# NARRATIVE SUMMARY

# PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

# 1. PERSO NNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

- a. During the month of December, 108 Officers and 3420 Enlisted personnel joined the Division. Personnel transferred by normal rotation included 106 Officers and 1913 Enlisted. Personnel transferred by service records due to MedEvacs were 8 Officers and 104 Enlisted. Other personnel transferred by service records included 4 Officers and 26 Enlisted.
- b. Award recommendations to FMFPac: 3 Navy Crosses, 13 Silver Star Medals, 4 Legion of Merit Medals, 57 Navy Commendation Medals and 5 Navy Achievement Medals. In addition 379 Purple Hearts were presented.
- c. On 29 December 1967, Commandant of the Marine Corps approved the Presidential Unit Citation award for the 3d Marine Division. Periods covered 8 March 1965 to September 1967 for all members of the 3d Marine Division and elements in direct support.
- d. Casualties sustained during the month included: 68 KIA, 460 WIA, 7 DOW, 28 NFI and no MIA.
- e. Congressional Interest Cases: 115 cases processed, 73 cases completed, 22 cases pending and 16 cases readdressed to other commands. Discharges: 1 Hardship Discharge to CMC for decision, 1 Unsuitable Discharge approved, 1 Misconduct Discharge disapproved. Pending: 1 Hardship Discharge, 1 Unsuitable Discharge and 2 Unfitness Discharges.
- f. On 9 December 1967, a helicopter courier service was commenced on a daily basis to provide an expeditious exchange of communications between this headquarters and subcrdinate commands. This service, weather permitting, allows prompt delivery of guard mail to designated control points, where rapid exchange occurs. In inclement weather, fixed wing aircraft is employed.

# 2. EXCHANGE SERVICES

a. Merchandise Sales for Branch 1010 for the month of December 1967 were \$805,267.35 with the ending inventory \$1,355,085.68.

- b. 1170 pallets and 12 conex boxes of exchange merchandise were received by Branch 1010 during the month of December. Of these 32 pallets were air shipped to Khe Sanh.
- c. During December all concessions under contract to the Army-Air Force Exchange Service were converted from Piasters to Military Payment Certificates as a payment medium.
- d. The Force Logistic Command rough rider convoy from Danang to Phu Bai was used to augment sea shipment of merchandise.

# 3. POSTAL SERVICES

a. The following figures represent poundage of U.S. Mail received and dispatched during the month of December:

- b. The division Post Office and 15 Unit Post Offices continued to furnish all phases of postal service to all units of the Division. The location of all Unit Post Offices remained as reported on 1 December with the exception of Unit 4. This Unit moved from the Division Post Office (Forward), Dong Ha to a building furnished by the 11th Engineer Fattalion. The moving of this unit will relieve the strain presently imposed upon the current postal facilities. In addition, this unit will be available to deploy on short notice if the need arises.
- c. During the Christmas mailing season the Division Post Office acted as a clearing and sorting agency for the American Red Cross and resulted in the saving of many man-hours in handling and redispatching of this merchandise. This office forwarded 2,610 packages and 735 bags during this period.

### 4. DIVISION CLUPS

a. During the month of December a new officers' club at Phu Bai was completed and opened for business.

### 5. INFORMATIONAL SERVICES

- a. During December 1967 a total of 82 news releases were prepared and included news stories, feature articles and photographs with captions. In addition 1,939 FHTNC releases were made.
- b. Eighteen civilian correspondents visited Phu Bai and 53 visited the press center at Dong Ha Combat Base.
- c. Radio and TV Coverage. A total of 590 minutes of tape recorded time for radio and TV was submitted to HQMC. The total time included 128 individual hometown interviews.

# 6. SPECIAL SERVICES

- a. The following items were issued under the "Criti-Pak" Program during the Month: Criti-Paks 146; Paperback Books 6400; Writing Kits 13,017.
- b. During the month 529 cases of beer and 212 cases of soda were issued under the Free Beer and Soda Program.
- c. During the month the Education NCO administered 145 High School GED tests and 24 College (CCT-GE) tests. Testing was conducted in the Phu Bai, Con Thien, Cam Lo and Khe Sanh areas.
- d. Chris Noel, the Disc Jockey for Armed Forces Radio, entertained units of the Division in the Phu Bai area on 22 December 1967. Units visited included 3d Engineer Fattalion, 3d Medical Battalion, Headquarters Eattalion and 3d Motor Transport Battalion.
- e. During the month Division Special Services distributed approximately 30,000 ball point pens, the Division's gift to each man, plus 26,000 gifts received from III MAF.
- f. A total of 613 messages were sent by the Division MARS Station. 1223 phone patches were placed to the States; of these, 46 were placed for patients at the 3d Medical Eattalion.

### 7. BAND

a. In addition to its regular colors functions, the Eand played troop concerts at the various mess halls in the Phu Faj-Gia Le area. Most of the units had at least one concert during the month.

- b. The Fand traveled to Khe Sanh and Camp Evans to entertain, and also to Gua Viet for the dedication of Camp Kistler.
- c. The Band made several appearances, at CAC Units to entertain the Vietnamese adults and school children. In addition to this the Band played music at a party for Vietnamese children located near the Phu Bai area.

# 8. PROVOST MARSHAL

- a. Nineteen Vietnamese National Policemen, two Vietnamese National Policewomen and six Vietnamese Military Policemen are assigned to the Provost Marshal's Office, Phu Pai for the apprehension and processing of Vietnamese Nationals.
- b. A total of 71 cases were opened by CID and 63 were closed. 38 cases are pending. Of the total cases there were 53 felonies; two blackmarket, nine narcetics; and 18 misdemeanors.
- c. The total reported value of property stolen or otherwise missing was \$39,321.65. Total value of property recovered was \$27,394.45.
- d. A total of 10 vehicular accidents were investigated by this office, all occurring in the Phu Bai area, resulting in one Marine fatality; and seven minor injuries. Total property damage caused by vehicular accidents in the Phu Bai area is estimated at \$2,953.00. The consolidated monthly total for property damage being \$2,963.00.
- e. During the month of December 1967, 55 persons were detained and processed as follows:

- f. A total of 98 Military Police Reports were initiated during December 1967.
- g. The City of Hue was inspected for Flackmarket activities on several occasions during December. No changes in blackmarket volume and prices have remained stable.

- h. The inescopes were utilized on a limited basis due to a shortage of vehicles and communication equipment. The employment of the inescopes resulted in 11 moving violators being cited.
- i. Criminal Investigation personnel of this office conducted special classes for Officers and Staff Moncommissioned Officers of FLSG-A, and MCF-121, on search and seizure, as well as the marijuana problem.
- j. During the period of 20-25 December 1967, special security measures were placed into effect to control Vietnamese civilians permitted to enter various cantonments of the vital area for graves renovation.
- k. A joint special security detail composed of National Police, Quan Canh and U. S. Military Police was provided on 24 December 1967, for Vice President KY's visit to the 3d Medical Battalion.
- 1. North and South Check Points were established on route #1, at the Quang Tri Airfield area, on 30 December 1967. These checkocints are manned by National Police and U. S. Military Police.
- m. Civil Affairs continues to be a major activity of the Provost Marshal's Office. During the month of December, 13 cases of assistance to Vietnamese were rendered of significant importance requiring over one hour work with each case.
- n. The site of the new Provost Marshal's building has been surveyed, ground improvement and concrete foundation completed.



