





#### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

#### PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

#### 1. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

- a. During the month of June, 150 officers and 1,300 enlisted personnel joined the Division. Personnel transferred by normal rotation included; 64 officers and 805 enlisted. Personnel transferred by service records due to MedEvacs were 12 officers and 429 enlisted. Other personnel transferred by service records included 1 officer and 12 enlisted.
- b. Award recommendations to FMFPac: 1 Medal of Honor, 10 Navy Crosses, 25 Silver Stars, 6 Legion of Merit Medals, 111 Bronze Stars, 7 Air Medals, 71 Navy Commendation Medals, 2 Secretary of the Navy Commendation for Achievement Medals, 1 Distinguished Flying Cross and 1 Navy and Marine Corps Medal. Approved by FMFPac: 16 Silver Stars, 5 Legion of Merit Medals, 55 Bronze Stars, 8 Air Medals and 67 Navy Commendation Medals. In addition, 1950 Purple Hearts were presented.
- c. Casualties sustained during the month included: 98 KIA, 1238 WIA, 23 DOW, 14 NHD, 69 NHI and 1 MIA.
- d. Congressional Interest Cases: 166 cases processed, 118 cases completed, 24 cases pending and 24 cases readdressed to other commands.
- e. Discharges: 3 Hardship Discharges approved, 4 Hardship Discharges to CMC for decision, 3 Unsuitable Discharges disapproved, 3 Unfitness Discharges to CMC for decision, 1 Unsuitable Discharge pending and 1 Discharge Own Convenience to CMC for decision.

#### 2. EXCHANGE SERVICE

- a. A total of 400 pallets of general merchandise and 597 pallets of soda were received during the period.
  - b. Total sales for the month was \$549,099.15.

#### 3. POSTAL SERVICE

a. During the period lk stationary and mobile units continued to provide service to members of this command. One postal unit remained inactive and will be assigned when required.

- b. On 19 June 1967, Unit #5 Post Office was relocated from Dong Ha and established at Khe Sanh to provide all phases of postal support for members located that area.



#### 5. INFORMATIONAL SERVICES

- a. The section continued press coverage of 3d Marine Division activities, releasing 16h news, feature articles and photographs through the Force Information Office, III Marine Amphibious Force. Also, a total of 2,029 home town releases were sent to the Fleet Home Town News Center, Great Lakes, Illinois.
- b. A total of 11 civilian news correspondents visited the Phu Bai area during the month; 8 newsmen visited the Khe Sanh area, and 73 visited the Dong Ha area.



c. The Radio-TV section turned out a total of 545 minutes of tape recorded air minutes. This breaks down to a total of 500 minutes on Fleet Home Town News interviews and 45 minutes on special features on 3d Marine Division combat actions.

#### 6. SPECIAL SERVICES

- a. Division Order 1710.7 was published establishing a beach recreation area at Thuan-An (Col Co Island).
- b. A meeting of the Division Recreation Council was held on 27 June 1967.
- c. Movement of all recreation fund gear from Danang to Phu Bai was completed.
- d. 15 cases of beer and 1250 cases of soda were provided units of the Division under the "Free Beer and Soda Program".
- e. The following items were issued under the Special Services \*Critipak\* Program: small Critipak 51; large Critipak 21; paperback books 4,600; writing kits 20,000.
- f. <u>Division Education Program</u>. During the period 183 High School GED tests and 73 College (CCT-GE) tests were administered. Testing was conducted in the Phu Bai and Dong Ha areas.
- g. Special Entertainment. The following special entertainment was provided to units of the Division during the period:
- (1) A special Hue tour was arranged 16 June for 16 Marines of the Sniper Platoon, 9th Marines.
- (2) The "Sorties", an Air Force Special Services Show, performed for units in the Phu Bai Dong Ha and Camp Carroll areas on 25, 26 and 27 June.
- (3) Floyd Patterson, former heavyweight champion of the world, visited units of the Phu Bai area on 27 June.

#### 7. BAND

- a. During the month of June the band performed people to people concerts at all of the Combined Action Companies in the Phu Bai area. These concerts were very well received, both by the Vietnamese and military personnel.
  - b. Also during this month the band participated in the dedication of a hospital near Camp Carroll.
  - c. On the 24th the band took part in the dedication of Camp Evans, formerly known as the "Chinook area".
  - d. On the 29th of June the band went to Khe Sanh where they spent three days playing concerts at the mess halls and various clubs in the 26th Marines area.

#### 8. PROVOST MARSHAL

- a. Normal Military Police functions were performed on a continuing basis throughout the period, i.e., patrols and security watches.
- b. One officer and 23 enlisted Marines who had been TAD to the 1st Marine Division to augment the III MAF Brig were returned to duty with the 3d Marine Division Military Police Company.
- c. Nineteen special escorts for distinguished guests and USO entertainers were conducted in the Hue/Phu Bai area.
- d. During the period, a total of 234 persons were detained and processed as possible Prisoners of War.
- e. The city of Hue was inspected for blackmarket activities on two separate occasions. No significant increase in the blackmarket volume was noted. Blackmarket prices however are down about 10% over the previous last few months.
- f. A special U.S./ARVN security detail was posted at the Hue/Phu Bai Airport on 6 June to provide security for Premier KY.





g. Band concerts continued to be scheduled in conjunction with a colors ceremony and informal grand mountings throughout the local villages. The response has been overwhelming. Members of the Vietnamese Police agencies participate in these ceremonies and therefore a united front of Vietnamese/American relationships is presented to the villagers.

h. Civil affairs continues to be a major activity of the Provost Marshal's Office. During the month of June 20 cases of assistance to Vietnamese were rendered of significant importance requiring over one hour's work with each case.

