PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARYPERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION1. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

a. During the month of May, 161 officers and 948 enlisted personnel joined the Division. Personnel transferred by normal rotation included 81 officers and 934 enlisted. Personnel transferred by service records due to MedEvacs were 22 officers and 749 enlisted. Other personnel transferred by service records included 2 officers and 18 enlisted.

b. Award recommendations to FMFPac: 1 Medal of Honor, 5 Navy Crosses, 33 Silver Stars, 10 Legion of Merit Medals, 124 Bronze Stars, 13 Air Medals, 106 Navy Commendation Medals, 1 Secretary of the Navy Commendation for Achievement Medal, 1 Distinguished Flying Cross and 1 Navy and Marine Corps Medal. Approved by FMFPac: 1 Medal of Honor, 6 Navy Crosses, 13 Silver Stars, 1 Legion of Merit Medal, 63 Bronze Stars, 3 Air Medals, 81 Navy Commendation Medals, 1 Distinguished Service Medal and 2 Navy and Marine Corps Medals. In addition, 1649 Purple Hearts were presented.

c. Casualties sustained during the month included: 317 KIA, 2158 WIA, 18 DOW, 7 NHD and 57 NHI.

d. Congressional Interest Cases: 132 cases processed, 90 cases completed, 17 cases pending and 25 cases readdressed to other commands.

e. Discharges: 6 Hardship Discharges approved, 6 Hardship Discharges to CMC for decision, 2 Hardship Discharges pending, 1 Unsuitable Discharge approved, 1 Unsuitable Discharge Disapproved, 1 Unfitness Discharge approved and 1 Unsuitable Discharge pending.

2. EXCHANGE SERVICE

a. On 10 May, a physical inventory was conducted throughout the Exchange Service. On 11 May, the Exchange reopened for business.

b. A total of 533 pallets of general merchandise and 325 pallets of soft drinks have been received by the Exchange during the period.

c. Total sales for the month of May were \$469,673.45.

3. POSTAL

a. During the period all fourteen stationary and mobile units continued to provide service to members of the command.

b. The interior construction of the Division Post Office was started and completed during this period.

c. On 31 May 1967, a daily helilift was established to transport U. S. mail from Phu Bai to Khe Sanh on a daily basis. This will eliminate the necessity for transshipment to Khe Sanh via Dong Ha and will speed delivery of U. S. mail to members of this command operating in that area.

Phu Bai did not receive air letter mail 3, 4 and 29 May 1967 and no mail was received on 1, 7, 10, 14, 17, 23, 26 and 27 May 1967. However, this mail was received with the following days mail with the exception of Phu Bai mail for the 3d, 4th, 26th and 27th of May. All backlogged mail for these four days was received on the second day following non-receipt.

d. On 5 May, GySgt J. T. JENNINGS, USMC was appointed as Treasurer of the Enlisted Club vice Sergeant A. ZAJEC, USMC.

#### 5. INFORMATIONAL SERVICES

a. The section continued press coverage of the 3d Marine Division activities, releasing 111 news, feature articles and photographs through the Information Office, III Marine Amphibious Force. Also, a total of 1,002 home town releases were sent to the Fleet Home Town News Center, Great Lakes, Illinois.

b. A total of 28 civilian news correspondents visited the Phu Bai area during the month; 146 newsmen visited the Khe Sanh area, and 267 visited the Dong Ha area.

c. The Radio-TV section turned out a total of 618 minutes and 40 seconds of tape recorded coverage. This breaks down to a total of 398 minutes on Fleet Home Town News interviews and 220 minutes and 40 seconds as special features of 3d Marine Division Combat actions.

#### 6. SPECIAL SERVICES

a. Fifteen trucks of Special Services gear and equipment arrived at Phu Bai from the warehouse in Danang. The remainder of the warehouse is scheduled to be moved to Phu Bai via LCU by 4 June 1967, which should complete the re-location of the 3d Marine Division Special Services from Danang to Phu Bai.

b. Athletic gear for construction of a Physical Fitness Center was received during the period.

c. 12,200 writing portfolios were issued to units in the Dong Ha and Khe Sanh areas for distribution to forward units.

d. Authorization was received from the Commandant of the Marine Corps to extend the current accounting period to 15 September 1967, to coincide with the relief of the Custodian.

e. A Division Order establishing a beach recreation area at Thuan-An (Col Co Island), has been published. The facilities include swimming, boating, fresh water showers and a hot meal. Four boats; one 14' runabout, one sailboat, 21', and two sailboats (sailfish) were issued to the 3d Shore Party Battalion for use at the beach.

f. Division Education. During the month, 133 High School GED tests and 47 college (CCT-GE) tests were administered. Testing was conducted in the Phu Bai and Dong Ha areas.

i. A total of 500 messages were sent by the Division MARS Station. 1007 phone patches were placed to the states; of these, 35 were placed for patients at the 3d Medical Battalion.

6. The 1st Counterintelligence Team interrogated 139 persons during the month of May 1967. One hundred thirty persons were released as innocent civilians, one person was a rallier who was debriefed, eight persons were found to be VC, seven of those were detained by the Phu Loc District Chief and one was delivered to PMO. The Team continued to support Operation SHAWNEE/CHOCTAW with one Sub-Team (1 officer, 2 enlisted, and 1 interpreter). One Sub-Team is in support of CAC Hotel units in Phu Loc District (1 officer, 1 enlisted, and 1 interpreter). One enlisted member is working with the Special Branch National Police, Hue City. One Sub-Team is in support of the 26th Marines, Khe Sanh (1 officer, 2 enlisted, and 1 interpreter). The Team maintained liaison at district, village, and hamlet level in Huong Thuy, Phong Dien, and Phu Loc. Liaison continues with U.S. and Vietnamese intelligence and security agencies in Hue City.

