tanks sighted 15 to 25 VC with weapons running through elephant grass at (BT 035560). Tanks immediately took them under fire with 90mm gun and 50 and 30 caliber machine guns. Ten (10) VC were observed falling to the ground amidst explosions from 90mm guns. Area not searched due to intervening river. Results 10 VC KBGF confirmed.

While in support of G 2/9 3 tanks located at (BT 025557) fired on three bunkers and two boats at (AT 025554) and observed one secondary explosion from one bunker. A VC ran from the bunker. One tank fired a 90mm round scoring a direct hit on the VC. Results 1 VC KBGF confirmed, 1 bunker destroyed.

While in support of 1/9 at (AT 925536) tanks received small arms fire from a sniper at (AT 929529). A direct hit from a 90mm on the sniper was observed. 1 VC KBGF confirmed.

4 July: While in support of G 2/9 at (BT 019559) tanks using the Xenon infrared search light observed 3 VC in a sampan moving east at (BT 025553). Tanks fired 90mm and 30 caliber machine gun. Results: 1 boat destroyed and 3 VC KBGF confirmed.

5 July: While in support of A 1/9 at (AT 929537) received sniper fire from (AT 928525). Observed 1 VC running and tanks fired 90mm and caliber 30 machine gun. Area not searched because of intervening river. Results: 1 VC KBGF probable.

6 July: While in support of G 2/9 at (BT 019559) tanks observed 20 VC at (BT 034557) and took them under fire with 90mm cannon and 30 caliber machine gun, with good target coverage. Results: 6 VC KBGF probable.

While in support of G 2/9 at (BT 019559) tanks observed and took under fire 7 VC with weapons who were proceeding north from (BT 030552). 90mm gun and caliber 30 machine gun fire was delivered on target with good coverage. Results: 4 VC KBGF confirmed and 3 WBGF probable.

While in support of E 2/9 at (AT 981551) tanks observed 3 VC in black uniforms with packs approaching tank positions from tree line at (AT 981538). Tanks fired 90mm gun and 30 caliber machine gun. Thirty minutes later 3 VC with automatic weapons were observed at (AT 983537) again tanks opened fire with 90mm gun and 30 caliber machine gun fire. Results: 8 VC KBGF confirmed.

While in support of H 2/9 at (BT 019554) tanks observed 20 VC in black uniforms with weapons and packs proceeding along woodline from east to west at (BT 030552). Tanks fired 90mm gun, 50 and 30 caliber machine gun with excellent target coverage. Results: 9 VC KBGF probable, 5 VC WBGF probable.

8 July: While in support of E 2/9 at (AT 085544) tanks fired on 2 VC at (AT 977538) resulting in 1 VC KBGF confirmed.

11 July: While in support of E 2/9 at (AT 980564), observed 2 VC attempting to cross the river in a boat at (AT 975565). Tanks fired caliber 30 machine gun at VC as they moved the boat to the river. Target coverage was good. When firing ceased VC could not be seen. Boat was then fired on to assure it's not being used again.

14 July: In support of H 2/9 at (AT 981551) tanks destroyed a building believed to be used by VC. No search was conducted; results unknown. Two anti-tank mines were detonated this date. There were no casualties however extensive damage was done to both tanks.

18 July: A tank on patrol with B 1/9 detonated a M-16A1 bounding mine at (AT 937553). There were no casualties and no damage to vehicle.

In support of H 2/9 a tank received sniper fire from a house at (AT 986584). Tank immediately returned 90 mm fire destroying the house. The area was not searched. 1 VC KBGF probable.

21 July: Two tanks in support of elements of 1/9 observed 24 VC at (AT 942518). Tanks fired 90 mm fire and observed 8 direct hits. Eight VC KBGF confirmed.

Two mining incidents occurred; one in the 2/9 ZOA when a tank detonated an AP mine and one in the 1/9 ZOA when an AP mine was found and destroyed in place by 90 mm HE fire. There were no casualties.

Enemy contact was made on two occasions in the 1/9 ZOA. Tanks and infantry were receiving small arms fire in which one infantryman was KIA. Tanks returned a heavy volume of 90 mm and machine gun fire until contact was broken off. Results: 2 VC KBGF confirmed and 4 VC KBGF probable.

Tanks in support of H 2/9 were called to the assistance of a disabled LVT which was receiving small arms fire from an estimated 6 to 8 VC at (AT 983577). Tank returned fire and contact was broken. Enemy casualties not determined.

23 July: In support of B 1/9 at (AT 920547) tank crewman observed 19 VC at (AT 929549). Fired 400 rounds of caliber 30 machine gun fire with good target coverage. Area not searched because of darkness.

