PERSONNEL ADMINISTRATION

1. Personnel and Administration

- a. Casualties sustained during March included: 243 KIA, 1016 WIA, 24 DOW, 1 MIA, 1 MBD, and 4 MBC.
- b. 41 Officers and 3269 Enlisted personnel joined the Division.
 40 Officers and 2124 Enlisted personnel were transferred by normal rotation while 25 Officers and 763 Enlisted personnel were transferred by pervice facords. On 25 March 1966, 36 Officers and 1287 Enlisted personnel were transferred from the 3d Marine Division to the Force Logistics Command.
- 6. Awards presented to Division personnel included 1016 Purple Hearts, 15 Silver Star, 46 Bronze Star, 37 Navy Commendation and 34 Air Medals. Recommendations for medals forwarded to FMFPac included: 3 Legion of Merit, 22 Silver Star, 52 Bronze Star, 65 Navy Commendation, 19 Air Medals and 2 Distinguished Flying Crosses.

2. Field Exchanges

- a. A rapid increase in population coupled with a shortage of transportation due to operational counting of transportation due to operational counting of transportation the Phu Bai Enclave. On 28 March 1966, an overland convoy carried truck loads and 5 trailer loads of essential merchandise providing relief for the 4th Marines and other units in that enclave.
- b. On 23 March 1966 the 4th RIT Exchange at Chu Lei was closed and remaining stock inventoried and transferred to the 1stMarDiv. On 31 March 1966 the 7th RIT account was transferred to the 1st Marine Division thereby terminating 3d Marine Division Exchange activities in the Chu Lei enclave.
- c. The rationing of select items of exchange merchandise that are a subject to black market traffic will be initiated on 1 April 1966. The Division Exchange Officer was appointed project officer for the distribution of ration cards to each regiment and separate battalian within the Division.

3. Special Services

a. Inspection of Special Services activities within the Division was completed for all units except 3/9 which will be inspected 1 April. All units were satisfactory.

b. No significant increases in property of the Recreation Fund developed but total dollar value of Division assets increased due to receipt of the Division monthly share of Exchange profits. Present status of the Recreation Fund is:

- c. In addition to both high school and college level GED tests, the Special Services section administered additional testing through the Educational Testing Service of Princeton, N. J. These tests included college boards, law-school admission tests and tests for graduate study in business.
- d. During March, the Ann Margret Show played for Division Marines. Crowd estimates are difficult due to combined audiences at all performances. A conservative number would be about 7.000.

f. The semi-annual and change of Custodian inventory was completed on 5 March. The required reports were presented to the Recreation Council on 29 March and approved. Each unit account has been reconciled and no problems have been encountered.

4. Informational Services

- a. Press coverage of 3d Marine Division activities included 138 news features and 983 hometown releases through the Command Information Bureau of the III Marine Amphibious Force.
- b. The most significant operational coverages during March included Operations New York, Utah, Texas, and Kings.
- c. Other coverage included civil affairs programs, human interest stories, unique incidents and personal experiences of Marines involved in combat operations against the Viet Cong.

- d. The Radio/TV section produced a total of 233 minutes of tape recorded air time. Including 50 minutes for two recorded features, 21 minutes for 7 interviews for WYSL, Buffalo, N. Y. (special request), and 162 minutes for 54 hometown recorded interviews.
- e. With the arrival of the 1st Marine Division ISO at Chu Lai, the 3d Marine Division ISO team there was moved with the Fourth Regiment to the Phu Bai area.

5. Postal

a. The lat Marine Division moved into the Chu Lai enclave during this period and postal support for that area has been assumed by that command. The current locations and functions of 3d Marine Division post offices are:

e. During March letter mail was not received at Danang on 5 different occasions, at Chu Lai on 5 occasions, and at Phu Bai on 3 occasions. The frequency of receipt of letter mail is improving at each enclave.

6. Band

- a. Events for the month of March requiring participation of the band were somewhat curtailed due to the local political situation.
- b. Of particular note was the change of command ceremony for LtGen WALT and MajGen KYLE involving the use of the Band and Drum and Bugle Corps. An outstanding performance was noted by Gen WALT with letters of appreciation for all members of both musical units.
- c. A rehearsal area for the band including a stage type platform with cloth overhead has been established.

7. Division Clubs

- a. During the period 1-10 March 1966 the Bill Marine Division Club System formalized 22 branches of the Enlisted Men's Club, 20 branches of the Staff NCO Clubs and seven branches of the Officer's Club.
- b. It is estimated that at the present stage of formalization the net assets and the projected monthly gross sales of the Clubs are as follows:

- Enlisted Men's Club to go to Okinawa to purchase office supplies and equipment not to exceed \$2,500.00 which were urgently needed to accompalish the mission of the Division Club System. The necessary supplies and equipment were purchased for \$1,301.25.
- d. The supply of beer and soft drinks is still critical. A purchase of a supplementary supply of 69,000 cases of San Miguel Beer was made by the Division Clubs Officer to relieve the shortage.
- e. Informal lounges utilized by the forward infantry battalions have not as yet been formalized. Two lounges in the Phu Bai enclave were formalized 17 December 1965, the remaining informal lounges at Phu Bai are to be formalized in April upon arrival from Ckinawa of the Division Area Auditor.

S. Provest Marshal

- a. A second Dog Platoon consisting of 1 Officer and 41 Enlisted with dogs was joined from Fort Benning, Georgia on 3 March 1966. It is anticipated that training will be completed within thirty days and Dog platoons will be ready for operational assignment.
- b. Military Police posts were established on 14 March 1966 at the I Corps Tourane River Bridge with the mission of controlling U. S. Forces traffic. The posts are combined Traffic Control Points with Military Folice and ARVN Sentries on a 24 hour basis.
- o. Joint patrols were initiated 8 March 1966 with Vietnamese National Police and Marine Military Police. Areas covered: Hoa Phat Village, Dason Village in vicinity of 7th Engineers and Route 1B.
- d. Condition YELLOW was set 17 March 1966. Military Police vehicular patrols increased with augmented vehicles and personnel.

(11) Logistics.

- (a) Water trucks supporting the infantry battalions will not deliver shower or drinking water past Mieu Dong on Highway i This means that the company has to haul the water themselves, taking a good part of the day due to distance from water point.
- (b) The use of paper plates, cups, and plastic utensils will be a great help in alleviating the problems of feeding hot chow to 8 or 9 Marines standing guard at bridges etc. At the present time transporting boiling hot water in order to clean mess facilities properly has been a problem. Marines have complained of Diarrhea and stomach cramps which we belive is attributed to the lack of cleanliness of their individual mess gear.

(d) When a battalion has one or more of its companies involved in an operation for a period in excess of 3 days, plans should be made to resupply individual clothing on an as required basis. - (14) <u>Medical Support</u>. The Battalion Aid Station treated approximately 1,250 Vietnamese in the people to people sick call. Approximately 933 Marines were treated for minor ailments.
- (15) Chaplain Support. Mass was offered and Protestant coverage for the Battalion CP and rifle companies at the convenience of each unit. Memorial Services were held, Catholic and Protestant in the respective companies concerned.