# COMBAT INTELLIGENCE SECTION

### 1. PRODUCTION

- a. During the first week of December 1967 the G-2 Order of Battle, Plans and Estimates, Target Intelligence, and Drafting sections were combined into a single Production Branch. This combination was directed toward better management and organization of sections within G-2, and increased effectiveness and response in producing sound, timely, integrated intelligence for all command levels of the Division. Overall efficiency in the several sections has been significantly improved by this combination, although their separate functions remain unaltered under branch coordination and control.
- b. Order of Battle initiated a new approach to evaluation of intelligence on a continuing and a day to day basis. This approach is "Pattern Analysis" and employs successive overlays depicting numerous types of enemy activity to form a graphic representation of all significant enemy activity, sightings, contacts and agent reports, etc., supported by a coordinate register. Graphic representations form patterns which lend themselves to analysis and rapid exploitation more readily than the previous system. Order of Battle during December initiated a detailed nightly intelligence briefing for the G-2 Staff and other interested persons, and the production of a weekly Order of Battle update to all units in the AO.
- c. A special Order of Battle summary was compiled for SLF 3/1 (Operation Fortress Ridge) in conjunction with SLF 3/1's December landing north of Cua Viet. Detailed information on enemy unit strength and disposition was supplied on a continuing basis to Target Intelligence and Plans and Estimates for use in their respective functions.
- d. Plans and Estimates assembled information and prepared updates of the Khe Sanh area, Base Area 101, and Route 9. A special background brief on the DMZ Front was written and presented on three occasions: to the Commanding General and the Chief of Staff, to the staff officers of 3d Marine Division Headquarters, and at Dong Ha to approximately fifty commanding officers and S-2 officers in the area. A similar brief of background information on the Tri Thien Hue Military Region has been researched and completed as well as a special brief on current conditions in the 3d Marine Division AO for presentation to the Commandant of the Marine Corps.





Quarterly Review and Summary of activities in support of III MAF Campaign Order 1-67 was completed.

- e. Target Intelligence provided targets to III MAF which resulted in 38 Arc Light strikes and 704 TPQ-10 strikes on enemy troops and hard targets.
- f. The drafting section prepared 6 charts, 7 overlays, and 3 multi-sheet maps for use. Drafting also completed 8 special projects and illustrations of varied types, as well as providing slides and visual aids for the G-2 portion of the Commanding General's daily briefings.

### 2. 1st CIT

- a. The 1st CI Team screened 188 persons during the month of December. Twenty-two (22) persons were released as innocent civilians, seven (7) were detained as civil defendents and two (2) were VC/NVA rallier, 157 were interviewed in connection with employment at Phu Bai Combat Base.
- b. The team continues to support 3d Marine Division operations within the Thua Thien (P) area of operations. One sub-team (one officer, one enlisted and one interpreter) is providing CI coverage in Phu Loc District and one sub-team (three enlisted and one interpreter) in Huong Thuy District. One sub-team (one officer, two enlisted and one interpreter) administering the security program in connection with the hiring of indigenous personnel at Phu Bai Combat Base and internal security. One officer TAD to Special Branch National Police, Hue City, to conduct liaison with all U. S. and ARVN intelligence agencies. One team officer is presently assigned as Staff CI Officer.
- c. The present team strength is five (5) officers and eight (8) enlisted.
- d. Maintained liaison at District, Village and Hamlet levels in Huong Thuy, Phu Loc Districts. Liaison continues with U. S. and Vietnamese Intelligence and Security Agencies in Hue City.

# 10. PIIU

- a. During the month of December 1967, there were a total of 28 photo requests submitted to III Marine Amphibious Force by this Headquarters. Of these 8 requests were completed, 6 were cancelled and 14 are pending. There were 18 photo missions flown for units of the Division in addition to those specifically requested.
- b. A bridge study was completed of Rt. 9 between Ca Lu and Khe Sanh noting the condition, exact location and by-passes of bridges. Marine Air Group 36 was provided with selected photography and the location, size and condition of HLZ's. All units of the Division were provided with a copy of HLZ description in the Third Marine Division AO.
- c. Photo and IR coverage of the Northern part of Quang Tri Province were altered to meet the required needs of the holiday truces. There was also a detailed study of recent photo coverage of the A Shau Valley to determine the effectiveness of Arc Lights in the area and to note enemy construction and fortification activity.

and Quang Tri Provinces. There were few enemy contacts throughout the area of Operations. Maximum support was directed to Dye Marker projects.

Intelligence reports indicated increased activity in the Khe Sanh area and 3/26 was deployed from Camp Evans to Khe Sanh on 3 December 1967.

Throughout the month the planning and execution for Operation Checkers continued. This operation is the realignment of First and Third Marine Division forces northward. On 28 December 1/5 relieved elements of the 2/26 Marines in the Phu Loc area and the boundary between the two divisions was adjusted accordingly.

There were two truce periods during the month on 241800H December to 251800H December 196 and from 311800H December to 020600H January 1968. There were numerous enemy initiated incidents during both truce periods.

BLT 1/3, the ground component of SLF A remained under operational control of this Division during the month. The Amphibious Ready Group, Task Group 79.4 continued Operation Ballistic Arch and retained a readiness posture to support BLT 1/3 and Operation Kentucky.


SIF B conducted Operation Fortress Ridge in support of the Division in the vicinity of Cua Viet.

From 26-31 December SLF B conducted Operation Badger Tooth in the vicinity of the Street Without . Cy.

2. <u>KENTUCKY</u>. Operation Kentucky continued through the month. The 9th Marines with five infantry battalions conducted operations within their AO. In late November, the Regiment, with three infantry battalions and in conjunction with ARVN forces to the east, conducted Search and Destroy operations just south of the IMZ to uncover and screen Dye Marker position A-3. Contact during this phase of Kentucky consisted of numerous small unit contacts. Enemy Artillery attacks in the vicinity of position A-3 and Con Thien increased significantly. On 15 December A/1/1 made contact with an estimated NVA platoon to the northeast of Con Thien. Results of this contact were 3 USMC KIA, 23 USMC WIA. Enemy losses were 46 NVA KIA (C) and 135 NVA KIA (F).

Throughout the rest of the month there were numerous small unit sightings and contacts. Towards the end of the month the enemy attacks by fire decreased significantly.

On 23 December 2/1 relieved 1/1 at Con Thien and 1/1 re-deployed to Quang Tri. On 26 December 3/4 relieved 1/4 in the vicinity of A-3 and 1/4 deployed to C-2. On 29 December 3/3 relieved 1,3 at A-3 and 1/3 deployed to C-2.





On 24 December 2/9 was relieved from vicinity A-3 and returned to control of 3d Marines at Camp Carroll. Results of Kentucky for December were:

NAPOLEON The 1st Amphibian Tractor Battalion reinforced by one rifle company initially and subsequently by an additional rifle company and suprorting arms conducted operations in their assigned area. There were numerous small unit sightings and contacts in the northern portion of the Napoleon area of operations. On 11 December in the vicinity of YD 297746 heavy contact was made with an uninown size enemy force. F-2/4 and Company B. 1st AMTRC Battalion supported by LVTH-6's engaged the enemy throughout the day. Heavy small arms and automatic weapons fire were exchanged. Contact was broken late in the afternoon and friendly forces established night positions at C-4. Results of this contact were: Friendly 7 WIA (Evac), 13 WIA (Minor): Enemy 54 NVA KIA(C), 37 NVA KIA(P). On 16 December the 1st AMTRC Battalion CP at YD 349684 received approximately 80 rds of artillery and rocket fire. This attack resulted in friendly losses of 5 KIA, 11 VIA(Evac) 20 WIA(Minor). On 16 December F-2/4 was chopped to 2/4 and 1st AMTRC Battalion assumed Overational Control of C-1/3. There continued to be light contact and enemy sightings until about 21 December 1967. ### COMBAT AIR SUPPORT