24 July: In support of elements of 1/9 at (AT 906551) received approximately 15 rounds small arms fire from a position in the vicinity of (AT 901550). Tanks returned 90 mm, caliber 50 and 30 machine gun fire. Sniping ceased. Area could not be searched because of intervening river.

At 1545H in support of elements of 2/9 at (BT 018636) tanks fired a heavy volume of 90 mm cannon fire into a treeline from which they were receiving small arms fire. Results unknown, area not searched.

25 July: Tanks in support of elements of 1/9 made enemy contact on 3 occasions. Each contact was the result of enemy small arms sniper fire. On each contact tanks returned 90 mm, caliber 50 and 30 machine gun fire and contact was broken.

At 1925H a tank enroute from C 1/9 CP to hill 55 was hit by an RPG-2 anti-tank rocket at (AT 968590). The projectile penetrated the left sponson box, seared through a caliber 50 barrel and a tank bar and struck the turret at the turret ring penetrating the turret and destroying one round of 90 mm ammunition. There were no internal explosions, one tank crewman was WIA non med evac.

At 1510H a Company "B" tank at (AT 996567) detonated an AP mine. There were no casualties and only minor damage to the tank.

27 July: At 1130 flame tanks located at (AT 968590) in support of D 1/9 burned trees and brush around the ambush site that was used by the VC to fire RPG-2 rockets at a tank on 25 July.

At 1200 tanks located at (AT 906551) in support of B 1/9 received heavy automatic weapons fire from (AT 901537). Tanks returned fire with caliber 30 machine guns. Intervening river prevented search. Results unknown.

At 1500 tanks operating with elements of 1/9 leveled a structure in grid squares (AT 9457, and 9458) with 90mm and caliber 50 machine gun fire. One VCC was captured.

28 July: At 0930 while in support of B 1/9 tank crewman observed 2 VC at (AT 902552). Scored direct hits with 90mm cannon fire resulting in 2 VC KBGF confirmed. At 0935 drew small arms fire from (AT 901559). Returned a heavy volume of caliber 50 and 30 machine gun fire resulting in 2 VC KBGF confirmed.

Flame tanks supporting D 1/9 burned out a group of structures and undergrowth.

29 July: At 0945 a Company "B" tank in support of elements of 2/9 detonated an M16A1 mine at (AT 987577). No casualties or damage to vehicle.

At 1835 tank crewmen in support of elements of 1/9 found a raft at (AT 949578) containing 1000 rounds of caliber 30 ammunition, two M-1 carbine clips and articles of uniform clothing. The raft was destroyed.

At 2005 tank crewmen observed 10 VC in boats at (AT 974566) tanks took them under fire with caliber 30 machine guns. Two bodies were observed on the river bank and three bodies in the water. Five VC KBGF confirmed and two boats destroyed.

30 July: At 0515 2 tanks at (AT 906551) in support of B 1/9 were attacked by an estimated 20 to 25 VC from positions at (AT 507540) and (AT 905545). VC fired an estimated 250 rounds of small arms and two RPG-2 anti-tank rockets. Tanks returned 90mm and caliber 30 machine gun fire accounting for 8 VC KBGF confirmed and 8 VC WEGF probable. In addition, the following equipment was found on the VC bodies: 1 carbine, 1 caliber 45 pistol, 1 M-14 rifle, one RPG-2 with 3 rounds of ammunition, 1 French submachine gun, several Chi Com grenades, first aid equipment, and assorted papers and documents.

31 July: At 1902 at (AT 904543) Company "B" tanks received sniper fire from a treeline at (AT 905538). Tank returned 1 round of 90mm HE and firing ceased. At 1935 firing was again received from the same tree line. One tank crewman was WIA and later DOW. Tanks returned 1 round of 90mm WP. No search was conducted because of darkness.

8 July: At 1300 two flame tanks moved outside the vital area perimeter to burn high brush used the previous night by VC to hide while harassing infantry on the perimeter with small arms fire and handgrenades.

10 July: At 0530, a recon party departed company CP (YD 899152) to reconnoiter route from Phu Bai to Dong Ha. Two blown bridges and one mine placed in the road were encountered. Recon party returned at 1830 after checking the road and bridges from Phu Bai to Dong Ha.

21 July: Second Platoon with squad of infantry conducted patrol in area coordinates YD8116, YD 8315, YD8311, YD8311. Tanks received 10 rounds of small arms fire from vicinity of YD835141. Actual location of firing could not be determined. Area was searched with negative results.