7. The 15th Counterintelligence Team provided general support to all units participating in Operation PRAIRIE IV and Operation HICKORY. On the 5th and 10th of May, Detachment "B", 15th CI Team provided support to "A" Company, 1st AMTRAC Battalion on search and destroy operations. On 19 May 1967, Detachment "E", 15th CI Team provided support to 2d Platoon, 1st AMTRAC Battalion on a search and destroy operation. The Team initiated 13 penetrations by indigenous sources into VC controlled or semi-controlled areas during May 1967. The Team placed six indigenous agents in the field to establish residences and agent nets. Detachment "A" screened 1,200 refugees in conjunction with mass resettlement of approximately 18,000 refugees. The Team prepared and disseminated 53 CIR's and 39 spot reports of a counterintelligence nature. Ninety detainees were interrogated and processed. The Team attended and presented intelligence briefings, exchanged reports, and maintained liaison with U.S., ARVN and GVN intelligence agencies within Quang Tri Province.

8. The 3d Interpreter team, during the month of May 1967 processed 81 batches of captured documents from which a total of 167 pages of translation were prepared. A total of 227 official documents and 34 friendly documents were handled by the Team and Sub-Teams from which a total of 364 pages and 7 pages of translation were prepared respectively. Members of the team in Dong Ha worked a total of 13 hours in support of GIT, ITT, IRO and Legal. The members of the team attached to the 4th Marines CP worked a total of 28 hours in support of GIT and ITT. The members of the team in Phu Bai worked a total of 21.5 hours in support of Psy Ops and 3/26.

9. The 7th Interrogation Translation Team supported Operation PRAIRIE IV, Operation SHAWNEE, Operation CHOCTAW, and the Command Group at Khe Sanh during the month of May 1967. During May, the Team processed 31 detainees, classifying them as follows:

10. The Aerial Observation Section at Phu Bai flew 137 missions for a total of 289.5 hours; 14 missions were flown in USMC aircraft for a total of 21.7 hours; 123 missions were flown in U.S. Army aircraft for a total of 267.8 hours. The Aerial Observation Section at Dong Ha flew 190 missions for 465.6 hours; 102 missions were flown in USMC aircraft for a total of 243.2 hours; 59 missions were flown in U.S. Army aircraft for a total of 147.1 hours. 29 missions were flown in USAF aircraft for a total of 75.3 hours.

SECRET

OPERATIONS

1. GENERAL. The 3d Marine Division continued operations in Thua Thien and Quang Tri Provinces of South Vietnam in accordance with assigned missions. Division operations during the month were characterized by: The continuation of a search and destroy operation in the Khe Sanh AO with heavy contact; a multi-battalion offensive operation in the southern part of Quang Tri Province; the employment of two Special Landing Forces, and an additional battalion airlifted from Okinawa in the division AOR. SLF B, which concluded operations in the Khe Sanh AO and reembarked on 12 May, landed in helicopter assault in the DMZ in connection with Operation HICKORY at 201100H May. SLF A made an assault landing in the DMZ at 180800H May. The 3d Battalion, 4th Marines was administratively airlifted from Okinawa to Dong Ha, landing at 151600H May.

2. PRAIRIE IV. Operation PRAIRIE IV continued during May with heavy contact. Forces assigned to this major search and destroy operation varied from about two battalions during the Khe Sanh and HICKORY operations, to seven infantry battalions subsequent to operation HICKORY. On 8 May NVA forces attempted to seize the Con Thien Outpost, attacking in battalion strength accompanied by mortar, artillery and rocket attacks against Gio Linh, Dong Ha, Camp Carroll and Con Thien. This attack was defeated with heavy enemy losses. Beginning 17 May, PRAIRIE forces conducted operations in conjunction with Operation HICKORY in areas south of the DMZ and to the west of the Cam Lo-Con Thien axis, and provided fire support. On 18 May a heavy mortar, artillery and rocket attack was made against the Dong Ha Combat Base, Camp Carroll, Cam Lo, Con Thien and Gio Linh; friendly casualties sustained were six killed and 89 wounded. Repeated attacks with these weapons against Gio Linh and Con Thien were sustained throughout the month resulting in light casualties. At the termination of Operation HICKORY, all HICKORY forces were assigned to Operation PRAIRIE and several battalion size operations were continued in areas to the west and south of Con Thien. Operation PRAIRIE IV terminated at 312400H May. Cumulative friendly casualties at the end of the operation were: 164 KIA and 1,240 WIA.

