



1. Parsonnel and Administration

- a. Casualties sustained during the month included: 48 KIA, 421 WIA, 19 DOW, and 1 missing.
- b. During June, 64 officers and 1047 enlisted personnel joined the Division. There were 151 officers and 1708 enlisted personnel transferred by normal rotation. Transferred by service record were 7 officers and 302 enlisted personnel.
- c. Awards presented were a Silver Star Medals, 2 Legions of Merit, 35 Bronze Star Medals, 38 Navy Commendation Medals, 4 Air Medals, 7 Secretary of the Navy Achievement awards and 513 Purple Heart Medals.
- d. Twenty four noncommissioned officers were promoted to Warrant Officer.

2. Field Exchanges

- a. The Army and Air Force Exchange Service opened a new, larger exchange in the Division recreational complex in the vicinity of Hill 327. The exchange is comprised of 8 Butler Buildings.
- b. Back up stocks for the exchange at Phu Bai were increased during the month. Supplies, which included luxury items as well as essential items, were shipped by air and by Rough Rider convoys.
- c. Inventory of exchanges was conducted during the month. There were no major discrepancies.

4. Informational Services

- a. Press coverage of 3d Marine Division activities included 126 news and feature releases through the Command Information Bureau of III Marine Amphibious Force. In addition a total of 3152 hometown news releases were sent to the Fleet Hometown News Center, Great Lakes, Illinois.
- b. The most significant news coverage during the period was operation Jay.
- c. A total of 1178 minutes of tape recorded air time was produced by the Radio-TV Section during June.

5. Postal

- a. During June the Directory Section readdressed and forwarded approximately 1997 pounds of airmail and 13,035 pounds of other classes of mail for a total of 15,012 pounds.
- b. The following represents pounds of mail received and dispatched during the month of June.

c. During June air letter mail was not received at Danang on only 1 day. The Phu Bai area failed to receive letter mail on June 3, 10, 19, 22 and 24, for a total of 5 occasions.

6. Band

- a. The Division Band was on Okinawa during the entire month.
- b. The Drum and Bugle Corps was temporarily assigned to III Marine Amphibious Force on 24 June 1966.

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7. Division Clubs

- a. Five additional enlisted clubs were opened during the month.
- b. An NCO was assigned to the Phu Bai area as liaison NCO to assist in the technical aspects of club management, to ensure supplies are adequate and to act as collection agent.
 - c. The area auditor was moved from Okinawa to Vietnam in June.

8. Provost Marshal

a. The scout and sentry dog platoons were assigned to operational and administrative control of the 1st Military Police Battalion.





- 1. Operation FIORIDA. This operation was a search and destroy operation conducted in conjunction with ARVN forces in the Co Bi Thanh Tan area northwest of the Phu Bai TAOR. The operation was conducted during the period 9 June to 12 June. During the course of the operation no large enemy units were encountered. Total VC lesses during the operation were 15 KIA confirmed and 1 VCC.
- 2. Operation ATHENS. This operation was a search and destroy operation conducted southeast of the Phu Bai PAOR. The operation was conducted during the period 15 May to 25 June. Intelligence information indicated the presence of the 804th and 810th Battaliens and the Phu Bai District Armed Unit in the area. Decuments captured from VC KIA as a result of an ambush during the operation indicated that the KIA were couriers for the Phu Bai District Armed Unit (AKA P.18 and C.117 Companies). These documents consisted primarily of letters and their tener indicated that the VC unit was desperately short of rations to the extent that starvation was a possibility. Total VC lesses during the operation were 11 KIA confirmed, 29 KIA probable and 1 VCC.
- Operation JAY. This operation was a search and destroy operation in conjunction with ARVN units. It resulted from intelligence gained during LAM SON 283, an ARVN operation southeast of Quang Tri City. During LAM SON 283 the ARVN forces made centact with elements of the 808th VC Battalion. Intelligence gained from VC captives during this operation indicated further VC activity south of the LAM SON 283 area midway between Quang Tri City and Hue. Operation JAY was conducted during the period 25 June to 2 July. On the afternoon of 25 June the 2d Battalien, 4th Marines made contact with an estimated two VC Companies at (YD 573425). ARVN forces also made contact with VC forces. Intelligence gained from VC captives taken indicated that Marine and ARVN forces were in contact with the 806th Battalien and elements of the 812th Battalien. The VC breke centact on the 26 of June and Operation JAY continued until 29 June when authority to conclude the operation was given. However, before the forces involved could leave the field, an ARVN convey manned by the 2d Vietnamese Marine Battalien was ambushed on National Route #1 at (YD 503360) and Marine and ARVN ferces went to its assistance. Heavy contact with an estimated VC Battalien was made. Intelligence gained from two VC captured by Marine ferces and three VC captured by ARVN ferces indicated that the VC force in contact was the 802d Battalien plus support companies of the 6th Regiment. The VC breke centact and withdrew during the night of 29-30 June. VC lesses from the commencement of the operation until the ambush of the convey at 290815 were 82 KIA confirmed, 264 KIA probable, 3 VCC, 18 VCS and 12 weapons captured. As a result of the action to assist the ambushed convey the final VC lesses during the operation were 113 KIA confirmed, 259 KIA probable, 5 VCC, 18 VCS and 17 weapons captured.
- 4. The 3d Interrogation Translation Team provided a sub-team in support of Ist Battalion, 1st Marines during the period 4 through 30 June. On 7 June the sub-team assigned to 3d Battalion, 9th Marines during operation GEORGIA was detached. During the month of June the 3d Interrogation Translation





Team processed 196 captives at the 3d Marine Division Cellection Point, of which 129 were determined to be VC associated.