22 July: A heavy section of tanks of the 2d platoon with a reinforced squad of infantry and mine sweep team departed 2d Battalion, 1st Marines area at 1000 to patrol area south of position along river. At 1408, tank C-24 hit a mine at coordinates YD 790117. Mine was a charge of approximately 40 pounds and blew the fifth right road wheel and damaged the road wheel arm and track. Necessary parts to repair the tank were flown in by helicopter at 1530 and work began to make repairs. At 1610, a booby trap was located in the vicinity of the damaged tank and blown by engineers. No casualties resulted from either incident. At 1800, repairs were completed and the tank and infantry proceeded back to the 2/4 area. Tanks arrived at 1848.

23 July: Tanks conducted combat patrol with elements of the 4th Marine Regiment (rear) in grid squares (YD 8116, 8319, 8313, and 8113). Negative contact.

2 July: While in support of C 1/1, a tank detonated a mine at (BT 078658). There was moderate damage to the tank's suspension system. No casualties.

3 July: While in support of C 1/1 tanks fired the 90mm gun at a river crossing at (BT 122627) that was suspected of being mined. One secondary explosion was observed.

During the evening tanks in support of 1/1 at (BT 079612) observed a VC running outside the defense perimeter and fired 1 round of 90 mm cannister. A search was not made because of darkness. Results unknown.

5 July: Two tanks under OPCON Company "B", 3d Tank Battalion conducted a mine sweep on Anderson Trail. Discovered a cave at (AT 996633) and destroyed it with 90 mm cannon fire.

While in support of "A" 1/1 at (AT 067614) tanks and infantry received 400 to 500 rounds of small arms fire. Tanks immediately returned a large volume of 90 mm and caliber 30 machine gun fire. A search was not conducted due to darkness. Enemy casualties were not determined.

6 July: Again tanks were called on to return fire on sniper positions from which elements of 1/1 received fire at (BT 075600). Twenty five rounds of 90 mm gun fire silenced the snipers.

7 July: A tank operating with "A" 1/1 detonated a mine at (BT 148614). Grater analysis determined the charge to be approximately 30 pounds of black powder. There was moderate damage to the tank suspension system. No casualties.

While in support of 1/1 tanks received 30 rounds of small arms fire and immediately returned 90 mm fire. Darkness precluded a search of the area.

8 July: A tank detonated a mine at (BT 003634). There were no casualties, and only moderate damage to suspension system. Later that afternoon while repairing the suspension system, heavy small arms fire was received from (BT 003633). Tanks returned fire and contact was broken. A search of the area disclosed much blood and gore. At least one VC was KBCF probable. There were no friendly casualties.

10 July: At 2110H while in support of "A" 1/1 tanks received sniper fire and returned fire into the suspected area. Contact was then broken by the VC.

11 July: While in support of "A" 1/1 conducting a search and destroy mission tanks fired on the approaches to a village at (BT 105628). Three secondary explosions were heard indicating the area may have been mined.

18 July: A reaction force of 2 tanks with infantry was dispatched in support of elements of 1/1 and Popular Forces who were under attack at (BT 169574) and (BT 171576). On arrival tanks immediately took the enemy under fire with 90mm fire. Results 8 VC KBGF confirmed. 10 VC KBGF probable.

21 July: Two tanks on search and clear operation with elements of 1/1 fired 12 rounds of 90mm fire at snipers throughout the day. Results unknown.

23 July: While in support of elements of 1/1 (rear) at (BT 068713) tanks fired 7 rounds of 90mm into a suspected enemy mortar position located at (BT 061713).

27 July: At 1915H tanks located at (BT 054654) in support of C 1/1 were receiving small arms fire from (BT 050655). The VC exposed themselves when the tanks opened fire. As the VC retreated many direct hits were observed resulting in 5 VC KBGF confirmed and 3 VC KBGF probable.

28 July: At 1735H tanks in support of elements of 1/1 (rear) observed 8 to 10 VC running across a rice paddy at (BT 115625). 90mm cannon was fired with good target coverage. Results 1 VC KBGF confirmed and 4 VC KBGF probable.

30 July: At 2015H tanks in support of elements of 1/1 (rear) at (BT 084599) dispatched a reaction force of 1 tank with infantry to support a platoon that was pinned down at (BT 075608) by enemy fire. On arrival, heavy 90mm and caliber 30 machine gun fire was directed at the enemy force until they broke contact. Results of this action could not be determined due to darkness.

31 July: At 1420 while in support of elements of 1/1, dispatched two tanks as reaction force to (BT 082399) where an infantry platoon was pinned down by enemy fire. Tanks expended 10 rounds of 90mm HE and contact was broken. Area not searched, results unknown.