3. HICKORY. Operation HICKORY commenced at 170001H May with the mission of destroying enemy forces and military facilities in the DMZ south of the Ben Hai River and clearing non-combatants from that area. The operation was preceded by a build-up of friendly forces in the Operation PRAIRIE area as follows: 2d Battalion, 26th Marines from SHAWNEE at 151000H May; 3d Battalion, 4th Marines from Okinawa at 151600H May; 2d Battalion, 9th Marines from SHAWNEE at 161545H May. The following battalions were provided from Operation PRAIRIE at the commencement of the operation; 1/4, 1/9 and 3/9. The division command post opened at the Dong Ha Combat Base at 170001H May to control this major operation. Participating regimental control was by the 3d Marines and the 9th Marines, the latter displacing its command post to north of Cam Lo on 17 May. Several operations were conducted in conjunction with Operation HICKORY: PRAIRIE IV, previously mentioned; BEAU CHARGER (SLF A), an amphibious assault by sea

and air from the Gulf of Tonkin into the DMZ south of the Ben Hai River; BELT TIGHT (SLF B), which concluded upon the commitment of its infantry forces (2d Battalion, 3d Marines) by heliborne assault to Operation HICKORY; LAM SON 54, an ARVN five battalion search and destroy operation in the DMZ along the axis from Gio Linh north along national route #1 to the Ben Hai River. Operation HICKORY commenced with the attack northward of two infantry battalions along the Cam Lo - Con Thien axis. At 181130H one infantry battalion was helilifted from Dong Ha to LZ's in the DMZ northwest of Con Thien. At 201100H one infantry battalion was helilifted from amphibious troop carriers to LZ's in the DMZ northeast of Con Thien. Search and destroy operations were conducted throughout the southern portion of the DMZ with the destruction of many enemy fortifications. Operations were suspended during the truce for Buddha's Birthday on 23 May. Subsequent to this truce all HICKORY forces began search and destroy operations south and southwest toward "helicopter valley", with additional battalions attacking northwest toward the "three sisters" hills, holding Con Thien, maintaining security over the operational MSR, Route 561, and destroying previously discovered enemy fortifications in the vicinity of Con Thien. At 282400H May, Operation HICKORY was terminated and the division command post closed at Dong Ha. HICKORY forces remained in the Operation PRAIRIE IV area and reverted to the control of the 3d, 9th or 12th Marines in Operation PRAIRIE IV. During Operation HICKORY free world forces entered the DMZ for the first time. Cumulative friendly casualties at the conclusion of the operation were: 119 KIA and 817 WIA.

4. SHAWNEE. This three battalion search and destroy operation in enemy base area 114 continued during early May. Light contact was made during the search of the enemy base area. The search continued northward through the Hai Lang National Forest area with increased contact and the discovery of several moderately sized enemy base camps and supply caches. Operation SHAWNEE was terminated at 212400H May. Cumulative friendly casualties at the end of the operation were: 13 KIA and 139 WIA.

5. CHOCTAW. Operation CHOCTAW, a multi-battalion search and destroy operation, commenced 220001H May in the Co Bi-Thanh Tan area of Thua Thien Province, under the control of the 4th Marines. Operations in the CHOCTAW area were limited to patrol and ambush actions during the deployment of forces to Operation HICKORY, due to the austerity of forces remaining in the CHOCTAW area. CHOCTAW also provided one rifle company for operations in the Nam Hoa area and security forces for the Quang Tri Provincial Headquarters and the Phong Dien District Headquarters. Operations were characterized by frequent small unit contacts, sniper incidents, and mine and booby trap incidents. No major sightings or contacts were made. The operation was continuing at the end of May. Cumulative friendly casualties as of 312400H May were: 5 KIA and 25 WIA.

6. PHU BAI TAOR. The 3d Battalion, 26th Marines remained as the Phu Bai defense battalion throughout the month. Company size search and destroy

operations were conducted during the month in the Phu Loc, Troui River, and Gia Le areas. A company size search under the control of 3/26 commenced in the Nam Hoa area in support of Company C, 3d Engineer Battalion operations on Route 547 at 151115H May and is continuing. Security operations in support of hydrographic, topographic and road survey operations continue. The 3d Shore Party Battalion commenced security operations in support of dredging activities in the Hue Port area on 15 May. These operations are expected to continue until September. SPARROW HAWK forces from 3/26 were launched on 1, 24 and 30 May as security for the recovery of downed helicopters. The 1st Battalion, 26th Marines arrived in the Phu Bai TAOR from Danang at 060800H May and participated in security operations until its deployment to Khe Sanh 121650H May. The 26th Marines command post remained in Phu Bai until its displacement to Khe Sanh on 13 May.

7. KHE SANH. Operations which had begun on 28 April to destroy enemy forces attempting to seize Khe Sanh continued into early May. Two Battalion search and destroy operations were conducted in the northwest approaches to Khe Sanh, particularly along the ridge lines terminating in Hills 861, 881 north and 881 south. This unnamed operation, employing massive air strikes combined with infantry heliborne and ground assaults succeeded in forcing the enemy to abandon his heavily fortified positions. After the capture of Hills 881 north and 881 south it was determined by extensive reconnaissance activity that the enemy had retired from the battlefield with heavy losses. On 12 May the infantry and artillery elements of SLF B which had been employed in the Khe Sanh operations commenced back-loading aboard amphibious shipping. The 3d Battalion, 3d Marines also commenced movement to Dong Ha and Camp Carroll to resume participation in Operation PRAIRIE IV. Movement was completed by 131500H May when the 26th Marines relieved the 3d Marines of the Khe Sanh area. Cumulative friendly casualties in the Khe Sanh area from the commencement of heavy contact 240001H April until the beginning of Operation CROCKETT 131500H May were: 168 KIA, 436 WIA, and 2 MIA.

