NARRATIVE SUMMARY

PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

1. PERSONNEL ADMINISTRATION

- a. Two hundred and three officers and 4,369 enlisted personnel joined the Division. Personnel transferred by normal rotation included 93 officers and 3,999 enlisted. Personnel transferred by service records due to MedEvac were 17 officers and 302 enlisted. Eighty-eight officers and 331 enlisted were transferred to other units within WestPac.
- b. Awards. Award recommendations submitted to FMFPac included three Navy Crosses, 27 Silver Star Medals, 12 Legion of Merit Medals, one Navy and Marine Corps Medal, 81 Bronze Star Medals, 12 Air Medals, 104 Navy Commendation Medals and 87 Navy Achievement Medals. The following awards were returned from FMFPac approved: Two Navy Crosses, 10 Silver Star Medals, 18 Legion of Merit Medals, two Distinguished Flying Cross Medals, 94 Bronze Star Medals, four Air Medals, 88 Navy Commendation Medals and 75 Navy Achievement Medals. Additionally, 1,209 Purple Heart Medals were awarded.
 - c. Casualties. Casualties during the month included 81 KIA, 688 WIA, 12 DOW, 11 NHD, 45 NHI and O MIA.
 - d. Congressional Interest Cases. There were 179 incoming cases, 162 cases completed, 25 cases readdressed to other commands and 77 cases pending.
 - e. Welfare Reports. During the month 84 welfare reports were completed.
 - f. <u>Industrial Relations</u>. There are presently 516 Local National Civilians employed on 30 September. A request for an increase in the ceiling was made to III MAF. In return information was received that the 3d Marine Division would probably receive a cut by 31 October 1968.
 - g. Reproduction. During the month of September the reproduction section at Quang Tri received 342 job requests totaling 643,294 printed copies. The Dong Ha subsection received 161 job requests totaling 585,661 printed copies.

2. EXCHANGE SERVICES

a. Sales for the month of September 1968 were \$524,233.50. Inventory as of 30 September 1968: \$1,046,226.47.



- b. Captain Robert E. JONES was assigned as Division Exchange Officer relieving CWO-2 H. O. TATE.
- c. The following equipment was received from the Army and Air Force Exchange Service; one Jeep, eleven safes, three printing calculators and ten cash registers.


3. INFORMATIONAL SERVICES

- a. The Informational Services Office continued its coverage of the Division's activities. During the month of September, 3,001 written FHTN releases and 166 tape recorded FHTN radio interviews were prepared and forwarded to Fleet Home Town News Center, Great Lakes, Illinois. In addition, a total of 72 news and feature articles and 43 photo captions were also prepared and forwarded to CIB, III MAF for release and further dissemination.
- b. The Informational Services Office increased its staff at the Vandegrift Combat Base Press Center from two to eight personnel. The staff now consists of five Combat Correspondents (4312), one Radio Combat Correspondent (4313), one Still Photographer and an OIC, CWO-2 NADOLNY, Assistant ISO. This increase was made to better facilitate operational coverage of 3d Division combat activities and to better coordinate the activities of civilian news media representatives visiting Vandegrift Combat Base. The ISO section continued to operate its Press Centers at Dong Ha and Quang Tri.
- c. The ISO's Radio/TV section produced and forwarded to Headquarters, U. S. Marine Corps, eight tape recorded radio features and three sync/sound motion picture features.
- d. Informational Services personnel provided support (briefings, escorts, transportation and billeting) to 64 civilian news media representatives who visited the 3d Marine Division TAOR during September.
 - e. In addition, the ISO's Combat Artist produced and forwarded to CIB, III MAF for transport to Headquarters, U. S. Marine Corps 45 pieces of Combat Art, including pen, pencil, charcoal and water color sketches as the Division's contribution to the Marine Corps Combat Art Program.

4. SPECIAL SERVICES

a. The following items were issued under the "Criti-Pak" program: Criti-Paks - 26; Writing Kits - 25,400; Paperback Books - 1,300; Game Kits - 271.





- c. The Education Section administered 205 High School GED tests and 144 College (CCT-GE) tests.
- d. During the month, 1,384 pre-recorded tapes were ordered for units in the 3d Marine Division.
- e. A total of 176 messages were sent and received by the Dong Ha MARS Station. Six hundred and seventy two phone patches were placed to the United States for personnel of this Division.

5. BAND

- a. During the month the band played for the opening ceremonies at the Dong Ha Children's Hospital .
- b. Two People to People concerts were presented to the people of Quang Tri City during the month.
- c. The band participated in the dedication ceremonies for the Dong Ha Elementary School.
- d. The Dixieland combo and the Rock-n-Roll combo played for the farewell reception for Mr. BREWER, the State Department advisor to the Quang Tri Province Chief, at the Province Headquarters.
- e. During the month the Dixieland combo played a reception at the Quang Tri Province Headquarters for the Province Chief.
- f. The Rock-n-Roll combo provided a show for the troops at the 18th Surgical Hospital, Quang Tri Combat Base.