7 July: At 1138H 6 Company "B" tanks crossed the Song Thu Bon at (AT 966564) in support of elements of 3/9.

8 July: At 0932H, 8 Company "B" tanks crossed the Song Thu Bon at (AT 957552) in support of elements of 3/9.

While in support of "I" 3/9 at (AT 847528) tanks observed 4 VCS running from a hamlet. Tank personnel dismounted and apprehended all 4 VCS and turned them over to "I" 3/9.

14 July: Tanks in support of 3/9 elements made enemy contact on 4 occasions throughout the day. On two occasions when tanks ceased firing and the area was searched a total of 8 VC KBGF were found, 5 VC KBGF probable, one fortification was destroyed.

16 July: Tank crewmen at (AT 913514) observed a VC in a green uniform carrying binoculars and fired one round of 90 mm HE scoring a direct hit. One VC KBGF confirmed.

17 July: While at (AT 913514) tank crewmen observed 30 VC running out of a treeline in the vicinity of (AT 885533) and into a marsh by hamlet. Tank 90 mm gun fire was directed into the hamlet and surrounding area, resulting in 16 VC KBGF confirmed and 6 houses destroyed.

SPECIAL OPERATIONS

During July the 3d Tank Battalion continued with its special assigned mission of clearing anti-personnel mines, and in conjunction with engineer elements tanks continued to sweep for anti-vehicular mines on the MSRs. A total of 6 Anti-personnel mines were detonated when tanks traversed areas that were suspected to contain AP mines. While working with engineer elements a total of 14 coordinated mine sweeps were conducted in an attempt to locate anti vehicular mines.

Tanks when observing an area that might contain anti vehicular mines directed 90mm caliber .50 and caliber .30 machine gun fire into the area. As a result of this action secondary explosions were observed on several occasions. Tanks have continued to play an important role in the clearing of anti-personnel and anti-vehicular mines. New methods of employment of tanks will continue to be developed and devised to reduce the danger of mine casualties to infantry and thin skin vehicles.

On 11 July the 3d Tank Battalion assumed the responsibility for coordinating the defenses of the Southern Sector of the 3d Marine Division Rear Area. This responsibility required coordination with 7 battalion size units in addition to numerous company and battery size units within the Southern Sector. Southern Sector 3d Marine Division Rear Area Operation Order 1-66 was issued to implement the rear area defense requirements (See enclosure 12 for OpO 1-66).

TRAINING

Between operational commitments the 3d Tank Battalion continued to conduct training and troop orientation for individuals and units as required by current directives.

LOGISTICS

1. General

a. The period covered by this report is from 1 - 31 July 1966.

b. During the month of July the overall effectiveness of the Command's Logistic Support has been good. The continued lack of Class II Type II tank repair parts is the only exception.

c. The main Logistical efforts during this period were as follows:

(1) A continued effort to procure critically required tank repair parts.

(2) The processing of the remaining FY66 R&E M48A3 tanks to get them into the field and processing the remaining old M48A3's for evacuation.

(3) A limited technical inspection by a contact team from 3d FSR for the tanks being nominated for the FY67 R&E program.

(4) The re-computation of inventory control data on all 708 cards and an extensive review of stocks to determine any excesses.

2. Supply

a. Procurement, Availability, and Distribution of Supply.

(1) The availability and distribution of Class I, III, IV, and V Supplies remains excellent.

(2) The poor availability and slow distribution of Class II Type II Repair Parts for the Tank continues to be the most important factor affecting the material readiness of this command. This problem continues to exist despite the fact that continual effort has been expended by this command and higher headquarters to alleviate the problem. This command has never fallen below category C2 readiness. This continual high state of readiness can be attributed to excellent crew and organizational maintenance, the selective exchange of repair parts between R&E tanks and combat deadlined tanks, and close command attention to on hand supplies and equipment.

COMMUNICATIONS - ELECTRONICS

Reliable communications were maintained during the month of July to support tactical requirements of this organization.

Four (4) radio nets were maintained on a twenty-four (24) hour basis - (Division Tac #3, Battalion Tac, Southern Sector Defense, Fire Direction Control.) One (1) administrative net to C-3rd Tank Bn., Phu Bai area was activated three (3) times daily.

A Loop Line was installed in Sub-sector Defense, Sub-sector I area. Telephones were installed in S-3 bunkers.

AN/GIC-1 Alert Telephone System installed in command bunkers replaced telephone sets EE-8. This change provided Wire Section with telephone sets to be installed in areas of need.

A hot line was installed to the water point at Phong Bac to 3rd Plt I-3-I to coordinate patrol action.