- 9. The 1st Counterintelligence Team interrogated 176 persons during the month of June 1967. 166 persons were released as innocent civilians, he were classified as Civil Defendants, and 6 as VC/NVA. The team provides a sub-team each to the 4th and 26th Marines for Operations CHOCTAW and CROCKETT. Along with maintaining close liaison with Vietnamese at village, hamlet, and district level, members of the team also worked with Vietnamese intelligence and security agencies in Hue. One Sub-team was assigned to the Special Branch of the National Police along with one subteam each to Phu Loc and Huong Thuy Districts in support of Combined Action Companies Hotel and Alpha.
- 10. The 15th Counterintelligence Team provided general support for all units on Operation CIMARRON. Three detachments were located at Dong Ha and these detachments provided direct support to the 1st AmTrac Battalion and 3d Battalion, 9th Marines on a total of nine separate search and destroy operations. Separate detachments were also provided support and liaison at Cam Lo District Headquarters and Quang Tri Provincial Headquarters. Along with processing 50 detainees, the team initiated 6 penetrations by indigenous sources into VC controlled areas, and prepared and disseminated 42 counterintelligence reports and 19 spot reports. Close liaison was maintained with all U.S., ARVN and GVN intelligence sources within Quang Tri Province.
- 11. The 7th Interrogator Translator Team provided support for Operations CIMARRON, CHOCTAW, CROCKETT, BEAR BITE, CUMBERLAND, COLGATE, and MARY-LAND, during June 1967. The team handled a total of 138 detainees which were classified as follows:

PW(NVA) - 22 PW(VC) - 14 CIV DEFENDANTS - 13 RETURNEES - 8 INNOCENT CIV - 81

The team also maintained close liaison with the 1st ARVN Division and extracted much useful information from detainees taken in ARVN operations.

- 12. The 3d Interpreter Team provided general support to all operations run by the 3d Marine Division in the month of June as well as operating the Execument Translation Center for Division Headquarters. The team processed 68 batches of captured documents from which 427 items were screened, resulting in 93 pages of translation. Also, the team translated a total of 152 friendly official documents from which a total of 256 pages of translation were prepared as well as handling 18 other friendly documents. Finally, the team worked a total of 169 hours in support of claims, legal, Division Clubs, G-1, Psychological Operations, the Reconnaissance Battalion, and the Commanding General.
- 13. The Aerial Observation Section flew a total of 369 sorties for a total of 899.2 hours. 78 sorties were flown in Marine aircraft for a total of 173.4 hours. The Army provided aircraft for 210 sorties amounting to 497.1 flying hours and the USAF flew 81 sorties for a total of 228.7 hours. These missions were flown from Phu Bai, Dong Ha and Khe Sanh

#### **OPERATIONS**

-1. GENERAL. The 3d Marine Division continued operations in Thua Thien and Quang Tri provinces of South Vietnam in accordance with assigned missions. Division operations during the month were characterized by substantially reduced enemy contact. Major search and destroy operations were continued throughout the AOR, integrated with extensive reconnaissance activity. However, enemy forces failed to accept combat in any significant strength.

SLF A landed in an amphibious assault in Phong Dien District on 7 June. It reported to the operational control of the Division 11 June, and continued operations until reembarkation on 12 June.

- 2. CIMARRON. Operation CIMARRON commenced OloColH June. This multiregimental search and destroy operation in northern Quang Tri Province is the successor to Operation PRAIRIE IV. Several operations of up to two battalion size were conducted during June in the general area between Route 9 and the DMZ, and west of Thon Son Lam. Contact was light and sporadic although mine and booby trap incidents increased. Several moderate to large enemy fortified areas were discovered and destroyed. Forces assigned to the operation decreased on 5 June with the deployment of 2/26 to Phu Bai. Operations in connection with the contion of the cleared strip between Gio Linh and Con Thien concluded with the completion of engineer work on 17 June. The Con Thien Special Forces Camp deactivated 12 June with the departure of the CIDG component. CIMARRON forces assumed responsibility for the defense of the camp and its installations. Operation CIMARRON was continuing at the end of the month. Cumulative friendly casualties are: 445 WIA and 37 KIA.
- 3. CROCKETT. Operation CROCKETT continued during the month with minor contact. Forces assigned to the operation increased to two infantry battalions and supporting artillery when 3/26 deployed to Khe Sanh from Phu Bai on 12 June via Rough Rider. Several company size search and destroy operations were conducted in areas within supporting arms range of Khe Sanh, with several moderately sized enemy fortified areas discovered and destroyed. On 6 June the Khe Sanh base received a rocket attack in conjunction with an enemy company size ground assault against the outpost/relay station on Hill 950. The attack was repulsed and the position maintained. Other contacts were with fleeting units in squad or smaller size groups. The operation was continuing at the end of the month. Total cumulative friendly casualties are:

  244 WIA and 51 KIA.
- 4. CHOCTAW. Operation CHOCTAW continued during the month with slightly increased contact. CHOCTAW forces increased with the return of an infantry battalion from CIMARRON on 30 May, but decreased shortly thereafter with the build oup in Operation CUMBERIAND from CHOCTAW forces. Several company and battalion size operations were conducted by CHOCTAW forces both within the CHOCTAW OA and in contiguous areas. CHOCTAW forces operated in support of Operation BEARBITE (SLF A) in Quang Dien District east of Route 1 from 2 June to 11 June, at which time SLF A became Opcon

STOPPE

to the 4th Marines and a part of Operation CHOCTAW. CHOCTAW forces again operated east of Route 1 in a combined operation with the 1st Infantry Division ARVN from 2 June to 11 June. Small unit contacts, sniper incidents, and mine and booby trap incidents were the predominent contacts during the month. On 11 June a sharp engagement occured when 2/4 ambushed an enemy company (-) size force near My Chanh, inflicting heavy casualties. The operation was continuing at the end of the month. Total friendly casualties are:

4. CUMBERLAND. Operation CUMBERLAND commenced 3 June under control of the 4th Marines. This infantry and engineer operation provides for the up-grading and construction of a land-line of communications from Hue along Routes 547 and 548 toward the A Shau Valley and the establishment of an artillery fire support base in the vicinity of (YD 605085). Forces assigned to the operation increased to a full infantry battalion on 8 June. Fire support was provided from the Gia Le combat base. Contact was very slight. Route 547 had been up-graded for 15,100 meters at the end of the month and the operation was continuing. Friendly casualties are:

