

NATIVE SURFARY

PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

1. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

- a. During the month of August, 126 Officers and 2413 Enlisted personnel joined the Division. Personnel transferred by normal rotation included 222 officers and 3920 enlisted. Personnel transferred by service records due to MedEvacs were 18 officers and 318 enlisted. Other personnel transferred by service records included 17 enlisted.
- b. Award recommendations to FMFPac: 6 Navy Crosses, 31 Silver Stars, 7 Legion of Merit Medals, 1 Distinguished Flying Cross, 3 Navy and Marine Corps Medals, 107 Bronze Star Medals, 7 Air Medals, 101 Navy Commendation Medals and 4 Navy Achievement Medals. Approved by FMTPac: 1 Navy Cross, 13 Silver Stars, 4 Legion of Merit Medals, 1 Navy and Marine Corps Medal, 96 Bronze Stars, 6 Air Medals, 85 Navy Commendation Medals and 2 Navy Achievement Medals. In addition, 1006 Purple Hearts were presented.
- c. Casualties sustained during the month included: 60 KIA, 947 WIA, 13 DOM, 6 NHD, 54 NHI and 2 MIA.
- d. Congressional Interest Cases: 144 cases processed, 93 cases completed, 14 cases pending and 37 cases readdressed to other commands.
- e. Discharges: O Hardship Discharges approved, 5 Hardship Discharges to CMC for decision, 3 Unsuitable Discharges disapproved and 1 Unsuitable Discharge approved. Pending: 3 Hardship Discharges and 1 Unsuitable Discharge.

2. EXCHANGE SERVICE

- a. The Dong Ha Combat Base Exchange officially opened its addition to the facility on 6 August 1967. The additional apace provides for a larger selection of desired merchandise and accommodates a larger patron shopping area.
- b. The I Corps Area Exchange Officer, LtCol H. C. NOLAND, U. S. Army, inspected the 3d Division Exchange System on 9 and 10 August 1967. LtCol NOLAND was impressed with the Exchange operation and has assured the Exchange Officer of increased support and equipment.
- c. Colonel J. C. POTTER, U. S. Army, Chief, Army and Air Force Exchange Service, Vietnam visited and inspected this commands Exchange Service on 16 August 1967.

- d. On 25 August 1967, the Exchange Service moved into the new Butler building warehouse adjacent to the Post Office Philipping warehouse will be used for bulk and palletized merchandisc.
- e. 1079 pallets of Exchange merchandise were received from the A&AFES Depot Danang.

3. POSTAL SERVICE

- a. During the period, all 14 stationary and mobile units continued to provide service to members of this command. One postal unit remained inactive (Unit 13).
- b. The following figures represent pounds of U. S. Mail this command received and dispatched during the month of August 1967.

5. INFORMATIONAL SERVICES

- a. 128 news feature items and photographs were released through the III Marine Amphibious Force Information Office. Also, a total of 1474 home town news releases was sent to the Fleet Home Town News Center, Great Lakes, Illinois.
- b. A total of 78 civilian news correspondents visited the Phu Bai area during the month. One hundred and twenty two newsmen visited the Dong Ha area, one visited the Camp Evans area and ten civilian press representatives visited the Khe Sanh area.
- c. The Radio/TV section turned out a total of 1127 minutes and 50 seconds of tape recordings for the month. This breaks down to a total of 1034 minutes of Fleet Home Town News interviews and 88 minutes and 40 seconds of special features of 3d Division Combat actions. Also, six minutes and ten seconds of special requests tapes were turned out.
- d. Seventy correspondents, covering a political rally on 28 August 1967, were provided truck transportation from Phu Bai air terminal to Hue and return.

6. SPECIAL SERVICES

a. Recreation Fund Activity

- (1) The following items were issued under the "Critipak" Program: Critipaks 78, Paperback books 6,475; Writing kits 5,627.
- (2) 178 cases of soda and 600 cases of beer were provided units of the Division under the "Free Beer and Soda Program."
- b. Division Education Program: During the month 110 High School GED tests and 33 College (CCT-GE) tests were administered. Testing was conducted in the Khe Sanh, Camp Evans, Gia Le and Phu Bai areas.
- c. Special Entertainment: The following special entertainment was provided to units of the Division during the month.
- (1) "The Traildusters", a Military Country and Western Show, performed on 4 August at 3d Motor Transport Battalion and 3d Medical Battalion.
- (2) Russ Arno, singer, who records for Sinatra Enterprises, performed on 31 July, 1 and 2 August at 3d Motor Transport Battalion.
- (3) Robert Stack, movie and TV star, visited units of the Division at Dong Ha, Khe Sanh and Phu Bai on 6 August.

- (4) William Talman, TV star, visited units of the Division at Dong Ha, Camp Carroll and Phu Bai on 8 and 9 August.
- (5) Wendell Corey, movie and TV star, visited units of the Division at Dong Ha, Khe Sanh and Phu Bai on 18 August.
- (6) Tina Lawton, folksinger, performed on 21 August for 3d Motor Transport Battalion, 3d Engineer Battalion and 3d Medical Battalion.

7. BAND

- a. During the period, a 26 piece section of the 3d Marine Division Band left for a six week tour of Okinawa. Its expected return is 15 September 1967.
- b. That portion of the 3d Marine Division Band remaining in RVN, participated in several awards and change of command ceremonies as well as routine color functions. Additionally, the Band played at two school dedications and a County Fair at C/P Unit Hotel 6.

8. PROVOST MARSHAL

- a. The usual Military Police functions were performed throughout the period, i.e., patrols and security watches.
- b. Nineteen special escorts for distinguished guests and USO entertainers were conducted in the Hue/Phu Bai area.
- c. During August, 27 persons were detained as possible Prisoners of War.