A Trunk Line to Elick FDC was added to Smokerroom switchboard. We relocated the maintenance shop from GP tent to the Butler building. Construction of maintenance shop was in progress to provide a storage area for mount-out cases and a dry area to repair tank and vehicle radios.

Repair efficiency was reduced by the loss of one (1) AN/URM-43 and one (1) AN/ARC-48 to FLSG for repair.

This command now has four (4) AN/PAC-8, three (3) RT-66, one (1) AN/ARC-55, one (1) RT-70 deadlined and awaiting parts at electronic repair facilities of FLSG-A.

MEDICAL AND DENTAL

The Battalion Sick Call for the month of July is comparable with that of June. There were 198 patients seen. Complaints were numerous, but consistent with previous months. Heat rashes were not as prevalent as they were in June.

The Venereal Disease rate dropped considerably with only three cases contracted during July. Two cases were out-of-country and one in-country.

There were 125 Vietnamese civilians seen at the Battalion Aid Station who required the attention of a Medical Officer and 164 treatments rendered. Their various complaints were consistent with previous months and responded well to treatment.

One five or six year old child was brought to the Battalion Aid Station unconscious and transferred immediately to the USOM hospital. A diagnosis of Encephalomeningitis was established. This patient died two days after admission. This is the only case reported in Phong Bac.

The Civic Action Medical Teams visited Phong Bac and Hoa Cuong routinely three times a week. There were 834 patients seen in Phong Bac with a total of 1241 treatments rendered. There were 1133 patients seen in Hoa Buong with a total of 1395 treatments rendered.

The villages of Phu Hoa, Xom Mit and Hoa Cam (Dependent Quarters) were visited in co-ordination with Hoa Cam Training Advisors. There were 709 patients seen in these hamlets with 1065 treatments rendered.

The total patients seen by the Medical Teams in all villages or hamlets including those seen in the Battalion Aid Station was 2781. The total treatments were 3865.

CIVIL AFFAIRS

A growing diversification of activities marks the efforts of Civic Action Team in attempts to further the economic, social, and politico-cultural growth of its area of responsibility. Throughout July, the Civil Affairs section of the Tank Battalion continued its varied program in the hamlets of Phong Bac and Khue Truong II. As the organization coordinating all Civil Affairs projects in the South DaNang area, the battalion maintains close liason with the Civic Action endeavors of its compatriots as well.

A well-educated populace is one of the key ingredients in a successful for democracy. The Tank Battalion remains acutely sensitive to the intellectual requirements of Hoa Tho and Hoa Cuong Villages and continues to exert maximum effort to improve the educational facilities within both its practical and administrative areas. In consonance with this established policy, the Civil Affairs program took a large forward stride with the opening of the Khue Truong II Hamlet primary school on July 11. More than 500 people gathered for the ceremonies which officially marked the beginning of classes.

The villagers were greeted by members of the Quang Nam Province educational department, the Chief of Hoa Vang District, and other Vietnamese officials. Lt. Colonel Raphael, Commanding Officer of the Tank Battalion, was invited to speak and delivered a brief call for the students to "study hard so you can grow up to become educated citizens who will help build a strong, free, Viet-Nam."

The school which will provide an elementary education for approximately 300 children had stood empty for almost two years. In order to open it, the Civic Action Team procured text books, wall maps, a flag-pole, two Vietnamese flags, and 300 CARE school kits. With the assistance of other Tank Battalion Marines, the required school furniture was constructed, black boards were mounted, and the flag-pole was erected. Two teachers have been employed by Hoa Cuong Village and the school enrollment has already increased by about 20% necessitating a further provision of texts and school supplies.

While principal attention was devoted to the new school at Khue Truong II, the previously established one in Phong Bac Hamlet was not neglected. A chronic shortage of applicable text books was remedied on 23 July, when the Battalion Executive Officer, Major Doss, and the Civil Affairs Officer distributed nearly 700 new study/work guides to the students and Popular Forces soldiers of Phong Bac. Future plans call for an additional room to be added to this school and increased attention is being paid to the recurring needs of hamlet school children.

Among the brightest spots in any Civic Action program are those provided by the initiation and completion of meaningful self-help projects by the village people. During July, the people of Phong Bac Hamlet completed three new cement wells. Each of these was built with material obtained through Vietnamese governmental agencies and with labor provided by hamlet leadership. An additional two wells are now under construction and the only U. S. contribution thus far has been the use of transportation facilities of the 3d Tank Battalion to provide the requisite sand and gravel.

In a greater commitment to the defense of their homes against incursion of hostile elements, the residents of Phong Bac and Thon Phong Bac are also building four sentry boxes in strategic locations within the hamlets. Scheduled for completion during early August, these posts will be manned by locally recruited men. Once again, no American labor or materials have been expended on these projects but the Vietnamese have been careful to draw them to the attention of the Civil Affairs Officer in an attempt to show their accord with Marine activities in related spheres.