- 5. COLGATE. Operation COLGATE commenced 7 June under the control of the 4th Marines. This search and destroy operation employed SLF A and conducted on the Phu Thu peninsula. In combination with ARVN forces who isolated the peninsula and provided blocking forces, COLGATE forces conducted a heliborne assault in the northern portion of the OA. Search and destroy operations were then continued with moderate contact. Several enemy caches and harboring sites were located and a significant number of suspected VC detained, with the assistance of an Armed Propaganda Team. The operation terminated 11 June with the helolift of COLGATE forces to CHOCTAW. Friendly casualties at the conclusion of the operation were:
- 3 KIA and 29 WIA.
- 6. MARYLAND. This operation commenced on 25 June under control of the 4th Marines. This search and destroy mission was conducted by 1/3 reinforced by one company of 2/26. The operation was conducted in combination with ARVN forces who moved into the northern end of the peninsula. MARYLAND forces landed by helicopter in the southern portion of the OA. Search and destroy operations were conducted in a northerly direction until assigned blocking positions were reached. These actions resulted in light contact. Several harboring sites and caches were uncovered and several suspects were detained with the assistance of an Armed Propaganda Team. The operation terminated on 28 June with the helo lift of 1/3 (less F/2/26) to ColCo Beach for subsequent backloading aboard amphibious shipping. Friendly casualties on termination of the operation were a 4 WIA.
- 7. PHU BAI TAOR. The 3d Battalion, 26th Marines remained as the Phu Bai Defense Battalion until 11 June when it was relieved by the 2d

Battalion, 26th Marines, which continued the mission throughout the month. Upon relief of security-tasks, 3/26 conducted a battalion search and destroy operation in the Dong Truoi Mountain area south to Hai Dong village with slight contact. On 12 June 3/26 deployed to Operation CROCKETT by Rough Rider convoy. Several company size operations were conducted in the TAOR and in Phu Loc District to provide increased security for national Route 1. Security operations in support of hydrographic, topographic, road survey, and dredging operations continued. On 26 June and again on 27 June an infantry platoon reinforced with amphibian tractors conducted an operation from Col Co north to Thon Dai Loc and return in order to establish a topographic survey point. Sparrowhawk forces were launched on 16 June and 30 June as security for support of recon extraction and downed helo respectively.

8. BEARBITE. Operation BEARBITE was conducted by SIF A in northeastern Thua Thien Province under the operational control of III MAF. At the conclusion of the operation SIF A chopped operational control of the Division and the 4th Marines on 11 June. Operations continued in the same general area north of the CHOCTAW AO as a part of Operation CHOCTAW.



#### COMBAT AIR SUPPORT

#### 1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- a. Operation CIMARROL, in the Dong Ha area, continued throughout the month with fixed wing aircraft flying 981 sorties and expending 2,147.1 tons of ordnance. In the same period, helicopters flew 6,975 sorties, carried 6,272 passengers, and transported 1,010.3 tons of cargo.
- b. Operation CHOCTAW continued throughout the month with fixed wing aircraft flying 148 sorties and expending 171.4 tons of ordnance. Helicopters flew 355 sorties, carried 442 passengers and 23.6 tons of cargo.
- c. In the Khe Sanh area, Operation CROCKETT continued with fixed wing aircraft flying 556 sorties and expending 1,047.6 tons of ordnance. For the same period, helicopters flew 229 sorties, lifted 12 passengers and 631 tons of cargo.
- d. There were 8 fixed wing sorties flown and 125 tons of ordnance expended in support of Operation BEARBITE. Helicopters flew 22 sorties and lifted 19 passengers.
- e. For Operation COLGATE fixed wing aircraft flew 10 sorties and expended 27.5 tons of ordnance. Helicopters flew 154 sorties, lifted 445 passengers and 2 tons of cargo.
- f. Fixed wing aircraft flew 11 sorties and expended 21.1 tons of ordnance in support of Operation CUMBERLAND. Helicopters flew 75 sorties, lifted 69 passengers and 1.9 tons of cargo.
- g. There were 24 Arc Light strikes in Quang Tri Province and 6 strikes in the province of Thua Thien.





#### FIRE SUPPORT COORDINATION

#### 1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- a. Defoliation requests were submitted to III MAF for Khe Sanh, Con Thien Gio Linh Trace, Route 561 from Cam Lo to Con Thien, Ba Long Valley to Khe Sanh via Route 9. The mission for Route 547 (CUMBERLAND) was approved.
- b. A Fire Support Coordination Symposium was convened to reexamine procedures and recommend changes to LOI 1-67.
- c. Coordination/clearance procedures were established for operations COLGATE, MARYLAND, a combined S/D sweep near NAM HOA and an SLF landing in the PHU LOC area.
- d. Recommended revisions were submitted for Gun 11. Gun 12 has been distributed and was placed in effect on 1 July 1967.

#### 2. TARGETING

- a. Artillery. A total of 2478 long range, pre-planned targets were attacked during the month of June.
- b. <u>TPQ-10 Missions</u>. A total of 714 targets were struck by TPQ-10 missions during the month.
- c. Naval Gunfire. During the month there were two days of 5"/38 destroyer support, sixteen days of 5"/54 destroyer support, and ten days of 8"/55 cruiser support.



#### COMMUNICATION-ELECTRONICS

#### 1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- a. Communication Support Company (-), 7th Communication Battalion, was assigned to Dong Ha Combat Base to establish and operate semi-permanent communication facilities for tenant organizations in the Dong Ha Combat Base Area as follows:
- (1) Installation and operation of an AN/MTC-l area toll switchboard and associated cabling to provide local and long-distance service.
- (2) Operation of the Area Communication Center to provide Communication guard for Dong Ha area units.
- (3) Operation of Radio Relay/Tropospheric scatter facilities in Dong Ha to support the area system.
- (4) Provision of minimum radio communication support in the Dong Ha area, such as VIP Communication when requested, III MAF Command Nets, as required.
- b. During June Communication Support Company (-), 7th Communication Battalion, Dong Ha accomplished the following:
- (1) Installation and operation of the MTC-1 switchboard and associated MTA-1 Frame Van.
- (2) Activation of teletypewriter nets with Second Battalion, 9th Marines and 7th Communication Battalion at Chu Lai.
- (3) Sandbagging and hardening of all communication facilities in the Dong Ha area, with defensive trenches and bunkers constructed adjacent to communication facilities.
  - (4) Construction and operation of a new battery shop.
- (5) Laying of a major portion of the underground cabling to provide local and long distance trunk service in the Dong Ha area.
- c. In response to 3d Marine Division 3000412 to III MAF requesting a small lightweight UHF transceiver, four modified RT-10 transceivers were assigned to 3d Marine Division by LFDA and are currently undergoing combat tests by Division units.
- d. Nine AN/PRC-25 Auxiliary Speakers were received from III MAF for tests and are now undergoing field checks by 3d Marine Division combat units.



e. 3d Marine Division MARS. A total of 806 messages and 1625 telephone calls were handled by Division MARS stations at Phu Bai. Of the 1625 telephone calls processed, 56 were priority/emergencies.