# 1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- a. In the Dong Ha/DMZ area, Operation KENTUCKY was supported by 817 CAS/DAS and TPQ sorties during this period. These aircraft delivered 97-tons of ordnance. Also, 321 B-52 aircraft hit 38 targets one or more times surrounding the DYEMARKER construction area. At this same time, rotary-wing aircraft flew 685 sorties carrying 1,168 passengers and 148-tons of cargo.
- b. In support of Operation OSCEOLA with the First Marine: Regiment, Marine air support by CAS/BAS and TPQ flew 105 sorties and delivered 69-tons of ordnance on selected targets. Helicopters flew 107 starties transporting 1,083 passengers and 20-tons of cargo.
- c. Operation SCOTLAND in the Khe Sanh area had 37 CAS/DAS and TPQ sorties expending 266-tons of ordnance on selected targets. During this same period, rotary-wing atteract flew 317 sorties carrying 889 passengers and 61-tons of cargo.
- d. In the Fourth Marines area Operation 250SHO received 107 CAS/DAS and TPQ sorties, expending 70-tons of ordnames on selected targets. Helicopters flew 82 sorties and carried 6 passengers while transporting 20-tons of cargo.
- 2. NEW DEVELOPMENTS. None.

# FIRE SUPPORT COORDINATION

### 1. GENERAL

Coordination and control of supporting arms continued in accordance with established policies. No new techniques were developed or employed.

# 2. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- a. Fire Support Coordinator (Phu Bai)
- (1) Prior to the Christmas cease fire period, 118 tampets were planned for attack by artillery. There were also 42 targets planned for air. All targets were hit during the period 241600H to 241800H.
- (2) Twenty-five TOT's were planned and fired on 31 December 1967. The primary emphasis was at River Crossing sites in the DMZ.
- (3) During the later part of December, a daily TPQ program has been planned in Base Areas 101 and 114.

# 3. TARGETING

- a. Artillery. A total of 23,633 targets were attacked during the month of December and 189,599 rounds were expended.
- b. TPQ-10 Missions. A total of 2,242 targets were struck by TPQ missions and 11,853,740 lbs of ordnance was expended during the month.

# 1. COMMAND POST COMMUNICATIONS

- a. Movement into the 3d Merine Division Communication Center bunker was completed at Phu Bai.
- b. A new 200 pair cable to the new CP was installed by the Army to provide entry into Army Dial System at Phu Bai.
- c. Major effort of Communication-Electronics personnel was directed toward displacement of communication facilities to the new Command Post at Dong Ha.
- d. Installed five 25 pair cables at DHCB to provide for Division telephone communications. Installed four additional 25 pair cables from frame to Radio Relay site at DHCB.
- e. Bunkering and hardening of all communication facilities at Dong Ha has begun.

# 2. Dye Marker Communications

- a. The Comm-elect Dye Marker Officer visited 9th Marines, 12th Marines, FISU-1, 2d ARVA Regiment.
- b. A Dye Marker School was set up at Dong Ha to train operators of associated Dye Marker equipment.
- c. Radar surveillance sets FFG-5 and FPS-6, Searchlight MSS-3 and Night Observation Device were placed in operation at C-2, C-3, C-4 and A-4.

### 3. IWS

a. Eleven IdC3 circuits were moved from Phu Bai to Dong Ha and six now circuits were activated at Dong Ha in support of Operation Checkers.

### A. Radio Relay

- e. An eight channel Radio Relaw site was established between Dong Ha and A-3.
- b. Two 4 channel Radio Relay Vans were sent to Quang Tri to replace 7th Comm Bn equipment and personnel.
- c. One 4 channel Radio Relay Van was moved to Khe Sanh and new link established to DHUB.
- d. One 12 channel Radio nelay Van was relocated at Dong Ha to provide communications to III Mar.

# 5. IT./FRC-25 Radios

- b. Planar triodes for Radio Relay Set PRC-27B and connecting rods, rings, and carburetor rebuild kits for TRC-27 generator set PU-278 are all in critical supply.
- c. BB-451 monoblocks for Radio Set PRC-41/47 remain in critical supply.
- d. 400 cycle generators are critically short throughout the Division.

# PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

- 1. During the month of December the Psychological Operations objectives were:
  - a. Support Chieu Hoi program.
  - b. Exploit VC/NVA battlefield losses.
  - c. Lower VC/NVA morale.
  - d. Show strength of GVN and Allied forces.
  - e. Reduce mining and booby trap incidents.
  - f. Discredit VC/NVA.
  - g. Induce reporting VC activity.
  - h. Explain presence of U. S. Forces in Vietnam.
  - i. Instill good health habits in the people.
  - j. Encourage support of the GVN.
- 2. Psychological Operations supported all named operations and Regimental AOR's. The Phu Bai TAOR, the DMZ and the Recon Zones were also targeted regularly.
- 3. The following leaflets by type were delivered by aerial leaflet drops:

4. There were 41 hours and 10 minutes of aerial broadcasts covering the same basic themes in the same general areas as the leaflet drops.

- 5. There were 271 hours of ground broadcast in support of the 4th Marines, 9th Marines, 3d Marines, 26th Marines, 2/26, 1st AmTrac Battalion, and Combined Action Platoons in Thua Thien and Quang Tri Provinces. General themes were Vietnamese music, MEDCAP instructions, Chieu Hoi, support GVN, good health, mine reward and general weapons reward.
- 6. There were 36 hours of movies shown to approximately 4,580 civilians. General movie themes were cartoons, good health, and support GVN.
- 7. Hand distribution of leaflets, \*posters, Free South newspapers, and Farm Magazines totaled 276,100.
- 8. Thirty three VC/NVA rallied through the Chieu Hoiprogram in Thua Thien and Quang Tri Provinces.
- 9. Thirty eight Kit Carson Scouts graduated from the fourth Kit Carson Scout school on 29 December bringing the total number of scouts employed by the Division to ninety seven. Kit Carson Scouts participated in over 512 patrols with Marine units, a significant increase over the 315 patrols that they participated in last month. Two scouts were killed in action during December. KCS Phuoc was killed on 6 December while on a company size operation with 2/26. KCS Loi was killed on 26 December while on patrol with 1/9.
- 10. The rewards program was intensified and resulted in increased weapons and ordnance being turned in by civilians in both the 1st Marines and 4th Marines areas.
- 11. On 28 December a homemade explosive device was exploded in a jeep of a 3d Division Dent Cap operating in Tay Loc (YD 7422). No one was injured and the Dent Cap was terminated. Coordination was made with the Village Chief and District Advisor and two broadcasts were conducted in Tay Loc on 29 December. The broadcast explained the need for villagers to help protect MedCap and Dent Cap teams and that MedCaps and Dent Caps would be withdrawn if the villagers could not protect the teams. The broadcasts were well received and further psyops broadcasts will be conducted in the area.
- 12. Face to face propaganda, through the use of Armed Propaganda Teams, continues to be the most effective means of psyops available to Marine units. A Quang Tri APT was depolyed with G-2/4 from 22-26 December in the Quang Tri

airfield area (YD 2755), one of the many successful APT operations this month. The APT discovered two C-10 Russian mines and one Chi Com grenade. The team killed two VC and captured four other VC. G-2/4's company commander stated that their help was invaluable in identifying VC and discovering mines.; He stated that the APT saved many Marine lives.

Two APT members from Quang Tri are conducting continuing PsyOps operations from Con Thien in an effort to increase the number of ralliers in that area.