6. POSTAL SERVICES

a. The following figures represent poundage of U. S. Mail received and dispatched during the month of July.

b. The Division Post Office and fourteen Unit Post Offices continued to furnish all phases of postal services to all units of the Division. Currently Unit Post Offices are located at Dong Ha, Quang Tri, Ca Iu and Camp Carroll. Mobile money order units were made available to organizations in the field when requested.



- c. On 30 September 1968 CWO-2 Rex T. SCHALCH assumed duties as Division Postal Officer. lstLt James F. ALEXANDER rotated to CONUS.
- d. The protective canopy extending from the existing post office building at Dong Ha, was completed on 30 September. The processing of mail pallets can now be accomplished without any damage to the mail by the forthcoming monsoon season.

7. PROVOST MARSHAL

- a. A total of five hundred traffic citations were issued by the PMO during the month. Three hundred and eighty-five were moving traffic violations.
- b. One hundred and fifteen vehicles were impounded for exceeding the posted speed by 10 miles per hour or more.
- c. A total of 84 Military Police Reports were initiated during September 1968.
- d. A total of 21 vehicular accidents were investigated by the PMO, resulting in one death and three injuries. The consolidated property damage was \$1,480.00.
- e. During the month of September 1968, 26 persons were detained and finally processed as follows:

Prisoners of War - 5
Innocent Civilians - 20
Returnees TOTAL - 1

f. Major SKIPPER reported aboard on 23 September 1968, and assumed the duties of Commanding Officer of Military Police Company on 24 September 1968. He assumed the duties of Provost Marshal on 29 September 1968.

9. <u>IEGAL</u>. During the month of September the Office of Staff Judge Advocate tried five General Courts-Martial cases. It also reviewed nine Summary and 15 Special Courts-Martial cases. Six Judge Advocates were assigned to act as Article 32 Investigating Officers and 28 as counsel for courts-martial cases. The legal assistance officer handled 68 cases. Two battalion legal offices were inspected by a Judge Advocate assigned by the Staff Judge Advocate.

10. CLUBS. During the month of September the Division Clubs warehouse at Dong Ha received 559 pallets of Beer, 81 pallets of Soda, 754 cases of Snacks and 790 cases of Liquor.







1. PERSONNEL

The month of September ended with a total of 28 chaplains aboard. Of these Chaplain ZANDSTRA, 2nd Bn, 26th Marines is SLF, ADCON/OPCON to 9th MAB. Chaplains BERG, 1st Bn, 26th Marines and HENSLEY, 3d Bn, 26th Marines were changed to ADCON as well as OPCON to 1st MARDIV. Chaplain ECKER, 2nd Bn, 3d Marines was changed to ADCON as well as OPCON to 3d Marine Division.

2. DIVINE SERVICES

3d Marine Division chaplains conducted 332 Sunday Divine Services during the month of September with an attendance of 9,495. Weekly services numbered 333 with a total attendance of 5,862.



47 Memorial Services were held with an attendance of 944.

High Holy Days of the Jewish Faith were celebrated at China Beach Recreation Center with Chaplain BRESLAU, USA, conducting. All 3d MARDIV personnel of the Jewish Faith were invited to attend on a TAD basis as operations permitted.

Latter Day Saints worship services were conducted weekly by lay leaders in the Quang Tri/Dong Ha areas.

3. OPERATIONS


3. Order of Battle Section

a. The Target Intelligence Section maintained and disseminated overlay:






- d. Sensors Spotlight Reports were received and relayed on a real time basis to various using units.

COLLECTION BRANCH

- 1. During September, the Collection Branch received, processed and disseminated 731 Agent reports from the following agencies:
- a. 525th Military Intelligence Group; Provincial Reconnaissance Unit; Census Grievance Center; National Police Special Branch; 7th Counterintelligence Team; and 15th Counterintelligence Team. In addition, numerous intelligence to Military Advisory Command, Vietnam; Third Marine Amphibious Force; XXIV Corps; Commander, United States Naval Forces, Vietnam; 1st Marine Division; Combined Material Exploitation Center; I Corps Advisory Groups; Task Force Hotel; Task Force Clearwater; 3d Reconnaissance Battalion, and regiments and separate battalions of the 3d Marine Division.
- b. The number of detainee reports received by Collection during September totaled 19h, of which 17h were captured during September. Twenty three were captured prior to September 1968.
- 2. The Airborne Personnel Detector (Sniffer) was tasked daily, but poor weather and the lack of supporting gunships combined to permit only nine missions. The APD pilots are briefed by the Collection Officer prior to each mission, and are debriefed immediately upon completion of the mission. The information obtained is disseminated to division units, the Division Fire Support Coordination Center and the G-2 Production Branch.
- 3. 1stLt R. W. O'CONNOR was assigned as assistant Collection Officer on the 13th of September 1968. 1stLt O'CONNOR is replacing 1stLt A. N. MANGHAM.