- 5. The 3d Counterintelligence Team conducted 42 interregations of VC and WCS during the month. Members of the team participated in two search and clear operations, twelve special inquiries and continued menitering the local political situation.
- 6. Major projects conducted during the month of June included a directed reconnaissance effort of the Cam Io District in Quang Tri Prevince. This effort is a result of numerous, lew level agent reports and has as its purpose the determination of whether or not large scale NVA infiltration across the DMZ is taking place.
- 7. The final cumulative VC lesses inflicted by Marines for the month of June were 310 KIA confirmed, 449, KIA probable and 20 VC captured, 1 returnee, 228 VCS and 36 weapons captured.



OPERATIONS

- 1. General. A total of 9.143 offensive actions were conducted by the Division during the month of June resulting in 688 contacts with the Viet Cong. Again weather conditions during the month were favorable for the conduct of effensive operations. The Division conducted seven major operations during the month. These were operations ATHENS, BEAVER, RENO, FLORIDA, DODGE, JAY and TURNER. In addition, extensive search and destroy and search and clear operations were conducted in the seuthern sector of the Damang TACR under the operation code name of LIBERTY. A brief summary of the major operations follows:
- a. ATHENS. Operation ATHENS was a battalien search and destrey eperation conducted in Phu Lec District, Thua Thien Prevince vicinity of (YD)9702). The eperation was conducted during the period of 15 May 1966 to 25 June 1966. The mission assigned was to search out and destrey enemy forces in the area and prevent enemy passage from the mountain areas to the area northeast of the Hue Phu Bai TACR. The 3dBm, 4thMar commanded by LtCol S. A. VALE, was the participating unit and the command and control headquarters. Contact with the enemy was considered very light throughout the operation as Marine units conducted vigorous patrols and search and destrey operations. Results of operation ATHENS were:

b. BEAVER. Operation BEAVER was a battalion size search and destroy operation conducted in the Co Bi Than Tan area (YD 5330), Phong Dien District, Thua Thien Prevince, during the period 010001H June to 091155H June 1966. The 2dBn, 1stMar was the participating unit commanded by LtCel R. E. HANIFIN, Jr. Contact with the enemy was light throughout the operation and final results were as fellows:

c. FLORIDA. Operation FLORIDA was a regimental size search and destroy

eperation conducted in the same vicinity as eperation BEAVER (Co Bi Than Tan area) YD 5028, Phong Dien District. 4th Marines, under the command of Colonel D. W. SHERMAN, was the command and control headquarters for this eperation. Units participating were 2dBn, lstMar, 2dBn(-), 4thMar and 3dBn(-), 12thMar, plus combat supporting units of tanks, recon, engineers and meter transport. The 1st Marine Air Wing provided air support. This was a coordinated operation with the 1st ARVN Division. The operation commenced at 091630H and terminated at 120800H June 1966. As in operation BEAVER, contact with the enemy was light and final results were:

d. RENO. Operation RENO was a reconnaissance in force operation conducted by the 2dBn, 4thMar in the Deng Ha area (YD 2459) Gio Linh, Cam Lo and Thien Pheng Districts, Quang Tri Province during the period 300845H May to 091630H June 1966. Headquarters, 4th Marines was the command and control headquarters for this operation. The mission was to conduct reconnaissance in force operations to determine the location, strength, identity and activity of any enemy forces operating in the Deng Ha area. Contact with the enemy was light and the operation resulted in three VC KIA and no friendly casualties.

e. <u>DODGE</u>. Operation DODGE was a search and destrey eperation conducted in the Phu Thu District (YD 8524), Thua Thien Prevince during the period of 170730H to 231400H June 1966. The operation was conducted by the 2dBn, 4thMar and elements of the 1st ARVN Division. Again enemy resistance was light and operation DODGE terminated with the following results:

f. TURNER. Operation TURNER was a company size raid conducted in the vicinity of A Shau (YC 4983), Nam Hea District, Thua Thien Prevince. The

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mission of the raiding party was to destroy abandoned ammunition in the vicinity of the abandoned A Shau Special Forces Camp. Company "I", 3dBm, 4thMar under command and control of Headquarters, 4thMar conducted the operation during the period 230635H to 230915H June 1966. The company was divided into two raiding parties since the ammunition to be destroyed was located in two separate areas. Both raiding parties were landed by hele in their respective IZ's at 230700H and commenced preparation of the ammunition for demolitions. At 230845H the heles returned to pick up the raiding parties and all treeps were extracted by 230855H. The last ammunition, set with a time fuze, was detonated at 230900H. All units returned to Phu Bai at 230915H. There were no friendly casualties nor was there any contact with the enemy.