- f. A TRC-97 Radio Relay link was established between Phu Bai and Khe Sanh to provide 12 channels of high reliability circuits.
- g. A TRC-27 Radio Relay link was established between Khe Sanh Combat Base and Khe Sanh City to provide local telephone service to activities in that area.
- h. Problem Areas. Accessories for the AN/PRC-25 have become increasingly critical. First Battalion, 9th Marines report 48 radios deadlined for H-138 handsets and other 3d Marine Division units have similar shortages. CG, 3d MarDiv 281145Z May 67, CG 3d MarDiv 012147Z Jun 67, CG 3d MarDiv 010723Z Jul 67 and CG 3d MarDiv 010733Z Jul 67 apply.



#### PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

- 1. During the month of June the Psychological Operations objectives were:
  - a. Support Chieu Hoi program.
  - b. Exploit VC/NVA battlefield losses.
  - c. Lower VC/NVA morale.
  - d. Show strength of free world forces.
  - e. Reduce mining and booby trap incidents.
  - f. Discredit VC/NVA.
  - g. Induce reporting VC activity.
  - h. Explain presence of U.S. Forces in Vietnam.
  - i. Instill good health habits in the people.
  - j. Encourage support of the GVN.
- 2. Psychological Operations supported all named operations and Regimental TAOR's. The Phu Bai TAOR, the DMZ, Recon zones and the A Shau Valley were also targeted regularly.
- 3. The following leaflets by type were delivered by aerial leaflet drops:

- 4. In addition to the aerial leaflet drops, 79 hours 20 minutes of aerial broadcast were utilized in the same general areas with the same general themes.
- 5. A total of 90 hours 15 minutes of ground broadcasts and 20 hours 15 minutes of movies were shown primarily at the CAC units throughout the Phu Bai TAOR and the Dong Ha TAOR. The teams were used mainly for MEDCAPS, movie festivals and broadcasting in secure areas. The main themes used were a

general explanation of the Chieu Hoi program, GVN helps the people, Allied and ARVN might and various messages and movies designed to instill a feeling of nationalism among the people. Strong emphasis was placed on cleanliness and health at every opportunity.

- 6. Approximately 112,850 leaflets, posters and newspapers were hand distributed during the month. The largest portion of these were the Free South newspapers which were handed out by the Military Police at check points and by CAC units. Various mine reward leaflets were distributed along Highway 9 in and around the Refugee Center in Cam Lo by the 3d Motor Transport Battalion. Health and cleanliness posters and leaflets were handed out at MEDCAPS, ground broadcasts and movie festivals.
- 7. Interrogation reports indicate that many captives as well as ralliers were influenced to some extent by leaflets and broadcasts. Some said that leaflets were more effective, some said the broadcasts were. Some said broadcasts during the night were more effective and some preferred day broadcasts. No matter what the dissemination means or time of day, the general opinion was that increased effort would result in increased defections.
- 8. The Kit Carson Scout program is gaining momentum. Feed back from the units employing the scouts indicate that they are highly motivated, aggressive and concientious. Particularly good reports have been received on the new scouts who completed the screening/training program last month. Present plans are to conduct a new class in Thua Thien province in July and in Quang Tri province in August.

#### LOGISTICS

#### 1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

a. Logistic support of Operations CHOCTAW, CIMARRON, CUMBERLAND, CROCKETT, and COLGATE required a continuing effort to keep stocks at desired levels on position, exercised all means of transportation available to the Division, and resulted in a continued requirement for extensive maintenance support at all echelons due to equipment fatigue and combat damage.

#### b. General

- (1) As a result of reported stoppages with the M-16 rifle, the Division reemphasized the basics of care, cleaning, and familiarization in an intensive training program utilizing maintenance contact teams, "trouble shooting" teams, inspections, and numerous directives. This program became active in early June and by the end of the month appeared to have had the effect of greater troop knowledge and familiarity with the weapon.
- (2) On 5 June an ad hoc congressional committee consisting of Representatives ICHORD (Missouri) and LONG (Louisiana) and Col (USA, ret.) CROSSMAN visited the Division and sought from Marines in the field their opinions of the effectiveness of the M-16 rifle.
- (3) A daily CH-53 logistic flight was established, moving cargo between Phu Bai, Dong Ha, and Khe Sanh.
- (4) FMFPac authorized the Force Logistic Command to cannibalize unserviceable M-3 compressors for flame tanks. The Division had two operable compressors at the end of the month, of an allowance of four.
- (5) The Khe Sanh airfield underwent extensive repairs for a two week period in mid-June. Resupply was continued by CH-53 and C-123 aircraft, and by truck convoy.
- (6) A lifting sling was fabricated by the 3d Shore Party Battalion and used successfully on several occasions to move 155 howitzers (TD) by CH-53.
- (7) Temporary shortages of cleaning equipment for the M-16 rifle were alleviated by special air shipments directed by CG FMFPac.
- (8) Division units were authorized to submit requisitions to provide all personnel with lightweight utilities.
- (9) Coordination with FLSG-A and FLC was intensified to correct discrepancies in the FLC machine printout of deadlined combat essential equipment.

- CEADE
  - (10) The CG FMFPac Motor Transport Maintenance Assistance Team visited the Division and provided assistance where required.
  - (11) Dust suppression remained a continuing problem. Some asphalt and pentiprime were received, and significant additional quantities were requisitioned.
  - (12) The 1st AMTRAC Battalion voluntarily deadlined half of its tractors due to the expanded nature of its security mission, which requires troops to be used as infantry.