Visits to the village of An Trac were made weekly, serving the needs of the villagers there with confessions and Mass. Lectures were initiated on the Religions of Vietnam giving them to new replacements as they report to the Battalion CP.


(16) Civil Affairs. During the month of March, 2d Bn, 9th Marines distributed the following items in accordance with the civil affairs program: 1,234 bars of soap, 38 sewing kits, 900 lbs of rice, 1300 lbs of wheat, 1000 lbs of cornmeal, 1200 lbs of bulgar, 25 bibles, 164 lbs of clothing, 300 school kits, 3200 pieces candy, 50 canisters of salt, 75 bars bubble bath, 66 boxes chicken gravy mix, 169 toys, 4 gallons salad oil, 4 boxes of macaroni.

- 1. Operation UTAH. This operation was conducted from 4 to 7 March in the area northwest of Quang Ngai City. Exploitation of captured documents and interrogation of captives confirmed that elements of the 1st VC Regiment and the 21st (AKA 36ER) NVA Regiment were engaged by Task Force DELTA during the operation. This confirmed previous reports of the movement, from Quang Tin and Quang Nam Provinces, of these regiments. One captive also stated that the 195th NVA AA Battalion was located in northern Quang Ngai Province. 12he tactics utilized by the enemy forces during the engagement with elements (at least two battalions) of the 21st NVA Regiment are considered significant. This unit conducted a determined defense from an extensive trench and tunnel system. The NVA force was well armed, well trained and possessed excellent camouflage and fire discipline. In addition, these troops did not hesitate to move from their fortified positions to counterattack in force when they felt it advantaged to do so. The final cumulative VC losses inflicted by the Marines in this operation were 358 KIA, 325 possible KIA, 68 WIA and 4 VCC. 17 CHICOM AK-56 assault rifles and 6 CHICOM RPD, type 56, light machine guns of the new weapons family were included in the 45 weapons captured. The small number of weapons cape tured in comparison to the large number of VC killed, demonstrates both the training and the emphasis of clearing the battle field by the NVA unit.
- Operation TEXAS. This operation was conducted from 20 to 25 March in the area northwest of Quang Ngai City. Task Force Delta, conducting a search and destroy operation in communication with ARVN forces, engaged elements of the lst 🦠 VC Regiment and the 21st (AKA 36th) NVA Regiment. Screening of captured documents and interrogation of VCC indicated the presence of the 60th Battalion, 90th Battalion, T.119 Mortar Company, T.121 Recolldess Rifle Company T.123 Engineer Unit, T.125 Transportation Unit and T.240 Dispensary Unit of the 1st VC Regiment, the 11th Battalion of the 21st NVA Regiment and the 130th Engineer Company of MR-V in the enemy force encountered. Marines once again encountered an enemy who chose to defend from a fortified position, this time a village. The VC exhibited excellent fire discipline and allowed friendly troops to advance within close range before opening fire. A stubborn three hour VC defense was conducted in Phuoc Dinh Hamlet (BS 5183) prior to breaks ... ing of contact by the Viet Cong. Cumulative VC losses inflicted by Marines were 283 KIA, 281 possible KIA and 2 VCC. 22 weapons were captured including one 60MM mortar, and two B-40 rocket launchers.
- 3. Operation KINGS. This operation was conducted from 19 to 27 March in the southern sector of the Danang TAOR. 9th Marines units conducted a search and destroy operation resulting in cumulative VC losses of 60 KIA and 53 possible KIA. On 25 March at 0030, Company "E", 2d Battalion, 9th Marines was attacked by an estimated two VC companies supported by 60MM mortars. The attack was repulsed and the VC broke contact after receiving heavy casualties (43 KIA and 40 possible KIA); Subsequent exploitation of captured documents identified the VC force as elements of or possibly the entire R.20 Battalion.

This battalion is the same unit that attacked Company "A", lst Battalion, lst Marines on Hill 22 on 30 October 1965. The tactics employed, time of attack, diversionary attacks on adjacent positions, length of the attack and concentration of the attack on one sector of the Marine positions are similar in both attacks. One new innovation was the use of water buffalos to screen the movements of the VC in this attack. It is noted that this is the only battalion in the Danang area that has engaged Marine units since their arrival in South Vietnam. Although numerous other battalions have been reported, some by agents, some by captured documents and others by VCC, the R.20 remains the only battalion confirmed by combat engagement with Marine units within the Danang TAOR.

- 4. Operation OREGON. This operation was conducted from 20 to 23 March. An estimated battalion of VC defended a strongly fortified village in vicinity (YD 555433) in northeastern Thua Thien Province on 20 and 21 March. The village was surrounded by barbed wire and mine fields and defended with 60MM and 81MM mortars, recoilless rifles and automatic weapons up to 50 caliber. YC bunkers encountered in the area were constructed of clay and rock, and were strong enough to withstand air strikes. The largest bunker had outer dimensions of 25' X 20' X 6' with an interior that measured 15' X 10' X 3'. Bunkers were camouflaged by building straw Vietnamese houses over them to mask their appearance. VCC interrogations revealed that enemy units engaged during the operation were the 802D Battalion (AKA K2), a confirmed unit normally operating in this area, and two new units, the K.500 Battalion and the K.05 Company. Neither the K.500 and K.05 are accepted by order of battle at present, but the VCC statements are sufficient to direct attention to possible newly formed or infiltrated organizations. The final cumulative VC losses inflicted by Marines were 81 KIA, 36 possible KIA and 8 VCC.
- 5. Operation ALABAMA. This operation was conducted from 29 to 30 March in the southeastern sector of the Danang TACR. This battalion search and destroy operation, was conducted by the 9th Marines, resulted in cumulative VC losses of 4 KIA and 2 possible KIA. No items of intelligence significance were generated by this operation since enemy contact was desultory.
- 6. New and sophisticated propaganda leaflets were found by USMC units in both Quang Ngai and Quang Nam Provinces. Marines engaged in Operation TEXAS found two types of leaflets new to this command. The content of the leaflets, printed in excellent inglish with a professional format, exhorted the serviceman to reject the war and cited "Nation Wide" anti war demonstrations in the U.S., hardships and jeopardizing family happiness by serving the interests of the "Munitious Makers" was stressed in one leaflet. Marines in the Danang TAOR also found a leaflet, apparently issued by the same agency, which contained entreaties to demand peace and withdrawal, avoid useless death, sympathize with the struggle of the Vietnamese people and refuse to carry out orders. A reproduction of a petition against the draft, issued by Phillip Abbot Luce of

New York City was printed on the reverse of this heaflet. The VC utilization of internal American events coupled with the smooth format utilized represent a new phase of VC psychological warfare in this area.

7. During the month of March several significant changes occured in the enemy order of tattle. The 21st (AKA 36th) NVA Regiment, elements and possibly the entire 1st VC Regiment and the 195th NVA AA Battalion moved to Quang Ngai Province. The 95B NVA Regiment, with its 4th, 5th and 6th Battalions, was confirmed as an operating unit in Thua Thien Province. The 810th VC Battalion was upgraded from probable to confirmed and the 812th Battalion was added, as probable, to the enemy strength in Quang Tri Province.