- d. The City of Hue was inspected for Blackmarket activities on two separate occasions during the period. Blackmarket volume continues to decline and prices have remained stable.
- e. The Vietnamese National Police and Military Police have commenced a periodic detailed check of all civilian stores and personnel in the Phu Bai area. Store records and personal clearances were examined for discrepancies.
- f. Special security details were performed on 9 August for the Commandant of the Marine Corps.
- g. Special sentries and traffic control posts were established when the ammunition dump at Phu Bai exploded.
- h. During the period numerous conferences were held with Chief LAP, National Police, Hue, concerning security of the Phu Bai Vital Area and Viet Cong activity. Through these conferences Chief LAP has continued to supply intelligence information on the surrounding area. Such information is passed to the 3d Marine Division G-2 Section for evaluation.
- i. The Vietnamese National Police have started to prosecute known prostitutes in and around the Hue/Phu Bai area. Eight girls were sentenced to 3-5 months in jail.
- j. A new detention facility was constructed by Public Works to serve as a secure means to hold U. S. forces personnel at the Provost Marshal's Office. The new facility can house four prisoners at one time.
- k. A special legal school was conducted by the Assistant Legal Officer of Division Legal Office for all officers, SNCOs and CID personnel. Subjects discussed were search and seizure, rights of individuals, courtroom procedures and other miscellaneous subjects.



- 3. The 15th Counterintelligence Team screened 31 persons during the month of August 1967. Sub-Teams were provided to 3/26 for a search and destroy mission and to 3d and 9th Marine Regiments in direct support of Operation KINGFISHER. Close liaison was maintained with U. S. and Vietnamese intelligence and security agencies in Quang Tri Province. On 7 August 1967 information gained from a 15th Counterintelligence Team source enabled the National Police to effectively neutralize a low level Viet Cong Intelligence net. There were 45 counterintelligence reports and 19 spot reports prepared and disseminated. Blacklists of 23 villages were for aished to 1st Amtrac Battalion. A Counterintelligence briefing was presented to the Assistant Division Commander and Staff.
- 4. The 7th Interrogation Translation Team provided support for Operations CUMBERLAND, FREMONT, and BELT DRIVE in addition to support for Phu Bai and Dong Ha. The sub-team in support of the 9th Marine Regiment was withdrawn on 15 August 1967. On 15 August 1967 the 7th Interrogation Translation Team assumed the translation of captured enemy documents and ARVN Intelligence materials for all supported Marine units and activities in Thua Thien Province. During the month of August, 40 detainees were screened and classified as follows:

For the period 15-31 August 1967, 43 batches of documents were processed for 155 total items and 109 total pages of translation. Close liaison was maintained with GVN and ARVN agencies so that follow-up interrogations could be carried out on detainees obtained by Vietnamese sources.

5. The 15th Interrogation Translation Team provided support for Operation KINGFISHER from 12 August 1967 and to the U.S. Navy and U.S. Coast Guard. During the month of August, 29 detainees were screened and classified as follows:

For the month of August, 12 batches of documents were processed. Close liaison was maintained with GVN and ARVN agencies.

- 6. The 17th Interrogation Translation Team arrived in country on 22 August 1967 and was assigned to the 3d Marine Division. For the remainder of the month a sub-team was deployed to Cam Lo, support was given to Phu Bai and to the PsyOps section.
- 7. The 3d Interpreter Team supported Operations BELT DRIVE and BEACON POINT and provided support to the 3d Marine Division in the Hue-Phu Bai area. On 15 August 1967 the processing of captured documents and ARVN POW reports was turned over to the 7th and 15th Interrogation Translation Teams. During the month 9 batches of captured documents were processed of which 20 items were screened resulting in 7 pages of translation. During the same period 49 friendly documents were processed resulting in 120 pages of translation. The team worked a total of 9 hours in support of PsyOps.
- 8. The 9th and 11th Interpreter Teams supported Operations BELT DRIVE and BEACON POINT. Interpreters were placed with the 1st Counterintelligence Team at Phong Dien and Phu Loc and with the 15th Interrogation Translation Team in Dong Ha. In addition, interpreters were provided to CAC A-3 on a continual basis and an interpreter was assigned CAP headquarters, Huong Thuy for the period 24-28 August 1967.
- 9. The Aerial Observation Section flew a total of 537 sorties for a total of 1,176.2 hours during the month of August. Two hundred and twenty one sorties were flown in Marine aircraft for a total of 366.4 hours. The Army provided aircraft for 228 sorties amounting to 577.3 hours. The Air Force flew 88 sorties for a total of 182.5 hours. The section provided general support for all operations by the Division by flying missions from Phu Bai, Dong Ha and Khe Sanh airfields. One briefing was held for selected members of the 3d Reconnaissance Battalion. It is noted that the AO Section was responsible for almost one half of the enemy confirmed and probable kills in the 3d Marine Division area of operation during the month of August.

10. During the month of August the Combat Intelligence Section produced two (2) periodic Intelligence Reports, forwarded to 3d Marine Division units one special Intelligence Collection Requirement and initiated one EEI message. The section provided one OOB analyst to 1st Battalion, 9th Marines for Operation BEACON POINT. Additionally the Combat Intelligence Section opened files for 40 captives in August. The OOB Section also issued the monthly update to the Quarterly Enemy Order of Battle Summary.

11. Plans and Estimates Unit.

- 1. Special Intelligence Studies

- B. Research was commenced on Study #21, Base Area 101, with an estimated publication date of early September.
- 2. Intelligence Briefings. Briefings were provided to the Intelligence Officers of the staff's of Special Landing Force Alpha and Bravo to assist them in planning of Amphibious Operations in the 3d Marine Division 10R.
- 3. Plans and Estimates. Research was commenced in late August relative to the preparation of an Intelligence Annex, Intelligence Estimate, and related documents for a proposed Operation SHERMAN.
- 12. The 3d Marine Division Target Bulletin for August added 930 new targets, of which 443 were in Thua Thien Province and 487 in Quang Tri Province.

 Based on the Target List and recommendations from the OCB Section, TIO submitted an average of 15 targets a day for TRQ-10 strikes. Of these an average of four (4) a day were struck. TIO publishes a daily Long Range Target

SECRÉT

Report which lists all of the TPQ-10 missions flown, expending an average of 1500 pounds of ordered on each target. TIO screens requests from subprdinate units for Arc Light strikes, validates or adds additional intelligence to III MAF proposals and initiates Arc Light strikes in all areas which present lucrative targets. TIO initiated twenty (20) requests for Arc Light strikes in August.


During the month of August, TIO revalidated 12 Arc Light targets. Of the 57 targets struck by Arc Lights in August in the 3d Marine Division TAOR, TIO proposed or revalidated 33. ITI MAF initiated action on the remaining 2h targets. During the period, TIO provided target overlays and target lists for four (h) Special Intelligence Studies. Upon special request from subordinate units, TIO provides special target lists. TIO provided such lists to the 26th Marines for the proposed artillery raid along Route 9 and to 1st FAG for use in the 175mm shelling of A Shau Valley.