g. JAY. Operation JAY was a search and destroy operation conducted in Phong Dien District, Thus Thien Prevince (YD 5642) during the period 250800H June to 021300H July 1966. The operation was conducted as a result of intelligence gained from LAMSON 283, an ARVN operation conducted southeast of Quang Tri City: Headquarters, 4th Marines was the command and control headquarters for the operation. Units participating included 2dBn, 4thMar; 3dBn, 4thMar; 2dBn, 1stMar and 3dBn, 12thMar. JAY was a coordinated operation with the 1st ARVN Division. On the afternoon of 25 June, 2dBn, 4thMar made centact with an estimated two VC companies in the vicinity of YD 5643. It was later estimated that the VC unit was a battalien. Elements of the ARVN Division also made contact with this same unit and the engagement continued throughout the night. Naval gun fire, artillery and air strikes were called on the enemy positions with excellent coverage. Two large secondary explosions were observed and the VC appeared to be running in confusion sessarch and destroy eperations continued on the 27th and it was apparent that the VC were attempting to break contact and exfiltrate the area. By 261800H June contact with the enemy was light and amounted to sporadic exchanges of small arms fire. Deliberate search and destroy operations continued with light contact until 290830H when information was received that a Vietnamese Marine convoy had been ambushed by an unknown number of VC on Highway #1 (YD 5035). Elements of the 1st ARVN Division and the 4th Marines were dispatched to make contact with the VC and assisted the ambushed convoy. Heavy fighting continued through the morning and air strikes were called on several VC units with excellent results. At 291045H Company Bo 3d Anti-tank Battalion observed a large number of VC in the open and took them under fire with receilless rifles resulting in 12 VC KIA (Cenf). The VC again breke contact and the operation continued with no further significant action. The eperation terminated at 021300H July 1966. Results of operation JAY were:

- 2. Headquarters, 1st Marine Regiment arrived in Damang at 070930H June 1966 and operational centrel was assumed by the 3d Marine Division at that time. On 150800 June the 1st Marines assumed respensibility for the southeast sector of the Damang TAOR with the 1st and 3d Bms, 1stMar assigned.
- 3. A total of four Rough Rider conveys were conducted between Danang and Phu Bai during the menth. One Rough Rider convey was conducted between Phu Bai and Dong Ha. Three Rough Rider convoys were conducted between Danang and Tam Ky. All convoys were executed without incident.

2. INTRA DIVISION TRAINING

- a. Schooling on use of personnel detector, chemical was conducted for a period of 21 days by the Limited War Laboratory Training Team for students from 3d Division.
- b. AN/PPS-6 Radar demonstrations were presented by a team from the Development Center, Quantico of the AN/PPS-6 for members of the 3d Marine Division.
- c. 2,559 Division personnel made use of the HOA CAM Range facility during the month of June. Personnel fired individual and crew served weapons for familiarization and zeroing.

COMBAT AIR SUPPORT

1. Significant Events

- a. Operation BEAVER began on 1 June with 8 CH-46's of HMM-265 lifting 195 Marines of 2/1 into the Co Bi Thanh Tan area. Small arms fire was received but no aircraft were hit. Four F-4's of MAG-11 covered the lift under the control of 2 armed UH-1E's of VMO-2.
- b. At 1753H on 5 June 4 A-4's of VMA-211 were diverted from their prebriefed Steel Tiger target to attack several 37mm AA guns near route nine. The flight destroyed 1 gun position, damaged another, and triggered a secondary explosion with heavy black smoke rising to 900 feet. During the night 2 F-4's, 2 F-8's and 4 A-4's struck targets in the same area on search and destroy missions.
- c. Operation FLORIDA commenced on 9 June with 16 F-4's providing 45 minute IZ prep followed by 12 CH-46's helo lifting 940 Marines of 2/1 and 2/4 into the IZ while 6 F-4's provided cover. A daily requirement of 4 UH-34's for Med-Evac/Resupply, 6 UH-34's for reaction force, and 2 UH-1E's for TAC(A)/Command and Control was provided. On 10 June 10 UH-34's of HMM-161 lifted 273 troops without incident in addition to lifting 126 troops and 17.5 tons of cargo with resupply aircraft. FICRIDA secured on 12 June with 8 CH-46's hauling 16,700 lbs. of cargo and 462 troops from the ISA to PHU BAI. Close air support target damage assessment was 2.50 caliber machine gun positions destroyed and one secondary explosion.
- d. Operation DODGE began on 18 June with 180 Marines moved into the operating area followed on 19 June by 350 Marines and 205 more on 20 June. Fixed wing escort was used on all helo lifts. A daily requirement for 2 UH-34's for Med-Evac/Resupply, 10 UH-34's for reaction force and 2 UH-1E's for TAC(A)/Command and Control was provided. On 23 June Operation DODGE secured with 12 UH-34's lifting 504 Marines from the operating area with 4 F-4's providing cover.
- e. Operation TURNER began at 0630 on 23 June as 6 CH-46's of HMM-164 escorted by 2 armed UH-1E's of VMO-2 lifted 80 Marines from Phu Bai to A shau. Fixed wing cover was provided by 9 F-4's and 3 A-4's. UH-1E's controlled 2 F-4's in an air strike with one gun position destroyed. At 0850 the CH-46's retracted the Marines upon completion of mission.
- f. Operation JAY began on 25 June when 20 CH-46's of HMM-265 and 114 UH-34's of HMM-161 lifted 987 Marines of 2/1, 2/4, and 3/4 and 385 ARVN into operating area. UH-1E's of VMO-2 acted as TAC(A) with 4 A-4's providing cover. Hostile fire was received by fixed wing and helicopters throughout the day. One F-8 and 1 F-4 were hit and returned to DANANG without further incident. At 1620 1 UH-34 of HMM-161 was shot down while on a Med-Evac mission and the aircraft was immediately destroyed by fire. Four crewmen received serious injuries from burns and were evacuated by VMO-2 UH-1E's despite heavy ground fire. Fixed wing support consisted of 6 F-8



