



#### NARRATIVE SUIMARY

#### PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

Administration. Company level administration is now satisfactory. The units are effectively controlling their internal management. Two lstSgt's have reported aboard and both will be of tremendous assistance.

Personnel. During July the personnel situation improved in most areas. Sufficient maintenance personnel are now on board to absorb losses to be experienced during August. The Battalian continues to be short eight warehousemen (3051). The Division has been advised of this and will assist when assets become available. The Battalian is short 19 personnel in MOS 3531. Division has assigned five and a battalian school has been started to train additional personnel as drivers until the situation resolves itself. During August five lieutenants MOS 1802 will rotate leaving a significant shortage of platoon commanders. In addition, a Major MOS 1802 and a Lieutenant MOS 2025 will rotate during August.

#### INTELLIGENCE

Weather. Precipitation in the Quang Tri City - Dong Ha area was I.ll Inches for the month of July. The month was a relatively hot one with temperatures reading a high of 103° and a low of 68°. The mean monthly high was 94°, the mean monthly low was 77°. The average monthly temperature was 85°. Although rains were heavy at times and heat casualties were suffered in some units on operations, tank maneuverability and crew operation was not hindered by the weather.

Intelligence. Although there were many agent reports during July of enemy movement in every Area of Operation in Northern I Corps, significant sightings were in the Con Thien area and clong the coast north of the Cua Viet River.

Tanks operating with the 9th Marine Regiment in the area north of Con Thien below the Demilitarized Zone participated in the capture of many enemy weapons in both large and small caches. Evidence that elements of the enemy's 27th Independent Regiment and 270th Regiment were operating in the Con Thien, A3 area was found; however, no significant contacts were made.

Incidences of NVA/VC anti-tank mining showed a noticeable increase, especially in the Napolean/Saline area north of the Cua Viet River. There were also numerous incidents of mines in the Leatherneck Square area on primary and secondary roads, as the enemy continued his tactic of LCC interdiction. Large numbers of anti-tank mines were uncovered in caches located by Marines operating in the area.

NVA attacks by fire were most prevalent at Cua Viet and landing zones along Route #9 in the Vicinity of Ca Lu. Enemy guns were quiet for the most part north of Leatherneck Square due to the many B-52 strikes in the Demilitarized Zone during July.

During the month the enemy has been concentrating on building and supplying his forces in order to conduct his "third offensive". Intelligence reports indicate that he has been somewhat successful in bringing his forces to a point of readiness for assuming the offense; however, the disposition of enemy forces in Northern I Corps at this time is unfavorable for him to mount any large scale ground attacks. He does retain the capability of attacks by fire, small probes, and sapper attacks at any time.

### CIVIL AFFAIRS

The Hamlet health worker was present at each MedCap to aid the Navy Corpsmen and participated in on-the-job training. A number of personal hygiene classes were also given to the civilians.


The Battalion Civil Affairs Officer gave five orientation classes to new personnel in the Battalion during the month.

#### OPERATIONS & TRAINING

Company A. Company A, participating in Operations Napolean/Saline and Kentucky, supported the 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines; 1st and 3rd Battalions, 3rd Marines; 2nd Battalion, 26th Marines; the 9th Marine Regiment; and the 1st Air Cavalry Division.

From 1 through 8 July, the 2nd Platoon supported the 1st Battalion, 3rd Marines, operating southeast of Gio Linh, with fire suppression missions, direct fire against enemy personnel, both in bunkers and in the open, and counter-mortar fire. The tanks accounted for 55 KLA(C). One tank (£25) suffered mine damage, was repaired and continued to operate.

The Company, minus the 2nd Platoon, reinforced with its flame section, participated with the 9th Marines in an operation around Con Thien, from 7 through 15 July. The Company provided direct and counter-mortar fire support, and conducted sweeps with the infantry. 14 KIA(C) were credited to the Company. One tank (A53) took a direct hit on the turret by an 62mm mortar round, causing the evacuation of a platoon sergeant. Another tank (A32) sustained mine damage. The tank was short tracked and continued to perform its mission.