13. During the month of August 36 photo requests were submitted, 33 to III MAF and three (3) to Division Air. Only two have not been fulfilled in one form or another. For various reasons, Division Air has not flown Requests 198-67 and 217-67. Special area studies for Project Dye Marker and for the 9th Marines were completed. Specific areas below the DMZ were submitted in the monthly Aerial Photo Plan. Additionally considerable time and effort was put forth in supplying adequate photo coverage for the 12th Marines. A total of 11 missions were forwarded to them for their use. Two other items of note were the completion of Area Study No. 20 and a weekly occupied enemy activity of the DMZ and areas north of the DMZ.

15. Lesson Learned. A 1st ARVN Division Interrogation report of PW VU DANG HONG (AKA PHUONI) states the following about ambushes. Ambushes set by ARVN's were often discovered at night because of smoking, use of perfumed cils, describing was not complete, coughing and checking weapons. When an ambush was discovered, the group would change direction. These same faults could possibly be applied to our own ambushes. The use of shaving lotion, decdorants, coughing, checking weapons are things that appear to be human nature. There have also been a few indications that ambushes have fixed on the enemy point instead of waiting for the main body of the force. The enemy quite often let our point and a good portion of the main body pass before they initiate an ambush. These tactics and the means by which the enemy detects our ambushes should be made available to every man involved in setting an ambush.



OPERATIONS


l. GENERAL. The 3d Marine Division continued operations in Thua Thien and Quang Tri Provinces of South Vietnam in accordance with assigned missions. Division operations during the month were characterized by increasing enemy artillery fire, frequent minor ground contacts and heavy ground contacts in the KINGFISHER area. Company and battalion size search and destroy operations were conducted throughout the AOR. Extensive reconnaissance was conducted with numerous sightings of small groups of enemy and frequent minor contact with enemy forces. Enemy harassing tactics of sniper, mine and booby trap incidents were encountered throughout the area.

SLF BRAVO landed in an amphibious assault in the Hai Lang - Quang Tri area on 27 August. Operations ashore were continuing at the end of the month with no significant contacts.

- 2. FREMONT. Operation FREMONT continued with minor enemy contact. 2/4 continued to provide security for the Camp Evans area and conducted extensive patrolling and small unit search and destroy missions throughout the OA. 2/3, under OPCON of the 4th Marines since July, participated in the security of Camp Evans and search and destroy missions in conjunction with 2/4 throughout the month until backloading on 21 August. Operations were characterized by minor enemy resistance and harassing tactics of mine, sniper and booby trap incidents. Toward the end of the month ambushes, OP's, and blocking positions were established by 2/4 in the vicinity of National Route #1 to coordinate with ARVN activities in support of the approaching national elections. Forces were also provided for security of MCB construction on Route #1 and for W/1/13 at forward artillery base near Huong Dien. FREMONT was continuing at the end of the month. Cumulative friendly casualties: 13 KIA and 162 WIA.
- 3. RUSH. Operation RUSH commenced 0630 5 August 1967. 2d Bn, 4th Marines (-) with 2 companies 2d Bn, 26th Marines conducted search and destroy operations in conjunction with 1st ARVN Division forces in the area southwest of Phu Bai Combat Base. Only minor contact with small groups of enemy resulted from this action. Contacts we've characterized by light enemy SA/AW fire, hand grenades and sporadic booby trap incidents. An enemy hospital base camp and harboring site was discovered and destroyed. Operation RUSH terminated 1800 9 August 1967.
- 4. KANGAROO KICK. Operation KANGAROO KICK was continuing on 1 August 1967. It was being conducted by SIF BRAVO in the My Chanh River area. It continued until 3 August 1967 when BLT 2/3 and Detachment A, HMM-265, were chopped to the 3d Marine Division. Contact was light throughout the period.
- 5. CUMBERLAND. Operation CUMBERLAND continued throughout the month with frequent minor contacts. The purpose of Operation CUMBERLAND was to provide security for the engineering effort involved in the construction of a Forward Fire Support Base and for the Main Supply route used to supply this

effort. The 1st Bn, 4th Marines was assigned to these tasks. The Forward Fire Support Bawe was completed during the early part of the month and Army 175mm guns were introduced into the area. The contacts encountered took three forms: sightings of small numbers of enemy troops by infantry units on patrol or in night defensive positions; small arms and RPG attacks on resupply convoys along the Main Supply Route; and sniper attacks against engineer mine sweeps along the Main Supply Route. Mines were also frequently employed by the enemy along the Main Supply Route. Cumulative friendly casualties: 5 KIA and 88 WIA.

- KINGFISHER. Operation KINGFISHER was continuing at the beginning of the month with minor contact. The 9th Marines with three battalions and the 3d Marines with two battalions were the major units involved. The 9th Marines were reinforced with two companies and a command group from 3d Bn, 26th Marines during the latter part of the month. The 1st Amphibious Tractor Battalion operated in an infantry role in the eastern part of the KINGFISHER area. Ground action was light during the early part of the month with the largest part of the activity involving artillery attacks on Gio Linh, Con Thien, Cua Viet and Dong Ha. Air Strikes controlled by aerial observers against enemy positions and troop concentrations, ARC LIGHT strikes in the DMZ and numerous minor contacts made by reconnaissance teams. Activity began to pick up around the 18th of the month with a number of small unit contacts in the area between Con Thien and Cam Lo. On the 20th, the enemy ambushed a resupply convoy moving south along Highway #9 between Thon Son Lam and Ca Lu. This contact developed into an intense fire fight with heavy dependence upon supporting air. Final results of the contact included 109 enemy KIA(Confi med) and 305 KIA(Probable). Forces were sent into the area to exploit the contact and contact remained heavy in the area for the next four or five days. Contacts throughout the KINGFISHER area remained heavy throughout the latter part and the artillery attacks on Gio Linh, Con Thien, Cua Viet and Dong Ha steadily increased in intensity as the elections scheduled for 3 September 1967 approached. On 28 August 1967, the 1st Amphibious Tractor Battalion found 51 enemy rockets in position and ready for firing on Dong Ha. Cumulative friendly casualties: 73 KIA and 380 WIA.
- 7. ARDMORE. Operation ARDMORE was continuing throughout the month with minor contact. Operation ARDMORE involved the 26th Marines with the 1st Battalion, 26th Marines and the 3d Battalion, 26th Marines. Operations consisted of defense of the Khe Sanh Combat Base, facilities and combat outposts, extensive patrolling to the maximum range of artillery and frequent company sized search and destroy operations. These operations involved numerous contacts by reconnaissance patrols operating in the TAOR and a minimum of contact by the infantry units. Aerial observers made numerous sightings throughout the period and called a number of artillery missions and air strikes with significant results. Cumulative friendly casualties: 9 KIA and 3h WIA.