5. Photo Imagery Interpretation Unit

a. The 3d Marine Division Photo Imagery Interpretation Unit submitted 53 requests to MXIV Corps, 3-2 Air for aerial recon during the month of September 1968. Forty three requests were fulfilled, two were cancelled and eight are bending. FITU received a total of 60 aerial photo missions of which 50 were distributed to 3d Marine Division units and attached Army Units. The remaining were held for basic coverage of the Division TAGA. In addition, FITU received 115 photo imagery interpretation reports which were bassed to division supporting units.





- a. 7th Interrogation Translation Team. During September 1968, the 7th ITT provided support for operations Kentucky, Lancaster II, Napoleon/Saline, Scotland II, Trousdale and Trousdale North. Team members participated in operation Scotland II. A total of 18 interrogation reports were submitted to the division. Ten innocent civilians were interviewed.

7. Interpreter Team.

- a. 3d Interpreter Team. During September, the 3d Interpreter Team continued to support the division by operating the division Document Translation Center. DTC processed 50 batches of captured documents, from which a total of 995 documents were screened, summarized or fully translated. In addition, 22 friendly documents were processed resulting in 40 pages of translation.
- b. 9th Interpreter Team. During September, the 9th Team provided support to the division and Task Force Motel in operations Kentucky, Lancaster II, Napoleon/Saline, Scotland II, Trousdale and Trousdale North.
- c. 11th Interpreter Team. During September, the 11th Team supported operations Kentucky, Lancaster II, Mapoleon/Saline, Scotland III, Trousdale and Trousdale Morth. In addition, the team gave direct support to Special Landing Force 2/26, and furnished Marine Vietnamese language interpreters to work as Instructor/Interpreters for the Kit Carson

Scouts and as Supply Supervisor/Interpreter for COADS in Quang Tri City.

8. Counterintelligence Teams.

a. 7th Counterintelligence Team. During September, the 7th CIT continued to provide counterintelligence coverage of Trieu Phong, Mai Linh and Hai Lang Districts of Quang Tri Province. The 7th Team provided the 3d Marine Division with 21 CIP Reports and 2 Spot Reports during September. The 3d Marine Division is continuing to maintain liaison with Quang Tri City through 1stLt ... N. BROWN, 7th Counterintelligence Team Commander.

b. 15th Counterintelligence Team.






4. LIAISON:

OPERATIONS

3d Marine Division offensive operations during September continued to be oriented toward the destruction of the NVA 320th Division. That enemy formation, after loitering north of the central DMZ, had moved southeast during August and was turned back with heavy losses in the latter part of that month. In the initial days of September, the 3d Marines in the Razorback-Rockpile-Camp Carroll area made several contacts with the 52nd Regiment. Later, as the 9th Marines completed operations on the Nui Tia Pong hill mass, 10 km west of the Rockpile, that Regiment with organic battalions and 1/4, 2/3 and 2/26 commenced offensive operation into the DMZ. Sharp engagements with small enemy units characterized these operations in which the 3d Marines joined. Additional huge caches were uncovered in and just south of the DMZ. Among the captured material for the month of September was over 32 tons of rice, 51 tons of salt, 593 individual weapons and 49 crew served weapons. Ammunition captured included 23,000 mortar rounds, 4800 mines, 13,000 grenades, 266 artillery rockets, over 5,000 RPG and recoilless rifle rounds, a million and a quarter rounds of small arms and antiaircraft maching gun ammunition. Twelve and a half tons of explosives were captured throughout the many storage complexes uncoverd. The large number of NVA killed during the month (1399) and the huge quantity of supplies captured, including over seven hundred weapons, were indicative of the heavy mauling taken by the 320th Division. Capture of these huge quantities of supplies cut short any offensive the NVA had planned for the early monsoon period.

2. <u>NAPOLEON/SALINE</u>. Throughout the month of September, 1st AmTrac Bn conducted small unit operations from Cua Viet, C-4 and Oceanview while Co C, 3d Tank Bn conducted operations in the vicinity of My Loc.

At the beginning of the month, Co C, 1/11 and Co C, 3d Tank Bn conducted a one day search and clear operation in the vicinity of Nhi Ha with the mission of destroying bunkers and levelling the buildings remaining in the village. There were no significant ground attacks.

During the latter part of the month, 1st AmTrac Battalion, in conjunction with a PF Company, conducted several search and cordon operations in the various resettlement villages resulting in 4 NVA/KIA(C).

For the most part, throughout the month of September, there were no significant ground contacts. However, there were several artillery attacks which resulted in minor damage at Cua Viet.

In the 2nd ARVN Regiment AO, Co A, 3rd Tank Battalion, supporting a 2d ARVN operation into the DMZ, reported 73 NVA/KIA(C). Two Marine tanks were damaged by mines but there were no friendly casualties.

3. KENTUCKY. Through the first ten days of September, the 1st BDE, 5th Infantry Mechanized conducted small unit operations in their area of responsibility. There were several light mortar and artillery attacks but no significant ground contacts.