8. CROCKETT. Operation CROCKETT commenced 131500H May in the northwest portion of Quang Tri Province (Khe Sanh AO) with a mission to detect and destroy enemy personnel infiltrating into and through the Khe Sanh AO. The operation is controlled by the 26th Marines, who is also designated SOP, 3d Marine Division/CG III MAF Representative, Khe Sanh. This operation, employing one infantry battalion and two artillery batteries, with appropriate reinforcements, was continuing at the end of the month. There was light contact. CROCKETT forces continued to search the AO, destroying enemy fortifications remaining from previous contacts, employing air and artillery against infrequent small unit contacts, and constructing fortified positions on Hill 881 south. Cumulative casualties as of 312400H May were: 2 KIA and 18 WIA.

9. BEAU CHARGER. Operation BEAU CHARGER commenced with the amphibious landing of SLF A in the DMZ 180800H May. Although the operation was controlled by CTG 76.4, it was conducted in conjunction with Operation HICKORY. In the second phase of this operation, BEAU CHARGER forces conducted search and destroy operations along an axis from the DMZ east of Route 1 south to Dong Ha, in the PRAIRIE IV OA. Operation BEAU CHARGER was terminated 261300H May and SLF A reembarked on amphibious shipping. Cumulative friendly casualties at the end of the operation were: 23 KIA and 79 WIA.

10. CUMBERLAND. Operation CUMBERLAND provides for infantry and engineer operations for the up-grading and construction of a land-line of communications from Hue to Route 548 in the A Shau Valley and establishment of an artillery fire support base in the vicinity of coordinates (YD 605085). Heavy commitments in the Khe Sanh and HICKORY areas precluded initiation of the full operation during May. However, security and engineer operations commenced along Route 547 in the Nam Hoa area 151115H May. Operational planning for Operation CUMBERLAND, initially assigned to the 26th Marines, was reassigned to the 4th Marines during May. Forces assigned to the Nam Hoa area preparing for the operation are Company G, 2d Battalion, 9th Marines from the CHOCTAW area and Company B, 3d Engineer Battalion. These operations were continuing at the end of the month.

COMBAT AIR SUPPORT1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

a. Operation PRAIRIE IV continued throughout the month of May with fixed wing aircraft flying 482 sorties and expending 805.1 tons of ordnance. Helicopters in support of PRAIRIE flew 8,121 sorties, lifted 6,895 passengers and 1,033.2 tons of cargo.

b. Operation SHAWNEE ended 21 May. For the period 1-21 May, fixed wing aircraft flew 110 sorties and expended 141.8 tons of ordnance. Also in this period, helicopters flew 939 sorties, lifted 1,090 passengers and 14.7 tons of cargo.

c. Operation CHOCTAW commenced 22 May. During the period 22-31 May, fixed wing aircraft flew 44 sorties and expended 91 tons of ordnance.

d. For Operation HICKORY, 17-28 May, Marine fixed wing aircraft flew 936 CAS sorties, expending 1,511.7 tons of ordnance. Helicopters flew 868 sorties, lifted 1,172 passengers and 121.4 tons of cargo. USAF aircraft also supported this operation with 51 fixed wing sorties flown south of the DMZ, expending 92.8 tons of ordnance. Additionally, USAF aircraft flew an estimated 300 sorties north of the DMZ.

e. In the Khe Sanh area fixed wing aircraft flew 825 sorties and expended 1,601 tons of ordnance.

f. There were 22 Arc Light strikes in Quang Tri Province and 26 strikes in Thua Thien Province.

2. PROBLEM AREAS. Operation HICKORY provided numerous examples of the need for Marine O1 aircraft to be configured with two FM radios and a multi-channel UHF. Units operating in close proximity make it mandatory to monitor them one battalion at a time.

FIRE SUPPORT COORDINATION1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

## a. The Assistant Fire Support Coordinator:

(1) Participated in planning for Operation CUMBERLAND by recommending artillery employment, fire support coordination and communications.

(2) Assisted G-3 Plans officer in the selection of protective barrages for Con Thien contingency plan.

(3) Instituted air control procedures for reduced SHAWNEE Operation by the establishment of daylight Sav-a-Planes and a night time Hot Fan.

(4) Continued to coordinate Traildust (defoliation) missions with 3d MarDiv units.

(5) Established a study and collection of data pertaining to the feasibility of acquisition of metal observation towers.

(7) Assisted in the coordination of supporting arms for Operation BEARBITE with SLF and 3d MarDiv units.

2. TARGETING

a. Artillery. A total of 2291 long range, pre-planned targets were attacked during the month of May.

b. TPQ-10 Missions. A total of 1629 targets were struck by TPQ-10 missions during the month.

c. Naval Gunfire. During the month there were twenty four days of destroyer support, 12 days of heavy cruiser support, and 7 days of light cruiser support.

COMMUNICATION-ELECTRONICS1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

a. Operation HICKORY. The 3d Marine Division Command Post displaced to Dong Ha on 17 May and returned to Phu Bai on 29 May. In order to respond to requirements of the Division Command Post at Dong Ha and combat elements of Operation HICKORY, the following actions were taken:

(1) Displacement of augmentation Communication Company personnel and equipment to Dong Ha.

(2) Installation of two TRC-27 radio relay links from Dong Ha to 9th Marines, Cam Lo.

(3) Installation of radio relay link from 12th Marines at Dong Ha to Con Thien.