#### (1) Unit Moves:

- (a) On 8 June the Sniper Platoon RLT 26 was airlifted from Okinawa to Dong Ha utilizing 1 Marine C-130 aircraft on an operational move transporting 46 passengers, 3 pallets and 2 tents and poles.
- (b) On 19 June elements of 3/26 were moved from Phu Bai to Dong Ha by Marine C-130 transporting 55 passengers. This move was completed 19 June.
- (c) On 21 June "B" Co 3d Recon Bn was airlifted from Phu Bai to Khe Sanh utilizing 2 Marine C-130 aircraft on an operational move, transporting 40 passengers, 15 pallets of mount out supplies, 1-M422Al and 1-M416Bl. A like element was then transported back to Phu Bai from Khe Sanh completing the move the same day.
- (d) On 25 June elements of "B" Co 3d Reconnaissance Bn were moved from Phu Bai to Khe Sanh utilizing two Marine C-130 aircraft, transporting 46 passengers, 15 pallets of mount out supplies, 1-M422Al and 1-M416Bl on an operational move. The same day 24 passengers and seven pallets of baggage were brought back from Khe Sanh to Phu Bai completing the move.
- (e) On 29 June BLT 1/3 was backloaded and became SLF. Back-loading was completed 291045H June.



f. Food Services. During the month of June 1967 the 3d Marine Division Food Services Program consisted of 47 operational messes supported by 516 OF 33 personnel. Of the total messes in operation, 9 are permanent type field messes housed in MCON structures and the remaining 38 are temporary field messes. Subsistence support provided Marine Corps, Navy, and Army personnel of this division averaged 29,700 rations daily. Of the total personnel subsisted, approximately 89% were subsisted on "A" type rations supplemented with "B" ration items and approximately 11% consumed Meals, Combat, Individual, Daily. Meals, Combat, Individual are being consumed only when operational requirements preclude serving "A" rations.

#### g. Supply

#### (1) Significant Events

- (a) FSAO-4 team inspected 2/26, 3/26, 3d AT Battalion and 3d Engineer Battalion during the period of 2-11 June 1967.
- (b) The excess and cancellation program has reported a total of \$5,727,657.01 from 1 April to 31 May 1967.
- (c) Colonel J. M. WEIDNER relieved Colonel R. R. WEIR as Division Supply Officer.
- (d) M16Al rifle cleaning material was requisitioned by Division units. Special handling was required. Material should be in the hands of all units armed with M16Al rifles on or before 2 July 1967.
- (e) Selected items of NBC material are being turned in by units to FLSG-A and FLSU-1.



(f) The following units were visited by the Supply Management Team during June 1967:


#### (g) Test Projects:

l. Five hundred six gallon disposable water containers were tested in the 9th Marines TAOR. The reports from using units were very favorable. These containers eliminate numerous problems in handling, recovering, cleaning, and accounting for water cans. Also, the water delivered in these containers is likely to be much cleaner than water delivered in a metal can. We have requested that 2500 per month be made available to the Division as soon as possible. III MAF has indicated that this quantity will be increased to 5000 per month.

2. One hundred inflatable pillows were delivered to 3d Shore Party Battalion and 2/26 for testing. Test reports from these units are due 10 July 67 and will include comments as to what the pillows should be used for and whether or not they should be included in unit allowances.

#### (h) Planning:

- 1. Planning was completed and appropriate directives issued for backloading 1/3 at Col Co on 29 June as the SLF.
- 2. The G-L Plans Officer attended a conference at III MAF to discuss a plan for issuing lightweight utilities and jungle boots to all personnel at Camp Butler, Okinawa prior to arrival in RVN. A commencement date of 1 September 1967 was recommended for this program.
- 3. Stockage objectives at Khe Sanh were reviewed in response to CG III MAF 140248Z, and ammunition stockage objectives were raised to 30 DOS for selected items.
- 4. Change 2 to OPO 22-67 revised stockage objectives for all classes of supply for the CUMBERLAND area in keeping with the increased weapons and troop density.
- 5. The revised procedures for reporting of Deadlined Combat Essential Equipment set forth in FMFPac 0 4000.13C are to be implemented for the reporting period 16.30 June 1967. Significant changes are the addition of reportable items of equipment and the change of format for reporting of these items.


- l. Information received that the squad water containers (2½ quart) are arriving in country and will be available for issue to Division units very shortly.
- 2. Metascope assemblies are continuing to arrive in country. The 4th Marines received an allotment of 117 on 26 June 67. However, provisioning is not complete as the batteries required (BA 13121U) have not yet arrived.
- 3. 11th Engineers Eimco Tractors were placed in service by permission of CG FMFPac despite the lack of spare parts. This was necessary in order to complete the Gio Linh Con Thien obstacle Trace. Tractors in 1st 155 Gun Battery and 1st 8" Gun Battery on hand but on administrative deadlined.

#### 2. PROBLEM AREAS

- a. Supply. Shortages of selected items of Class II supply, including some critically required spare parts.
  - b. Transportation. No significant problem areas.
- c. Services. Shortage of adequate laundry units, bath units and water distribution equipment.

#### d. Maintenance

- (1) Shortage of repair parts
- (2) Inability of FLC to support the increased forces in the Dong Ha area with adequate facilities/personnel.

#### DIVISION ENGINEER

- 1. Division and Force Engineers in the Division's AOR continued to perform in their combat support roles during the last month. Continuous engineer support has been provided for Operations Cimarron, Crockett, Choctaw, Cumberland, Colgate, Maryland and SLF operations. This has included construction, demolition, minesweeping, road construction and maintenance, obstacle installation and removal, water supply and utilicies support. Bunkers have been constructed at Con Thien, Gio Linh, Gia Le and in support of the CAC program. Numerous enemy bunkers and fortifications encountered in the DMZ and Khe Sanh areas were destroyed as were tunnels throughout the areas of operations. Major engineer responsibilities and projects have included:
- a. National Route #1. RVN Route #1 extends from the DMZ south through Quang Tri and Thua Thien Provinces to the southern boundry of the Division AOR at Lang Co. Its 148 kilometer length includes 73 bridges.

Four floating bridges are currently installed along Route #1 at Pho Trach, My Chanh, Ai Tu and Phuoc My. In addition a ferry is installed at Hue to allow for passage of heavy vehicles.

The travelled way of Route #h is generally fifteen to eighteen feet wide, surfaced with bituminous pavement, with shoulders from three to seven feet in width. The road is in need of maintenance which, in the past, has been limited to temporary repairs to destroyed bridges or mine craters. The road condition in several areas, notably near Phu Loc and from Phu Bai to My Chanh is severely potholed and convoy traffic is hampered in traversing these sections.


Plans for rehabilitation and upgrading of Route #1 call for an immediate maintenance program to insure continued traffic ability during the remainder of the summer and through the monsoon season. This effort is currently underway. This will be followed by a deliberate upgrading of thee road to MACV standards to include bridge construction and resurfacing.