OPERATIONS

- 1. General. The tempo of operations continued to increase during the month of March as a total of 12,230 offensive actions were conducted resulting in 732 contacts with the VC. Weather conditions were dry and generally favorable to offensive operations. The Division conducted a total of six major operations during the month. These were operations UTAH, OREGON, TEXAS, KINGS, INDIANA and ALABAMA. A summary of these operations follows:
- a. UTAH. Operation UTAH was a search and destroy operation conducted in close coordination with ARVN units. Task Force Delta, under the command of Brigadier General PLATT, was the command and control headquarters for this operation. Subordinate units consisted of 1/7(-), 2/7 (-), 3/1(-) and 3/11. In addition, the Farst ARVN Airborne Battalion conducted operations in conjunction with Marine units during the operation. The operation was conducted during the period 040900H to 071825H March 1966 in the vicinity of SON CHAU VILLAGE, QUANG NGAI Province (BS 5684). D-Day was executed on 4 March with only light resistance being encountered by the Marines. However, the BRVN Airborne Battalion became heavily engaged and the 2d Battalion, 7th Marines was ordered to its assistance. During the next several hours elements of 2/7 were heavily engaged by an estimated two main force VC battalions. During the next three days search and destroy operations were conducted by all units with enemy resistance varying from light to heavy. The Commander's Analysis of Operation UTAH concerning significant features and highlights of the Operation follows:
- (1) The most significant feature of Operation UTAH, as compared with previous operations conducted by Task Force Delta, was the nature of the enemy engaged and the manner in which he fought. Previous Task Force Delta operations had encountered primarily local force and some elements of main force Viet Cong units whose primary tactics involved the employment of long range sniping and harassing fires, and a marked unwillingness to engage Marines in fixed compat. As a result of these "harass and withdraw" tactics, the units of Task Force Delta have developed counter tactics stressing rapid, aggressive pursuit to fix and engage these VC. During Operation UTAH the enemy encountered was a regiment of the North Vietnamese Army, well armed and equipped, well trained, and willing to engage the Marine and ARVN forces from their strongly fortified and excellently camouflaged defensive positions. In addition, these highly disciplined troops did not hemitate to move from their prepared positions to counterattack in force whenever and wherever they felt it advantageous to do so. Upon initial contact with this strongly entrenched and determined enemy, the aggressiveness of the Marine units proved to be somewhat of a hindrance to their effectiveness, for the speed with which they established close contact limited the effectiveness of supporting arms. After these initial engagements, upon trying to withdraw to allow the necessary room for supporting arms fares, the counterattacks of the Viet Cong again closed the contact to the point where supporting arms were hampered. This feature of Operation UTAH emphasized the importance of two aspects of the Vietnamese environment. The first of these is the continuous necessity for accurate intelligence and proper employment of scouting and security

elements in the movement to contact. Utilization of these means not only ensures rapid expecitation of the type of contacts encountered in previous operations, but also provides sufficient warning of a well-defended position to be able to utilize full strength of supporting fires before fully engaging the enemy. The second of these points is the necessity, once closely engaged with the an enemy force, to be able to quickly withdraw, employ supporting arms, and reengage to avoid losing contact.

- (2) This operation can serve as an outstanding example of the benefits to be derived from a close working relationship between the U.S. field commanders and the U.S. Advisors to ARVN units. In two separate instances the 1st ARVN Airborne Battalion ran into situations in which they were receiving heavy pressure from the Viet Cong forces. In both cases, without prior coordination and without ever meeting face-to-face with the Marine commanders involved, the advisors were able to arrange supporting attacks by the adjacent Marine battalions which relieved the pressure from the ARVA Battalion. The TFD staff and the staff and advisors of the 2d Infantry Division, ARVN, were collocated during the operation. Planning and coordination measures resulting from the close proximity of the staff and Commanders were excellent. In order to obtain the same close coordination during fature joint USMC-ARVN operations, it is confidered essential that the Command Posts of ARVN and USMC units involved should be collocated and planning and intelligence functions be adjacently operated.
- (3) During this operation the five gallon plastic water cans were used on a trial basis. The results of the est there considered excellent since they were light, easy to handle and inexpensive.

sively throughout the operation and provided very effective support to the ground units. Division snipers were also employed during this operation and accounted for eight of 31 confirmed kills on the 20th. VC were effectively engaged by the snipers at ranges up to 600 meters. The following are highlights of the operation:

- (1) Operation OREGON was developed on the basis of information from normally reliable sources that a VC battalion was operating within the OREGON area.
- (2) Psychological operations included the use of leaflets to explain the presence of Marine forces to the local population and surrender leaflets to disrupt and destroy enemy morale. Psychological operations also included the maximum utilization of village chiefs to accompany Marine forces and openly demonstrate the close GVN USME relationship. Medical attention provided the local people by battalion doctors and corpsmen also contributed to establishing warm relations between Marines and the local people. One hundred and of by tylenamese people were treated by the medical personnel on OREGON and liaison established with two local priests who brought people for medical treatment and furnished intelligence information on the movement of the VC.

- TEXAS. Operation TEXAS was a search and destroy operation conducted in BINH SON and SON TINH (BS 5992) Districts of QUANG NGAI Province. The command headquarters was Task Force Delta under the Command of Brigadier General ENGLISH. Subordinate units consisted of 3/7 (-)(Rein), 2/4(-)(Rein), 3/1(-)(Rein) and 3/11(-)(Rein). The 1st Marine Air Wing provided air support during the entire operation. The operation commenced at 200930H and terminated at 251915H March 1966. The operation commenced initially with a mission assigned to 7th Marines to conduct a joint search and destroy operation with the 5th Airborne Battalion, ARVN, and one battalion (-)(Rein), 7th Marines for the purpose of reoccupying the government outpost of AN HOA (BS 474864) which had been over run during the night of 18-19 March. This mission was successfully completed on D-Day (20 March 1966) by the 3d Battalion, 7th Marines. The mission became, and remained for the duration of the operation, a joint ARVN/USMC search and destroy operation in the SONG TINH District. The Commanders Analysis of the operation, which follows contains significant features and highlights of the operation.
- (1) As in Operation UTAH the most significant feature of Operation TEXAS was the nature of the opposition encountered and the type and

extent of their fortification. The three most significant engagements of the operation took place in fortified hamlets, emphasizing the experiences gained from recent operations that indicate the VC are more likely to defend the populated low-lying areas rather than adopting the classical concept of defense from prominent "high ground" terrain. Within these fortified hamlets the Viet Cong have demonstrated a highly developed ability to construct the elaborate trenchworks; tunnel systems and underground bunkers and command posts able to withstand the effects of all the ordnance normally employed by Marine Aviation and Artillery units against them. In addition, these main force units have exhibited a high degree of proficiency in the planning and execution of protective defensive fires, allowing friendly units to close to a range which limits the effectiveness of friendly supporting arms, and then engaging them with well-planned small arms, mortar, recoilless rifle and automatic weapons fires. It is imperative that all Marine units be made aware of these capabilities of the Viet Cong, and that they remain qually prepared to engage this type of activity as well as the sniping, booby trapping, and harassing tactics employed by the local force guerrillas.