(4) Installation of an additional MRC-62 radio relay link from Phu Bai to Dong Ha.

(5) Activation of radio teletype on III MAF Command net.

(6) Activation of additional covered circuit on Division TAC net.

(7) Activation of full duplex TTY circuit with III MAF COC and 3d Marine Division COG, Dong Ha.

(8) Activation of half duplex circuit from 3d Marine Division COG, Dong Ha to 3d Marine Division (Rear) COG, Phu Bai.

(9) Installation of secure voice circuits with the two SLF's.

b. Khe Sanh Operation. To support 3d Marine Division activities in Khe Sanh, communication equipment and personnel at Khe Sanh were augmented and radio relay links were established between Khe Sanh and Hill's 861 and 881.

c. Installation of Fixed Plant Teletype. Five units of fixed plant teletype equipment were received from CONUS during May. These units were used to terminate circuits with 1st Marine Aircraft Wing and III MAF COC, for DCS overload circuit, and for assignment to a NavCommOps set which will be activated by 30 June 1967.

d. 3d Marine Division MARS. Division MARS stations at Phu Bai and Dong Ha passed a total of 500 messages and processed 1571 telephone calls between 3d Marine Division personnel and CONUS, Hawaii, Phillipines, and Okinawa. Additionally a large volume of military and personal traffic was passed over the in-country MARS net.

e. 3d Marine Division AFRS. 3d Marine Division AFRS station was placed on a 24 hour broadcast basis during May.

f. Hue AFRS Television Station. AFRS T.V., with assistance of Division personnel, installed an AFRS Television Station in Hue. This station was activated 15 May 1967 and broadcasts daily from 1730 to 2230 on Channel 11.

g. Communication Facilities Physical Security Improvements. Sandbagging of 3d Marine Division communication generators at Phu Bai was completed during May. To provide additional protection against mortar and artillery attack, 475 pair of underground cable were laid within the Phu Bai Command Post and will be phased in to replace much of the existing overhead cables and wire. All communication facilities in the Dong Ha area were heavily sandbagged and all damaged cable was replaced.

## 2. PROBLEM AREAS

a. Units in 3d Marine Division are critically short on accessories for the AN/PRC-25 radio, including antennas, antenna bases and hand sets. A message has been sent to Commanding General, Force Logistics Command requesting assistance.

b. Great difficulty is being experienced throughout Vietnam in maintaining AN/TGC-14A teletypewriters in an operable condition. The problem is primarily due to lack of spare parts in the supply system. Spare parts are on requisition.

c. During the Division communication group displacement to Dong Ha, it was again apparent that existing switchboard facilities (Six SB-22's) at Dong Ha were inadequate. A request was made to III MAF for permanent augmentation at Dong Ha of a Communication Support Company to provide switching and communication center service for tenant organizations. (3d MarDiv msg 271300Z May 67). In reply, III MAF msg 291316Z May 67 authorizes communication augmentation personnel from 7th Communication Battalion to operate facilities at Dong Ha. Also, information from III MAF indicates that an AN/MTC-1 Switchboard will be provided for Dong Ha approximately 15 June 1967.

d. The Division Air Officer and Communication Officer, Reconnaissance Battalion indicated an urgent requirement existed for a smaller, lighter UHF Transceiver to replace the AN/PRC-41 and suggested the AN/PRC-63 or RT-10A survival radios might be suitable for this purpose. A message has been sent to III MAF, (3d MarDiv msg 300041Z May 67) requesting modification and issue of sixteen AN/PRC-63 or RT-10A survival radios to 3d Marine Division for on the job testing as Tactical Air Direction radios.

PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

1. During the month of May the Psychological Operations objectives were:
  - a. Support Chieu Hoi program.
  - b. Exploit VC/NVA battlefield losses.
  - c. Lower VC/NVA morale.
  - d. Show strength of free world forces.
  - e. Reduce mining and booby trap incidents.
  - f. Discredit VC/NVA.
  - g. Induce reporting VC activity.
  - h. Explain presence of U.S. Forces in Vietnam.
  - i. Instill good health habits in the people.
  - j. Encourage support of the GVN.

2. Psychological Operations supported the Phu Bai TAOR, the Dong Ha TAOR, operations SHAWNEE, CHOCTAW, PRAIRIE IV, CROCKETT and HICKORY.

3. The following leaflets by type were delivered by aerial leaflet drops:

4. In addition to the aerial leaflet drops, 56 hours 45 minutes of aerial broadcasts were utilized in the same general areas with the same general themes.

5. A total of 74 hours 50 minutes of ground broadcasts and 12 hours 20 minutes of movies were shown primarily at the CAC units throughout the Phu Bai TAOR and the Dong Ha TAOR. The teams were used mainly for MEDCAPS, movie festivals and broadcasting in secure areas. The main themes used were a general explanation of the Chieu Hoi program, GVN helps the people, Allied and ARVN

might and various messages and movies designed to instill a feeling of nationalism among the people. Strong emphasis was placed on cleanliness and health at every opportunity.

6. Approximately 200,000 leaflets, posters and newspapers were hand distributed during the month. The largest portion of these were the Free South newspapers which were handed out by the Military Police at check points and by CAC units. Various mine reward leaflets were distributed along Highway 1 from Phu Bai north into Quang Tri by the 3d Motor Transport Battalion. Health and cleanliness posters and leaflets were handed out at MEDCAPS, ground broadcasts and movie festivals

7. Feed back from four captives indicated that all four had heard broadcasts or seen leaflets. Three understood the information and two believed what they heard. The one who did not understand had found a leaflet with writing only and could not read.