- 8. LIBERTY. Operation LIBERTY commenced 30 August with the purpose of supporting ARVN forces during the VN National Election. Units throughout the Division TAOR are establishing short range patrols, blocking forces, reaction forces and ambushes well outside local villages. This operation is directed towards interdicting the VC in their efforts to gather rice and interfere with the elections. The operation will take place within the framework of existing operations and will continue through the election period. LIBERTY will involve the entire 3d Marine Division.
- 9. BALT DRIVE. On 27 August, BLT 2/3 landed by air and sea in the Hai Lang Quang Tri area. Search and destroy operations are continuing ashore with insignificant contact.
- 10. PHU BAI TAOR. 2d Bn, 26th Farines continued operations in the Phu Bai TAOR. Company and platoon size, search and destroy operations were conducted in Huong Thuy and Fnu Loc Districts as well as extensive patrol and ambush activities. Only minor enemy contact resulted. 2/26 also provided forces for perimeter security, convoy security and security for MCB units working on Route #1.

- b. Contact Instruction Team assisted Division units in conducting familiarization firing and zeroing of M-16 weapons.

COMBAT AIR SUPPORT

1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- a. In the Dong Ha area, Operation KINGFISHER was supported by FMAW fixed wing aircraft flying 1,565 sorties and expending 2,643 tons of ordnance. For the same period, FMAW rotary wing aircraft flew 582 sorties, lifted 179 passengers, and transported 210 tons of cargo.
- b. In the Khe Sanh area, Operation ARDMORE was supported with fixed wing aircraft flying 233 sorties and expending 373 tons of ordnance. Helicopters in support of the operation flew 213 sorties, lifted 1,071 passengers, and carried 638 tons of cargo.
- c. In the 4th Marines area, fixed wing aircraft flying in support of Operation FREMONT flew 31 fixed wing sorties and expended 151 tons of ordnance. Helicopters flew 391 sorties, lifted 184 passengers, and 87 tons of cargo.
- d. Fixed wing aircraft flew 91 sorties and expended 422 tons of ordnance in support of Operation CUMBERLAND. Helicopters flew 285 sorties, lifted 135 passengers, and carried 177 tons of cargo.
- e. There were 14 Arc Light strikes in the province of Thua Thien and 28 strikes in Quang Tri Province.

(3) Initiated planning for Operation Ropeyarn, a combined Air/NGF/Arty strike operation with objectives of neutralization and destruction of the Cap Lay artillery and AA gun emplacements.

3. TARGETING

- (a) Artillery. A total of 8908 long range, pre-planned targets were attacked during the month of August.
- (b) TPQ-10 Missions. A total of 990 targets were struck by TPQ-10 missions during the month.

COMMUNICATION-ELECTRONICS

1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- a. CommSuptCo (-), at Dong Ha, completed burial of approximately 90% of the cables in the Dong Ha area. Communication facilities and cables were routed and installed in the new CP Bunkers. Blast walls were constructed at the NCO and troop quarters. CommSuptCo has accepted responsibility for Gio Linh Communications and began phase-in of their personnel to relieve the 12th Marines of this task.
- b. 3d MarDiv representatives attended the I Corps Area Communication Coordinator's Conference at III MAF Headquarters on 10 August 1967.
- c. All 3d MarDiv voice circuits south between Phu Bai and Danang were cut-over to the IWCS system during August. Seven voice circuits were cut-over to the IWCS TRC-66 system between Phu Bai and Dong Ha.
- d. Communication Company routed and buried 1,000 line pairs to the new 3d MarDiv CP, installed the telephone frame and began telephone hook-up. Action was initiated for a new CP intercomm system and new PA system for the CG's briefing room. Conferences were held with Air Force representatives to work out details and requirements for the forthcoming DYE MARKER USAF ISC NAKHON PHANOM 3d MarDiv COC secure voice and TT circuits. Army, Navy and Air Force representatives visited 3d MarDiv CP, Phu Bai, to provide information and guidance on requirements for AUTOSEVOCOM and AUTODIN installation in the new Communication Bunker.
- 2. 3D MARDIV MARS. A total of 775 messages and 1776 telephone calls were processed by NØEFJ at Phu Bai and NØEFA at Dong Ha. In addition, 490 uncompleted calls were attempted. 68 urgent/priority and official calls were made. Decrease in telephone calls processed during August was due to a 50% cut in operating time directed by the Navy MARS Coordinator.
- 3. All 3d MarDiv units were visited by the CEO Contact Team during August in preparation for a GAO visit. Follow-up visits were scheduled as required.
- 4. PROBLEM AREAS. Although some H-189 Handsets were received by 3d MarDiv units, no antennas were received and these items still remain critical. Other items in extremely critical status are Planar Triodes for the TRC-27B, PU-278 Generators, Monoblocs for BB-451 Batteries and Communication Center supplies.

PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

- 1. During the month of August the Psychological Operations objectives were:
 - a. Support Chieu Hoi program.
 - b. Exploit VC/NVA battlefield losses.
 - c. Lower VC/NVA morale.
 - d. Show strength of free world forces.
 - e. Reduce mining and booby trap incidents.
 - f. Discredit VC/NVA.
 - Induce reporting VC activity.
 - h. Explain presence of U.S. Forces in Vietnam.
 - i. Instill good health habits in the people.
 - j. Encourage support of the GVN.
- 2. Psychological Operations supported all named operations and Regimental TAGR's. The Phu Bai TAOR, the DMZ, Recon Zones and the A Shau Valley were also targeted regularly.