- (2) One of the most gratifying aspects of Operation TEXAS was the manner in which the battalions from two regiments were committed to the operation on very short notice, with a minimum of detailed planning, and yet experienced only minor problems in the functions of command and control, administration and logistics. This success can be largely attributed to the fact that all of these units had previously operated together under Task Force Delta and the manner in which all functions were performed was familiar to all participating units.
- (3) There were only two significant problems excentered in the field of communications. The first of these was the overcrowding of the artillery conduct of fire nets caused by the necessity to use the PRC-25 radio, and the artillery battalion's shortage of these radios. The second was the inadequacy of their command net to handle logistic support requests and routine reports. The PRC-47 is a large, heavy radio that is virtually impossible to operate while on the move. In addition, the relatively short battery life of the BB451 creates an additional logistical burden. These factors combined to make utilization of this equipment erratic and an unnecessary hardship to the personnel carrying these radios.
- (4) Operation TEXAS again demonstrated the value of collocating the command post during a combined USMC/ARYN operation. With the forward CP of the 2d Infantry Division, ARVN only a few meters from the Task Force CP the mutual cooperation and coordination of effort between the two forces was accomplished with an absolute minimum of confusion and lost time.

- f. AIABAMA. Operation AIABAMA was a search and destroy operation conducted by 3d Bn, 9th Marines(-) in DIEN BAN District, QUANG NAM Province during the period 290745H to 301340H. The operation was terminated by due to almost negative contact with the enemy.

- 2. Small Unit Operations. The following were significant small unit operations conducted during the month:
- a. Co M. 3d Bn. 9th Marines. Two OTTERS were returning from tesupplying Co L when they were attacked by approximately 12 VC in the
 vicinity of BT 095685 at 211850H. A Co M squad patrol in the vicinity
 of BT 091682 heard the firefight and attacked in the direction of the
 VC. Five additional squads with tanks were dispatched to the scene
 of action. Enemy casualties were seven KIA (BC) and five KIA (POSS).
 In addition, two CHICOM SMG's one M-14 rifle, one sniper rifle with
 grenade launcher and five CHICOM grenades were captured. Marine
 casualties were one DOW and six WIA.
- b. 2d Br, 1st Marines. At 020400H the Combined Action Company sighted an unknown number of VC at YD 955085 and the enemy were brought under intensive small arms fire. A subsequent search of the area revealed six VC KIA and the following equipment: One U.S. Carbine, three K-50 SMG's, one K-50 modified, two 1/2 pound blocks of TNT, five VC hand grenades, two CHICOM concussion grenades, 300 rds SMG ammo, several magazine poundes, cartridge belts, clothing and a tool kit for a Russian heavy machine gr.. There were no friendly casualties.
- 3. A total of four truck convoys were executed on Highway #1 from Da Nang to Phu Bai and return. One convoy was executed between Da Nang and Task Force Dalta CP and TAM KY (BS 3022). These convoys, under the odde name of ROUGH RIDER, were executed without major incident. Two rounds of small arms fire was received by one of the convoys but no damage or casualties were incurred.
- 4. On 1 March 1966 the TAOR in Phu Bai was expanded in the NE and SE corners.
- 5. 1/1 moved from Da Nang to Phu Bai on 1 March 1966. On 28 March 1966 the 4th Marines (-) completed movement from Chu Lai to Phu Bai and assumed operational control of the Phu Bai TAOR. The 1st Battalion (-), 4th Marines deployed from Chu Lai to Phu Bai on 31 March 1966. BLT 3/4 arrived in country at Phu Bai on 190700H March 1966 after completing a two month training cycle in Okinawa under the Intra-theater BLT Rotation program.

- 6. Employment of the scout sniper teams continued and on 19 March the first formal scout sniper platoon was graduated. This platoon became organic to the 3d Marines.
- 7. Indicative of the VC employment of mines, booby traps, and extensive field fortifications are the following figures concerning enemy fortifications, and ordnance destroyed by the 3d Engineer Battalion during March:

8. The COUNTY FAIR concept was orginally tested on a pilot basis in February. The concept was refined and established as a standard type operation for Division units. COUNTY FAIR is a USMC/GVN coordinated operation specifically designed to destroy VC influence and to introduce GVN influence in isolated hamlets and villages. USMC units cordon a village or community which is then searched by GVN forces. The villagers are evacuated to a central location where they are interrogated, fed, processed for identification and exposed to propaganda lectures. While this is being accomplished other GVN forces conduct a detailed search of the village or community for hidden tunnels, food, munition caches and hiding VC. This technique has proven very successful in each instance where the concept has been properly executed. A total of four COUNTY FAIR operations were conducted by the 9th Marines during March with the following results: 9 VC KIA, 8 VCC, 24 VCS and 2 ARVN deserters apprehended.

A VC document captured by a Marine Patrol provides a Viet Cong evaluation of COUNTY FAIR operations. The document, as translated, stated "At 0200 on 7 March 1966 2 combined forces of 1.5. and GVN military personnel numbering approximately 600 men launched a search operation in a hamlet of "H" Village (DEONG SON hamlet, AT 995676). The US and GVN forces displaced the villagers to a general area where our care were isolated from them. Some of our cadre and guerrilla fighters were forced to emerge from their hiding places in tunnels so as to contact (meld with) the people. As a consequence, five of our mentwere killed by the U.S. and GVN soldiers. This should serve as a lesson (warning) to all of us. The enemy may conduct this same type of operation in the future in other areas. This warning must be disseminated to all other villages. Water and food stocks adequate for a period of three to five days must be prepared. It is also necessary that our forces resist the efforts of the enemy to surround the hamlet and as quick as possible escape the encirclement."