and 4 F-4 sorties. On this date 10 H-34's of MAG-16 also lifted 165 Marines at 0700 and 140 Marines at 1300 from 9th Marines. Both helicopter lifts were escorted by fixed wing aircraft. On 26 June fixed wing support for Operation JAY consisted of 4 F-8, 13 F-4, and 10 A-4 sorties which destroyed 30 structures during the day. On 28 June 10 F-4's and 6 A-4's accounted for 16 KIA (confirmed) and 30 KIA (probable) in support of an RVN Marine Corps convoy which was ambushed on Highway one. At 1025 UH-34's of HMM-161 began lift of a 454 man ARVN unit into IZ prepped by 2 F-4's. The lift was completed at 1330H. JAY continued through the end of the month with 10 ASRT sorties being run on 30 June.

- g. Normal support operations to include Med-Evac, resupply, convoy escort, recon inserts and retractions, ASRT bombing and psychological warfare were run on a continuing basis throughout the month.
- 2. New Developments. None.
- 3. Problem Areas. No new problems were encountered during the month of June.

COMMUNICATION-ELECTRONIC

1. Significant Events

- a. Receipt of Fixed Plant Teletype equipment has improved the teletype capability of the ν ivision Communication Center.
- b. Four (4) technicians were provided to FISG "A" Electronics Maintenance to assist in the installation of electronics parts. Over 380 items of communications electronics equipment were removed from deadline.

LOGISTICS

1. Significant Events

- a. Pelitical unrest in Danang and Hue reas subsided and resupply of Division units returned to normal. The City ramp at Hue continues to be utilized for the majority of the resupply eperations for the Phu Bai AOR.
- b. A 10 section causeway was installed at Red Beach on 27 June 1966. The causeway can accommedate LST and smaller lighterage.
- c. Bridge Ramp near the Danang river bridge became eperational for loading/unleading LST's en 29 June 1500. Upon completion 2 LST's, 4 LCU's and 2 barges can be accommodated simultaneously.
- d. At the close of this period there were 52 separate items on the Red Ball program. This is a decrease of 12 items reported in May.
- e. Final turnever of 8 LVTP5Al FY-66 R&E vehicles was accomplished during this period, completing the FY-66 R&E program.
 - f. Ten Tanks, M48A3 were turned ever for R&E during this period.
- g. 1 LWTP5, 2 ONTOS (1 Code X) and 4 M48A3 tanks were damaged as the result of enemy action.

2. New Developments

- a. A second Division Supply Management Team has been formed which will permit more visits to organic units to assist them in resolving supply problems and uncovering any existing discrepancies.
- b. A fresh water system consisting of a six inch water main which provides treated water pumped from the Song Can Do to elevated storage tanks in the Division CP became operational.

3. Preblem Areas

a. There are 1214 items presently on the problem items list published by FIC. Of this tetal, 383 have been problem items for four consecutive menths or longer.



DIVISION CHAPLAIN

- 1. The menth of June began with 28 chaplains in the 3d Marine Division (Rein) plus four chaplains with 1st Marine Regiment under eperational control of 3d Marine Division. Chaplain FRANKLIN was retated to CONUS in June and Chaplains ONDO, SIMS, and MCPARTLAND joined the Division from CONUS. Chaplain BROWN was transferred from 3d Marine Division to FLSG & Deaving 29 chaplains in the 3d Marine Division as the menth ended.
- 2. Chaplain John CRAVEN, Floet Marine Ferce, Pacific Chaplain, visited Vietnam from 11-15 June and the Division Chaplain erganized a briefing for him on chaplain matters. Chaplain CRAVEN speke at the dedication of the 9th Meter Transport Battalion Chapel on 12 June.
- 3. Sunday Divine Services for June totaled 339 with an attendance of 7880. There were 434 weekday services with 6011 attending.

CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

1. General

- a. Documents published by this section and civil affairs situation reports submitted by subordinate commands are enclosed as follows:
 - (1) Division Civil Affairs Newsletter Number 8.

- b. One 8 June 1966 the 29th Civil Affairs Company of the U.S. Army joined III Marine Amphibious Force with six civil affairs plateons and a variety of functional area teams. One plateon has been assigned to each infantry regiment and the functional teams are retained in general support, available on request.


2. Highlights

- a. <u>Civil Government</u>. The civil government at QUANG NAM Prevince began early in the month of June to function with the return of Dr. CHI, the Prevince Chief, to his post in HOI AN (BT 145570).
- b. Public Health. Liaisen is being established with public health efficials at province and each district in which 3d Marine Division units are working for the purpose of assisting the Ministry of Health and its programs of improved wells and heads. 3d Marine Division units are also assisting the health efficials by distributing posters and banners extelling the virtues of good hygiene and sanitation practices.
- c. Public Education. The classroom construction program is progressing slower than expected. III Marine Amphibious Force being unable to provide the necessary construction materials has advised this command to attempt to obtain coment and reofing for the program from the USAID province representatives, and such arrangements have been made with QUANG NAM Province and will complete pleted with THUA THIEN Province. Sufficient coment has been obtained to keep the earth block construction operation continuing. The earth blocks for the schools are being constructed by refugees under the supervision of the 7th Engineer Battalion. Liaison is being maintained with education officials in both provinces to insure that sufficient numbers of text books and teachers are available when the classrooms are completed.
- d. Commerce and Industry. The location of the 3d Battalion, 9th Marines in the AN HOA Industrial Complex has previded sufficient security for the commencement of coal mining operations. 3d Tank Battalion is continuing construction of a model market place in PHONG BAC hamlet, HOA THO Village. The development of such commercial centers will do much to stimulate the commerce of the area. 3d Battalion, 1st Marines is planning a similar project in the hamlet of AN TRACH.
 - e. Feed and Agriculture. Excellent rapport established between the