13. On 5 December 3/12 test fired six (6) 105mm artillery leaflet rounds. Difficulties were experienced and the test firing performance was not satisfactory. A review of the packing procedures and a check of the fuzes will be made prior to the next test firing.

14. The NVA campaign was supported with NVA oriented leaflets drops through out both northern provinces with special emphasis in Quang Tri Province. The 27th Independent NVA Battalion, which operates south of Con Thien, has been targeted heavily. Intelligence information indicates that the unit's morale and supplies are low. A special leaflet directed specifically at the 27th Independent Battalion was produced and is being dropped on a continuing basis. The 804th NVA Battalion has been heavily targeted with aerial broadcast and leaflet drops in the Phu Bai TAOR resulting in several relliers from the unit.

### LOGISTICS

### 1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

# a. General

- (1) Combat support and combat service support organisations of the Division continued to train and familiarisation fire the new M-16 Rifles prior to placing them in service. As of 31 December eight of 19 organisations had completed necessary prerequisites and had placed the M6 Rifle in service.
- (2) An inspection team composed of FISC "A" and Division Ordnance personnal conducted technical inspections of MI6 Rifles issued to the infantry and recommissance organisations of the Division to determine serviceability. Approximately 75%(8113) of the Rifles inspected were declared unserviceable due to pitted chambers. Within four to six months all MI6Al's in the infantry and recommissance units will be replaced with the M-16 Rifle with chromed chambers.
- (3) On 28 December the second monthly logistics conference was held at the Force Logistics Command and was attended by representatives of the Division G-h and Supply Sections. Also in attendance were representatives of other major commands in III MAF.
- (h) Logistics technical/administrative inspections were conducted during December as part of the Commanding General's Inspection of 9th Motor Transport Battalion and 11th Engineer Battalion. In addition the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-h and the Special Staff sections under cognizance of G-h made over 100 staff visits to units of the Division.

e. Food Services. During the month of December the 3d Marine
Division Food Services Program consisted of 48 operational messes
supported by 491 OF-33 personnel. Of the total messes in operation,
20 are semi-permanent field messes housed in TSFC structures and the
remaining 28 are temporary field messes. Subsistence support provided
Marine Corps, Army and Navy personnel of this command averaged 33,705
rations daily; further an average 9,000 rations per day were provided
to other U. S. Military Organisations operating within the 3d Division
area of operation for a grand total of 42,705 daily rations. Approximately 15% of the total average rations fed daily consisted of Meals
Combat Individual and approximately 55% were subsisted on the
Expeditionary Force Menu. The Expeditionary Force Menu is based on
MCO Plollo.17, Chapter 4, Marine Corps Expeditionary Force Menu (Tropic)
and both perishable and non-perishable components are utilized. The
Meal Combat Individual is utilized only where operational requirements
preclude serving the Expeditionary Force Menu.

# f. Supply

- (1) The Excess and Cancellation Program totaled 15,229,379 dollars for the period 1 January to 30 November 1967.
- (2) Field Supply Analysis Team Four completed the inspection of the following Division organisations and final reports were made to CMC:
  - (a) 3d Medical Battalion
  - (b) 3d Motor Transport Battalion
  - (c) 1st Field Artillery Group
  - (d) 3d Shore Party Battalion
  - (e) 3d Battalion 12th Marines
- (3) A program was instituted by CG FMFPac whereby Force Logistics Command and 3d Force Service Regiment cancel all requisitions held outstanding in excess of 90 days.

- (4) As of 31 December there were 74 items on Red Ball.
- (5) The Division Supply Officer and Division Supply Management Teams visited numerous units providing advice on improving supply readiness and providing general supply management assistance.
- g. Plans. In addition to the normal day to day planning, plans were drafted for the logistical aspects of Operation CHECKERS. In addition, requirements for the Monsoon Season 1968-69 were determined. Administrative Order 61-67 for Dye Marker was completed during the month.

#### 2. PROBLEM AREAS

- a. Supply. The shortage of office supplies and stationery continued to create administrative problems. Inadequate supplies of monoblocks for Battery BBh51, AN/PRC-25 modules and antenna bases, and communication center supplies hampered communications operations. In addition, repair parts for the Mh22 Mighty Mites, Multi-Fuel vehicles, and heavy engineer equipment were critical and the lack of these parts resulted in a high deadline rate for these equipments.
- b. Transportation. Over-taxed lines of communication presented the greatest logistic problem. All three basic modes of transportation land, sea, and air were used to the maximum. Each mode had to operate at peak efficiency in view of the high priority programs competing for the available transportation. Construction of the Quang Tri Complex, Dye Marker, and the normal daily resupply continued to compete for transportation during December. Division convoys continued to augment the transportation assets of III MAF and FIC as well as provide maximum transportation to Northern I Corps.
- c. Services. Laundry facilities and the number of bath units in operation in the 3d Marine Division area of operation continued to be inadequate.
- d. Maintenance. Short supply of repair parts for accomplishment of second and third echelon maintenance continued to hamper maintenance efforts of the Division. Inadequate third echelon maintenance support for XENON searchlights resulted in a high deadline (13 of 20) of these items.

## DIVISION ENGINEER

- 1. During December, the Third Marine Division received engineer support from a Division and a Force Engineer Battalion and four Navy Mobile Construction Battalions. Additionally, maintenance and utilities support was provided by detachments from Naval Support Activity, Danang. Coordinates below are taken from NAP: Vietnam AMS, Series L701h, sheets 6442 II and 6541 I and IV, 1:50,000. Major Engineer projects have included:
- a. <u>Maintenance of Route #1</u>. The combination of bad weather and enemy action required continuous coordinated effort between Mavy Mobile Construction Battalions, Marine Engineers and ARVN engineers to keep Route #1 open. Major events included:
- (1) 4 December. A blown concrete culvert 7000 meters northwest of Phu Loc (ZD015027) replaced by four metal culverts.
- (2) 5 December. Food was widened to 24 feet (3D 021027) and a 36 inch culvert was replaced by two 60 inch culverts.
- (3)  $\delta$  December. MCB-74 completed the new 61 meter bridge at Phu Loc (2D099005).
- (4) 11 December. Old culverts replaced (ZD059021) and road widened to 24 feet.
- (5) 15 December. 3d Engineer Battalion completed the task of removing 200 feet of M4 floating bridge (ZDO99005) from the new bridge site at Phu Loc.
- (6) 18 December. An old nine meter bridge near Thu Loc (20072011) was replaced by four culverts.
- (7) 20 December. Concrete culvert arch (ZD006035) was replaced by two motal culverts and the road was widehed to 21; feet.
- (8) 22 December. Old concrete slab bridge (ZD075010) was replaced by two metal culverts.
- (9) 30 December. The ferry at An Lo (YD624303) was not in use due to low water level.
- b. Maintenance of Route #9. MCB-5 continued to maintain and improve Route #9 during December. The critical stretch continued to be west of Cam Lo where the road is badly potholed. An engineering estimate of the manpower and materials required to open Route #9 between Ca Iu and Khe Sanh was made. A photo reconnaissance of this stretch of road was conducted on 28 December 1967. It was learned from these photographs that twelve bridges are destroyed and will have to be replaced. It is estimated that two force engineer companies, or their equivalent in CB forces, two Division engineer platoons and one

bridge platoon will be required to upgrade Route #9 between Ca Lu and Khe Sanh.