COMBAT AIR SUPPORT MARCH 1966



- a. Operation Utah began on 4 March with the lift of 440 ARVN Troops into an unsecure landing zone at BS 543833. Twenty UH-34's from MAG-36 escorted by 8 A-4 and F-4 type aircraft and 4 armed UH-1E's accomplished the lift in spite of heavy 50 caliber, small arms, and automatic weapons fire. One of the escorting UH-1E's was shot down and 2 A-4's were scribbled to protect the crew who were later picked up by a UH-34. Approximately 20 minutes later, an F-4 covering the landing zone was hit by heavy 50 caliber fire. The pilot turned toward Chu-Lai, but the crew was forced to eject over water. Within 30 minutes the pilot and radar operator were picked up by 2 V UH-34's from Chu-Lai. At the completion of the ARVN lift, a total of 36 UH-34's carried 665 Marines of 2/7 into the same zone. Eleven aircraft were hit and 7 crew members wounded. One UH-34 was forced down near the zone with 3 rounds in the fuel tank. The crew was immediately evacuated, but the aircraft was later repaired and flown to Ky Ha. By 1500, 12 UH-34's from MAG-16 augmented MAG-36 forces and lifted 2 companies and a command group from 3/1 to a landing zone in the operation area without incident. Resupply and med-evacs through the night concluded the first day of the operation. The 5th, 6th, and 7th of March saw continuous logistic, med-evac, and close air support. Heavy anti-aircraft fire, including air-bursting ordnance, was prevalent throughout Utah. Retraction began on the 7th with 24 UH-34's lifting 588 Marines of 3/1 to the Chu-Lai airfield. An additional 181 personnel of 1/7 and 2/7 were lifted to their battalion areas without incident. When Operation Utah concluded on 8 March, the First Marine Aircraft Wing accounted for 267 fixed wing sorties which dropped 233 tons of ordnance, and 2100 helicopter sorties that transported over 2200 troops and 171 tons of cargo.
- b. On 9 March, Marine Air went to the assistance of the U. S. Army and Vietnamese personnel at the beseiged Special Forces Camp of A Shau. Two UH-34's from HMM-263 launched at 1515H on a med-evac mission and landed in the compound with one aircraft being incapacitated by ground fire. The crew was recovered by the wingman and returned to Marble Mountain. In spite of extremely adverse weather conditions on the 10th, a force of UH-34's escorted by armed UH-1E's retracted 69 personnel from A Shau. Fixed wing aircraft provided close air support totaling 92 sorties, one of which cost an A-4 and pilot. Three UH-34's and one helicopter gunner were also lost. By 1840H, word was received that all friendly personnel had been evacuated by air or had left the camp on foot.
- c. Operation Oregon began on 20 March with 16 UH-34's and 2 UH-1E's lifting 450 Marines from Phu-Bai to the operating area. Later that afternoon, 180 additional troops were lifted into the area and 30 WIA's were evacuated while MAG-11 F-8's and F-4's provided close air support for the ground forces 23 miles Northwest of Phu-Bai. Troopslifts, resupply, medevac, and close air support were conducted until the operation came to a close on 24 March with the return by helicopter of 1400 troops to Phu-Bai.
- 2. New Developments. The first CH-46's of HMM-164 arrived in country on 8 March. Joining MAG-16 at Marble Mountain, the new squadrons' CH-46's boast approximately twice the lift capability of the UH-34.
- 3. Problem Areas. No new problems were encounted during the month of March.

LOCISTICS TON LOCAL PROPERTY

1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS -

- a. During the month of March, logistics inspections of Division units were completed.
- b. The 3d Engineer Battalion continues to precut timber for bunker kits and these are being provided to Division units with engineer personnel assisting in the emplacement. The following is a recapitulation of bunkers to date:

- c. The Red Ball program is continuing to function. At the end of this reporting period 39 separate items are on Red Ball.
- d. CRITIPAC number 4 has been received by Division units. Although units are not receiving all they ask for the CRITIPAC continues to aid the supply status of the Division.
- e. Approximately 1,000 plastic water cans have been issued to units, priority to Infantry and Reconnissance units. An additional 3,000 are being procured. This water can costs less than half the price of metal cans, weighs only one pound as compared to five pounds for the metal can and gives every indication of being fully acceptable for use in Vietnam.
- f. Disposable mess gear is being issued in small quantities to infantry units located away from adequate mess facilities or adequate water in order that they might be served at least one hot meal per day. Units have been requested to report acceptability and suitability by 1 May.
- g. Three M48A3 tanks were disabled by mines but repaired. One LVTP5 hit mine tand Coded X. One M48A3 tank was submerged and evacuated.
 - h. Two M53 155 guns were received on the R&E program.

- k. "D" Medical Company, let Medical Battalion arrived in Danang and was redesignated "B" Medical Company, 3d Medical Battalion. "B" Medical Company was chopped to Medical Battalion.

- b. During the latter part of March demonstrations by Vietnamese divilians delayed unloading and loading operations in Hue and Danang.

e. During this reporting period the 1st Marine Division assumed eperational centrel of the CHU LAI Tactical Area of Responsibility.

Headquarters, 4th Marine Regiment displaced to the HU BAI Tactical Area of Responsibility. The realignment of communication means between Headquarters, 3d Marine Division at Damang and Headquarters, 4th Marines was made with a minimum of disruption to previously installed facilities.

a. Objective

(1) The basic objective of the Marine Division Civic Action Program continues to attempt to enhance distressed areas, strengthen the papular appeal of the government in the eyes of the Vietnamese people and to improve the image of the Republic Vietnam Armed Ferces (RVNF).

b. Highlights

(1) Governmental Functions

- (a) Civil Gevernment. There has been an increased effort this month to coordinate all Civic Action and Civil Affairs through the Civil Government up to and including District level. This point will continue to be emphasized in order to assist in achieving our Civil Affairs efforts.
- (b) Public Education. 3d Tank Battalion assisted Phong Bac School (AT998706) in Hoa Tho Village by repairing the building which had been damaged by VC. In addition to the repair the battalion presented the school with two, one for each classisten, large maps of South Vietnam. On 11 March a reopening ceremony was held at the school. The Division Band entertained at the ceremony. Guests included Capt. Hoa, Hoa Vang District Chief, Lt. Col. Rapheal, Commanding Officer of the 3rd Tank Battalion, and the guest of honor Colonel Simmons, who presented two Republic of Vietnam Flags to the school.

On the evening of the same day, during a Psy Ops meeting held by the village chief of Hoa Tho Village, a VC terrorist squad attacked the school killing one person, injuring several others, and doing slight damage to the school building. The damages were repaired within four days by villagers and Marines and the incident was exploited fully for Psy Ops purposes. Another significant sidelight of this sequence concerns both Civil Government and Public Education and appears to be representative of problems with which Civil Affairs Officers necessary become involved. About the time that repairs were completed one of the teachers at the school reported to the Tank Battalion Civil Affairs Officer that she was not being paid. An investigation revealed that in this particular case the village chief was responsible for collecting a "student tax" from his villagers in order to may the teacher. The Civil Affairs Officer contacted the village chief and remedied the situation. When this process has been repeated enough times it is expected that the village chiefs will learn to perform their duties in the proper manner, thus making some direct contribution to the achievement of our Civil Affairs objectives ! In several areas USMC units are actually paying teachers with contributions from within the unit. While this is better than having no teacher it is far more desirable to persuade the appropriate level of government to perform their duty. CARE school kits continue to be distributed to schools the oughout the Division TAOR.

(d) Labor. 3d Engineer Battalion continues to train laborers which that unit employes in minor engineer skills. Most of this training is "on the job" training instruction. This type of Civil Affairs project will in the long term produce highly desirable effects on the nation building process.

(d) Public Health

The 2d Battalion, 3d Marines have assisted with renovation of one building and construction of one light structure to be used as id tations. Vietnamese nurses work with 2/3 Medical personnel at both locations.

There is also a program under consideration where by this battalion may pair 5 Vietnamese to render medical aid.

3d Engineer Battalion Marines and Vietnamese civilians constructed a dispensary in Da Mon 2 (BT 057729). The local officials made arrangements to staff the dispensary with a full time nurse, and basic medical supplies.

1st Battalion, 12th Marines is renovating a three room reilwood terminal at Nam O (935835) to be used as a dispensary. It is expected that this dispensary will eventually be staffed by Vietnamese.

(e) Public Safety. The Combined Action Company operated by the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines continues to be one of the most effective programs for gaining the support and loyalty of the populace for the GVN. While the other programs are appreciated by the people, when conducted in a professional manner, the thing which they appear to desire and appreciate most is a secure environment in which to work and live.