- b. National Route #9. RVN Route #9 extends west through Quang Tri Province from Dong Ha to the Laos border. This road from Dong Ha to the Khe Sanh Base extends sixty-three kilometers and includes thirty-six bridges, most of which are by-passable. The critical bridge along this route spans the gorge east of Khe Sanh at YD 913403. Efforts are underway to construct a bridge to replace the tactical bridge currently installed at this location. On 27 June Rte 9 was opened to class 60 traffic between Dong Ha and Khe Sanh. Future plans include resurfacing of the Dong Ha Camp Carroll section prior to the monsoon.
- c. RVN Route 551. This route extends from Hue east through Thua Thien Province to the port facility under construction at Tan My. The road is twelve kilometers in length and includes ten bridges, none of which are considered critical. It is fourteen to eighteen feet in width, of bituminous surface, with shoulders from three to five feet wide and is subject to flooding in low sections near Tan My during the monsoon. The road surface is in fair condition as a result of recent emergency maintenance measures taken by MCB-62.

d. RVN Route #547. RVN Route 547 extends from Hue to the A Shau valley. The road is currently open to class 60 traffic from Hue to Nam Hoa. This section of road is from fourteen to sixteen feet in width, of bituminous: surface, with two to four foot shoulders. It includes three minor bridges all of which are by-passable.

From Non Hoa west to A Shau the road deteriorates to an intermittent footpath. Elements of the 3d and 11th Engineer Battalions following the trace of Rte 547 have constructed a class 30 road to the vicinity of a proposed Fire Support Base near YD6008, a distance of about 18 kilometers. This section is to be subsequently upgraded to class 60. Future plans include the development of the Fire Support Base for the employment of 175 guns and installation of a 765 foot floating bridge across the Song Huong at Nam Hoa to replace the ferry currently installed.

- e. RVN Rte De Gia Le a Gio Long. This road extends from Rte 1 in the vicinity of Gia Le westward through Thua Thien Province to its intersection with Rte 547 in Nam Hoa. The road, which is presently inca dilapidated state, is 15km in length and includes six bridges. It is twelve to fifteen feet in width and of laterite surface. It is planned to upgrade and improve this road to class 60 to afford a direct route from Phu Bai to the Song Huong crossing on Rte 547. The opening of this road will shorten the land route from Phu Bai to the Fire Support Base on Rte 547 by nearly 10 miles.
- f. RVN Rte #561. RVN Route 561 extends from Cam Lo northward through Quang Tri Province to Con Thien. Its thirteen kilometer length includes one major bridge at Cam Lo. One road is twelve to fifteen feet in width and has a laterite surface. The road is currently being widened and upgraded to class 60 by the 11th Engr Battalion. This project includes clearing a 200 meter strip on both sides of the road.
- g. Gio Linh Con Thien Clearance. The 11th Engineer Battalion completed clearance of a 600 meter wide strip between Con Thien and a point 1,700 meters east of Gio Linh. A 500 meter deep belt was also cleared around the Gio Linh and Con Thien outposts.
- h. Phu Bai Airfield. A 5,600 foot asphalt runway is currently operational. The strip is in good condition and is capable of traffic up to and including C-130 aircraft. Current plans call for a rehabilitation of the present runway and further extension of the parking apron to accomodate additional aircraft.
- i. Dong Ha Airfield. A 3,700 foot runway surfaced with AM-2 matting is operational at Dong Ha. The field is capable of traffic up to and including C=130 aircraft. Current plans call for replacement of the existing runway with an asphalt surfaced runway along the south side of the present runway. It is anticipated that this construction will be accomplished prior to the onset of the monsoon season in October.



- j. Khe Sanh Airfield. A 3,900 foot strip is currently operational at the Khe Sanh Combat Base with a surface of AM-2 matting. It is capable of handling C-130 aircraft. Runway repairs including resurfacing were completed this month.
- k. Huong River. The Song Huong is currently navigable for LCU traffic to the city of Hue. An LST Port Facility is presently being constructed at Tan My near the mouth of the river. A trafficability study has indicated that the river is navigable to LCM traffic from Hue to Nam Hoa for use as a supply route to support the Fire Support Base on Route 547.
- l. Bo Dieu River. The Song Bo Dieu is navigable to LCU traffic Cua Viet to Dong Ha. It is presently planned to dredge the river to a depth of 10 feet and a width of 150 feet between the port facility at Cua Viet and Dong Ha.
- m. <u>Division Command Post</u>. The Third Engineer Battalion is constructing a new Division Command Post Facility at Phu Bai. The complex includes a large administration building with six wings and quarters for the Commanding General and his staff. The facility is expected to be ready for occupancy in late July.

#### 2. MINESWEEPING OPERATIONS

- a. Daily sweeps of lines of communication are conducted by engineer elements to counter enemy mine efforts. The 3d Engineer Battalion conducts an average of ten deliberate minesweeps a day over about 25,000 meters of roads and trails. Sweeps along Route #1 in the Co Bi Thanh Tan area have located numerous mines and other explosive devices. The 11th Engineer Battalion conducts daily sweeps of Route 1 from Dong Ha to Gio Iinh and Route 561 from Cam Lo to Con Thien. Sweeps of Route 9 are also conducted as required to support Rough Riders to Khe Sanh. Sweep teams conduct daily mine detection activities along a heavily interdicted section of Route 1 near Phu Loc.
- b. Despite the number and extent of minesweeping operations, the enemy's mining operations continue to result in substantial casualties and damage to equipment. The extent of the road network within the division area generally precludes detailed daily sweeps of all traveled routes.

#### 3. MINE WARFARE AND ROAD INTERDICTION

a. A review of mine incidents reported by 3d Division units reveals the continuing emphasis on mine warfare by the enemy. The following incidents were reported during June:

#### 4. MILITARY CONSTRUCTION

- a. The Military Construction Program (MCON) for the Division is rapidly coming to a standstill as most of the remaining FY=66 projects are well underway and the implementation of the FY=67s program is awaiting release of funds. Construction priorities for the last of the FY=66 and the FY=67s projects were established at conferences on 7 June for the Phu Bai area and 22 June for the Dong Ha area.
- b. Utilization of the Advance Base Functional Component Program established by III MAF has resulted in the submission of 26 requests by 3d Marine Division. The major items requested are 684 tropical huts, 603 strongback tents and 400 bunkers of various sizes.