An increasing awareness of their responsibility within the Vietnamese American pacification effort is being displayed by local officials. During the past thirty days, contacts between the Civil Affairs Officer and Village/Hamlet officials have more than tripled. Local leaders have become markedly more friendly and this increased rapport has elicited a growing flow of raw intelligence material concerning Viet Cong activity in the Hoa Tho and Hoa Cuong Village areas. Operating in close contact with the Battalion Intelligence Officer, the Civic Action team has received information relating to individual natives currently serving with insurgent forces. A program to win these dissidents to the government is already in progress through the application of psychological techniques among the relatives who continue to reside within the hamlets. In addition to these measures, local Marine forces have been notified of the locations suspect's homes for use as a guidance factor in establishing meaningful patrol routes and laying effective ambushes.

During the month, Tank Battalion Marines continued to provide security for the Phong Bac School and to patrol the Phong Bac Hamlet area. They were partially assisted in these duties by the Popular Forces soldiers who are stationed at the Hoa Tho Village office which adjoins the school. Discussions with local officials reveal that these patrols disrupt Viet Cong attempts to move freely in the Binh Thai-Phong Bac area; and constant Marine active participation in anti-government operations by local sympathizers. New population control measures for this area are currently under study by the Intelligence and Civil Affairs Officers.

While it is unrealistic to term any of the hamlets in Hoa Tho village 'pacified' (these include Thon Phong Bac, Phong Bac, Yen Bac, Binh Thai, and the Cam Hoa's), significant progress is being made toward this end. Rather than deluding itself with the superficial and deceptive calm of everyday rural Viet-Nam, the Tank Battalion Civic Action Team remains alert to every hint of Viet Cong activity in its area. At the same time, relations with all strata of hamlet society continue to improve and the past month has seen a Vietnamese woman point out a booby-trapped M-26 grenade to the Civil Affairs Officer. The grenade was lying atop the spoon in order to hold it in the depressed position; the pin had been withdrawn. Placed in a mound of earth about two feet above ground level, the grenade was camouflaged with dirt but could easily be detected upon close inspection. It is suspected that the booby-trap was designed for use against Marine/Popular Forces units which provide security for the nearby Phong Bac school or as a terror device to inflict casualties on inquisitive hamlet children. The knowledge that this woman was regarded for her action had spread throughout the hamlet and will undoubtedly have a salutary effect on future discoverers of such ordnance.

The battalion has displayed a vigorous approach to community problems and encourages hamlet leadership to work through normal Vietnamese government channels. A corollary to this cooperation is the ever-growing bond between members of the Civil Affairs staff and the officials and advisors of Hoa Vang district. A close liason with U. S. Army representatives attached to the District Chief's military staff has provided the Battalion with invaluable information concerning dealings with the Vietnamese bureaucracy. Additional intelligence information regarding insurgent operations in neighboring hamlets has been provided both by Hoa Van and by Army advisors from the ARVN Training facility at Hoa Cam. When coupled with a series of preliminary visits with USOM representatives in Da Nang, these improved relations have paved the way for increased cooperation between the Tank Battalion and other U. S. agencies.

The MEDCAP program continues to be one of our most effective contact points with the Vietnamese people. During July, the MEDCAP team spent more than 1400 man-hours in treating local people. In visits to various "aid centers" which have been established throughout the Battalion's area for Civic Action Responsibility, the Corpamen held sick call for 523 adults and 2133 children. Significantly the number of adult patients continues to rise each month. This increase is a heartening one since it mirrors a growing trustfulness on the part of the usually reticent Vietnamese older generation. In addition to the mobile MEDCAP units, the Battalion Aid Station welcomes all of the hamlet people who approach the Command Post for treatment. During the past month, 101 children and a further 24 adults availed themselves of this opportunity. The MEDCAP activities are however not confined to merely ministering to ailments already apparent. The Corpamen provide sanitary and health instruction as part of their normal treatment procedure and frequently distribute soap to their patients.

Cases of a nature whose seriousness demands more specialized attention are evacuated to USOM hospital facilities for further diagnosis and care. Three instances this month were deemed sufficiently grave to warrant this evacuation assistance. Finally, the Aid Station maintains its program of training rural health workers and has three full-time "nurses" working with MEDCAP team. These girls have been extremely well received by the hamlet populations.

As an overall indication of the outstanding accomplishments of the Battalion's medical support to the Civil Affairs effort, during July a 24% increase in the number of treatments within the Phong Bac - Khue Truong area was effected.