(2) Economics Functions

- (a) Commerce and Industry. 3d: Battalion, 3d: Marines continue to inspire and assist in implementation of improvements of the market a Antrac. There are plans in the offering to make this market the commercial center of the Southerr portion of Hoa Vang District. 3d: Tank Battalion is assisting Hoa Tho Village officials plan the construction and supervision of a market place in Fhong Bac Hamlet. This plan includes the clearing of land, which is currently not in use, establishing market regulations for the operation of the market, and buildings for market stalls.
- (b) Food and Agriculture. The 9th Marine Regiment is instrumental in assisting with control of the rice harvested within Hos Vang District by making arrangements for two 2th ton trucks to be available to the District Chief to transport harvested rice.
- 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, 9th Marine Regiment assisted representatives from the U.S. Agency for International Development in coordinating a conference with farmers and local governmental officials at Antrac regarding a proposed agricultural development program for Antrac Hamlet. If the people of the hamlet agree to the proposal the project will be instituted, and will include:

Duck Raising
Rice, commercial fertiliser application to
Hog raising cooperative
Vegatable gardening with improved strains of seed, gardening methods
and the application of commercial fertilizer

it is the intention of the commands involved to assist with and encourage the program, but not become involved to such an extent that the removal of Marines would adversely effect the program.

(3) Public Facilities

(a) Public Works and Utilities. Anti Tank Battalion assisted with renovation of Yen Bac Hamlet (AT 985708) and has induced the people to at a new well for the purpose of supporting a hamlet shower which is clanned.

In Da Lan Hamlet (BT 057729) the 3d: Engineer Battalion installed a culvert to improve drainage of living areas, and constructed a dock for the fishing boats of the hamlet.

(4) Special Functions

(a) Displaced Persons and Refugees. 1st Battalion, 3d Marines and 3d Shore Party Battalion continued assistance to refugee camps in their area.

A conference concerning coordination of assistance to refugees was held at this Headquarters. Conferees were the Division G-5, Representatives of the U. S. Agency for International Development, who have the primary responsibility for refugees, and a representative of III MAF. The USAID representatives explained that some refugee camps were obtaining assistance from several sources, resulting in massive over assistance while other refugee centers were in dire need of assistance. It was agreed that the USAID, Quang Nam Province, Refugee Representative would furnish III MAF with the location of all refugees in Quang Nam Province, and that USMC units would coordinate assistance for refugees located within the TAOR's. This is in no way intended to transfer the responsibility for the administration of the refugee program from USAID.

(b) Civil Information. The Civil Information program is based on the premise that having a well informed public is an important step in the "Nation Building" process. The 3d Marine Division's involvement in this area is in its infancy, and consists of inducing hamlet chiefs to have bulletin boards put up and assist them in obtaining informational material for the bulletin boards, and assisting the Joint U. S. Public Affairs Office (JUSPAU) in distributing periodicals. This month the 1st Amphibious Tractor Battalion assisted the people of Cam Le (AT 014718) in construction of a bulletin board, and the 3d Anti-Tank Battalion helped the people of Yen Bac. Two hundred copies of "Nations Progress" a JUSPAO published monthly magazine directed toward the rural population, was distributed in banlets throughout the Division's TAOR with favorable reception. The distribution of the magazines will be continued monthly, gradually increasing the number distributed. Additionally, JUSPAO has agreed to furnish worthwhile Saigon newspapers for distribution to the rural population. It is expected that this program will get underway during the month of April.

c. Programs

(1) Operation "Cleft Palate" Hare Lip

(a) Operation Cleft Palate/Hare Lip assisted two children during this reporting period. One sponsored by the 3d. Mr Battalion and the other by Headquarters lst Marines. Both operations were conducted at the Naval Hospital in Saigon. Responsibility of post operative care, will be that of the units requesting the service.

(?) MEDCAP

(a) MEDCAP continues to provide the high psychological impact desired. During the month of March MEDCAP teams treated a total of \$1,865 Vietnamese civilians.

(a) Dental care to the Vietnamese continues to expand each menth and total procedures increase. Total teeth extracted during this period 3,072.



AS OF 1500, 6 MARCH 1966

On 2 March ARVN units made contact with VC in the hill area 7 miles NNE of Quang Ngai. Two VC were captured in this engagement. They stated they were members of the Demolition Co of the 36th NVA Regt and that their Regimental CP was located in the hamlet of Cham Mha (4) (BS 553828) 7 miles NW of Quang Ngai City. On 3 March another intelligence report was received indicating the possibility of a regimental CP in the same area. A plan was immediately developed to exploit this target by conducting a joint ARVN/USMC search and destroy operation through the Chan Mha area east to Highway 1 on 4 March with one ARVH Battalion and one USMC Company. Other forces were alerted to stand by for quick commitment in the syant the target proved fruitful. At 040900 20 UH-34's and 4 armed UH-1E's of MAG-36 commenced the lift of the ARVN forces from Quang Ngai City to a landing sone (BS 544834) 1000 meters NW of Chan Mha (4). The landing was successful, but was met with extremely intense VC .50 cal MG, automatic weapons and small arms: Mrs. which downed two UH-LE's and hit over half of the helicopters making the first landing. Ground fire also hit a Marine F4 covering the landing. The F4 turned towards Chm Lai, and the crew ejected over water and were rescued at 041000. In accordance with plans, at 041000 the 1st Marine Regiment alerted two companies as a reaction force under the operational control of 7th Marine Regiment. As the reports began to come in, Task

Force Delta was reactive ted and took over operational trol. At 041035. 3dBn. 1st Marines, was alerted, and at 1135, the 1st Marines were directed to free all of 3/1 for commitment. During this time, the Battalion Command Group and three companies of 2/7 were organised to be lifted into the 12. To expedite reaction capabilities, at 1130, 12 UH-34's from MAG-16 at Phu Bai were flown to Chu Lai to augment MAG-36 and to be employed by Task Force Delta, whose Headquarters had moved to Monestery Hill (Buddha Mtn)(BS 661756). At 041200, 2/7 commenced their lift into the original LZ, Co F in the leading aircraft. The lift of 2/7 was completed at 1305. During the lift one UH-34 received three hits and was forced down in the IZ. Eleven other heles were hit, and seven crew men wounded during the execution of this lift. During the lift of 2/7 and for five hours thereafter, the ARVN Airborne Bn and Marines in the LZ met heavy resistance in the form of mortar, small arms and 50 cal MG fire. Upon completion of the lift and consolidation of the LZ, the ARVN and Marines commenced an attack to the east and mortheast. This attack was met with murderous fire from the VC, who tensciously held prepared defensive positions. Companies F and G 2/7 were receiving heavy mortar and small arms fire from both flanks as well as the front. Forty-four air strikes and numerous artillery missions were employed to assist in the reduction of the VC positions. Near dusk VC fire moderated, but 2/7 remained in heavy contact until approximately 2100, when the VC disengaged. When all attempts to regain contact were unsuccessful, night defensive positions were established, intermingling ARVN and USMC forces. During the night several patrols, while attempting to reestablish contact, encountered small groups of VC attempting to exfiltrate the area.