On the 11th, Co D, 1/11 conducted a search and cordon operation in the vicinity of the market place northeast of Con Thien. Here they made heavy contact with an unknown size enemy force in a bunker complex. The enemy was engaged with small arms, tanks, artillery and fixed wing, resulting in 35 NVA killed and seven prisoners.

In mid-month the brigade conducted a one-day search and cordon operation north of Λ -3 into the DMZ. The 1st Bn, 77th Armor attacked from the west of Λ -3 while 1st Bn, 11th Infantry attacked from the east of Λ -3. The one day operation netted 35 NVA killed plus seven weapons captured.

On the 20th, the 1st BDE conducted a search and clear operation in the Khe Chua Valley northwest of Cam Lo. Thile the 1st Bn, 61st Infantry occupied blocking positions, the 1st Bn, 77th Armor cleared the valley. In three days the operation concluded with several sharp contacts with small-size NVA units resulting in 15 NVA(C) and 6 individual weapons captured. 1st Bn, 11th Infantry then conducted an operation in the DMZ west of A-4, to determine the BDA of recent B-52 strikes. There were several instances of mortar attacks but no significant ground contacts.

4. LANCAST.R. At the beginning of the month, the 3d Marines conducted search and clear operations in the vicinity of Mutters Ridge and continued to operate from Camp Carroll, Thon Son Tam, the Dong Ha Mountain CP and Khe Gio bridge. There were several heavy mortar and artillery attacks and several ground probes by small NVA units. Meanwhile, 2dBn, 26th Marines, under the operational control of the 3rd Marines, operated in the Mai Loc Special Forces TAOR and had no significant ground contacts.

On the 12th of September, 2ndBn, 26th Marines was helilifted into LZ Margo in the upper Cam Lo valley to conduct operations in the DMZ. On the 16th, while moving, the 2ndBn, 26th Marines received 204 rounds of 82mm mortar resulting in heavy casualties.



On the 17th, the 9th Marines, with 1/4, 1/9, 2/26 and 2/3 commenced a search and clear operation in the northern portion of the Lancaster AO. 1/4 and 1/9 were helilifted into LZ's in the DMZ on the south bank of the Ben Hai River and attacked to the south. 2/3 and 2/26 attacked to the north from the Cam Lo Valley. The battalions made sharp contacts with several NVA units resulting in 228 NVA/KIA(C) and 3 POW's. 1/9, 1/4 and 2/26 uncovered several large bunker complexes containing over 3,000 mortar rounds, 390 RPG rounds, twenty-five 107mm Rocket rounds, 330,000 rounds of small arms ammunition, 75 claymores, 3000 lbs of TNT, 5000 lbs of rice and 455 individual weapons.

During the latter part of the month, 1/4 continued to attack to the northeast along the DMZ while 1/3 attacked to the east. There were no significant ground contacts. 1/9 carried out an attack in the ridges west along the DMZ without significant contacts.

5. SCOTLAND. During the month of September, 4th Marines continued to conduct operations from Ca Lu and fire support bases Cates, Shepherd and quantico, but made no significant contacts.

Meanwhile, the 3rd Bn, 9th Marines conducted search and clear operations in the vicinity of LZ Winchester and LZ Krypton. They encountered small units of NVA which tenaciously resisted their advance linto bunker complexes where erge caches of ammunition and rice were stored. These contacts resulted in 158 NVA(C), 24 individual weapons captured and five crew-served weapons captured, as well as 13 tons of rice, 3600 rounds of mortar ammunition, 800 mines and 925 RPG rounds.

The 2d Battalion, 9th Marines, continued to exploit the large caches uncovered in August. The enemy staged several mortar attacks and lightly defended their bunker complexes. Throughout the month the Marines discovered many bunker complexes, some with hospitals and messhalls containing large quantities of medical supplies and rice. During the last few days of September, 2/9 was helilifted into LZ's Foxtrot and Sandy to conduct search and clear operations along the Nui Ba Lao ridge. There were no ground contacts, although some bunkers were uncovered and destroyed. On the 29th, three companies of 3/4 conducted a search and cordon operation in the Ba Long Valley southeast of Ca Iu to seek out and capture VC suspects in the area. Results of the operation were





- 2. INFORMAL SCHOOLS. On-the-job training and contact team instruction continued to be the primary means of accomplishing technical training within the Division. - 3. <u>KIT CARSON SCOUT SCHOOL</u>. A Division formal school is conducted to train Chieu Hois as Kit Carson Scouts for future assignment to division units. During the month of September 23 students were graduated. The school is conducted on as needed basis.



- 2. Psychological Operations support all named operations and Regimental TAOR's. The area above Thon Son Lam was targeted regularly.