Other activity during the month included direct fire at enemy in the open and at enemy observation posts, resulting in three KLA(C), three houses destroyed and three secondary explosions. Several sweeps and patrols with the infantry were conducted. On one of the patrols two tanks (A25 and A35) were submerged while crossing a tidal stream. Two other tanks (A23 and A35) sustained mine damage while operating with the supported infantry.

Company B. From the first through the fifth of the month, the 3rd Platoon of Company B maintained its positions at Khe Sanh Combat Base, providing support for the units moving out of Khe Sanh.

On 5 July a Company B truck was fired on by a sniper between the Rock Pile and Comp Corroll on Route #9. The occupants of the vehicle returned the fire and continued moving. No results could be determined.

At the Rock Pile on 19 July Pl4 was hit with a 122mm & cket. Extensive damage to the fire control system inside the turret was caused by the concussion.

Supporting Task Force Hotel; the 3rd and 4th Marine Regiments; the 1st Battelion, 4th Marines; and the 1st and 2nd Battalions, 9th Marines in the Lancaster and Scotland II Operations, Company B provided counter-rocket fire and direct fire at enemy troops in the open and at suspected enemy concentrations.

Company C. During the first part of July the 3rd Plateon of Company C continued to provide road security along Route #9 in support of Task Force Hotel and the 1st Marines in the Scotland II AO. With the evacuation of Khe Sanh Combat Base, the Plateon returned to the Company Command Post at Cam Lo.

From 1 through 8 July the 1st Platoon, supporting both the 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines and the 2nd Battalion, 3rd Marines in the coastal area north of Cua Viet, conducted sweeps with the infantry. The platoon accounted for five KIA(C). One Marine tanker was killed and two were wounded during the operation. Three tanks (Cll, Cl3 and Cl4) hit mines sustaining suspension damage. While the retriever (Ch3) was attempting to retrieve Cl4, Cl4 became mired in loose sand so deep as to make the extraction impossible. The tank was stripped and then destroyed in place.

On 29 July, the tanks at Cam Lo assisted other elements of Task Force Mike in securing a landing zone in the C-3 Bridge area for the 2nd ARVN Regiment, which began an operation in the Cam Vu area.

Other elements of the Company remained in support of the 1st AmTrac Battalion and the 3rd Marines (later the 1st Marines) in Operation Napolean/Saline AO. The Company Headquarters and the remainder of the tanks continued in support of Task Force Mike in defense of C-3, C-3 Bridge and Cam Lo District Headquarters.

Company A, 3rd Anti-tanks. Company A, 3rd Anti-tanks, continued supporting Task Force Hotel in Operation Scotland II during the first part of July. On 6 July, the Company was one of the last units to move out of Khe Sanh Combat Pase.

The Company Command Post was relocated at Quang Tri Combat Base with elements at Dong Ha, Cam Lo, C-2 Bridge and Con Thien, in support of Task Force Mike, the 1st Marines, and the 2nd Battalion, 26th Marines.

entos fired H&I fires and direct fire at suspected enemy positions from Khe Sanh, Cam Lo and Con Thien.

Battalion Headquarters. The Battalion Headquarters continued to defend its sector of Quang Tri Combat Base, utilizing patrols and LPs along with the perimeter bunkers.

From 8 to 11 July, the Battalion Headquarters was also charged with the responsibility for Juliet Sector. Personnel augmentation was provided by the 3rd Medical Battalion; 1st Battalion, 3rd Marines (Rear); 1st Battalion, 9th Marines (Rear); and the 25th MP Group, USAF.

Flame Tank F31 expended 5,440 gallons of diesel fuel in 16 loads burning brush around Quang Tri Combat Base to improve fields of fire on the perimeter.