USAID assistant prevince representative for agriculture of Quang Nam Province and 3d Marine Division Civic Action Officers from battalion to Division level has resulted in increased activity of Agriculture Ministry personnel throughout the Danang TAOR. Civic Action efficers have arranged through USAID for agreements, animal husbandry personnel, National Agriculture Credit Organization (NACO) personnel and Farmers Association representatives to visit lecal efficials and farmers to inform them of services effered by the Ministry of Agriculture.

- f. Public Transportation. The construction and improvement of reads and bridges in support of military operations serve secondarily to improve the civilian transportation system. From a civic action point of view the most significant accomplishment this month was repair of a bridge on route #14 (AT 914578) near Dai Loc District Headquarters. At noon on 25 June the bridge could handle only foot and very light vehicular traffic. The 3d Engineer Battalion began work and by near on 26 June it was capable of accommodating vehicles of 5 ten capacity.
- g. Refugees. Military eperations in Dai Loc and Duc Duc District generated a large number of refugees who gathered in the vicinity of the Dai Lod District Headquarters (AT 917578). On 23 June the Commanding General, 3d Marine Division and the Division G-5 efficer met with the Prevince Chief, Quang Nam Province, and the USAID representative for Quang Nam Province af bai Loc District Headquarters to plan appropriate action. There was an agreement made that USAID and Prevince would previde feed and temporary shelter (amounting to about 150 tens of materials) and that the 3d Marine Division would transport the materials and precure from III Marine Amphibious Force, U. S. Army refugee teams and public health teams to coordinate, supervise and administer care and control of the refugees. The following day 14 men of the 29th Civil Affairs Company, U. S. Army were assigned to this Headquarters for operational control, and the delivery of food was begun. By 28 June 45.7 tons of rice, 6 tons of bulgar wheat, 6000 lbs of clothing, and additional amounts of miscellaneous items had been delivered. On that day it became apparent that the District Chief was not giving full cooperation and that some of the food might be going to people other than refugees. Further shipments were cancelled until such time that District Chief agreed to preper control measures for the feed. It is expected that an effective program will be worked out soon. On about 29 June a report was received that 3000 to 5000 refugees were collecting in the vicinity of Dien Ban District Headquarters (BT 065534). The report was investigated by the Division G-5 and action was taken on 30 June to dispatch a refugee team to that location and provide food commencing on 1 July.
- h. U.S. Vietnamese Relations. On the merning of 23 June a delegation of political, religious, labor and education leaders representing the people of Quang Nam Province called on the Commanding General and Commanding Officers of one 1st, 3d and 9th Marines and presented teken gifts of appreciation for USMC participation in the fight against the Communists. The group was





i. General Analysis. Operation LIBERTY required the vast majority of the Division's time, energy, and resources this month somewhat slowing the civic action momentum in the field. The Division G-5 exploited this opportunity to strengthen the base of operation by establishing increased rapport with the Vietnamese authorities and USAID officials in the Quang Nam Province Capital, Hoi An. Operation LIBERTY has succeeded in wresting about 156,077 people from VC control and thus presents the largest civil affairs challenge yet encountered by any USMC command. With the doctrine thus far developed and the added civil affairs capability, this command is well prepared to handle that challenge.



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c. Attachments and detachments. Effective for planning on receipt and execution on order.

d. Assumptions.

- (1) Increased enemy use of the HAPPY VALLEY area (Vic ZC 1667 AT 8167 AT 8163 ZC 1663) will be detected and confirmed by one or more of several sources. Enemy use will be as a base camp, way-station, storage area, training area, or combination of these.
- (2) Forces required will be available.
- (3) GVN authorities will approve establishment of a USMC operating area in the HAPPY VALLEY area for a period of up to two (2) weeks.
- (4) Arc Light strikes of targets nominated in the HAPPY WALLEY area will be approved and struck.
- 2. MISSION. Commencing on date to be announced, 3d Marine Division conducts deliberate search and destroy operations, in Infantry Battalion (Rein) strength, in the HAPPY VALLEY operating area, to locate and destroy Viet Cong installations (buildings, equipment, etc.) and VC forces found in the area by methodical exploitation of Arc Light strikes.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of operations.

- (1) Commencing on D-2 or D-1 Day (as required), one Infantry Company, reinforced with recomnaissance and engineer Marines, moves overland to arrive at Hill 310 (AT 862666) not later than I-2 hours on D-Day. After Arc Light strikes, company moves to nearest target area and conducts methodical and deliberate search and destroy operation throughout that target area. Upon completion, and on order, company conducts similar search and destroy operation in next target area. On completion, company (rein) returns to DANANG TAOR base via helicopter or foot, as ordered.
- (2) At I-Hour on D-Day, the battalion (rein) less two companies lands by helicopter in LZ at (2C 1566), establishes operating base, and commences methodical and deliberate search and destroy operation in nearest Arc Light target area. After juncture with company (rein) moving from North, conduct similar search and destroy operations in remaining Arc Light target area and in all draws leading South from HAPPY VALLEY, from (ZC 1166) to (ZC 1766).