- 4. In addition to the aerial leaflet drops, 85 hours 30 minutes of aerial bros casts were utilized in the same general areas with the same general themes.
- 5. A total of 149 hours and 30 minutes of surface broadcast was conducted. Waterborne operations accounted for 63 hours and 10 minutes of this total. PsyOps speaker teams working with Coastal Groups 11, 12 and 13 and with the Thua An Island Naval Support Detachment covered most of the waterways and coast from Phu Loc to the DMZ and along the rivers from Thua An Island

to Hue and from the mouth of the Cua Viet River to Dong Ha. The remaining 76 hours and 20 minutes were broadcast mainly on the 4th Marines perimeter, at MedCAP's in the Phoung Dien area and at CAP units throughout the Phu Bai area. General themes were music, MedCAP instructions, Chieu Hoi, GVN helps the people, support GVN, good health, vote in coming elections and what to do when the VC enter your village.

- 6. A total of 10 hours of movies were shown. One hour and 30 minutes of movies were shown at a modified County Fair conducted by 2/26. The remaining 8 hours and 30 minutes was shown in the Khe Sanh area in support of the 26th Marines. General movie themes were cartoons, good health, cleanliness, support GVN and films designed to generally instill a feeling of nationalism among the people.
- 7. Approximately 104,500 leaflets, posters, newspapers and pamphlets were hand distributed during the month. The largest portion of these were the Free South Newspapers passed out by the Military Police at check points and by CAC units.
- 8. On 19 August 21 scouts graduated from the Quang Tri Kit Carson Scout School and were assigned to Division units as follows:

e. Food Services. During the month of August the 3d Marine Division Food Services Program consisted of 51 operational messes supported by 510 02 33 personnel. Of the total messes in operation, 10 are permanent type field messes housed in MCON structures and the remaining his are temporary field messes. Subsistence support provided Marine Corps, Navy, and Army personnel of this Division averaged 31,000 rations daily. Of the total personnel subsisted, approximately 87% were subsisted on "A" type rations supplemented with "B" ration items. Approximately 13% consumed Meals Combat Individual daily. Meals Combat Individual are being consumed only when operational requirements preclude serving "A" rations.

f. Supply

- (1) Supply Early Warning messages have been instituted to avvise higher headquarters of retential problem areas.
- (2) Division Supply/Maintenance Management Teams completed inspection schedules in preparation for GAO visit.
- (3) The Excess and Cancellation Program totaled \$10,451,634.57 for the period 1 January 1967 to 31 July 1967.
- (h) FMFPac Supply Assistance Team conclude pre-GAO inspection of Division units.
- (5) Division Supply Officer attended conference on GAO visit conducted by Daniel III Maron I, August 1967.

g. New Items of Equipment

- (1) Metascope Assembly, Image, Infrared. Provisioning has not been completed. Battaliens of the 9th and 26th Marines have not received their allewance of subject items. Currently no units have received the required batteries. A message requesting assistance has been sent to the Commanding General Fleet Marine Force Pacific.
- (2) Starlight Scopes. The second increment of Starlight Scopes has been received. This increment of 18 scopes added to the scopes previously on hand increased the Divisions assets to a total of 71 Starlight Scopes.
- (3) Decontaminating Apparatus Ml2. The Division allowance of 37 units has been approved and receipt can be expected within next 90 days. Vehicle cleaning stations will be established utilizing this equipment. The Ml2 should be of assistance in keeping vehicles clean and in operating condition during the mensoon season.
 - h. Planning. Plans were completed and issued for Operation LIBERTY.

2. PROBLEM AREAS

a. Supply

- (1) Many common items of supply remain a serious problem to this Command. Demand continues to exceed the flow of supplies. Although immediate relief is often obtained on a one time basis, the lack of consistent supply is of continuing concern.
- (2) A chronic shortage of stationery and office supplies, which has prevailed for the past eight months, continues to deter from eraficient administrative precedures.
- (3) The construction of and maintenance of perimeter defenses and bunkers continues to be restricted by lack of lumber, sandbags and eight foot stakes.
 - b. Transpertation. No significant problem areas.
- c. Services. There is an inadequate number of laundry units, bath units and water distribution equipment to satisfy Division requirements.

d. Maintenance

- (1) Short supply of exygen, acetylene, 6 TN batteries, tires and tire patches centimes to impair maintenance efforts in all units.
- (2) Short supply of replacment parts for accomplishment of both 2d and 3d echelon maintenance has resulted in the deadlining of equipment for excessive periods.
- (3) Lack of replacement transmissions and engines for the Truck Utility Wil22al, has resulted in a large deadline of this item. Of the five hundred and sixteen vehicles on hand this Division, one hundred and one are now in 3d echelon repair facilities.
- (4) Lack of component parts/modules for the radio set AN/PRG-25 contributes to a high deadline rate of this item.
- (5) Support through the Direct Exchange Program continues to be unsatisfactory. Items that are rebuilt and returned via the Direct Exchange Program are often received in an unsatisfactory condition. In addition, the lack of repair parts at the supporting maintenance facility reduces the number of items available for exchange.

DIVISION ENGINEER

- 1. During August the Third Marine Division received engineer support from a Division and a Force Engineer Battalion, from three complete Navy Mobile Construction Battalions and from detachments of three NMCB's. Additionally, engineer maintenance and utilities support is provided by detachments from Naval Support Activity, Danang. Major responsibilities and projects have been included:
- a. <u>Direct Support</u>. The Division Engineer Battalion has provided continous engineer support for all operations involving Third Marine Division units as well as support for SLF operations in the Division TAOR. This support includes construction, minesweeping, demolition, road construction and maintenance, obstacle construction and removal, and utilities support.
- b. The Repair of National Route #1. The repair and upgrading of National Route #1 from the DMZ to Lang Co is underway with the state of MCB-11, MCB-3, MCB-121, and a detachment of MCB-74. The four battalions are presently patching and resurfacing the road. Completed portions include the Gio Linh to Quang Tr: section, a three mile section from An Lo to PK-17, from Hue to the Troui Bridge and a two mile section south of Phu Loc.
- c. Maintenance of Route 9. The 11th Engineer Battalion is responsible for maintaining Route 9 from Dong Ha to Lang Vei. Bypasses must be continuously maintained as the majority of bridges on the road are limited to class 16 traffic. Between Thon Son Lam and Khe Sanh are four bridges that have destroyed by the enemy and three with very poor decks that must be bypassed. There is also a washout that must be spanned by tactical bridging for vehicles larger than a 5-Ton truck. The major bridge is the bridge across the Rao Quan River which requires an all relixed span bridge to be emplaced prior to convoy movement to Khe Sanh. The 11th Engineer Battalion supports convoys to Khe Sanh by opening the road to traffic when required.
- d. Operation Cumberland. Elements of the 11th Engineer Battalion completed the clearing of a Fire Support Base west of Nam Hoa on Route 547. The entire length of the earth and laterite surfaced road was improved and maintained as was the 760' floating bridge at Nam Hoa.
- e. Division Command Post. The 3d Engineer Battalion with assistance from elements of the 11th Engineer Battalion and MCB-121 is constructing a new Division Command Post at Phu Bai including quarters to the Commanding General and his serfor staff. The buildings are nearly completed except for minor interior and plumbing work. Construction has begun on four large bunkers for command and communications facilities to serve the new Command Post.