- 4. There were 24 hours and 44 minutes of aerial broadcasts covering the same basic themes in the same general areas as the leaflet drops.
- 5. There were 70 hours and 45 minutes of ground broadcast in support of the 4th Marines, 9th Marines, 3d Marines, and Task Force Hotel in Quang Tri Province. General themes



- 6. There were 47 movies shown for 20 hours and 30 minutes. Themes used were: Drama # 2, Night of the Dragon, Frontiers, Behind the Spacemen, Infant Care and Feeding, and Origin of the Motion Picture.
- 7. There were 153,000 leaflets, posters, and Free South newspapers distributed in Quang Tri Province.
- 8. Twenty-five VC/NVA rallied through the Chieu Hoi Program in Quang Tri Province.
- 9. There are 94 Kit Carson Scouts employed by the Division. 3d Marine Division scouts participated on 250 patrols this month and discovered 26 mines and booby traps.
- 10. The Quang Tri Armed Propaganda Teams were deployed throughout the 3d Marine Division AO with CAG and 2d ARVN's units. The APT's are being used to conduct face to face propaganda, identify VC, gather intelligence information, and provide security for Quang Tri City.

- 11. This month ground broadcast teams have been on seven operations with 3d Marines, 4th Marines, and Task Force Hotel.
- 12. The NVA campaign was supported with NVA oriented leaflet drops throughout Quang Tri Province. In addition, Rally and Surrender Appeals and Safe Conduct Passes were air dropped on known NVA locations and infiltration routes.



COMBAT AIR SUPPORT SEPTEMBER 1968


1. Significant Events

- a. During this period, fixed wing fighter and attack aircraft flew a total of 2,074 sorties expending 5,248.0-tons of ordnance in support of the Third Marine Division in its area of operations.

 Out of 23,591 sorties, 39,583 passengers were transported along with 6,922.0-tons of cargo being delivered.
- b. Of the above totals, 1,120 fixed wing sorties delivered 2,808.0-tons of ordnance on selected targets in the Dong Ha and demilitarized zone area in support of operations KENTUCKY, LANCASTER II and NAPOLEON/SALINE. Rotary wing aircraft in these same areas transported 10,221 passengers and 1,312.7-tons of cargo in support of the same operations.
- c. Operations SCOTLAND II in the Vandegrift Combat Base area was supported by 954 fixed wing fighter and attack sorties. These sorties delivered 2,440.0-tons of ordnance on selected targets within this area of operations. Helicopters lifted 29,362 passengers and 5,609.3-tons of cargo and supplies to fire support bases and outpost positions in the western portion of the Third Marine Division area of operations.
- d. One-hundred-and-twenty-six (126) B-52 ARC LIGHT aircraft struck twenty-one (21) targets with 3,150-tons of ordnance being expended in support of the Third Marine Division.
- 2. New Developments. None.
- 3. Problems Areas. None.

1. COMMAND EMPHASIS:

- a. Division offensive operations continued at a high level during the month of September. The major actions were conducted by the 1st Bde, 5th Inf (Mech) west of Con Thien near the southern DMZ boundary on 7 September, a one day operation into the eastern DMZ area by the 1st Bde, 5th Inf (Mech) and 2d ARVN Regt on 13 September and a regimental size operation into the central DMZ area (northern Lancaster AO) on 17 September. All actions were preceded by a coordinated attack by fire employing Arc lights, tac air, artillery, and NGF.
- b. A list of recommended targets to be attacked upon arrival of the USS New Jersey was submitted to XXIV Corps and III MAF. Criteria for selection of targets was based on those targets which are beyond the range of the 8"/55 and those targets within range of the 8"/55 but are considered too hard for the 8"/55. These targets were included in a Target Planning List (TPL) published by III MAF. It is planned to update the TPL at two week intervals.

b. DISTRIBUTION OF FIRES

- (1) The decrease in supporting arms expenditures again this month was due to the continuing decrease in enemy activity in the Division AO.
- (2) As major actions moved westward into the heavy canopied area, there was a significant increase in a requirement for supporting fires by the 8" and 155mm howitzers. The 105mm round has proven to be too light for penetrating heavy canopy.



- (3) 20% (3939) of the missions reported to the FSIC were observed. The remaining 80% were unobserved missions with 75% (14,434) fired during daylight hours and 5% (890) during the night hours.
- (4) The continuing decrease in NGF same expenditure is attributed to a decrease in enemy activity in the eastern DMZ/Cap Mui Lay areas and to the fact only one destroyer was on station as NGFS during most of the month. 97% of the ammo expenditure was on targets in and north of the IMZ with 44% of the missions being observed.
- (5) The USS New Jersey (BB 62) reported on station at 300600H September. The ship has been assigned in support of the 3d Marine Division for an initial period of five days. Her first mission with the 16"/50 began at 0730.
- (6) Are light strikes were integrated and coordinated with ground operations in three major actions during the month. On 7 September two divert strikes were utilized in support of ground operations conducted by elements of the 1st Bde, 5th Inf (Mech) in coordination with a similiar eperation by the 2d ARVN Regt. On 16 and 17 September nine strikes were delivered in support of insertion of helicopterborne forces in the northern Lancaster AO. Five strikes were placed on the objective area and the remaining four strikes against known artillery positions which could support enemy troops in the objective area.