Despite our obvious goal to help the people help themselves, a certain amount of selective relief assistance is still required each month. During July for example, the Tank Battalion distributed more than five tons of splintered lumber to the hamlet population of Phong Bac for use as cooking fuel. About 60,000 lbs. of edible garbage from the mess hall was given away for use as pig food and a large amount of soap was distributed to reinforce a continuing personal hygiene campaign. Villagers working with Marines on local civil affairs projects were invariably the recipients of appropriate amounts of rice, bulgar wheat, cooking oil, or canned goods.

1. SITUATION

- a. Enemy Forces. See current INTSUMS.
 b. Friendly Forces. Reference (b) applies.

2. MISSION

To establish mutually supporting defenses of all tenant units in the Southern Sector of the 3d Marine Division Rear Area and to provide sufficient forces to defeat and destroy any enemy force that should penetrate the Sector.

3. EXECUTION

a. Concept of operations

(1) The Southern Sector of the 3d Marine Division Rear Area is divided into five Sub-Sectors, with an appointed Sub-Sector Commander who is responsible for the coordination of defenses within the Sub-Sector.

(2) Sub-Sector Commanders will organize a reaction force from units within the Sub-Sector to block enemy penetrations and to repulse enemy attacks should the defenses be breached.

(3) In addition to Sub-Sector reaction forces, certain specified Sub-Sectors will provide forces for a Sector reserve that will be utilized by the Sector Commander to implement Annex B (Counter Attack Plan).

(4) Sector and Sub-Sector blocking positions will be established to prevent the enemy from advancing on vital areas and to contain the enemy so that he may be destroyed.

b. Commander Sub-Sector I. (Commanding Officer, 3d Tank Battalion).

(1) Coordinate the defenses, patrols, listening post and ambushes of commands within Sub-Sector I with emphasis on areas not physically occupied by or observed by friendly forces and to ensure that all defenses are mutually supporting. Annex A (Task Organization).

(2) Organize a sector reaction force of sufficient strength to block and counter attack enemy penetrations into the sector. Annex B (Counter Attack Plan).

(3) Organize from resources available within Sub-Sector I a provisional company headquarters, one infantry platoon and 2 machine gun sections. This force will be utilized only on the order of the Southern Sector Commander as a portion of Sector reserve. This force will be supported by 2 M48A3 tanks, 2 LVTP-5's and 1 LVTC-1.

c. Commander Sub-Sector II. (Commanding Officer, 4th Battalion, 12th Marines).

(1) Coordinate the defenses, patrols, listening posts, and ambushes of all commands within Sub-Sector II with special emphasis on those areas not physically occupied by, or under the observation of friendly forces and ensure that defenses are mutually supporting. Annex A (Task Organization).

(2) Organize a Sector reaction force of sufficient strength to block and counter attack enemy penetrations into the Sector. Annex B (Counter Attack Plan).

(3) Organize one provisional infantry platoon and one machine gun section from resources within Sub-Sector II to be utilized by the Southern Sector Commander as part of the Sector reserve force.

d. Commander Sub-Sector III. (Commander, Hoa Can R. F. Training Center).

(1) Coordinate the defense, patrols, listening posts and ambushes within Sub-Sector III with emphasis on areas not physically occupied by friendly forces.

(2) Organize a reaction force of sufficient size to block and counter attack enemy penetration of the Sub-Sector III defense.

e. Commander Sub-Sector IV. (Commanding Officer, 1st 8 Inch Howitzer Battery).

(1) Coordinate the defense, patrols, listening posts and ambushes within Sub-Sector IV with emphasis on those areas not physically occupied by or under the observation of friendly units.

(2) Organize for use within Sub-Sector IV a reaction force of sufficient strength to act as a blocking force and counter attack enemy penetrations into the sector. Annex B (Counter Attack Plan).

f. Commander Sub-Sector V. (Commanding Officer, 9th Motor Transport Battalion)

(1) Coordinate the defenses, patrols, listening posts and ambushes of commands within Sub-Sector V and to ensure mutually supporting defenses with emphasis on those areas not physically occupied by friendly forces. Annex A (Task Organization).

(2) Organize a force of one provisional infantry platoon from resources available within Sub-Sector V for use by the Commander, Southern Sector as a portion of the Sector reserve.

(3) Organize a reaction force for use within Sub-Sector V of sufficient strength to act as a blocking force and to counter attack enemy penetrations into the Sector. Annex B (Counter Attack Plan).

g. Coordinating Instructions

(1) Annex C (Southern Sector Overlay)

(2) Defense of camps, installations and the internal and perimeter security of units located within the rear area is the responsibility of each respective unit.

