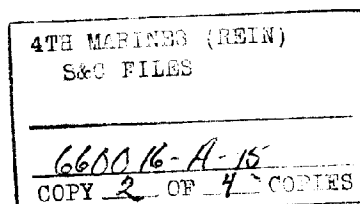

Physiological Warfare Report 1st Battalion, 3d Marines for period 14 Jan 1966

The 3d Marine Division Band assisted the 3d Battalion, 3d Marines in its Psy Warfare program by presenting a musical program for 354 adults and 200 children in the CAM NE area at 141335H. The presentation consisted of American folk songs, marches and rock and roll selections. The band also played three Vietnamese songs which made a great impression on the audience. In order to make the local people feel that they had a share in the show three local Vietnamese boys were invited to conduct the band, and one elderly man played the drums.

The people seemed very enthusiastic and receptive. The battalion added to the program by distributing 600 pounds of corn to 325 people, 6 cases of sweet Tarts to 200 children and 30 gallons of cooking oil to 325 people.

The program was a definite success and should be repeated as often as possible, with the customary distribution of gifts and food as an added attraction.

16 students attended the school in AN TRACH.

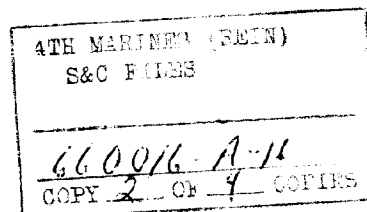

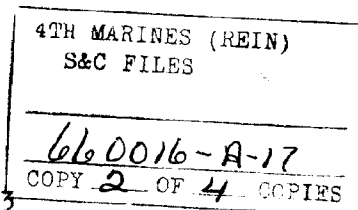

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Company A continues to hold a daily sickcall in Hai Ninh (615017). The Bn Surgeon made one visit during the reporting period. Mrs. Tai, the hamlet nurse, holds her sickcall separately and refers cases to the corpsman. Three young people have been recruited by the village chief as nurse trainees and take turns assisting at sickcall. They are: Nguyen Hic, male, 17, a high school student who speaks broken english and whose father is the police chief of Vinh An (2) (612012); Nguyen Thi Mai, female, 16, resident of Hai Ninh; and Tran Thi Mai, female, 16, resident of Vinh An (2). In addition to sickcall 456 vitamins have been distributed.

The villagers are building a dispensary .

The patrol commander in Hai Ninh hold s frequent meetings with village officials. He receives frequent intelligence data. The people in Vinh An (1), (2), and Hai Ninh are very friendly now however the people in Vinh An (3) and (4) (vic. 610000) are withdrawn. The village chief is planning to talk with them. The following population statistics were received: Hai Ninh--700, Vinh An (1) and (2)--200, Vinh An (3) and (4) --170.

Maj. Gen. Walt visited Hai Ninh on 15 Jan and met briefly with village leaders. App. 100 villagers gathered to see the General.

The people are beginning to bathe themselves. Children are often washed by Marines at the hamlet well and look forward to it.

The Peoples Action Team working with the Marines in the area are not working too well. There is a lack of enthusiasm on their part and on the part of the villagers for them. So far there is nothing overt to report but they have been of much less value to the program than expected.

Fox company reported that they treated a total of seventeen (17) villagers at Daong Son #3 (999670). Six (6) children, nine (9) female adults and two (2) male adults. The various complaints were skin infection, stomach aches and minor infections. Ten (10) school kits were distributed to the various children who are attending school. Soap was also distributed to the village elders with the intention of them passing it on to their families.

McHo company reports treating a total of sixty-two (62) villagers at Mieu Mung #2 (032682). Fifty-four (54) children and eight (8) female adults. The main complaints were skin infection, headaches, colds and minor cuts and bruises.

Large quantities of school kits are being distributed to the local grammar schools in the 2nd Battalion, 9th Marines area. Attempts are being made to further supply school children here with all school items currently available through the Civil Affairs Team of this Battalion.

The people seemed very grateful for the above assistance and distributed items and it is believed that a most favorable impression was made upon them.

The Division Band held a concert at the Buddhist Orphanage in HOA PHAT Village (BT 988767) as a prelude to TET, the Vietnamese New Year. Also the following items were donated for further distribution on 21Jan66 to orphans, widows of ARVN soldiers and needy families.

Approximately 200 pounds of clothes 3,730 bars of soap, 375 pounds of candy, consisting of 6 cases of Mason Candy, with 30 one pound boxes per case, 416 small boxes of licorice, assorted brand candies, 4 boxes loose. Rolled wheat, consisting of 15 sacks, weighing 1500 lbs and other food items weighing approximately 314 pounds are as follows Salt 5 bags, oil cooking 4 cans, baby food cereal, milk cans, 1 case, cookies 10 cans and toys were delivered to the Buddhist Orphanage.

The Chief also agreed to publish a schedule to the villagers living along the subject section of highway in order that they might help in the clean up of their village.

In the last month there has been a noted increase in the number of local people coming to the village sickcall for aid. It shows that the Vietnamese are placing more confidence instead of shying away from them in fear or in doubt.