- c. Maintenance of Route #561. Maintenance and improvements continued on Route #561 (YD151607) to (YD116701). However, inclement weather made asphalting impractical throughout the month.
- d. Khe Sanh Airfield. The estimated completion date of 2 December was not met due to the nemewailibity of some special anchors which were necessary items. Epon arrival of the anchors, the field was completed and declared operational for C-130's on 10 December.
- 2. Military Construction. The 1967S MCON Program is 91% completed for the Phu Eai Gia Le- Dong Ha areas. The 9% remaining is mainly for buildings from Project #Ch08 which are not needed in Phu Bai and will be reprogrammed to Quang Tri, and Project #Cl34A Community Facilities which had the lowest construction priority. TSFC construction is being continued in the Dong Ha Combat Base with MCB-5 erecting 55 SEA huts, one butler bldg, expanding one messhall and starting two others last month. The majority of the military construction forces and bulk of the construction material have been and will continue to be concentrated on "Dye Marker".
- 3. Base Development. Work on the Base Development of the Quang Tri Complex is continuing. A master site plan of the road net and the unit locations west of Highway #1 has been prepared and is being submitted to the III MAF Ease Development Board.

# 4. Combat Operations.

- a. Minesweep Operations. Division units conducted 407 visual/deliberate sweeps covering a total of 2,170,800 meters of Routes 1, 9, 561, and 566. In the process these units discovered and destroyed 7 anti-personnel mines, 19 anti-vehicular mines, and 23 improvised mines that ranged in size from friendly and enemy grenades to 250 pound bombs.
- b. Tunnel Teams. Third Engineer Battalion dispatched a four man tunnel team from "B" Company to support Third Marine operations in support of operation "Kentucky".
- c. Enemy Facilities Destroyed. On operation "Cove", Third Engineer Battalion elements destroyed four 105MM rounds, six 60MM rounds, thirty-five 155MM cannisters and three VC huts with concealed bunkers. On operation "Neosho", they destroyed four anti-personnel mines, three Chicom grenades, twenty-nine 60MM rounds, sixteen 81MM rounds, one M-72 rocket, and 18 bunkers. Eight of the enemy bunkers were heavily reinforced with logs, cement, rattroad rails and engineer stakes.

## d. Combat Support.

(1) The 3d Engineer Battalion provided one engineer platoon

OPCON to 1st Battalion, 26th Marines and one engineer platoon OPCON to 2d Battalion, 4th Marines throughout the month. A total of 77 Marine engineers were in general support to infantry battalions participating in operations Newtor, Neoshc, and Kentuck.

- (2) The 3d Shore Party Battalion supported ISA's and HST's on five separate combat operations. Elements of the Battalion conducted 11 mechanized patrols and 11 foot patrols, and established 10 ambushsites and two listening posts. In addition, a 15 man security detail was provided for the ICU ramp at Dong Ha and dredge security at Thuan An Bay.
- 5. Dye Marker. Due to urgent requirements to provide bunkers to artillery positions at C-1, construction was initiated to install modified bunkers. Bunkers are III MAF design and consist of twelve 8X12's and twenty-seven lOX2h's. Utilization will be for personnel, ammunition, powder storage, CMR, FDC, CP, etc. Material for the bunkers are borrowed from the Tactical Support Functional Components Program (Third NCB) and will be replaced from Dye Marker stocks upon receipt of supplemental BOM. CO, III MAF message 100328Z Dec67 established new criteria for the classification of a complete bunker. Old reports considered bunkers with roofing felt as completed for reporting purposes. CG, III MAF authorized modification to three towers at A-3 and C-4. Utilization of treated piling for tower legs is authorized in lieu of 6X6 timbers. CG, III MAF authorized ammunition boxes filled with earth for berm row and bunker revetting vice sandbags. M8Al matting is authorized for use as a blast layer where cannisters and/or rock are not available to complete bunkers in an expeditious manner. Earth drills have proven satisfactory for use in emplacing M-16 mines. An additional twenty drills are anticipated for use in the installation of the linear obstacle. Firing ports will be installed in all 18x2h burkers at A-1, A-2, A-3 and C-1. The carpentry portion of bunkers is complete at A-1, A-2, A-3, A-4, C-1, C-3, C-4 and Ca Lu. One 18X24 bunker was destroyed by fire at C-2 on 24 December. Bunkers at site A-1 are complete in accordance with III MAF message 100328Z Dec67. Wire emplacement is completed at A-4, C-1, C-2, and C-4. No mine fields to be emplaced at A-1, C-3 and C-4. The prevailing weather conditions have impeded progress on all sites, and the laying of as shalt on Route #561. Progress on the sub-base on the access road from Route #1 to A-3 is progressing satisfactorily. The well at A-lais down 88 feet.

## 1. Refugees

## a. Thua Thien Province

- erated by military operations. However, it has been confirmed that approximately 255 families in Quang Dien and Phu Loc districts have moved short distances from VC controlled areas into more secure GVN territory. These were completely voluntary movements. Limited commodity support was provided by the Provincial Refugee Service, which has managed to accomplish some significant actions to improve the life of refugees in the Province. However, this has been with extremely limited activity on the part of the Refugee Service Chief, Mr. Bai. He withholds the distribution of commodities stockpiled in the Service's warehouse. Further, Mr. Bai's unwillingness to request authorization to make expenditures in the important areas of education, health and sanitation facilities for resettlement camps has stagnated many efforts in Thua Thien.
- (2) In Phong Dien District the recently generated refugees from Operation LAM SON 140 in November 1967 were miserable in their temporary tent shelters, suffering from cold and dampness. Mr. Bai claimed to be unaware of the condition. In Quang Dien, flooded conditions prevailed in the resettlement center of 500 homes due to the heavy rains. In Phu Loc district, the Bang Lang refugees have been awaiting the arrival of cement and tin roofing to go ahead with construction of their homes. Transportation and distribution of materials was organized by the Hamlet officials and the Refugee Advisor.
- (3) Wells are badly needed in Phong Dien, Quang Dien and Nam Hoa Districts. On I December 1967, 5 cement castings for well construction in Vo My Camp, Phong Dien District, were transported by two 3d Marine Division trucks. The assistance of the Provincial Public Works Chief has been enlisted to construct the needed wells with the use of refugee labor. The 8th Platoon, 29th Civil Affairs Company has finished a complete survey of all Civic Action needs in the Phong Dien/Quang Dien Districts of the Province, with emphasis on the pressing requirements of the two large refugee camps established in those districts upon the relocation of 4,400 refugees from the "Street Without Joy" area during November 1967. The results of this survey have been used to plan and organize Civic Action projects in the districts for implementation during 1st Quarter, CY 1968.

## b. Quang Tri Province

(1) The Refugee Service Chief disbursed the entire resettlement budget and asked SCR, Saigon for 25,000,000 additional plasters of which 10,000,000 have been thus far received. 86,000 plasters were used to complete construction of a sawmill which employs refugees. An additional 500,000 plasters were loaned to the Sawmill Management Council to purchase sufficient logs for the production of commercial lumber in adequate quantities.

- (2) Stockpiling of disaster-relief commodities in Quang Tri Province, using limited available warehouse space, began to provide immediate aid for future refugees that may be generated. Further, a Public Health Doctor began a comprehensive, three month program of medical treatment in refugee villages. The special air-lift to Khe Sanh and sea-lift to Cua Viet of refugees did not begin as planned due to non-availability of a Caribou and the silting of Cua Viet which prevented LSTs from landing.
- (3) Unemployment problems in Quang Tri seemed to be directly associated with the refugee problem. In areas of large numbers of "unofficial refugees", there was unemployment. Advisory effort was directed toward establishing small industry and henceraft marks to alleviate the unemployment situation.
- (4) None of the refugee camps, other than at Cua Viet and Huong Hoa which received deliveries directly from Danang, regularly received either CORDS commodities or SCR foodstuff support. This was caused by the general logistics problems of the CORDS/GVN system in the Province and the lack of truck transportation. Transportation for refugee support continues to be a major problem area in the Province, as is recruitment of GVN personnel for the Provincial Refugee Service.
- (5) Refugees were the object of increased enemy attention, as indicated by stepped-up VC attempts in the Cam Lo area to induce the refugees to return to VC-controlled areas. The principle VC concern seemed to be that the refugees represent lost manpower and food supplies, which have become more and more critical for them in recent months.