F. Khe Sanh Airfield. Heavy rains in July and Augus caused subgrade failure at the Khe Sanh Airstrip. The only lasting solution is to emplace a crushed mack subgrade for the strip. For this purpose a rock quarry is being tablished and two rock crushers were airlifted to Khe Sanh.

2. MINESWEEPING OPERATIONS.

- a. During August the 3d Engineer Battalion averaged 10 sweeps a day covering 35,000 meters of road. These include daily sweeps of Rt 561, Pt 547, the access roads to Camp Carroll, Camp Evans, and Gia Le, and Ril from Phu Loc to Lang Co. The Third Engineers also provide convoy minesweeping support as required.
- b. The 11th Engineer Battalion conducts a daily sweep of Rt 1 between Dong Ha and Gio Linh (15 Km) and sweeps the bypasses on Rt 9 as required.

3. MINE INCIDENTS.

a. In August there were 54 incidents reported involving the discovery of mines or boodytraps by Third Marine Division Units. Approximately 80 explosive devices were discovered and destroyed or removed. Division units reported 68 detonations of mines including 19 detonations by vehicles.

4. MILITARY CONSTRUCTION

- a. Construction of facilities provided by the 67S Military Construction program is now about 31% complete. Completed buildings include 244 (16'x32') huts. Five messhalls and 19 showers are presently under construction. Work has commenced on recreational and welfare facilities including the chapel, EM Club, SNCO Club and volleyball/basketball courts.
- b. The Advance Base Functional Component (ABFC) Program is now providing facilities for 3d Marine Division units. At Camp Evans 60 strong-backs have been completed and a 500 man messhall is being constructed. Forty 16'x32' huts have been constructed at Dong Ha for the alternate Division Command Post. ABFC requests submitted in August are as follows:

5. BASE DEVELOPMENT.

a. The 32d Naval Construction Regiment became operational in late August. This Headquarters, which is located in this Le, will have operational control of the MCB's in the 3d Marine Division area. The close proximity of the NCR Headquarters to 3d Marine Division Headquarters appeared to improve communications and liaison with the supporting Construction Battalions.

NSA Public Works Maintenance detachment in Phu Bai became in August and is accepting work requests for maintenance, repair and alterations to facilities and minor construction projects. The detachment also has responsibility for the Phu Bai central water and electrical distribution systems.

c. Relocation of an 8th Radio Research Field Station antenna field at Phu Bai has released 200,000 square meters of land from an electronic easement that had previously prohibited transcruction.

6. UTILITIES AND WATER SUPPLY

- a. The lack of rainfall during the Summer months led to a serious shortage throughout the Division. Most seriously affected was rou Bai where stringent water controls were imposed for a brief period before late month rains brought refler.
- b. The Phu Bai central water distribution system now provides non-potable water in Third Division and FLSG-A areas. However, lack of a filtration system has thus far prevented the production of potable water.
- c. The electrical power situation remains quite serious. Operational assets continue to decrease as generators wear out, breakdown, or are damaged by enemy attacks. The division input to the generator rebuild program in August was five while only one was returned. The 3d Marine Division now has 56 camp power generators on hand and 54 in the rebuild program. Several times during the month units were without power for periods up to several days when breakdown occurred with no replacements available.

7. SUB-ZONE COORDINATOR

a. The Sub-Zone Coordinator concept as implemented on I August with the assumption of duties as Sub-Zone Coordinator, I comps Tactical Zone by MajGen B. A. HOCHMUTH. On 15 August Sub-Zone Coordinator Instruction 5400.1 was published outlining the Northern Sub-Zone Coordinator organizational structure and task assignment. During the month nine additional SLCI were promulgated and work continues toward the publication of a complete set of directives governing the conduct of all military personnel in the Northern Sector, I Corps Tactical Zone.

CIVIL AFFAIRS

1. Refugees

- a. During August no new refugees were generated. Temporary and permanent refugee camps continued to receive aid from Vietnamese sources. The 1st Amphibious Tractor Battalion at the mouth of the Cum Viet River held a modified Caunty Fair Operation on 26 August at YD 330697 to assist the Vietnamese Refugee Service and CORDS in registering the population and distributing commodities.
- b. At Cam Lo the brick factory operated by the refugees was put in service during August. Initially a goal of 500 bricks per day was set for a production output quota. The project is under the joint management of CORDS and Cam Lo District Chief with the 11th Engineer Battalion furnishing a plant supervisor. A school for the refugee camp was the first allocation of bricks. This project was 66% complete by 31 August.
- c. In other developments at the Cam Lo refugee camp a 750,000 gallon reservoir was completed by the 11th Engineer Battalion. On 16 August the laying of pipe for the water intake commenced from the Cam Lo River, but a series of mining incidents has delayed this portion of the project.