\$164 US converted to piastres was turned over to Co G for payment for relocating 41 graves. The village chief will pay the families affected. The graves are being relocated so that a road can be built in the area.

Long Phu I - The village chief presented the land contracts for that portion of land which our CP is located and explained that the annual land tax for that area was 25 piasters and further explained that the people of the village extracted an annual income of about 2,000 piasters from harvesting the land. The Civil Affairs Officers it is appropriate that we pay the 2,025 piasters tax asked, and would like to know if there is a fund for such expenses.

Gifts for TET were given to the village chief for distribution to the people and further plans were discussed for the market and laundry. Building will begin after TET. The chief invited me to his home on the morning of 22 January 1966.

1. During the reported period, the members of this command became aware of the following trends in the relationship between the local populace and USMC forces.

a. The basic goodwill that has existed in the area of Hoa Long village continues to exist and underlines all dealings between this command and the civilian populace in the area of Marble Mountain. Chief Sun of Hoa Long village has received every assistance that he requested. The chief has become a forceful leader and is planning the construction of a dispensary.

b. The realignment of the TAOR has increased the civil action program in the more southerly portions of the Battalion's TAOR. The number of hamlets in which medcap treatment is administered has doubled. This enlargement of the civil affairs effort is slowly achieving the desired result; the goodwill of the populace.

2. The following results have been accrued or can be anticipated with the continuing expansion, of the civil affairs effort in heretofore lightly developed areas.

a. The local populace has the benefit of greater security from the VC. This security has led to an increase in the amount of travel by civilians between the hamlets and the market place located at the hamlet of Non Muoc BT 073702. This development has pleased many of the local farmers since for the first time in years they have been able to market their produce.

b. The chief of Hoa Long village reports that business in the markets of his village has increased five times of what it was before the Marines arrived. Undoubtedly this development has induced a friendly attitude on the part of the local populace towards USMC forces.

3. This command desires the services of the 1st Civil Action Company, I Corps. A team from that organization worked briefly in Hoa Hai village but failed to complete any worthwhile programs. This command believes that said unit could be of great use in the pacification of this area.

On 19 January the CAC in Thuy Luong (YD882173) treated 13 Vietnamese at sick call. The CAC in Thuy Tan (YD911149) treated 25, CAC in Loc Bon (YD925104) treated 9 Vietnamese at sick call. The Medcap Team from "RAS" 2/1 in the village Phu Ong (YD821182) treated 208 people at sick call.

C. Personal Assistance.

On 19 January 850 pounds of food was distributed to 350 people in the village of Phu Ong (YD821182). On January 19 150 bars of soap was given to 150 needed people in Phu Ong (YD821182).

D. Evacuation Assistance.

On 19 January the CAC in Loc Bon (YD925104) evacuated a 12 year old boy with a serious swollen face, to "AR Medical for treatment.

E. Reaction of People.

On 19 January the clean up campaign along Route 1 was continued. There were Marines, PF's and villagers working to haul away trash. The operation has been suspended temporarily and observing "TET". On 19 January the Phu Ong 600 members of "People action Team", were introduced into the village of Phu Ong (YD825182). The theme of the program was "if the VC won't let you come to us, then we will go to them". A great number of villagers turned out in our "RAS" Medcap Team in 2/1. They attended 208 patients in the afternoon. The U.S.O.M. provided 250 lbs of rice, 250 lbs of wheat, 250 lbs of corn and 50 gals. of corn oil which was distributed to 60 families in the Phu Ong area. The Civil Affairs Section, distributed 150 bars of soap, 150 boxes of candy and "TET" presents to the children. The program was most successful and had the most dramatic impact of any conducted by this Bn. so far. The contact are planned after "TET".

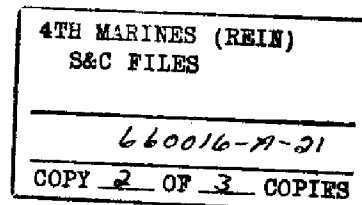

Part II: NARRATIVE REPORT:

Today the Battalion Aid Station treated a total of thirty-four (34) villagers at our dispensary site (992673). Twenty-nine (29) children, three (3) female adults and two (2) male adults. The various complaints were scalp infection, eye infection, skin infection and other minor cuts and bruises.

This afternoon a small amount of food prepared by this Battalions mess, and left over from the noon meal, was distributed to approximately thirty-two (32) villagers from the Hoa Thai Province. Also at this time, at our dispensary site (992673), the Civil Affairs Team distributed about nine (9) pounds of clothing, seventy-five (75) bars of unwrapped soap, and about forty-one (41) packages of candy among the villagers.

It is noted that those above mentioned items were taken with enthusiasm.

When arriving at the village they gave each of the children a new 5P note (600 children) they gave out a total of 900 5P note. The village chief presented the Marines with a potted tree. (one to each Btry) The Marines reported that they were accepted by the people with great enthusiasm more than usual. The people were more than happy with the Marines coming to visit them.