8. The first Kit Carson Scout training program was completed this month. Out of the original twenty-one trainees only twelve successfully completed the program. The training consisted of political indoctrination, orientation to Marine type operations and what to expect, familiarization with the M-16 and instructions on good health habits. Throughout the program they were screened to determine their suitability as scouts. After completion of a three day leave period the scouts will be assigned to units operating in the area from which they came.

LOGISTICS1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

a. Logistical requirements continued at a rapid pace during the month of May with the increased tempo of tactical commitments and unit movements.

(1) Rotation of BLT 2/9 was cancelled until further notice.

(2) On 3 May 1/26 commenced an airlift from Danang to Phu Bai. The movement was completed on 6 May.

(3) On 4 May Company "C" 1/26 was airlifted to Khe Sanh.

(4) On 11 May Headquarters RLTC 26, 1/26 (-) and "A" Battery 1/13 commenced air movement to Khe Sanh, and BLT 2/3 (-) began air movement to Dong Ha for re-embarkation. The re-embarkation of 2/3 was completed on 13 May and the air movement to Khe Sanh was completed on 15 May.

(5) On 15 May elements of BLT 3/4 began air movement from Okinawa to Dong Ha. This movement was completed on 16 May.

(6) The remaining elements of BLT 3/4 arrived at Dong Ha on follow-up shipping from Okinawa on 23 May.

(7) The elements of BLT 2/3 that had not been helo lifted into Operation HICKORY, were debarked at Dong Ha on 25 May.

b. Extensive repair of the Phu Bai airfield commenced on 24 May and is expected to be completed on June 6.

c. The 11th Engineer Battalion completed a 200 meter wide cleared trace between Con Thien and Gio Linh and cleared a 500 meter wide perimeter around each of these combat bases. The 11th Engineers also opened Route 561 between Cam Lo and Con Thien and began work on route 547 between Hue and the A Shau Valley fire support base.

d. Base Development

(1) The construction of the new Division CP complex has progressed at a satisfactory rate with the administration building framing 40% complete. Shortages of essential construction materials (roofing tin and electrical wire) may delay completion beyond the planned date of 15 July 1967. Five butler buildings were released to the Division in Phu Bai with three additional buildings to be available during June.

In addition, construction has commenced on nine butler buildings for the Gia Le Base and eight for Phu Bai. Road surfacing is underway within the Phu Bai Base with two miles of asphalt surfaced road completed. Construction of the air passenger terminal at the Hue-Phu Bai airport is 80% completed although temporarily halted for lack of construction material. (Electrical material, roofing tin and lumber).

(2) Siting of buildings for the FY-67 supplemental MCON program is 85% complete and priorities will be assigned in the first week of June with construction scheduled to start shortly thereafter.

f. At the present time there is one item on "Red Ball".

g. During the period 23-31 May, a MUMS contact team from Okinawa conducted MILSTRIP training for 76 Officers and NCO's of the Division.

h. A reconciliation team from Force Logistics Command visited the Division for the purpose of reconciling outstanding requisitions with their records.

i. Changes in Allowances

(1) Authority has been received to requisition M35 trucks as interim vehicle support for Combined Action Platoons.

(2) Allowance of body armor, upper torso, on the basis of one per man in the T/O, has been received for Infantry, Recon, Engineer and Anti-Tank units, however authority to requisition has been held up.

j. During the month of May the following motor transport, engineer and ordnance equipment sustained combat damage.

(6) During the month of May, 27 armed convoys traveled between Phu Bai and the Co Bi Thanh Tan area, averaging 22 cargo vehicles and 60 S/T per resupply convoy.

o. Resupply by helicopter was used extensively during the period covered by this report.

(1) Phu Bai area - helicopters were used 27 days out of the month for a total lift of 133 S/T.

(2) Co Bi Thanh Tan area - helicopters were used 6 days out of the month for a total lift of 21 S/T.

(3) Khe Sanh area - helicopters were used 30 days out of the month for a total lift of 573 S/T.

(4) PRAIRIE area - helicopters were used 31 days out of the month for a total lift of 428 S/T.

## p. Test projects

(1) Ordinance locator. Tests were completed and results forwarded to III MAF on 20 May. Test results: Locator suitable for limited uses such as search of personnel, rice caches, hay stacks, and the like.

(3) M16A1 Rifles. All first increment rifles placed in late June or early July. Second increment units have requisitioned their training allowance of M16A1 rifles.

r. Food Services

(1) During the month of May 1967 the 3d Marine Division Food Services program consisted of 44 operational messes supported by 415 OF 33 personnel. Of the total messes in operation, 9 are permanent type field messes housed in MCON structures and the remaining 35 are temporary field messes. Subsistence support provided Marine Corps and Navy personnel of this Division averaged 21,976 rations daily.

s. The total ammunition expended for the month of May is listed on Tab A.

t. During the month of May representatives of the G-4 Section and Special Staff conducted a material maintenance inspection of the 3d Medical Battalion.

u. Planning was completed on Operation HICKORY and CHOCTAW and the required directives published, including an updated Class V stock level for Dong Ha.

2. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~

a. During the month of May the Force Logistics Command would only accept walk-through requisitions which were Priority 02. Due to a low fill rate by FLSC, a high number of walk-through requisitions were required inasmuch as this Division has been actively engaged during the entire period of time.

b. There continues to be a shortage of company grade supply officers.

c. The shortage of electrical power within the Division has reached serious proportions. On 18 May two 60 KW generators and large sections of electrical lines were destroyed by enemy action at Dong Ha. Presently the Division has sixty-two 20 KW and larger generators on hand. There are no backup generators available and a deadlined generator means a unit without power.

3. SPECIAL OPERATIONS. - Operation HICKORY

This multi-battalion operation in Quang Tri Province required extensive build up of all classes of supply in the Dong Ha area for support of the Division and two Special Landing Forces. The LSA, Dong Ha provided the only resupply for the forces engaged in Operation HICKORY until route 561 could be opened by the 11th Engineer Battalion. The LSA delivered 594 S/T of supplies and 747 personnel, utilizing 648 helicopter lifts, to the units engaged in the operation.

CIVIL AFFAIRS1. RELOCATION OF DMZ POPULACE

a. Early in the month the Division continued to monitor and support the GVN/OCO planned removal of the population of Trung Luong and upper Gio Linh districts to Cam Lo. It appeared that this would be an extremely difficult and extended operation.

b. With the inception of Operation HICKORY, however, the picture changed completely. One of the objectives of HICKORY was to clear the entire operating area of civilians and to accomplish this expeditiously. This meant that at least 12,000 people would have to be transported and resettled within a period of days and that this would have to be accomplished before completely adequate preparations could be made at the resettlement site.

c. On 19 May the movement began and by 23 May it was reported by GVN authorities that there were already 6,000 people at the temporary resettlement area at Cam Lo. By 29 May the population had grown to 10,674 and many of these were already being transferred to permanent homesites in the area.

d. Primarily because of the timing, neither the GVN nor OCO was ready or equipped to handle this sudden influx of people and it was necessary for the 3d Division to furnish much of the support required. Most of the transportation was Marine Corps furnished with up to 53 trucks per day from the 3d and 9th MT Battalions shuttling between Trung Luong or Gio Linh and Cam Lo. Not only refugees were moved in these vehicles but most of their possessions as well, including house frames and livestock. Shelter was also provided for the most part; over 160 G.P. tents were erected at Cam Lo. The refugees were completely dependent on the Marine Corps for water. The 11th Engineers supplied potable water by tank trucks and trailers and dug nine "shallow" wells in the housing area, while MCB-11 constructed a 500 barrel water storage tank. MEDCAP and DENTCAP teams from the 3d Marines and from D Company, 3d Med Battalion supplemented GVN and ARVN Medical care and the Division Preventive Medicine Unit worked on public health measures. Civil Affairs and refugee teams from the 29th Civil Affairs Company and teams from the 244th PsyOps Company were active in the resettlement area. In addition, virtually all OCO foodstuffs and building materials were transported, stored and secured by Marines or Army Civil Affairs personnel.

e. By the close of the month the flow of people into Cam Lo had apparently abated, the situation appeared in relatively good order and progress was being made in permanent resettlement. A great deal still remained to be done, however, and it appeared that the Division would be deeply involved in this project for some time to come.

2. REVOLUTIONARY DEVELOPMENT. The RD Program in both provinces is still affected by the security situation. While losses were not as severe as in April the situation was still precarious along the Phu Bang-Huong Thuy border in Thua Thien and east of Quang Tri. One Ap Doi Moi was abandoned in Thua Thien (Van The) and another in Quang Tri (Ngo Xa Dong) was the scene of a major engagement involving three battalions. There is no question that the program is now well behind schedule and that there is little likelihood of achieving this year's objectives. During the month a Marine officer was assigned to the RD advisory staff in Quang Tri. There is now one officer assigned to this duty in each province.

3. ELECTIONS. Hamlet elections were held in both provinces on three dates during the month. Marines furnished screening elements to protect balloting areas where requested and no unusual incidents occurred. It was reported that approximately 80% of those registered went to the Polls.

4. KHE SANH - LANG VEI. The newly reconstructed hamlets at Lang Vei were virtually abandoned as a result of the recent attack on the Special Forces camp. The population moved back toward the district headquarters at Khe Sanh with most settling near Lang Boo (YD 819379). The 26th Marines have been working closely with the Bru people in the Khe Sanh base area, employing them to construct bunkers and clear fields of fire.

## 5. DIVISION CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

a. Agriculture. A series of meetings was held with the Farmers Association of Huong Thuy to explore the possibilities for a cooperative to sell garden products to military bases in the area. Some difficulties were encountered but the prospects now appear favorable and it is hoped that a processing center will be completed and ready for operation by 1 July. CAC demonstration gardens continue to do well. Pig projects have been proposed in a number of villages. Pens are already being constructed in two locations and pigs will be purchased in Danang when these are ready. The Japanese rice threshing machine was used extensively in upper Phu Loc district. The reaction of farmers continues to be highly favorable. Thirty machines were received from III MAF at the end of the month and will be distributed in June.

b. Refugees. In addition to the Cam Lo project Civil Affairs personnel continued to give active support to other refugee settlements in both provinces. In Quang Tri, the larger settlements, Ha Thanh (YD 219698) and Cua Valley (YD 096523), received substantial logistic and medical support during the month. In Thua Thien the 4th Marines carried on an aggressive program of support for the refugee communities in the vicinity of the Phong Dien district headquarters, while in the Phu Bai TAOR the hamlet of Diem Tu (YD 865165) is being rehabilitated with Marine support.