## 2. Revolutionary Development

## a. Thua Thien Province

- (1) With the Provincial RD Plan year nearing the end, all hamlets have been or are in the process of being completed. Project completion is on schedule with no major problem areas. On 16 December, the Provincial Survey Team, composed of a representative from the 11th DTA, who conducted the inspection, and the RD Chief and the District Chief of the respective district, started inspecting the 67 hamlets. To date, seven hamlets have been inspected and all were accepted and approved as being completed hamlets. During the inspection a marked interest on the part of the hamlet people as to the outcome of the inspection, hamlet affairs in general, and the willingness to participate in the area of project building was noticed.
- (2) Military support for the RD Program remained the same as in November. Three battalions of the 1st ARVN Infantry Division, three RF companies and fourteen PF platoons continue to provide a good security screen for the RD effort. The PF platoons are still understrength in some RD areas. Enemy activity against the RD Cadre Teams during December remained low with only two RD/VC contacts; both in Phu Vang District. Elements of the K-1 Battalion are believed to have launched a mortar attack on 6 December against Nam Hoa Subsector and the Marine Corps rockcrusher, and an attack on 21 December on PRU Headquarters in the vicinity of YD766202. The

attacks resulted in six killed and six wounded for the first attack and sixteen killed (15 civilians) and 66 wounded (59 civilians) for the latter attack.

- (3) The 1968 Province RD Plan is complete. This plan is considered to be demanding but realistic and very compatible with the situation existing in the Province. The Province staff is now in the process of preparing the 1968 Pacification Plan.
- (4) A program for in-Province training has been drawn up by RD Headquarters. This training has long been desired and should start functioning in January 1968. Because of the shortness of the Vung Tau Course, the technical RD Cadre is not adequately prepared to completely and successfully carry out its total mission. The advanced in-Province training will utilize personnel of the Vietnamese technical service agencies as instructors, which should aid both sides in the learning process. Two village/hamlet officials training courses were conducted during the month, with an attendance of approximately 109 officials.

## b. Quang Tri Province

- (1) The security situation showed a marked improvement during December. This resulted in substantial progress in the completion of projects by RD Cadre Teams throughout the RD priority area. The continued location of the 1st Marines near Quang Tri City and 3d Marine Division operations conducted in the areas to the west and southwest of the RD priority area were of primary importance in shielding previously pacified areas and permitting the RD Program to function. The improved security resulted in not a single incident taking place against Quang Tri Province RD Cadre Teams during December.
- (2) In December, 1st ARVN Division forces continued to perform very well in support of the RD and pacification programs. Three battalions of the 1st Regiment remained in direct support of these programs, preventing any significant enemy interference. The Regiment continued to conduct combat operations on the outskirts of the primary RD area, creating a defensive atmosphere for the enemy. Regional Forces (RF) directly supporting the RD Program did not change in December. The Popular Forces (PF) assigned to the RD and pacification programs continued to be used primarily for security missions. In December, training and logistical support of these units was emphasized, which should begin paying dividends in 1968. Regional and Popular Force units continued understrength, which limits performance in both RD and pacification support and in combat operations.
- (3) The cold, wet weather in the first two weeks of December slowed the flow of commodities to the field and made construction work in RD hamlets difficult. This slowdown was offset by many courses conducted for hamlet and village officials, and for RD and Static Grievance Cadre. By mid-month, the weather improved and work in the field accelerated. Despite the holidays and weather, the revised RD Program for 1967 appeared to be on schedule. There also was considerable energy expended in drafting the Pro-

vince Pacification Plan for 1968. The "town meeting" concept continued to develop with GVN officials assuming the responsibility of calling the meetings and achieving meaningful results.

# 3. Division Civil Affairs/Civic Action

## a. Agriculture

- (1) IR8 Rice. 15 experimental fields were planted in December in Thua Thien Province. Each of these fields is located next to two other types of rice fields (i.e. the normal variety of rice grown in this area, plus an improved version of Vietnamese rice). Harvesting is expected to begin during May 1968.
- (2) Pig Projects. All 10 pigs now being raised in pig projects in Thua Thien Province continue to progress well. Their weights range from 115 to 175 lbs. Breeding of the 9 gilts and 1 boar will begin in the month of January 1968. Une-nair of each litter will be given to Division G-5 to distribute further to other farmers and thus expand this project.
- (3) Rice Threshers. A total of 55 rice threshers loaned to farmers by Division G-5 were used for the Fall 1967 rice harvest. The agreement nade with the farmers was that they would either purchase the machines for 3,500 \$VN at the end of the harvest or return them to Division G-5. 32 farmers purchased the threshers. It is expected that 9 other machines will also be purchased. The remainder are being collected by G-5 for reissue during the Fay 1966 harvest.
- (4) <u>Duckling Project</u>. On 5 December 1967, the 3d Anti-Tank Battalion presented 296 ducklings to the Hamlet Chief of Bach Thach Hamlet, Phu Loc District in Thua Thien Province, for distribution to the people of the hamlet. Funds in the amount of \$50.00 for this project were donated by the Protestant Chapel Fund, U.S. Naval Air Station, Seattle, Washington. During the duckling presentation, 271 people received MEDCAP treatment. Bars of soap and soap powder donated by the Tam Campfire Girls, American Legion of Chicago, and several relatives of a Marine of 3d Anti-Tank Battalion were presented to the villagers. A large bundle of clothes donated by the Overseas Vives Club of Jacksonville, North Carolina, was distributed by the Hamlet Chief. Ten bags of cement were given to the Hamlet Market Place which was a previous 3d Anti-Tank Battalion Civic Action project. The hamlet's cormerce has increased to such a degree it is necessary to enlarge it. NCB-121 Doctor and Chaplain accompanied 3d Anti-Tank Battalion on the presentation.
- b. Food for Peace. This program conducted in accordance with Public Law 480 by which Vietnamese workers are paid in the form of commodities for their labor continues to expand. The following is the status of the various units' projects:
- (1) 3d Marines/Camp Carroll. A total of 42 workers per week are being employed to fill sandbags and cut/clear fields of fire. Salad oil and bulgar are used in payment of wages.