COMMUNICATION-ELECTRONICS

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 1. Command Post Communications. 1st Brigade, 5th Division (Mech) established a new Radio Relay link to Cua Viet. This link is in addition to the existing MRC-62 shot operated by Comm Company, 3d MarDiv.
- 2. Tropical Storm "BESS". Water damage to bunkers was experienced at the 3d HarDiv Command Post and at Vandegrift Combat Base. A few antennas were damaged because of high winds. One TRC-97 at Vandegrift Combat Base was damaged due to inundating, but returned to service.
- 3. New Equipment. Operational evaluation of the PRC-77/KY-38 continued during the month with excellent results. Appropriate reports have been forwarded to Headquarters III MAF.


4. Functional Areas.

- a. Communication Center. Near capacity operations continued with the Communication Center processing 62,345 messages during September.
- b. <u>Wire</u>. Wire construction continued throughout the Dong Ha Combat Base with the wire platoon installing a 100 pair cable to service the 1st Brigade, 5th Inf Division (Mech)/9th Marines (Rear) area. One overhead spiral-4 cable was installed to upgrade the circuits on the FCC-19 on DCS.

LOGISTICS

1. Significant Events

a. General

- (1) The Assistant Chief of Staff, G-4 and the Special Staff Sections under the cognizance of the G-4 made over 100 Staff Visits to Division units.
- (2) During the Commanding General's Technical Inspections, the G-4, Motor Transport, Engineer, Embarkation, Supply, and Ordnance Officers inspected the 3d Battalion, 12th Marines and 1st Battalion, 4th Marines during the month of September.
- (3) Major R. G. KENNEDY was assigned to the Division Ordnance Section to be the relief for LtCol M. S. EDMUNDS as the Division Ordnance Officer.
- (i) In order to sid in the overall logistic effort during major operations, IstLt W. W. DUNIAP was assigned as G-1: Limison Officer to Task Force Hotel for Operation Scotland II/Nanking.
- (5) On 23 September 1968, the bridge spaning the Song Cam Lo River at Cam Lo Village was destroyed due to a trepical storm. A ferry was placed into service the following day. Further, a flexible pipeline was installed to enable resupply of PCL. Construction of a transom trestle bridge class 30/10, 353 feet in length, was completed on 1 October 1968.
- (6) On 28 September 1968, a fire started at approximately 1345 in the immediate area of the Cus Viet hard ramp. No Marine casualties nor loss of equipment was incurred. However, Navy casualties included one dead, two missing, and six medevacs. In addition the following equipment was lost; three FBR's, one APMI barge, two Skimmer boats, all buildings, and their contents located on the pier.

- (1) The 9th Motor Transport Battalion drove 36,585 miles transporting 4,878 short tons of cargo and 18,225 personnel.

- e. Food Services. During the month of September 1968, the 3d Marine Division Food Services Program consisted of 51 operational messes supported by his OF and 33 Personnel. Of the total messes in operation, 27 are semi-permenant field messes housed in TFSC structures and the remaining 2h are temporary field messes. Substituence support provided Army, Navy and Marine Corps personnel of this account averaged 33,382 rations daily. Approximately 25% of the total mations fed daily consisted of Meal, Combat, Individual and approximately 75% were subsisted on the Expeditionary Force Menn. The Expeditionary Force Menu is based on MCO P10110.17. Chapter 4. The Marine Corps Expeditionary Force Menu (Tropic) and both perishable and non-perishable components are utilized. The Meal, Combat, Individual is utilized only where operational requirements preclude serving Expeditionary Force Menu.
- f. Supply. The overall supply support received by the 3d Marine Division was satisfactory, however, some items became or continued to be critical. The following items of supply were critical as of the end of the month:

Problem Areas

General

The most significant problems confronting the Division are the T/E shortages, high deadline rate, and shortages of 2nd Echelon repair/component parts in Engineer Equipment. The lack of response to these problems has caused the 3d and 11th Engineer Battalions and the 3d Shore Party Battalion to be in a degraded CREQP status.

b. Services

Laundry facilities continue to improve, however, an unacceptable number of personnel still must rely on Vietnamese laundry facilities. Ice continues to be marginal at both Quang Tri and Vandegrift Combat Bases.


Although the number of generators presently on hand in the Division is in excess of allowances; those on-hand are for the most part in field maintenance (3d/hth Echelon) shops, and/or in the rebuild program. The high deadline rate seriously hampers the Division's ability to provide adequate power to forward areas. Only 37% of the general service (20, 30, 60m, 60cycle) generators on-hand are operationally ready.

d. External Maintenance Support

A major factor in the high deadline rate is related to equipment evacuated to field maintenance facilities. The time frame in which items of equipment are returned to the user from the maintenance cycle is not responsive to meet the demands of the Division.