c. DENTCAP. The arrival of the 3d Dental Company at Phu Bai will mean that the extensive MEDCAP Program conducted in the area can now be completed by a significant DENTCAP effort. One dentist and two technicians will devote much of their time to this assignment.

d. Grave Removal. The expansion of the helicopter facility at Phu Bai airfield has required the removal of some 2,000 graves from the area. The G-5 section conducted negotiations with province, district and village officials and by the end of the month families had started to move individual graves. It is hoped that the area will be cleared by 1 July. An effort is still being made to see that those who removed their graves during the fall and winter of 1966-67 are indemnified by the GVN.

f. Civic Action Funds. Funds were utilized primarily to support refugees in the Cam Lo area. Over 1,400 cooking utensils and 1,000 candles were purchased.

6. PERSONAL RESPONSE. During May the Personal Response team's activities were slowed to some extent because of operations in Khe Sanh and along the DMZ. The team, however, did manage to conduct discussions with units of the 9th Marines, 12th Marines, and the Army's 40th and 94th Artillery Battalions. The monthly Personal Response school was conducted at the Division CP with an all time high attendance of 53. Personal Response also became an integral part of the CAC Program, with lectures given as part of each CAC indoctrination course. Close coordination continues with the III MAF/FMFPac (FWD) project officer.

Chaplains reported such varied activities as distribution of food, candy, clothing, school supplies; assisting native churches, orphanages and hospitals; assistance in Medical Care Program of Vietnamese villagers; and the showing of films on personal hygiene and patriotism to the villagers near their unit's area.

### 3. PREVENTIVE MEDICINE/SANITATION

a. The Phu Bai dump problem was turned over to "C" Company, 11th Engineer Battalion for completion of a two foot sanitary earth fill.

b. The Benedictine Orphanage ice plant was reinspected and passed the tests for the production of potable water for ice to be used by units of the 3d Marine Division.

c. The Phu Bai area non-potable water for showers has been checked for chlorine content and bacterial contamination. Tests reveal minimal bacterial content and an adequate chlorine content is maintained.

d. Aerial dispersal of insecticides to be requested by Preventive Medicine Section in support of individual unit commanders. Request was made to Commander, Naval Support Activity, DaNang.

e. Laundry service support was gained for the 3d Medical Battalion hospital laundry from FLSG-A in the month of May.

### 4. UNIT DISPLACEMENT

a. On 17 May 1967 as a consequence of unit displacements and tactical requirements the Division Surgeon was deployed to Dong Ha Combat Base. The Surgeon returned to Phu Bai on 29 May 1967.

### 5. DISEASES

a. Influenza program: Units are receiving vaccine and are beginning immunizations.

b. 3d Marine Division personnel admitted to the sick list by the Division Psychiatrist with psychiatric diagnosis numbered 60. 49 were evacuated, 10 were returned to duty, and a total of 87 outpatients were seen.

c. A total of 158 cases of illness classified under the category of venereal disease were reported in 3d Marine Division personnel during May. There were 119 cases of Gonorrhea, 36 cases of Nonspecific Urethritis, 2 cases of chancroid and 1 case of Syphilis. 25 cases of ~~VD~~ were acquired in RVN, 130 in R&R Centers and 3 in unspecified locations. The 1 case of syphilis was from Bangkok.

d. For the month of May there were 587 non-hostile casualties admitted to the sick list. Of this group there were 86 cases of Fever of Undetermined Origin, 34 cases of Gastroenteritis, 30 cases of Cellulitis and 13 cases of Heat Prostration.

e. For the month of April there were 85 confirmed cases of Malaria, of which 57 were P. Falciparum, 5 were P. Vivax and 23 were undetermined.

#### 6. LOGISTICS

a. On 3 May 1967 FMFPAC reported \$80,000 additional operation and maintenance Navy Project 20 funds became available and requested immediate requisition of all equipment items listed under Phase II, FY 68 project 20 budget estimate. The complete package of requisitions was prepared, taken to 1st FSR for coding, then taken to II MAF for approval and delivered to 3d FSR for final processing on 16 May 1967. The estimated amount of this transaction was \$74,700.

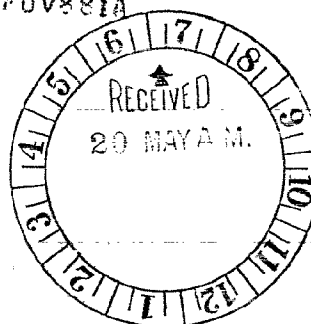

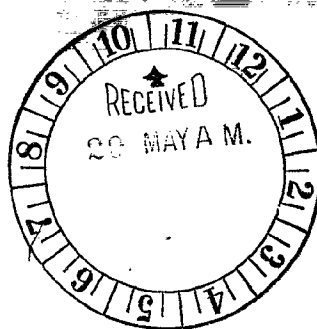

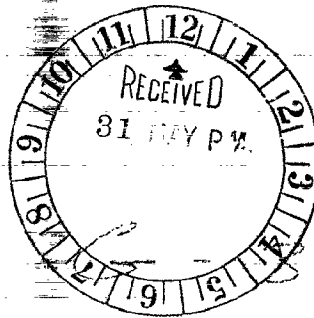