Upon completion and on order, return by helicopter or on foot to DANANG TAOR base.

(3) At L+3 Hour on D-Day, one company (rein) lands by helicopter in IZ at (201672) and conducts search and destroy operations to the Southwest down the valley toward HAPPY VALLEY and juncture with the battalion (-) therein.

b. Bn. 3d Marines (Rein).

- (1) On D=2 or D=1, as required to arrive at Hill 310 (AT 862666) not later than L=2 hours on D=Day, one company, reinforced with reconnaissance elements and engineer detachment, commence movement overland along axis (AT 9366 = AT 8666). Upon arrival at Hill 310, permit no elements West of that hill until after Arc Light strikes have occurred. After the Arc Light strikes, move the entire company (rein) to target area #1, establish operating base, and conduct methodical and painstaking search and destroy operation in the target area. On order, proceed to target area #2, establish operating base, and conduct similar search and destroy operation in that area. Upon completion of search and destroy operations, be prepared to return to base camp within DANANG TAOR by helicopter or on foot.
- (2) At L-Hour on D-Day land the reinforced battalion, less two (2) reinforced companies, in LZ at (2C 1566).

 Simultaneously castablish operating base and initiate methodical and painstaking search and destroy operation, in reinforced company strength, in Arc Light target area #4. Effect juncture with reinforced company moving from North. After juncture, conduct coordinated search and destroy operation in target area #3 and in draws entering HAPPY VALLEY from the South from (2C 1166) to (2C 1766). After thereas coverage of all target areas and draws, be prepared for return to base camp in DANANG TAOK by helilift, foot march, or both.
- (3) At L#3 Hour on D-Day, land one reinforced company in IZ at (ZC 1672). Conduct detailed search and destroy operations from IZ to mouth of North-South valley where effect juncture with battalion (-) in HAPPY VALLEY. In move South down the North-South valley, search draws entering that valley, with emphasis on those entering from the West.
- (4) Take VC/NVA prisoners alive when possible.

- (5) Determine location, strength, identity, and movement of VC units; locate assembly areas, training and logistic bases, and infiltration routes. Capture supplies and destroy facilities. When practicable, evacuate captured food and medical supplies to HIEU DUC District Hqs or 3d Marines Hqs, to be delivered to appropriate GVN authority. Insure that all Marines are familiar with the contents of reference (e).
- (6) Exploit to the maximum all contacts.
- (7) Conduct extensive night ambush operations on flanks and in rear.



1. SITUATION

- Enemy Forces. Ref (a) and current INTSUM's.
- Friendly Forces. No change. b.

- MISSION. Effective 070800H JUN 66 3d MarDiv conducts a maximum effort offensive within the Da Nang TAOR to destroy VC forces, facilities and influence within the TAOR and occupy, clear and control present uncleared areas to the limit of advance (Annex A Opn Overlay); conducts COUNTY FAIR type operations and local security in semi-cleared areas; defends vital installations; and conducts reconnaissance operations in designated reconnaissance zones.

EXECUTION 3。

a. Concept of Operation. This Division conducts a closely controlled and coordinated, heavily supported offensive operation involving all units on the perimeter of the Da Nang TAOR in a deliberate, detailed, systematic and thorough clearing of VC forces and complete destruction of VC facilities and influence within the TAOR. For purposes of this operation, three types of areas are designated, cleared, semi-cleared, and uncleared (Annex A Overlay). The outer line defining the semi-cleared area is designated the front line. The operation will be conducted essentially

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as a conventional, linear type attack of all forward units, adjacent units coordinating, to push the front line forward from its present position in a deliberate search and clear operation, to include the cordon and search of every hamlet in zone, coupled with complete demolition and destruction of actual or potential VC tactical locales. The major effort and priority of combat support is to units moving south. To achieve maximum support for this operation only minimum necessary forces will be utilized to secure or support rear areas. Phase lines and the limit of advance for this operation are indicated on the operations over-Target date for completion of operation is 30 June 1966. On completion of operations, newly cleared areas will be consolidated in preparation for the monsoon. Concurrently, COUNTY FAIR type operations will be conducted on suitable targets within the semi-cleared area, security will be maintained on installations in semi-cleared and cleared areas, and reconnaissance operations will be conducted in designated reconnaissance zones.

b. 3d Marines

- (1) Attack south and west to seize that portion of phase line AMBER within TAOR; conduct deliberate, detailed search and clear operation.
- (2) Continue the attack on order to seize that portion of phase line GREEN in TAOR.
- (3) Conduct COUNTY FAIR operations on suitable targets in semi-cleared area.

c. 9th Marines

- (1) Attack south to seize that portion of phase line AMBER within TAOR; conduct deliberate, detailed search and clear operation.
- (2) Continue the attack on order to seize that portion of phase line GREEN in TAOR.
- (3) Conduct holding operation in AN HOA area using a two company battalion to provide security for the immediate industrial area.