2. Revolutionary Development

- a. Thus Thein. Lack of commodities and concentration of GVN effort on the Presidential and Senatorial elections were responsible for the alow down in the revised plan for RD in the second semester hamlets of this prevince. In the RD hamlets enemy activity was mederate and generally directed toward acts of terrorism and propagands in an attempt to disrupt the upcoming elections. Fifteen VC incidents resulted in the following friendly casualties: 1 RD worker KIA, 7 RD workers WIA, 1 civilian assassinated, 1 civilian WIA and 3 civilians kidnapped. Pelitical problems are of increasing concern as accusations and counter-accusations of military and RD cadre involvement in election campaigning for their Presidential canidates are being made. RD cadre are said to be favoring the Dai Viet Party, contrary to Ministry of Revolutionary Development policies on the subject.
- b. Quang Tri. The general mood in Quang Tri's RD program has been one of tension with emphasis on the defensive posture during August. The death of the RD Control Group Chief, Captain BACH VAN CAN, and a VC attack on Trieu Phong District and RD Campaign Headquarters undermined the confidence of the people. Political implications were also present in the death of Captain VAN CAN since he was a functionary in the Dai Viet Party and was at odds with some RD leaders. As in Thus Their Province 7 second semester RD teams were delayed in moving on 31 August because of the elections. Self help projects in all RD hamlets continued to progress despite the negative influence of the above facts. In 6 contacts 2 RD workers and 1 PF were killed and 1 civilian was executed by the VC.

3. Division Civil Affairs/Civic Action

- a. Agriculture. The pig prejects started in July continued to pregress. Two swine production schools were held in Thuy Chau and Loc Ben Villages. CORDS and the Previncial Animal Husbandary Department personnel (Hue) participated in the classes which had an attendance of 75 people. Sixteen rice threshing machines were distributed in the Huong Thuy and Phu Loc Districts during August. Other machines distributed are 1 to Khe Sanh, 2 to Phong Dien District and 4 to the Dong Ha area.
- b. MEDCAPS. MEDCAPS/DENCAPS continued to progress at an increase ever earlier menths. For the second menth this year approximately 48,000 patients were treated in the 3d MarDiv AOR. A Chelera epidemic in Thuy Lueng and Thuy Tan Villages broke out on 19 August. The local pepulace was inneculated by teams from FLSG-A, Provincial Health Service and Combined Action Plateon corpsmen. Serum was supplied by CORDS. Dector WILLIAMS, M. D. of the Hue, MACV staff, spoke on the Provincial Hespital (Hue) at the menthly MEDCAP meeting held on 23 August at 3d Medical Battalion.
- c. Feed for Werk. In Quang Tri Prevince the feed for work program spensored by CORDS centimues to effor employment to many Vietnamese families around Dong Ha and Camp Carrell combat base areas. This program pays local workers in USAID commedities for filling sandbags based on a fair market price for labor in the area. In the Khe Sanh area a similar program using rice for payment is employing 60-70 laborers a day for base housekeeping cheres. Each of the programs is working satisfactorily and has furnished additional labor forces which otherwise could not be hired.
- d. <u>Legistics</u>. Legal civilians centinued to be banned from using military aircraft flying to or from Khe Sanh during August. Read traffic is new closed as bridge abuttments were destroyed and a military convey was attacked on route 9 south of the Rockpile. This means all legistics to Khe Sanh must move by air and in addition all civilians are isolated in this area.

Two Marines were assigned to the CORDS staff, Deng Ha, during August to assist in warehousing USAID commedities. In addition, Division meter transport units have continued to assist CORDS and Province officials of Quang Tri and Thua Thien in transporting commedities due to the shortage of local vehicles in these organizations.

e. Third Marine Division Vietnamese Scholarship Fund. During the menth 53 students of Thus Thien received benefits from the scholarship fund. Expansion of the program to Quang Tri Province is new in progress with applications due in September from this area. The III MAF General WALT Scholarship Fund is being used in conjunction with the Division fund to give an added financial base to the program.

- f. Expansion of CAAOR. In the Phu Bai area HMM 164 was assigned to Thuy Tan Village (YD 909140) as civic action coordinator in lieu of FLSG-A. This change enabled FLSG-A to expand their area of interest in Phu Thu Distric around the District Headquarters. MCB-3 expanded their civic action efforts to Nam Hea District in the area of the refugee camp at Thuong Dang during the menth.
- g. <u>Civil Affairs</u>. G-5 representatives dealt with the Phu Vang District Chief and JUSPAO in preparing a pamphlet informing the people of Phu My Village of the eventual benefits of construction project going on in their area. In the Dong Ha area G-5 representatives dealt with Saigon GVN officials on the subject of grave removal payments which have been pending since October 1966.
- h. Civic Action Projects. The following civic action projects were completed or begun during August:

4. Personal Response. The 3d Marine Division Personal Response team held informal discussions with 678 efficers and men at various units in the Phu Bai and Camp Evans areas. In addition, the team conducted a 3 hour lecture/tour of the Imperial City of Hue as part of the Division Staff NCO School. The 6 hours of personal response classes in the CAG training syllabus remain a popular part of their program.

The Division Personal Response School was held on 2-3 August with 38 students in attendance. The Division Personal Response Council met on 22 August to review progress of the program and to hear CDR SCHNEIDER, USN, the III MAF Personal Response Officer.

DIVISION CHAPLAIN

I. PERSONNEL

The month of August 1967 began with twenty-eight (28) chaplains serving with the 3d Marine Division; two (2) of whom (Chaplain STEWART 1/3 and Chaplain WILSON 2/3) were with their units deployed to Special Landing Force; one (1) of whom (Chaplain CHASTEEN 2/9) was hospitalized aboard the USS SANCTUARY (AH-17).

Chaplain STEWART rotated to CONUS during the month.

Chaplain CHASTEEN was transferred to U.S. Naval Hospital, Great Lakes, Illinois 18 August for further treatment of serious wounds received on 29 July during hostile action.

Chaplain MYATT 3/3 departed 5 August on 30 days emergency leave.

Chaplain HABIBY 2/26 was slightly wounded in action on 19 August, not requiring hospitalization.

Chaplains MCALISTER, PHILLIPS, SETREPT and THOMPSON renorted from CONUS for duty with 3d Marine Divisic during the month of August.

Chaplain WILSON returned to country briefly with 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines to OPCON 3d Marine Division for several operations but remained ADCON 9th MAB.

Chaplain KEARSLEY, Force Logistic Command, continued to travel throughout 3d Marine Division TAORs providing Latter Day Saints religious coverage.

Chaplain GEEZA, 1st Marine Division, offered Eastern Orthodox religious services at least once during the month in all 3d Marine Division enclaves. On 27 August Chaplain FRIMENKO, newly reported to 1st Marine Division, began relieving Chaplain GEEZA in this coverage.