#### 5. BASE DEVELOPMENT

- a. In June much attention has been given to the Liting of facilities both in the Phu Bai Gia Le complex and Dong Ha. Recreational facilities have been sited at all three Combat Bases. Additionally, at Phu Bai an amphitheatre, chapel, MUST hospital, hardstands and am EM Club have been sited.
- b. In Phu Bai Gia Le twenty butler buildings have been completed and are in use while construction is underway on another fourteen. At Dong Ha four are in use and fifteen are under construction. The paving of roads in the Phu Bai Base is proceeding on schedule and is 75% completed. A central water system is being installed at Phu Bai and is expected to come on line in the latter part of next month.

#### 6. UTILITIES AND WATER SUPPLY

a. The production of potable water is a major task for the 3d and llth Engineer Battalions. Twelve water points are now in operation and produce nearly 2½ million gallons a week. The water production problem is aggravated by the dry season dwindling of water sources and the difficulty of drilling productive wells. Attempts are being made to drill wells at both Gio Linh and Con Thien to eliminate the present large scale transporting of water from Dong Ha to these outposts.

- b. The electrical power situation showed improvement in this month with the arrival of nine 150 KW generators. Consolidation of power requirements has been accomplished whenever possible but the non availability of large wire prevents the most economical generator employment.
- c. A central power plant is being installed to provide electrical power to much of the Phu Bai Combat Base. The distribution system is largely installed and two 700 KW MUSE generators have arrived in Phu Bai. It is planned to have this system in operation in the latter part of July.

#### CIVIL AFFAIRS

#### 1. CAM LO RESETTLEMENT

- a. By the first week in June the movement of refugees from the DMZ area to Cam Lo had been completed and by mid-June most commodities had been transported and distributed. While this did not mean that Marine support for the refugees could be withdrawn it did indicate that the "crash" phase was over and some of the considerable number of personnel and items of equipment could be returned to their units. On 12 June, therefore, the MT platoon was returned to the 3d MT Bn and on 16 June the Cam Lo warehouse was closed, releasing about 25 personnel from the 11th Engr Bn and 29th CA Company. Most of the tentage in the temporary resettlement area was struck and turned over to FLSU at Dong Ha.
- b. Marines are still deeply involved at Cam Lo. Food supplies are still being transported to the site in Marine vehicles and the 11th Engr En is still being relied upon to maintain the water supply. The OCO-planned water system for the permanent area is not materializing and Marine engineers are now exploring the possibility of moving the existing tank and piping system from the temporary to the permanent area. The 11th Engineers, with G-5 support, also have under construction a facility to make cinvaram earth blocks. Refugees will supply the labor and will be paid in USAID commôdities. Bricks will be used for construction of homes and public building for the refugees. The 29th CA platoon, stationed at Dong Ha, has made Cam Lo a priority civic action project and is helping to coordinate the efforts of a number of units furnishing support to the refugees.
- c. Resettlement to permanent homesites is progressing rapidly. The new estimate of total population in the area is about 9,000 and of these 7,500 have already moved. Home construction is proceeding apace and so are plans for allocating farmland. The next planting period occurs in August.
- d. The Cam Lo area continues to attract a good deal of attention. Among the visitors during the month were General THIEU, Premier KY, Ambassador BUNKER and General WESTMORELAND. The I Corps Joint Coordinating Committee visited the area on 20 June. In general, visitors seemed favorably impressed with the way the relocation project has been carried out despite the difficult problems encountered.

#### 2. REVOLUTIONARY DEVELOPMENT

a. Thua Thien. The RD effort in Thua Thien made satisfactory progress during June. Teams in Huong Tra and Huong Thuy, along Highway #1, claim to have achieved their objectives and they are moving to second semester New Life Hamlets in July. Those in northern Huong Thuy and Phu



Vang have begun to make some progress but it will probably be necessary for them to stay in place for the balance of the year to achieve any significant results. Much of the progress in June can be attributed to friendly operations. One ARVN battalion has been assigned to each of the three RD areas and they have been active and successful. There were eight RDW/VC incidents in June compared to thirteen in May. Five were VC initiated. Casualties were two KIA, two WIA, all attributable to booby traps encountered during search operations.

- b. Quang Tri. The RD program in Quang Tri began to develop a more positive and optimistic tone during June. A campaign headquarters was established at Trieu Phong and a third battalion was assigned to RD protection. The coordination of all efforts through one headquarters should do much to increase the effectiveness of the RD effort and a third battalion should help to plug the gaps in the security of the priority area. The area was generally quiet during the month; morale improved and RD cadre recruitment improved dramatically. Supplies for self-help projects began to 110w into the area after a hiatus during the Cam Lo resettlement. While there is still a long way to go the RD curve finally appears to be headed up.
- 3. ELECTIONS. Hamlet and village elections were completed for both provinces during the month. Final results are as follows:


#### 4. DIVISION CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

- a. Agriculture. During the month the G-5 agricultural advisor worked with MCB-62 and 2/26 to establish hog programs in Thuy Chau and Loc Bon villages. Participants were furnished plans and material to construct pens and by the end of the month seven projects had been completed. Plans are underway to obtain pigs for each project through OCO resources. The advisor also worked with 4th Marines Civic Action team in expanding the agricultural possibilities for refugees in the Phong Dien area.
- b. MEDCAP. The MEDCAP program expanded into two new areas when MCB-3 arrived in country and was assigned responsibilities in Phu Vang district and "A" Medical Company began holding weekly sick calls at Nam Hoa district headquarters. This had previously been curtailed for security reasons but the activity accompanying the construction of Route 547 has improved the situation markedly.

- c. Grave Removal Phu Bai. The removal of several hundred graves from the proposed cantonment area for MAG-16 at the Phu Bai airfield proved to be difficult. Target date for beginning construction was 13 June but it was not until 18 June that the graves were finally removed. III MAF was requested to query Saigon on the status of indemnification of those who have cooperated by relocating thousands of graves to make way for base expansion at Phu Bai and Dong Ha.
- d. Logistics. The logistics situation was improved considerably during the month when a 2½ ton truck was acquired for use by the G-5 section and the major part of a Butler Building was assigned for storage of civic action supplies.
- e. Youth Scholarship Program. This section is working with the Division Chaplain and OCO, Thua Thien, to initiate a youth scholarship program in both provinces. The program, to be supported with chapel funds, will be non-sectarian and will subsidize talented students to enable them to attend either academic or vocational schools they could not otherwise afford. Thirty students are being selected for a pilot effort and it is planned to expand the program in the fall, if successful.
- f. Meetings. Civic Action area coordination meetings were conducted at Phu Bai on 14 June and Dong Ha on 17 June, primarily to review changes in assigned areas of responsibility.