DIVISION ENGINEER

- 1. The 3d Marine Division received engineer support from a Division and Force engineer Battation and two Naval construction Battations during September. Maintenance and utilities support was also furnished by CBMU-301 at bong Ha, Quang Tri, Cua Viet, and FOB vanderrift. Map coordinates below are taken from MAP: Vietnam, AMS Series L7014, Sheets 6442III, 6442II, and 6342I. Major engineer projects included:
- a. Maintenance/Upgracing of Route #1. Route #1 remained open to traffic within the Division AO during September except for two days 7Sep60 and 24Sep60 caused by two tropical storms. Upgrading of Route #1 to MACV standards continued. Down graded cement being utilized to hold shoulders in during monsoon season. 20,700 tons of asphalt placed to date.
- b. Maintenance of Route #501. The lith Engineers continue the upgrade of Route #501, 75% complete. H-0 bridge completed 20Sep68 at C-2. Additionally Class 60, 5 float reinforced ferry put in operation by 1st Bde, 5th Inf Div (Mech.) from 43-30 September 1960 at YD118604.
- c. Bridges and Culverts. A transom trestle at coordinates YDO20562 installed by the lith Engineers is open to all class of 30/40 traffic, abutments were reinforced. Installation of a 353 foot transom trestle bridge completed at coordinates YDD148604 open to Class 40 traffic. In addition routine maintenance of bridges and culverts was accomplished during September.

4. Military Construction. Construction continues at VCB to include strongbacks, heads, and bunkers. Existing facilities at Dong Ha and Quang Tri are being maintained.

5. Base Development

- a. Construction in the Division AO was essentially limited to continuation of the MER construction of heads, showers, messhalls and troop billets.
- b. DHCB: Renovation of the Dong Ha ASP is about 85% complete. Construction of MER heads and showers was completed for DHCB.
- c. QTCB: Work began on the 2d increment of the ASP. The access road to Camp Red Devil is 60% complete. MER heads were completed, as were 500-man messhalls for the 3d Engr Bn and for the 3d Tank Bn and a 250-man messhall for the 3d SP Bn. Approximately 650 SEA Huts were completed for 3d MarDiv units.
- d. Vandegrift FOB: Construction started on 5-100 man messhalls. Sixteen strongbacks were completed at Ca Lu and 24 were completed at Vandegrift FOB.



 - 1 company in direct combat support of 9th Marines



- c. Camp J. J. Carroll, Thon Son Lam, and Vandegrift remain as "planned" Duel Blade sites until nigner headquarters approves III MAF and in turn Third MarDiv's plan to apprade all nine (9) existing Duel Blade sites plus the three (3) newly proposed to second generation (steel and concrete) full Duel Blade status.
- d. Well sunk at A-1 with drilling continuing at A-4 and C-1 operations commencing.
- e. Three major briefings were held explaining this Division's second generation plans to nigher headquarters. UCAR (ground stabalizer) experimentation has begun by MCB-7 for a sandbag substitute.
- f. Problems incurred during the month included fighting bunker flooding due to large entrance way water pooling areas. The need continues to exist for more sandbags/culvert/revetting material from Duel Blade sources to reduce entrance way areas and or equipment trenchers for drainage ditches. Longer pickets and more chain link are required to increase maximum usage due to increased 25 ft fence to bunker APG 7 distance. Second generation living and functional bunker design must have "to ground level entrances" similar to first generation and thusly preventing monsoon flooding. If bunker remains as designed to date the same problems will result as are now occurring with present second generation fighting bunkers. The 7,500 pound slope parapets continue to settle due to poor compaction, high psi and lack of footings. All future parapets will require timber footings.
- g. September tropical storm damage caused no significant structural damages to first generation facilities; however, sandbag deterioration greatly increased and 60-70 per cent of all second generation fighting bunkers filled with water.

CIVIL AFFAIRS

1. Revolutionary Development

- a. Pacification progress reached a high mark this September with the Viet Cong Infrastructure eliminations, since 1 January 1968, passing the 500 mark. A project to bring the government permanently to some 11,000 persons living in the Street Without Joy area of the Province, entered Phase I of Operation Fisher. Accordingly, recommendations were made for in-depth training of district and village chiefs in public administration. RF/PF forces conducted a total of 450 night ambushes and patrols under close DSA's, MAT's and CAP's supervision. Enemy initiated activity remained low throughout September, while pacification activities continued without interference.
- b. Revolutionary Development activities increased in September while the number of types of popular organizations continued to expand. The number of completed "self-help" projects (420) moved closer to Quang Tri's national record (574) of last year. The administration of self-help and the self-help inspecting committee of the RD Council was very good. Several RD Cadre Groups were moved to new hamlets to render considerable aid in recovery from two floods.