- (2) 4th Marines/Camp Evans. This project began on 8 December 1967 with 225 workers per week (about 50 per day) being employed to fill sandbass. 45,000 sandbass were filled from 8-31 December 1967. Rolled oats, cooking oil and wheat are the commodities used in payment.
- (3) 9th Marines/Dong Ha. An average of 100 workers per day are being employed to fill sandbags. Payment was in salad oil during December.
- (4) 26th Marines/Khe Sanh. The Food for Peace project continues to offer needed employment for Montagnard (Brou) families in the Khe Sanh area. An average of 27 Brou were employed daily by the 26th Marines for camp trash disposal and sanitation, camp maintenance and working parties in the Khe Sanh Airfield landing support site. Payment for the services was made in rice.
- (5) 1st Marines/Quang Tri. A Civic Action project involving road repair by 42 refugees from Hai Phu Village began on 5 December 1967. This project will benefit the Vietnamese people in the area as well as improving a road utilized by 1st Parines' vehicles. It also provides employment for the refugees in an area where unemployment exists. ## c. Logistics

- (1) The 3d Larine Division Civic Action program and logistical support continued to be devoted toward complementing the RD effort and operating in areas outside and adjacent to the RD priority areas. During this month, the 3d Marine Division continued to furnish logistics help to CORDS and GVN agencies. Transportation of commodities has been one of the major contributions. The Division G-5 warehouse issued 9,078 items of commodities to units in support of Civic Action programs during December.
- (2) The continuation of full operations by the Quang Tri Airfield assisted the RD effort in Quang Tri Province. CORDS use of this facility was promptly coordinated by the Senior Province Advisor and significant benefits were gained by CORDS in overcoming problems in logistical transportation. The location of the airfield and its security force continued to be an effective deterrent to VC forces attempting to penetrate the RD priority area from the west.
- (3) A change in the policy which previously banned local civilians from using military aircraft flying to or from Khe Sanh was authorized by Commanding General, III Marine Amphibious Force. Implementation of the new policy has been effected by the Senior Province Advisor, Quang Tri Province. This program is of measurable assistance to the economy of the Khe Sanh area and should in time greatly improve the attitudes and usefullness of French coffee planters, local merchants and the populace in the Khe Sanh area. A civilian air passenger terminal at the Khe Sanh Airfield is being built by the people of the Khe Sanh area. Tin for the roof is being supplied by III harine Amphibious Force.
- d. Public Health. During the month of December, public health education films were shown by the 7th Platoon, 29th Civil Affairs Company (U.S. Army)

Enclosure (1) SECRET to over 7,000 Vietnamese. The effect on the Vietnamese population was good and the health film will continue throughout the monsoon season. The films shown were titled Cleanliness, Insects as Carriers of Disease, Tuberculosis and Water and Winged Scourge.

- e. 3d Marine Division Vietnamese Scholarship Program. 110 students, 102 in Thua Thien and 8 in Quang Tri, were paid 167,920 \$VN for the Scholarship Program during the month of December 1967. 280,000 \$VN has been received from III Marine Amphibious Force for the period January-April 1968 and there is a current balance of 302,384 \$VN in the Fund. The Vietnamese school year ends 1 May 1968. The 3d Marine Division Scholarship Program will end in Phu Bai area this year. The initiation of this project again next academic year will be a matter under the cognizance of the 1st Marine Division.
- f. Graves Removal Phu Bai. Trash disposal continued to present a potential problem in the Phu Bai vital base. Therefore, a new trash disposal area is being obtained. The removal of 3,000-5,600 graves to clear the area in vicinity of YD901143 is necessary. Coordination of the grave removal with Province and District officials has been effected and the Vietnamese citizens concerned are scheduled to begin moving graves on 2 January 1968. It is expected that 30-60 days will be required to complete this project.
- g. Civil Affairs Area Survey. In preparation for the turnover of Civic Action responsibility in Thua Thien Province to the 1st Marine Division during January 1968, an area survey has been initiated. All 21 Civil Affairs functional areas and the status of all Civic Action projects in the Province are being surveyed by the 7th Platoon, 29th Civil Affairs Company located at Phu Bai. This platoon will remain at Phu Bai after 3d Marine Division relocates to Quang Tri and will provide continuity for Civic Action during the turnover period. Uncompleted projects will be turned over to the 1st Marine Division for completion. It is expected that the survey will be finished about 15 March 1968.

## h. Personal Response Program

- (1) This is a systematic effort to establish rapport between Americans and the people of Vietnam. Its objective is to achieve acceptance of each group by the other in order to further the accomplishment of our mission in Vietnam. Formal and informal instruction in Vietnamese history, culture and religions is presented during unit visits by the 3d Marine Division Contact Team and in a formal two-day Division Personal Response Course conducted monthly at Phu Bai.
- (2) The following Personal Response instruction was given during December:
- (a) A total of 1,234 personnel (81 officers, 88 Staff NCOs and 1,065 other enlisted) received instruction during 26 hours of formal school presentations and 17 hours at field lectures.
  - (b) The formal school lectures included instruction at the CAG

School, the 3d Recornaissance Battalion Indectrination Course, the Division Staff NCO Leadership Jourse and the Division Personal Response Course.

- (c) 8 officers, 15 Staff NCOs and 3 other enlisted personnel attended the 10th Division Personal Response Course conducted at Phu Bai from 4-5 December 1967.
- (d) Field lectures and discussion periods were conducted at seven battalions. 963 personnel (included in total reported in (2) above) attended the lectures.

## i. Christmas Program

- (1) The majority of the 3d Marine Division's assets for support of holiday celebrations have been reserved for TET in accordance with III Marine Amphibious Force guidance. However, it was possible for the Division to give the following support to the Vietnamese people's celebration of Christmas in our CAACR.
- (a) 21,260 toys were purchased from toy merchants in the City of Hue by Division G-5. Unit donations provided funds for 11,060 toys of the total number that was bought.
- (b) 40,000 cookies and 80,000 pieces of candy were purchased from merchants in Hue. 10,000 small plastic bags were obtained in which to package the gifts.
- (c) 900 health and comfort kits, each consisting of a toothbrush, toothpaste, washeloth and a ber of soap, were prepared by Division G-5. On 24 December 1967, Commanding General, 3d Marine Division, accompanied by the Commanding General, 1st ARVN Division, presented these kits as Christmas gifts to wounded 1st ARVN Division patients in their hospital in Hue.
- (d) In addition, unit bakeries and messhalls baked cookies and provided punch and kool-aid for numerous Christmas parties in our CAACR.

#### (2) Unit Programs

(a) 3d Marines. A Christmas party was conducted on 24 December 1967 at the Cam Lo Refugee Elementary School for 300 "underprivileged" refugee children of Cam Lo District. Short speeches were delivered by the District Chief, and CAO, 3d Marines, followed by the playing of several indoors games and relays. All children were then mustered in front of the school, and at an appointed time, Santa Claus, standing in a jeep, was driven into the yard. The pre-packaged bags of candy, gum, balloons, and toys were then passed out as the lines moved by Santa. The contents of all gifts were either contributed by members of this unit, or bought with funds earned by the CAO from cutting hair. The Commanding Officer, S-3 and CAO, 3d Marines were the honored guests at a party presentation at the Gia Mon Refugee Center, and were hosted by Father Co, the well known Vietnamese Priest in the area. Presents were exchanged, and a swagger stick was given to the CAO for his recent promotion to Major. The presentation consisted

of several folk songs and dances performed by young girls and boys of the hamlet, followed by a timely entrance of Santa Claus, who delivered gifts to each performer. The guests were then treated to an elaborate dinner before returning to Camp Carroll. Santa for both parties was provided by courtesy of a Sea Bee electrician, currently working at Camp Carroll.