On 27 July, a change of command ceremony was held, inaugurating the new Commanding Officer.

Five In Country Orientation lectures were conducted during the month with 56 men attending.

The evening briefings for the Commanding Officer and his staff continued.

#### LOGISTICS

As of 31 July, this Command had a shortage of fourteen major end items: one M51 recovery vehicle, two M3781 trucks, one M3C 110 communications vehicle, one M107 water trailer, three high pressure cleaning units, three mixing and transfer units, and three M38A1 utility trucks. Four M48A3 tanks were received to fill T/ deficiencies, one M48A3 tank and M513 wrecker were received as M42 vehicles, and one TD-15 tractor deficiency was filled when word was received that this battalion's previously coded tractor would be returned when repaired.

There were nine incidents of enemy activity involving damage to battalion vehicles during July. Of these, six have had necessary repairs and returned to use, one is currently awaiting repair, one is a suspected combat loss awaiting authority to be dropped from this account, and the remaining vehicle (MuRA) was declared a combat loss. A replacement vehicle has been received for the combat loss and a replacement MuRA3 is available for issue when authority to drop the suspected combat loss is received. In addition two MuRA3 tanks were submerged and appropriate requisitions have been submitted by FISG-B for damaged parts.

As of 31 July there were eight tanks, four flame tanks, two VTR's, four Ontos, thirteen motor transport vehicles, two communications vehicles, and four items of motor transport equipment deadlined. Of these, three tanks, two flame tanks, two VTR's, one Ontos, eight motor transport vehicles and one communications vehicle are deadlined for third echelon repairs. These figures indicate a 47% third echelon deadline rate. The overall deadline rate cannot be attributed to any specific reason, but some factors to be considered are dimagn resulting from enemy activity, insufficient availability of second echelon repair/spare parts, and slow response of third echelon maintenance.

The availability of second echelon repair parts for tracked vehicles continues to deteriorate. A survey indicates an increase in critical items of 84% over last month's list. "Nice-to-have" spare parts are no longer available and currently "need-to-have" repair parts are almost non-existant.

Supply activities during this period centered around relief of the Supply Officer and preparation of one tank platoon for transfer to the SLF. The Battalion Supply Officer was detached from this command on 12 July and was relieved by the then assistant Supply Officer. No major problems are anticipated. This battalion is required to furnish one tank platoon for the soon-to-be activated Special Landing Force. An allowance list from the last SLF is being used as the asis for the current SLF allowance list and no major obstacles are foreseen involving the outfitting of the platoon.

The Battalion Motor Transport, vehicles traveled 13,264 miles, carried 1,050 short tons of material, and transported 1,965 passengers. In addition, during this reporting period 36 M54A2C multifuel 5 ton trucks were force fed to this battalion by Division Motor Transport. Combined with the four M54A2C's on hand, this brought the battalion total to forty. All gasoline engine M54's were turned in to FISG-B. as excess property. Motor transport personnel shortages in the 3531 field are considered critical. A special program is being instituted whereby excess personnel from other occupational fields are being schooled by the Motor Transport Officer to help relieve this critical shortage.

The availability of repair parts required for infra-red equipment has not improved. Currently this battalion has a deficiency of 27 Xenon scarchlights which have been nominated for the Special Commanders Assistance Request (SCAR) program.

Services are considered satisfactory. Cantonment improvement continues.

Medical facilities within the battalion are considered satisfactory: There were 22 Marines requiring medical evacuation during July.



#### MEDICAL AND DENTAL

For the month of July, 1203 patients were treated at routine sick call, an increase of 346 over June. Diarrhea cases surged to 19 cases reported. Various skin afflictions and rashes were primarily responsible for the sick call increase throughout the Battalion.

Three cases of venereal disease were reported.

Dental treatment is available in the 3d Engineers Headquarters area.

Hospital corps strength continues to be adequate.