While the 11th of 2/7 was in progress, two parine 155 per How (SP) Berys moved to forward firing positions 7 KM northeast of the objective area. At 1500 two companies and the command group of 3/1 were lifted into a LZ approximately 3 KM north of the battle area. This lift was completed at 1550. In attempting to locate and fix the enemy, 3/1 had only light contact during the remainder of the day and finally established blocking positions to the north of the battle area. Plans were formulated and units positioned to completely surround the area in which the VC force was believed consentrated. During the night, to tighten the circle, ARVN 37th Rangers took up positions to the east of the enemy, while the ARVN 1st Bn. 5th Regt moved into the area to the northeast, 2/7 and the ARVN Airborne Bn remained west of the area. The day's action resulted in 110 VC KIA by Marings and 57 by ARVN as well as 300 estimated KIA. Friendly casualties were light. Also during the night the Hospital Ship REPOSE was underway from Da Mang to the objective area, arriving close off shore at 050245.

Enemy activity on the 5th commenced at 0530, when an estimated two VC - Bns were reported to have launched an attack from the NE and NW on the ARVN ABN Bn positions.

At 050650 two UH+34's commenced the lift of an additional company (I) of 3/1 from Chu Lai into an area immediately behind 3/1's night positions. At 050830 3 UH-34's commenced the lift of 2/4 into the VINH LOC area (BS 495790), 6 miles WNW of Luang Ngai in order to seal off the southern escape route of the VC. Heavy fire was met in the LZ despite LZ preps by A4 and F4 aircraft. 2/4 consolidated and attacked to the north, loaving two platoons of P/1/7 that had been flown in to provide security for a UH-34, shot down during the 2/4 lift. During the attack to assume

blocking positions to the menth of the enemy, 2/4 made contact with two groups of VC, one contact taking place at noon and another at 1306. These contacts resulted in 7 VC KIA and 12 possible KIA. The two platoons from B/1/7 providing security for the helo had several contacts, with small groups of VC during the same time period. One of these encounters resulted in 12 VC KIA.

By mid-morning 3/1 commenced a search and destroy operation to the south.

At 1030 M/3/1 made contact with an estimated VC company armed with 60mm mortars, 57mm RR and 50 cal MG in the TRA BINH DONG (1) area, L/3/1 made contact with 30 VC in the same area. Reports indicate the enemy were wearing khaki uniforms and black herets. The VC facing L/3/1 were in well prepared defensive positions in an area heavily mined and booby trapped. By 1330 all three companies of 3/1 were heavily engaged as the fight was pushed to the VC. The 1st ABN Bde (ARVN) (another Bn had been lifted into the objective area at 1450) supported the 3/1 attack, passing through 3/1. By 1700 the enemy was enclosed in a box surrounded by 2/7, 3/1, 2/4, the 37th Ranger Bettalion and the 1st Airborne Battalion. By 1800 all units in the objective area had beased movement and had begun to establish night positions.

The second battalien, 7th Marines received sporadic small arms and mortar fire throughout the day as they conducted a search and destroy operation in the Chau Nha area. Buring the day tunnels were discovered containing 46 bodies. These tunnels were destroyed with demolitions.

During the night, commencing at 2255, B/1/7 guarding a downed helo, was subjected to repeated attacks by an estimated two VC companies supported by 60mm and 81mm mortars. These VC were reportedly clad in green

uniforms and consequenced pitch helmets. An attempt was made to reinforce the two beleaguered plateons with a plateon from C/1/4 at 2310. The enemy fire in the landing zone was so intense that the helos could not land and the plateon was diverted to TF Delta CP. These attacks continued until 0430, when the VC broke contact, only to launch a pre-dawn attack an hour later. The other units conducted numerous patrols and ambushes in the objective area, but failed to make contact.


The ARVN ABN Bde was retracted on the morning of 6 March. Marine units commenced search and destroy operations throughout the objective area while the 1st Bn, 5th Regt (ARVN) and the 37th Ranger Bn (ARVN) continued to hold blocking positions to the east. These operations are being conducted so as to keep pressure on the surrounded VC forces in the TRA BINH DONG area while at the same time developing forces to exploit and pursue enemy targets.

There are several intelligence aspects of this operation, and the enemy encountered therein, that are worth special attention and summarization. The VCC captured on the 2d of March identified themselves as members of a Demolition Company of the 36th NVA Regiment. They said that there was a 33d Battalian (aka for 3d Battalian) of this regiment in the area. We have, of course, long been seeking this 36th Regiment, throughout Operation Harvest Moon and Double Eagle. These captives provided the initial tip on which CG, 2d ARVN Division, decided to move. The

information that they presented corresponded to very recent agent reports. The enemy engaged indeed displays the characteristics of a well-trained, regular force. He is fighting tensciously, not giving up an inch of ground. He is well dug in, employing bunkers, caves, and tunnels to maximum advantage. Although most captured weapons have not arrived at the command post of Task Force Delta, evidence is that he possesses best and newest weapons available. These are from the new Chicam family of 7.62 caliber weapons. They include the Type 56 assault rifle, the semi-automatic carbine, and the light machine gun, Model RPD. In addition, several Chicom 12.7 Heavy Machine Guns have been captured, and one captive states that he if from an antiaircraft battalion. Uniforms are good and are standardised. Two types have been reported. One group has been wearing black berets and another is wearing camouflaged pith helmets. We conclude that we are opposed in one location, near the original helicepter landing some, by an estimated two reinforced companies or a full battalion. In another location, in a fortified village complex, the enemy appears to be protecting a regimental command post with more battalions of this regiment. Our conclusion is that the intelligence received from the original two captives has brought us to the location of the command post of the 36th HVA Regiment. It is now surrounded. The enemy seems to know that he is surrounded and is determined to fight to the bitter end.

THE RECENT REMOVAL OF LT GENERAL NGUYEN CHANH THI, COMMANDER, I CTZN MAY RESULT IN ADDITIONAL DEMONSTRATIONS, BUT IT IS TOO EARLY TO ACCURATELY ASSESS THE IMPACT OF HIS RELIEF UPON THE POPULATION AND THE WAR EFFORT.



1. Reference (a) requested an analysis of Operation Utah as related to the principles set forth in reference (b).

2. Operation Utah is a classic example of Marine capability to react rapidly in pursuit of VC forces.

Brigodier General PLATT, Assistant Division Commander/Task Ferce Delta Commander was first notified of VC activity in the future area of operation at 031705H March 1966, by the Senior U. S. Advisor to 2d ARVN Division (Col. JONES). Two North Vietnamese Army Engineers had been captured by the ARVN on 2 march. These prisoners gave the location of a North Vietnamese Regimental Cr. This location corresponded with a SPAR report received by the ADC. Also at 031705H the ARVN requested 20 helicopters for use the following day. At 031708H General PLATT alerted Col. PEATROSS (CO, 7th Harines) to the impending situation. General PLATT then contacted the Chief of Staff, 3d Marine Division at 031715H and notified him of the requirements for 20 helicopters by the ARVN on 4 March. The Chief of Staff returned the General's call at 031830H and indicated the helicopter request was approved and that direct liaison was authorized with MAG-36. Commanding Officer, 7th Marines attended a joint conference in Quang Ngai at 031900H; returning at 032145, where he set into motion the final stages of planning for the oneration.