Chaplain HABIBY, 2nd Battalion, 26th Marines provided weekly Episcopal Holy Communion Services in the Division CP Chapel.

IV. RELATED ACTIVITIES

***** 1. "Religiously Based Customs in the Republic of Vietnam" lectures were delivered with regularity by 30 Division Chaplains. A one-hour lecture on this subject is a standard part of the indoctrination of newly joined personnel in practically all units. The Assistant Division Chaplain provided this lecture session as a standard part of the training cycle for the Personal Response School, as well as the lecture session on Vietnamese Religions in that school. The Headquarters Battalion Chaplain lectures to every Combined Action Group indoctrination class on both subjects.

URBANO, WESTLING, WILSON.

- 2. <u>Civic Action</u>. Chaplains reported such varied activities as distribution of food, candy, clothing, firewood, building materials and school supplies; assisting native churches, orphanages and hospitals; teaching English language classes; assistance in Medical Care Programs of Vietnamese villagers; and the showing of films on personal hygiene and patriotism to the villagers near their unit's area.





1. Background

- a. Plans originating from MACV for construction provided for an austere bunker with no internal accommodations, no provisions for waterproofing sides, no heads, water, electricity, showers or messhalls.
- b. The MACV order programmed one bunker for each OP, 12 bunkers for each strong point and 48 bunkers for each base area. This would provide for a total of 206 bunkers. After analyzing the basic need for accomodations for Base Areas and strong points the 3d Marine Division will construct ninety-five bunkers per base area and seventeen bunkers per strong point. This will provide for an extra 151 bunkers. Total bunkers to be constructed 357. (275, 18*x24*; 5, 12*x18*; 33, 9*x12*; 44, 8*x10*).

2. Plan

- a. Construction is to begin at area C-2 and move forward to A-4 to A-3, then begin linear obstacle running from Con Thien East; building a complete cross section as the force moves from West to East.
- b. Materials allotted for position C-3 will be used to complete positions C-2 and bring that area up to the 3d Marine Division specifications of 95 bunkers. The interior of all living bunkers will have built-in bunks, shelving and tables. (Table b to appendix 2 (Major Facilities) to Annex A (Engineer) to 3d MarDiv Admin Plan 45-67).

3. Specific Concepts

- a. Base Areas C-2 and C-3, each base area consists of 95 bunkers, sandbagged revetments, triple concertina, double apron protective fence and an O-4-8 density A.P. minefield.
- b. Strong Points A-3 and A-4, each strong point will consist of 15 bunkers, 2400 meters of sandbagged reveted trenches, 600 meters of overhead cover, 1300 meters of triple concertina, 5350 meters of double apron fence and 1640 meters of an 0-4-8 density minefield.
- c. Observation Points, consisting of one bunker and 500 meters each of standard concertina and double apron fence positioned approximately 1000 meters apart along the entire linear trace.
- d. Observation Towers, consisting of 18, 21 foot towers placed along the entire obstacle system. Generally there are 10 towers within the 3dMarDiv zone of responsibility.
- e. Obstacle, consisting of wire fences, an 44-8 density minefield and special sensor devices emplaced over the entire length of the linear trace.
- f. Road Networks, connecting base areas, strong points and existing routes, Route 1, Route 9 and Route 561, and improvement of all roads to all weather class 60 one way, and maintenance of same.



a. Enemy Forces. Current Intelligence Estimate, Intelligence Summaries, and Periodic Intelligence Reports.

b. Friendly Forces.

- (1) ARVN Task Force organizes, establishes and condects defense in assigned area. Reference (b) refers.
- (2) COMNAVFORV receives, stores, and ships fortifications, bridging and other bill of materials (BOM) in support of this plan.
- Force Logistic Command. Receives supplies directed by reference (c). Maintains adequate stock levels of these supplies at Dong Ha to insure meeting construction force requisition requirements on a timely basis. Issues supplies to persons authorized by separate order.
- (4) CG, III MAF provides special support and assistance beyond the capabilities of 3d Marine Division, as required and requested.

c. Attachments and detachments: Annex A (Task Organization)

d. Assumptions.

- (1) That required materials and equipment will be available and stockpiled at DONG HA in sufficient time to meet target dates as prescribed.
- (2) That the enemy will make vigorous and continuous efforts to impede construction, but that adequate forces will be made available to provide security necessary to thwart significant enemy activities.

MISSION

CG, 3d Marine Division, in coordination with 1st ARVN Division, establishes an area defense in Northeast QUANG TRI Province to include organization and occupation of a strong point/obstacle system to the south of the DMZ extending from CON THIEN (YD 1170) to YD 2274 (See Annex B (Operation Overlay)); prepares to provide reinforcement to 1st ARVN Division to man/assist in operation/employment of sensor and surveillance equipment until ARVN units are capable of assuming such responsibilities.

YD 195738 (See Annex B (Operation Overlay)).
- (2) Using currently assigned combat, combat support and combat service support assets conduct continuous close—in security operations required to provide adequate protection for personnel and materiel committed to the strong point/obstacle system construction effort. Search and destroy, sweep operations along the forward edge of the obstacle trace, immediate flanks and interior rearrances of Phase I construction will be coordinated with programmed/actual construction activities.

- (3) Using additive forces to be provided by this Headquarters, conduct deep security operations to extend the close security envelope established around the construction sites.
- (4) Select initial position areas for OP's, strong points and battalion base areas, and submit recommendations to this Headquarters for approval prior to commencement of permanent construction effort.
- (5) Prepare to provide reinforcement, as an interim measure to 1st ARVN Division to man/assist in operation/employment of sensor and surveillance equipment until adequate skill level is acquired by ARVN units.
- (6) Continue present mission assigned by reference (e).
- (7) Prepare detailed defense and counter-attack plans.

c. 12th Marines (Rein)

- (1) One Battalion 105mm How D/S 9th Marines
- (2) General Support 9th Marines
- (3) Be prepared to occupy strong points A-3 and A-4 with 4.2 artillery units, maintain firing positions for medium and light artillery at these strong points, and develors fire support bases of mixed light, medium and heavy artillery units at battalion base areas C-1, C-2 and C-3.
- d. <u>llth Engineer Battalion</u>. Direct support 9th Marines during Phase I construction period.