- (4) Conduct COUNTY FAIR operations on suitable targets in semi-cleared area.
- (5) Establish personnel control check point at intersection of routes 1 and 14 (BT 055588).

d. 12th Marines

- (1) Provide artillery support.
- (2) Authorized to displace artillery within the TAOR to facilitate artillery support as required.
 - (3) Priority of fires to units moving south.

e. Coordinating Instructions

- (1) Essential elements of the attack. See Annex A (Operation Overlay).
- (2) Maintain minimum forces necessary for security of installations in cleared areas.
- (3) A small number of provisional platoons from separate battalions are available on request for use in defense of fixed installations to permit the release of infantry units for this operation.
 - (4) Report front line positions daily by 1800.
- (5) Establish effective river control procedures to include barriers and blocks at critical locations.
- (6) Establish personnel control check points, in conjunction with ARVN elements as available, at critical locations on roads, trails, and other lines of personnel drift. Report locations as established.
 - (7) RCA authorized within TAOR.
- (8) This order effective for planning on receipt; execution at 070800H.
 - (9) DIRLAUTH all participants.
- 4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS. In accordance with reference (a).

1. Reference (a) directs an operation be conducted on a date to be specified after 15 June 1966 into the abandoned A SHAU Special Forces Camp for the purpose of destroying unexploded widnance within the same and one pallst of errant air-delivered supplies located to the West of the camp perimeter.

- 2. Accordingly, not later than 18 June 1966, submit for approval your operations plan in accordance with the following:
 - a. MISSION. Fourth Marine Regiment conducts a raid into the abandoned A SHAU Special Forces Camp with minimum required forces in order to destroy unexpended grenades and mortar and artillery ammunition thereat and to destroy one pallet of air-delivered supplies located approximately 150 meters West of the western tip of the camp.
 - b. CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS. The raid force, consisting of one platoon of infantry, reinforced with machine guns, M-72 LAAVs, and at least one 60mm mortar and crew plus one FAC Team, an 11 man team of EOD Marines, and a mine detection team from 3d Engineer Battalion (equipped with AN/PRS - 4 detector), organized into a tactical defense unit and a demolition unit, lands as early in the morning as weather and light conditions permit, by helo, in selected LZs in vicinity of Camp A SHAU. Tactical defense unit takes defensive/observation positions around camp while demolition unit proceeds inside camp : (preceded by mine detecting team), and assembles and prepares all unexploded ordnance found in the camp for demolition. One demolition

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party proceeds, with security from tactical defense unit, to location of errant re-supply package off the west apex of the camp and prepares that package for demolition. After dropping troops in LZs, helos return to PHU BAI and standby with reserve unit, prepared to launch for extraction of raid party (or for reinforcement) on 5 minutes notice. An AO in a O-IE and a one-section CAS mission remain over target area throughout operation with additional attack aircraft on strip alert. On signal, troops re-assemble, demolitions are fired, and, after the detonation, helos land and extract raid party. Expected duration of operation 2-4 hours.

- c. CONTROL. Vested in CO, 4th Marines. Request needed support not organic to your command from this Headquarters.
- d. DEMOLITIONS. Estimated 400 pounds.

e. ASSUMPTIONS

- (1) Weather will permit helicopter operations in and enroute to A SHAU for a manimum period of 4 hours in the latter half of the month of June; and that this favorable weather period can be forecast.
- (2) There will be no organized enemy in A SHAU camp or within 2 kilometers thereof at the time of initiation of the operation.
- f. RESERVE. Provide for a raid reserve to be standing by, for quick reinforcement if needed, at PHU BAI. Helicopters to be on Condition II alert for purpose of executing retraction or of transporting reinforcements to the A SHAU area.

g. MISCELLANEOUS PRECAUTIONS

- (1) Ordnance may be booby-trapped.
- (2) Camp perimeter trenches and external trails may be mined.
- (3) Avoid defensive minefields.
- (4) RCA authorized.
- (5) Designate alternate LZ for retraction should primary LZ be untenable.

Major SWINNEY, G-2 Combat Intelligence Officer, has additional information concerning the A SHAU area. He is prepared to visit your headquarters to assist you at any time convenient to you.

1. SUMMARY OF ENEMY SITUATION

a. General. Since A SHAU Special Forces Camp was overrun on 11 March by the 95B NVA Regiment, little enemy activity has been reported in this area. Photography taken on 24 May 1966 indicated that prepared positions in the area were unoccupied. Special Forces personnel returned to this camp on 18 May for a body recovery operation. The SF personnel received no enemy fire and observed no enemy during the operation which was approximately 40 minutes in duration. (Actual time at the camp.) Their reconnaissance of the camp indicated that the Main Force units had departed immediately following the battle. SF concluded that the only enemy force remaining in the valley area is an estimated company strength unit of hostile Phong tribesmen.

b. Enemy Disposition

- (1) See Appendix 1 (Enemy Situation Overlay).
- (2) No confirmed VC/NVA units are currently known to be located in the immediate vicinity of A SHAU. The location of the 95B NVA Regiment is presently unknown and it is carried as unlocated in Thua Thien Province. An unknown number of guerrillas operate in the area (possibly the previously mentioned Company strength unit of Phong Tribesmen).
- (3) All confirmed VC/NVA units in Thua Thien Province except 95B NVA Regiment are operating in area adjacent to the piedmont area and are not considered within reinforcing distance. The nearest confirmed unit, the 802d Battalion is approximately 20 miles north of A SHAU and would require more than 12 hours to traverse the intervening jungle covered terrain.
- Recent Activities. No VC activity was reported during the past 30 days with the exception of small arms fire directed at aircraft. This fire is believed to be the act of local force/hostile tribesmen in the area. Small arms fire hit 6 of 7 H-34 helicopters in vicinity of (YD 4492) when the SF operation was being withdrawn. No evidence of large organized units has been reported.

d. Enemy Capabilities

(1) Enumeration

- (a) Capability 1 Defend with local guerrilla forces.
- (b) Capability 2 Attack with local guerrilla forces.
- (c) Capability 3 Reinforce with forces up to a regiment in strength.
- (d) Capability 4 Evade major contact and employ harassing tactics.
- (e) Capability 5 Withdraw from or exfiltrate from the area prior to or after commencement of friendly operations.