2. Division Civil Affairs Activities

- a. Agriculture. The Quang Tri Province Farmers Association Chief and the Trieu Phong Farmers Association Chief purchased 20 rice threshers for 65,000 \$VN from G-5. Rice threshing is increased by 30% with the aid of these machines.
- b. Scholarship Program. Seven students are presently on scholarships and attending school in Quang Tri City. By the end of the school year, G-5 has plans for supporting 123 additional students.

c. Personal Response Program

1. Two Personal Response Courses were held during September. The 19th PR Course was held on 21 September 1968 consisting of 5 hours of instruction to 26 NCOs. The 20th PR Course was held on 24-25 September 1968 consisting of 5½ hours of instruction and a 3 hour tour of Quang Tri City. Seven SNCOs and 9 officers attended this course.





- 2. A total of 6½ hours of field instruction was presented by the Personal Response NCO during the month of September to the SNCO Leadership School and 4th CAG. A total of 64 NCOs and enlisted attended these presentations.
- d. MedCaps/DentCaps. A total of 14,800 VN civilians were treated by the 3d Marine Division units at MedCaps and DentCaps during the month of September 1968.
- e. Mid-Autumn Festival. The 3d Marine Division, G-5, prepared 22,000 bags of favors for the festival. Components from these bags included 22,000 Teen-E-Racers issued by III MAF G-5 and 40,000 cookies, 65,000 pieces of candy, 1,000 masks and 4,000 balloons purchased by 3d Marine Division G-5 in Hue and Quang Tri City. In addition, 3d Marine Division G-5 paid for the purchase of 5,000 bags of prepackaged festival favors at a cost of 150,000 \$VN in Danang. A total of 32,912 toys and favors were distributed by 3d Marine Division G-5, for the festival throughout Quang Tri Province. The Province Senior Advisor (PSA), Quang Tri, was given 10,500 of these favors to distribute to District Chiefs; 4th CAG was given 4,500 favors.

3. Civic Action Projects

- a. Trieu Phong District. Four telephone poles were delivered to Trieu Phong to serve as a reliable foot-bridge between Quang Tri City and Trieu Phong District, with the oncoming monsoon floods.
- b. Nham Bieu Hamlet. A project was initiated by G-5 whereby representatives of Nham Bieu Hamlet collect scrap wood on a weekly basis from the Quang Tri Trash Dump to build and improve their homes.
- c. 3d Marine Division Memorial Children's Hospital (Dong Ha Facility). During September 1968, a total of 416 inpatients and 1,242 outpatients were treated.
- d. Dong Ha City Hospital. Final repairs are being completed on the hospital and MCB-7 has installed a large capacity water pump, plumbing and wiring system. G-5, 108th Group, has scheduled doctors for daily visits to the hospital.
- e. School Repairs. G-5 assisted the 8th AA Platoon, in purchasing 300 sheets of tin for roofs for the following 8 Schools in Quang Tri Province; Gia De, Nham Bieu, Van Van,



Trung Xa, Truong Van, Cu Hoan, Tan Truong and Thuong Xa.

f. <u>Vinh Dai School</u>. Plans have been made for the construction of a school in Vinh Dai Hamlet by MCB-7. Funds for the school were provided by the Foremost-Mc Kesson Dairy Association to G-5 for such a school.

g. 3d Marine Division Brick Factory. With the opening of the factory on 18 September, 3,636 bricks were produced by the end of the month. An estimated 550 bricks are presently being produced daily.

3. PREVENTIVE MEDICINE/SANITATION:


The first contingent of indigeous food-service employees was hired to work in the Dong Ha Combat Base food-service establishments. Pre-employment and periodic food-handler examinations are being conducted.

4. DISEASE:

Third Marine Division personnel admitted to the Sick List by the Division Psychiatrist with a psychiatric diagnosis were 70. A total of 171 patients were seen, 28 were evacuated, 95 were returned to duty, 16 were recommended for administrative discharges, and five remain on the Sick List.

A total of 126 cases of illness classified under the category of venereal diseases were reported in the Division during the month of September, 1968. There were 123 cases of genorrhea, 3 cases of non-specific urethritis and no cases of either chancroid or apphilis.

There were 180 cases of confirmed malaria.



NARR TIVE SUMMARY

The 3d Dental Company provides dental support throughout the TAOR of the 3d Marine Division to personnel of the Division. In addition, it provides dental prosthetic treatment to Navy personnel of NSA and MCB units in the TAOR. A bunkered dental facility became operational at Vandegrift Combat Base on 21 September 1968, manned by one dental officer and two dental technicians. Construction of a major Tental facility in the Quang Tri battalion rears area is nearing completion and is expected to be operational in October. Dental prosthetics care is provided at "D" Medical Company in Dong Ha and Division OP clinic at Quang Tri. Assistance to Graves Registration is provided in identification of the dead. Dental company personnel provide support to the Marines Memorial Children's Hospital. Force Dental Officers, III M.F and FMTPac visited Company facilities during the month. Third Dental Company support at III MAF facilities was discontinued upon promulation of a III WAF dental officer billet on 30 September 1968.