- (b) 4th Marines. On 22 December 1967, a Christmas party was held at Tan Nguyen Hamlet for the children of the District. This party was hosted by a Catholic Priest, Father James My. The Culture/Drama Team from Hue put on several shows at the party. Candy, cookies and kool-aid were given by the messhalls at Camp Evans. The 8th Platoon, 29th Civil Affairs Company assisted in the planning and implementation of the plans. There were an estimated 2,000 people at this party.
- (c) 3d Motor Transport Battalion. A Christmas party was held for approximately 1,500 students from the schools at Diem Tu. The party was organized and conducted by the school and hamlet officials with assistance from the battalion. The unit's participation was obvious, but every effort was made to make the people feel that this was still their Christmas and their party. Approximately 1,200 gifts, obtained from the G-5, donations from 3d Motor Transport Battalion personnel and from private and religious groups in the U.S. and Vietnam, were distributed to the children. Cookies, candies and cake were also obtained for the occasion from the above sources. Only a few decorations were available; however, the people used their own resources and ingenuity to construct many quite elaborate decorations for the entire school grounds. The children and hamlet officials considered the party a success and numerous letters have been received expressing thanks for the unit's efforts in support of the celebrations.
- (d) 3d Shore Party Battalion. 500 assorted Christmas gifts were distributed to children of Hog Duan (YD859308) on 23 December 1967. They were delivered by Amphibious Tractors. On the same date, 600 assorted gifts for children were given to the Catholic nuns of Cu Lai (YD890286). The people of Tan My (YD814309) were given 800 pieces of candy and cookies on Christmas Eve. Delivery was effected by a Navy assault boat.
- (e) <u>Headquarters Battalion</u>. On 23 December 1967, this unit sponsored a Christmas party for approximately 300 children of Chiet Ba Hamlet adjacent to the "B" Sector, Phu Bai Defense Perimeter. From individual contributions of members of Headquarters Battalion, approximately 300 toys were bought and distributed. The Division Band played during the party while approximately 100 Marines distributed the toys, candy, cookies and drinks. Chaplain JONES of Headquarters Battalion assisted in the distribution of the gifts. A small MEDCAP was held and approximately 30 children were treated for minor cuts, bruises, etc.
- (f) tst Battalion, 44th Artillery (U.S. Army). A Christmas party was given to 120 orphans with the assistance of personnel from 1/44, Task Force PIKE and MCB-301 on 24 December 1967. In Dong Ha, a sit-down chicken dimer, favors and entertainment were provided for the orphans.
- (g) 3d CAG. 1,320 toys, general school supplies and several boxes of assorted clothing were distributed by CAP units in several hamlets.

The 3d Marine Division Band played at two Christmas parties; one at a school at Thuy Phuong and another at the orphanage in Nuoc Ngot.

- (h) Hac Bao (Black Parther.) Company, 1st ARVN Division Reaction Force. Gifts were provided by 3d Marine Division were presented to 600 children/dependents of members of the Hao Bao Company. 1st Lieutenant Hue, Commanding Officer of the Company, and his staff distributed the gifts and conducted the party which was highly successful. The American advisors stayed in the background as much as possible. Maximum credit was taken by the Vietnamese officers of the company in keeping with our objective of enhancing their position, not ours.
- (i) Thua Thien Sector/CORDS. 1,000 toys, 2,000 cookies, 4,000 pieces of candy and 500 plastic bags were given by the 3d Marine Division to the U.S. Army Sector Advisor, Thua Thien Province, for distribution to the dependents of ARVN soldiers and various orphanages and schools in Hue. These parties were conducted under the auspices of the Province Senior Advisor since all Civic Action activities in Hue are under his cognizance.
- (j) 1st Marines. From 23-25 December 1967, 14 Christmas parties were conducted by units of this Regiment and MAG-36 in the 1st Marines CAAOR. Christmas gifts were also supplied to two organizations, La Vang Chinh Orphanage and the Mai Linh District Chief, for further distribution to additional children. A total of 6,570 gifts were distributed. Cookies, candy, and in some cases, kool-aid were also distributed to the children at the Christmas parties. A Marine dressed as Santa Claus was present at the parties given by 2d Battalion, 1st Marines and the 1st Marines Headquarters.
- j. <u>Civic Action Projects</u>. As of 31 December 1967, the status of Civic Action projects for which materials and assistance were being provided by the Division was as shown on TAB A.
- k. MEDCAPS. A total of 48,279 Vietnamese patients were treated at MEDCAP/DENTCAPS during December. This was an increase of about 1,500 from the 46,794 treated in November.

## D. Related Activities

(1) Chapels

On 25 December RADM J. W. KELLY, CHC, USN, Chief of Chaplains, dedicated the new chaple at Camp EVANS. Chaplain COHILL is the Chaplain for the 4th Marines and oversaw the construction.

(2) Civic Action

Divine Services were held for the men of CLG, III MAF, with chaplains going out to these Marines in remote villages, assisting them in their spiritual and material needs.

Leadership/lectures on indigenous religions were given by chaplains during December on 32 different occasions. Total attendance at those lectures was 1,480.

To assist our civic action program on the Division level, 519,200.00 \$RVN was donated primarily to scholarships funds, refugee villages and orphanages. This money come from the protestant and catholic chapel funds.

(3) Christmas Gifts

At Christmes time, over 2000 Christmas packages were received and distributed throughout the Division by the Division Chaplain with the help of the Regimental and Battalion Chaplains. Many thousands of Christmas cards and letters were distributed not only to the men in the field, but especially to the hospital and hospital ships, the USS SANCTUARY and the USS RAPOSE.

## E. Visits

On 4 December, the Most Reverend Philip Nguyen Kim Dien, Archbishop of Hue, administered the Romen Catholic Sacrament of Confirmation to twenty-five (25) service men in the General Hochmuth \*\*Emografic Chapel.

On 24-25 December, RAIM J. W. KELLY, CHC, USN, Chief of Chaplains, made a visit to the 3rd Marine Division. During his stay he visited the hospitals of "A" and "D" Companies, 3rd Med Bn. He made a visit to CAP unit A-#6, where he toured the compound and distributed toys to the village children. On Christmas Eve, he participated in the Candlelight Worship Services at Dong Ha and assisted in the dedication of the chapel at Camp Evans.

# 2. PREVENTIVE MEDICINE/SANITATION

- a. On 15 December 1967 a preventive medicine team conducted an investigation of reported cases of infectious hepatitis at CAC-3.
- b. On 19 December 1967 a presumptive diagnosis of epidemic typhus was made in a Vietnamese interpreter employed by the Third Medical Battalion. All contacts were investigated by the Preventive Medicine section and immunized. All staff and patient personnel in the Phu Bai facility of the Third Medical Battalion were immunized.
- c. On 20 December 1967 an investigation was instituted on Cocoa Beach road concerning numerous dead rats (cause unknown). DDT dusting and typhus vaccine was taken to area for use. Three local nationals were immunized. Use of rodenticides was subsequently confirmed.

## 3. DISEASES

- a. 3d Marine Division personnel admitted to the sick list by the Division Psychiatrist with psychiatric diagnosis 17, and a total of 99 outpatients were seen. 45 were evacuated and 65 were returned to duty. There were 3 recommended for administrative discharge. 3 remain on the sick list.
- b. A total of 152 cases of illness classified under the category of veneral disease were reported in the 3d Marine Division personnel during December. There were 109 cases of Gonorrhea, 43 cases of non-specific Urethritis, 0 cases of syphilis and 0 cases of Lymphogranuloma Venereum. 29 cases of VD were acquired in RVN and 123 cases in R&R countries.
- c. For the month of December there were 522 non-hostitle casualties admitted to the sick list. Of this group there were 100 cases of Fever of Undetermined Origin, 8 cases of Gastroenteritis, 32 cases of Cellulitis, 4 cases of Hepatitis and 5 cases of Dysentery.
- d. For the month of November there were 27 confirmed cases of Malaria, of which 15 were P. Falciparin, 9 were P. Vivax, and 3 were undetermined.

## 4. VISITORS

a. On 13 December Captain W. A. WULFMAN, FMF Pac Surgeon, and HMCM A. B. CARROLL, FMF Pac Administrative Chief visited the Surgeon's office on official medical matters.