(3) Sub-Sector Commanders will submit proposed patrol and ambush overlays to this headquarters 24 hours prior to the time they are to be executed. In cases of conflict with patrols in adjacent Sub-Sectors the Sub-Sector Commander will be notified. Unscheduled patrols and ambushes may be sent out by Sub-Sector Commanders when deemed essential, however the Southern Sector Commander will be notified immediately of the patrol or ambush route and/or location, and time of return.

(4) Rules of engagement are contained in reference (d).

(5) Night and day patrols, ambushes and listening posts will be conducted so as to preclude a pattern in terms of time, route and mission. Patrols and ambushes may be of the type associated with reconnaissance, security or civil affairs. The requirement for wide dispersion will be emphasized to patrol leaders.

(6) Artillery support will be requested in accordance with Annex B (Fire Support Plan).

(7) Sector reserve forces will be prepared for operations on a 30 minute notice during hours of darkness and a 2 hour notice during daylight hours.

(8) Sector reserve forces will be committed on order of the Sector Commander.

(9) Sub-Sector Commanders providing platoon size reserve forces will furnish a medical corpsman with appropriate supplies and equipment.

(10) Sub-Sector Commanders furnishing platoon size Sector Reserve Forces will provide them with appropriate radios that will not on the Reserve Force frequency. (See Annex E)

(11) Sector Defense drills will be conducted to determine the effectiveness of all participating units.

(12) A limited amount of 81mm mortar illumination will be available from the Hoa Can R. F. Training Center. Sub-Sector Commanders submit requests to the Sector Commander.

(13) Reports

(a) Sub-Sector Commanders will submit a detailed overlay of all defensive positions within their Sub-Sector. The overlay will include mine field Record DA Form 1355 if mines are incorporated into defense plans.

(b) Proposed patrol and ambush orders will be submitted to this Headquarters 24 hours before they are to be executed.

(c) Spot Reports concerning enemy contact will be immediately submitted to the Southern Sector Commander and then reported in accordance with ref (f).

(d) Sub-Sector Commanders will report significant changes in attachments, detachments and personnel figures when they occur.

(e) Copies of Sub-Sector plans and orders prepared in support of this order will be submitted to this headquarters.

4. Administration and Logistics.

a. Administration.

(1) The responsibility for administration will remain with parent organizations.

b. Logistics.

(1) Logistic support will remain with parent organizations. Resupply of the Sector reserve force once it is committed will be the responsibility of the Sector Commander.

(2) Uniform and equipment for the reserve force will be normal field uniform, helmet, upper body armor (optional), and weapons appropriate for the provisional unit concerned. A basic allowance of ammunition will be carried for all weapons.

a. Communications.

(2) Sub-Sector Commanders will ensure positive communications with all tenant units within their Sub-Sectors. This may be accomplished by runner, telephone or radio.

(3) Sub-Sectors will be required to check in on the Southern Sector Rear Area Defense Net at 1800 daily or when required by enemy activity.

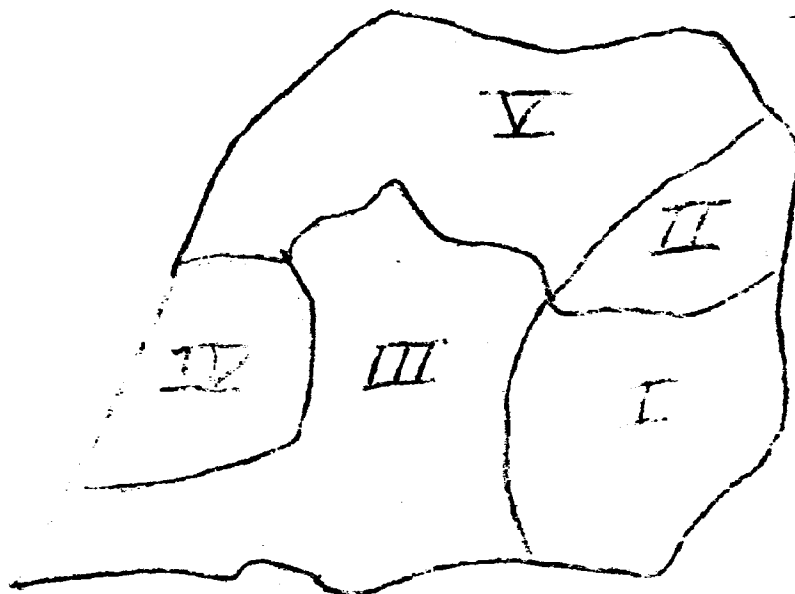