The 2d Battalion, 7th Marines was alerted at 031720H to prepare for departure to tunn Ngai on 4 March. At 032115H the Commanding Officer and his executive steff reported to the 7th Marine CP for a briefing, which ended at 032200H. The battalion published it's Frag Order #2-66 by 040200H. At 040700H, Commany E(-), 2/7, provided security for an artillery convoy to Binh Son. The remaining portion of 2/7, utilizing the same helicopters employed for the 1st ARVN Airborne Bn, moved to the battalion's helicopter landing zone at 040815H, with the lift commencing at 041040H. The first wave touched down in LZ Alfa at 041100H.

The 3d Battalion, 1st Marines was alerted to their impending commitment on Operation Utah at 041015H. The battalion established a helicopter pick-up zone at 041030H. Company K and one platoon of Company I of 3/1 were notified at 041200H of their mission as convoy security. Fourty-five minutes later the convoy moved out. The battalion received a frag order at 041310H authorizing direct liaison with MAG-36. At 041500H the lift of the remainder of 3/1 began, and by 041815 the lift was completed.

The 2d Battalion, 4th Marines was given a warning order at 042035H to prepare a battalion command group and two rifle commanies for a helicopter assault early on 5 March. Frag Order 171-66 was received at 042230H assigning the battalion its mission. At 050800H the first elements of the battalion were lifted out. Leading elements of the battalion landed at 050830H, followed by the command group at 050845H, with the entire lift being completed at 051107H.

The let Battalion, 7th Marines was alerted at 051030H for the commitment of a battalion command group in the area of operation. The command group moved by convoy from Chu Lai at 051145H. The battalion command group arrived in Binh Son at 051245H and at 051325H had OPCON of K Company 3/1 and E Company 2/7. Task Force Delta issued orders for the battalion to move from Binh Son overland into a blocking position. At 051410H the battalion began moving out. The quick response time is exemplified in the above discussions.

- 3. Although it is clearly recognized that the basic concept promulgated in reference (a) is "quick reaction", there can be segregated from the message at least ten "sub-principles" whose application will characterize successful enerations. Reference (b) had not yet reached any of the Utah participants at the time the operations commenced. The correlation between events on Itah and the content of reference (a) is so good that an objective discussion would be in order at this time.
- a. "VC continue to attack - usually against RF, PF, and isolated ARVE units". The 1st ARVE Arrborne Battalion landed southwest of the reported VC units and commenced moving to the northwest at which time they met very stiff resistance and were attacked by VC forces. It was the effort of 2/7, which diverted and blunted the attack thus relieving pressure on the hard pressed Airborne Battalion.

During the early morning hours of D+1 an estimated two VC battalions hit the let APVN Airborne Battalion. Three hours of close fighting followed in which, through the valiant efforts of the ARVN troops and the continuous defensive fires laid down by Marine artillery, the VC attack was broken. This artillery barrage was the most intensive fired thus far by Marine artillery in Victor. During a three hour period 1907 artillery rounds were fired.

b. "Engewement and pursuit of VC forces which reveal their presence by offensive action must be Priority #1 at all levels. Scheduled operations may be edjusted or delayed to accommodate quick reaction operations against lucrative VC targets." Utah became Priority #1 from the start with the ADC, the Residental Commander closest to the action and all staff sections concerned.

Plans were formulated immediately and refined as more details became available. Operation Maine scheduled to be conducted by the 7th Marines, was immediately delayed.

c. "Te must tighten up our liaison and communications with Vietnamese forces. Tactical unit commanders will establish direct communications with Vietnamese Division, Province, and Regional headquarters . . . and quick reaction procedures worked out."

This had been done in an extremely competent manner, at the highest levels General PhATT - General LAM - Colonel JONES, Colonel PEATROSS - Colonel JONES; 7th Marines liaison briefing weekly at the 2d ARVN Division Cr; permanent harine liaison officer at Quang Ngai and ARVN liaison at Chu Lai; an ARVN radio relay station in Chu Lai to name the most prominent. There is rever any question of exchanging information only at Corps level, the information is exchanged through the many liaison channels interconnecting the Chu hai Enclave and 2d ARVN Division headquarters.

d. "Me do not have an independent mission."

Lonediate response to the ARVN request for helicopter support was only the beginning of the cooperation and dual mission so vividly displayed throughout the operation. A joint CP was established just north of Quang Ngai to facilitate close cooperation and cut reaction time. The 2d ARVN Division Reconnaissance Company was under the operational control of 3/1 during most of the operation. Another outstanding example of working together was the quick response of 2/7 to the call for assistance by the 1st ARVN Airborne Bat alion on D-Day.

e. "VC particularly vulnerable to pursuit."

VC habits present an unusual opportunity for the success of aggressively executed pursuit operations. Such operations must be characterized by great imagination and must utilize all the combined arms, fincluding air.

The vC nearly always withdraw to the west or the nearest hills and heavily vegetated area. In order to prevent the VC from exfiltrating, a rectangle was forced and closed, with the driving forces moving toward the sea (east). All available supporting arms were utilized. Air was readily available and extensively used throughout the operation, but especially during the early stages. Artiflery was quickly moved from Chu Lai to the area of operation and in edicately began to support both Marine and ARVN forces.

f. "Constanders must not only plan for adequate immediate support, but must simultaneously issue necessary orders for the pursuit."

This is readily shown by the rapid and systematic deployment of Marine and ARVE forces. The original objective was to contain the VC, and to accombish this four battalions were quickly deployed. Then more battalions were moved into the area to provide manuever elements with which to exploit the situation.

g. "Fresh units should be thrown into the attack... However the unit under attack should begin its pursuit at first light."

A stendy stream of fresh units were systematically alerted and committed to the organian as shown in the aforementioned chronology.

h. "Aerial surveillance should be intensified immediately."

Not only were aerial observers rushed to the area but TAC(A)s were placed on station is mediately to pin-point targets. Almost continuous surveillance was maintained during daylight hours over the area of operation.

i. "Artillery and air strikes should be made against likely withdrawal routes and assembly areas whether or not VC are sighted, based upon tactical judgment of the commanders concerned."

exceptionally good use was made of artillery and air during the entire operation and narticularly during the early stages. Extensive use was made of artillary H and I's plus TPQ-10 air strikes at night on likely assembly areas and trail networks.

j. "This... tendency (on the part of the ground commanders, artillerymen and FAC's to withhold their fire power when enemy targets are not sighted) must be overcome in connection with pursuit operations... When he reveals his presence by an attack... at this time and immediately following the attack commanders on the ground and FAC's under specific instructions from commanders on the ground must apply heavy and sustained fire power against suspected withdrawal routes and assembly areas without hesitation... All commanders and troops must adopt the attitude of the hunter who is determined to find and kill the attacking VC force."

Air, artiflery and organic indirect fire weapons of the battalions were used extensively once the VC revealed their position. Fire was directed not only at the attacking force but likely routes of withdrawal and assembly areas.