(2) Analysis and Discussion

- (a) <u>Capability 1</u> Enemy knowledge of the terrain, prepared defensive positions including the camp, and desire to retain control of an important infiltration route, favor adoption of this capability.
- (b) Capability 2 Enemy knowledge of the terrain and covered routes of approach to close proximity of camp favor adoption of this capability. Organization of guerrilla forces and basic guerrilla doctrine militate against any coordinated attack against our superior combat power.
- (c) Capability 3 Recent VC offensive activities in the area and relative freedom of movement through VC controlled area favor reinforcement by the 95B Regiment. Vulnerability of massed forces to our superior supporting fires and increased logistics burden for multi-battalion operations militate against adoption of this capability. The 95B Regiment has remained unlocated since 11 March and it is possible that this unit could be utilized in such a role.
- (d) Capability 4. Basic VC doctrine against superior forces calls for adoption of this capability. Utilization of guerrilla tactice in inflicting maximum damage with minimum risk and avoidance of mass targets favor adoption of this tactic. Enemy knowledge of the terrain and ability to keep the camp under surveillance enhance this capability. The Special Forces operation on 18 May did not observe any VC activity during their brief stay at the camp. However, evidence that VC were in the

area was found (i.e. three deteriorated booby traps were found in the camp and several freshly dug fighting holes were observed). There are no indications that militate against adoption of this capability.

(e) Capability 5 - Enemy knowledge of the transitory nature of our operations, effective intelligence net, and the desire to avoid engagements not of their choosing favor adoption of this capability. The area is populated only by mountain tribes unfriendly to our forces and population control is not at issue. There are no indications militating against adoption of this capability. Withdrawal/exfiltration will only be to the extent required to avoid contact with our forces.

(3) Probable Courses of Action

- (a) In the immediate vicinity of the camp, implement capability 5, withdrawal, in combination with capability 4, harassment.

 Mines, booby traps and small arms fire may be anticipated in the area.
- (b) Implement capability 3, reinforcement and conduct attacks if weather conditions are such that their vulnerability to friendly supporting fires is minimized. The 95B Regiment is the only unit possessing a reinforcement capability in this area, however, there is no present evidence that it is in rapid reaction distance of the camp.

2. CHARACTERISTICS OF THE AREA OF OPERATIONS

- a. <u>Weather</u>. See daily weather forecasts and weather summaries as issued in INTSUMs.
 - (1) Southwest Monsoon (mid-May through September). Night skies are relatively clear over coastal and delta regions. Scattered to broken nocturnal cloudiness, bases 1000 to 2000 feet, can be expected over western mountains. Broken cumulus and scattered cumulonimbus, ceilings 2000 to 3000 feet (obscuring some peaks), can be expected over western mountains during afternoons. Afternoon coastal cloudiness is usually scattered cumulus, bases 2000 to 3000 feet.
 - (2) Fogs are relatively rare along the coastal plain during this season, but up to 5 foggy mornings per month can be expected in sheltered inland river valleys. Fogs form about 0400 local and dissipate by 0900 local.

(3) Thunderstorms can be expected over the area daily. Locally, the coastal plain can expect 7 to 11 thunderstorm days per month, while the western mountains and valleys can expect 15 to 20 local thunderstorm days per month. Thunderstorm activity in the objective area builds rapidly and visibility is reduced quickly.

c. Terrain

- (1) Relief. A SHAU Special Forces Camp is located in a mountain valley oriented northwest to southeast. The valley is interespersed with points of high ground.
- (2) <u>Drainage</u>. The drainage pattern finds numerous streams flowing from the high ground south of the valley northeast into the valley and from the high ground north of the valley, southwest into the valley.

- (3) Vegetation. Dense rainforest with canopies in excess of 60 feet cover mountains and ridges. Elephant grass reaching 8 to 12 feet high covers most of the valley floor around A SHAU Camp. Observation from the ground and air is very difficult and detecting movement of even large units is practically impossible unless they are detected while moving on trails in the valley.
- (4) Critical Terrain. A SHAU Special Forces Camp is surrounded by high ground ranging in height from 1096 meters to 601 meters. Critical terrain is located at coordinates (YC 469826), (YC 508824), (YC 504856), (YC 493845) and (YC 487854). During the battle of A SHAU the VC utilized this critical terrain for emplacing antiaircraft, mortar, 57 recoilless rifle and machinegums.
- (5) Helicopter Landing Suitability
 - (a) See Appendix 2 (Helicopter Landing Zones).
 - (b) Helicopters that transported the USASF personnel conducting the 18 May mission reported that the helicopters landed in the area northeast of the Special Forces Camp and between the camp and the airstrip. The airstrip has been cratered by the VC. The USASF personnel did not recommender the airstrip, but, from a distance, could not observe any booby trapping of the strip.