#### 5. PERSONAL RESPONSE

- a. Despite heavy operational commitments by most units during the month the Personal Response Contact Team was still able to reach an estimated 1,000 officers and men of the 9th MT Bn, 3d SP Bn, 3d MT Bn and the 3d Marines.
- b. The Division Personal Response School was conducted at the Division CP on 2-3 June. Thirty-two students, representing most units, attended. The Personal Response portion of the CAC syllabus has been raised to 6 hours.
- c. On 27 June the Division Personal Response Council met to review progress of the program and to hear Mr. Robert BREWER, OCO Province Representative, Quang Tri, discuss counterinsurgency warfare.
- d. During the month the Division participated in the III MAF Vietnam Assignment Survey. By the end of the month the PR Team had coded the answers to a 5% sample of Division personnel and forwarded the results to Danang for programming and interpretation.





#### 1. PERSONNEL

- a. The month of June 1967 began with 20 chaplains serving with the 3d Marine Division; Chaplain WILSON, 2/3 and Chaplain STANIS, 3/4 were with their units deployed to Special Landing Force; Chaplain KEARSLEY, Hq Bn was TAD to FLC.
- b. Chaplains BOLLES, MMCPARTLAND, ONDO and SIMS rotated to CONUS during the month.
- c. Chaplain HUSTIN was medically evacuated to CONUS on 7 June, not resulting from hostile action. Chaplain KEARSLEY was transferred by permanent change of station orders to FLC on 16 June.
- d. Chaplains HABIBY, MCMORROW and MYATT reported from CONUS for duty with 3d Marine Division during the month of June.



- b. On 9 June 1967 an investigation of the 2d Battalion, 4th Marines Regiment area was held by the Division Preventive Medicine Officer due to an outbreak of Amebic Dysentary.
- c. Aerial spraying by helicopter accomplished. Two runs were made, covering the Long Phu Bai River, Song Gia River and its tributary, and a portion of the Song Nong River.

#### 4. UNIT DISPLACEMENT

a. No medical unit displacement took place in the month of June.

#### 5. DISEASES

- a. Influenza program: Units are continuing the influenza program.
- b. 3d Marine Division personnel admitted to the sick list by the Division Psychiatrist with phychiatric diagnosis numbered 35. Twenty nine were evacuated, 6 were returned to duty, and a total of 71 out patients were seen.
- c. A total of 120 cases of illness classified under the category of veneral disease were reported in 3d Marine Division personnel during June. There were 117 cases of gonorrhea, 45 cases of nonspecific urethritis, 2 cases of chancroid and 1 case of Lymphogranuloma Venereum; 20 cases of VD were acquired in RVN, 100 in R&R centers. The one case of Lymphogranuloma Venereum was from Danang.
- d. For the month of June there were 691 non-hostile casualties admitted to the sick list. Of this group there were 102 cases of Fever of Undetermined Origin, 32 cases of gastroenteritis, 40 cases of Cellulitis and 30 cases of heat prostration.
- e. For the month of May there were 85 confirmed cases of malaria, of which 57 were P. falciparium, 05 were P. vivax, and 23 were undetermined.

MISSION: CO III MAF, in coordination with CO I CORPS, prepare a plan for the location, construction, organization and occupation of a strong point/obstacle system along the southern edge of the DMZ extending from the South China Sea to a point about one-third of the distance to the Lactian berder (Dong Ha Mountain - ND 020594).

CONCENT: In its completed form, the defense of the assigned sector will require one U. S. Regiment (rein) and one ARVN R giment (rein) disposed in six strong points and three battalion base areas. A reserve battalion is provided to be based at Dong Ha to be employed in tactical operations in support of the defence. The U.S. Fortion of the defense will include four company (rein) strong points and two battalion base areas. The ARVN will man two battalion (rein) strong points and one battalion base area. The organization of the defense, up to this point, has been achieved with a minimum commitment of troops. The initial effort has been and will continue to center on clearing the trace for the installation of the linear obstacle system between Gio Linh and Con Thien. Additionally, a cleared area, 500M in radius encircling Gio linh and Con Thien has been co pleted. The extension of the current engineer effort involves the widening of the by 200M trace between Con Thien and Gio Linh to 600M and extending it past Gio Linh to the East to the high water point of the flood plain (YD 246747). This work can be accomplished without commitment of construction materials and additional troop units. It should be completed by early in July.

Concurrently with the above, the trace to its terminus at the South China ion can be surveyed and plans developed for clearing it as well as the site for strong point A-1 (YD 267755) (Come TRY TO GET ARVN TO OR TO CAME)?

Apart from the above but complementary to the over all project, the following actions are being accomplished:

Houte 9 is being upgraded Route 1 North of Dang Ha to Cio Linh is being upgraded. Route 561 North from Cam lo to Con Thien is being upgraded. A site for storage of fortification materials has been selected at Dong Ha and plans are being made to prepare it for use.

MACCOMPANIATIONS: 1. Clear trace, 600M wide, Con Thien through Gio link to the high water point (YD 246747). Con-currently, survey trace to its eastern terminus and develop plans for continuation of clearing effort.

- 2. Clear sites for strong points A-1, A-3, and battalion base areas C-1, 6-2, and C-3.
- 3. Upgrade Route 7 Dong Ha to Thon Son Lam; Route 1 Dong Ha to Gio Linh; and, Route 561 com Lo to Con Thion.
- 4. When materials are available and released by COMUSMACV, together with construction and system sensor specifications, commence construction strong points A-1 and A-3. Concurrent with this and events 1-3, parrison troops

at Con This and Gio Linh continue to improve defensive positions and incorporate sensor systems not a part of the linear obstacle.

CTHER CONTENT: It is not recommended that tower construction be commended until such time as we are prepared to introduce troops above current levels permanently into the area. (Current level assumed to be Bn(-)). Tower construction must be accompanied by the introduction of troops to man and offend the tower area. The installation of a forward edge wire obstacle would serve no purpose.

Con Thien is currently a SF/CIDG Camp. In the development of the obstacle system, it is intended that this site be assumed by a U.S. Force (now assumed to be USMC). The CIDG should be planned to be moved to another site (for example: Western end of Elephant Valley, Sa Huynh, or as reinforcement for Long Vei).

Consideration should be given to relocating the Provisional Artillery Bn at Cio Link to a less engaged position; (for example: strong point A-3 (YU 169716).