Sanitation of the Battalion Command Post is improving slowly. Closer coordination with the Battalion Police Sergeant by BAS sanitation personnel is proving its worth.

The rat population in the Battalion CP area has been abated somewhat. Traps, when available, will be utilized to the fullest. The anti-rodent campaign is being supervised by medical personnel.

MedCaps were conducted on the 5th, 12th and 25th of July with 33 adults and 111 children having been treated. Forward BAS personnel conducted MedCap activities in the Cam Lo District Headquarters area totaling 120 adults and 376 children for July.



#### COMMUNICATIONS - ELECTRONICS

The month of July was devoted primarily to mapagement improvement techniques in the areas of electronics maintenance, and supply administration and requisitioning procedures.

Within the Battalion's electronics maintenance facility, specific emphasis was placed on a manual maintenance reporting system. The maintenance report was patterned after 5th Force Service Regiment's DATS (Data Automated Maintenance System) maintenance reporting system. Distribution of the battalion report is local. It is prepared weekly, updated daily, and designed to assist management personnel in keeping abreast of the electronics communication equipment processed by the Battalion maintenance facility for either calibration or repair.

A concentrated effort was initiated to obtain supply allowances of those second echelon electronics parts authorized this Battalion for the maintenance and upkeep of the new FM Family of Radios (Radio Set, AN/PRC-25 and Rado Set, AN/VRC-12). It was originally theorized that 90% of the electronics failures occurring in FM equipment would be repaired at the second echelon (battalion) maintenance facility. However, second echelon parts have not been available and it has been necessary to evacuate the equipment to FISG-B for repairs.

The Battalion's increase in the electronics maintenance work-load, and the arrival of Company A, 3d Anti-tanks, necessitated additional working area for the electronics repair facility. A mobile repair facility was fabricated for this purpose. The repair facility processed 160 items of electronics equipment during the month.

The message center processed 1,529 messages during July.

A quarterly RPS inspection was conducted by representatives of Headquarters, 3d Marine Division, on 22 July. A grade of satisfactory was given.

- 25 July 1968 A23 hit a mine near Mai Xa Thi.
- 26 July 1968 A31 and A34 fired 12 HE and 13 WP rounds at enemy in the open. Results were three secondary explosions and one house destroyed.
- 28 July 1968 C12 fired four HE rounds at three NVA in the open. Negative results.
- 28 July 1968 A31 and A34 fired 29 HE and ten WP rounds at an enemy OP. One KIA(C).
- 28 July 1968 A31 and A34 fired 17 HE and 11 WP rounds at enemy bunkers and personnel. Two KIA(C).
- 28 July 1968 A25 and A35 were submerged while attempting to cross a tidal stream at Mai Xa Thi.
- 29 July 1968 CoC tanks fired 158 beehive rounds in support of ARVN operation southeast of C-3 Eridge.
- 31 July 1968 A34 hit a mine southwest of A-3.

1. In accordance with reference (a) the following report is submitted:

a. Problem. When tanks are in a defensive perimeter, the direct fire control system enables the tank to rapidly come to bear on enemy morter/rocket flashes or other lucrative enemy targets; hence allowing range and deflection to be quickly transmitted to supporting artillery. However, to determine the azimuth to the target requires a calculation from what the tank's azimuth indicator reads to a magnetic azimuth, consistent with what the artillery can use. This reduces the response to transmitting the information.

b. Recommendation. The gumner's aid, a seldomly used part of the azimuth indicator, is constructed so that it can be rotated. A circle of cardboard covered with acetate can be cut to fit over the gumner's aid and attached to it. Mil calibrations from 0 to 6400 can then be marked on the acetate. When the tank moves into a defensive position, the azimuth indicator and gumner's aid can be zeroed on a given deflection, coordinated with the artillery. When the gumner traverses onto the target, he can read the deflection directly from the modified gumner's aid and relay it immediately to the artillery.
