



PROBLEM:

Updating Appendix 6 (Severe Weather Plan) to Annex Q (Administration and Logistics) to LOI 1-67.

DISCUSSION:

The XXIV Corps Op Plan 17-68 (Typhoon/Tropical Storm Contingency Plan) delineates a number of service support missions to counter the effects of severe weathers A number of these support requirements are indicated in our present Appendix 6. However, XXIV Corps! Op Plan 17-68 covers several additional areas of service support as indicated by the G-L's action brief. It is agreed that these points should be corrected regardless of the format of the Appendix 6. Is not recommended that Appendix 6 be deleted from the LOI, but that it be updated instead to agree with XXIV Corps Op Plan 17-68. The format of that of an Op Plan is a convenient metra to convey information but is not necessarily solely confined to tactical operations. The fact is any supporting documents in support of an operational plan or order will use the operational format unless it is obvious that this format will not be satisfactory. Examples can be found in the LOI where a number of staff sections other than G-3 have used the operation order/plan format.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

- 1. That the Appendix 6 (Severe Weather Flan) to Annex Q (Administration and Logistics) to LOI 1-67 be updated in accordance with XXIV Corps Op Plan 17-68.
- 2. That the G-4 prepare the appendix as required since the requirement is that of service support.

ERIEF ON KHE SANH AREA AND VIETNAMESE SALIENT

This brief provides the current enemy situation, weather, and terrain for the Vietnamese Salient and area along Route 9 from Ca Lu to the Laction Border, including the Khe Sanh area.

#### ENEMY SITUATION:

No current positive unit identifications are held for the area of interest. Units most recently known to eperate in the area have been (1) 246th Independent Regt, (2) 88th Regt, 308th Div, (3) the 83d Engineering Regt. The 68th Artillery Regt was suspected to be located in Lacs, but was never confirmed. Last contact with the 246th Independent Regt, which operated in the Khe Sanh vicinity, was en 27 July 68. Reperts of activity and sensor returns have only indicated the presence of large treep units in the Khe Sanh area. A PW report, dated 7 July 68, is the latest evidence of the 88th Regt, 308th Div operating in the area. A PW report, dated 7 June 68, provided the last positive evidence of the 63d Engineering Regt operating in the Vietnamese Salient.

During early Summer 68, shell reports from Khe Sanh Combat Base lecated an estimated artillery regiment in Lacs, probably in vicinity of Co Rec Mtn. No recent evidence of the unit's location has been obtained. At present, 246th Independent Regt; 88th Regt, 308th Div; 83d Engineer Regt and 68th Artillery Regt are carried as unlocated due to lack of contact. No identification has been made of a command headquarters superior to units known to have operated in the area, but suberdinate to the Hanci High Command. Presently, the enemy may be using the area for legistic and infiltration routes to 7th Front, MRTTH, and 4 Shau Valley.

The area could be reinforced from several directions within a 48 to 72 hour period. Reinforcing units, their direction of approach, and strengths are: (1) 48th, 52nd and 64th Regts/320th Div from the north (DMZ area) w/8,200;(2) elements of 7th Front from the east (Base Areas 101 and 114) w/2,295; (3) 102nd Regt from the west (Iaos) w/1,850; and 4) 6th, 9th, 29th and 90th Regts from the south (Base Area 611 and A Shau Valley Area) W/6,500. This totals 29 to 31 combat maneuver battalions with an estimated strength of 19,195 men.

The NWA is reported to have aircraft and maintain airfields in lacs.

UFO's have been reported in the Khe Sanh Area. The enemy has not employed aircraft in a tactical role within the area of interest. In the past, the the enemy has employed CS and incapacitating agents. But/no recent evidence has been received indicating intended use of CS agents within or adjacent to the area of interest although numerous enemy gas masks have been found in the area. The enemy is considered capable of possessing and delivering CS or incapacitating agents.

#### WEATHER.

During the first two weeks of October, most precipitation should occur in occasional afternoon rainshowers. After mid-October, precipitation will decrease sharply as the northeast monsoon prevails. Western mountain slopes will receive less precipitation than eastern slopes. Geilings below 1,000 feet will be rare after mid-October. Surface visibility will be 5 miles or greater, except during early morning fog. Surface winds will generally flow from the north at 04 knots during October mornings and from the northeast at 10 knots during the afternoon. The mean high temperature will be 85° F, mean low temperature 67° F.

TERRAIN:

Terrain is a generally rugged mountainous area covered by thick vegetation. In the Vietnamese Salient, vegetation is primarily brushwoods consisting of tall grass, bushes, and secondary shimble Throughout the northern section of the salient, areas of multi-layered canopy forest and/light single canopy undergrowth with bamboo are found. Along Route 9 and in the Khe Sanh area, vegetation primarily consists of multi-layered heavy undergrowth forest with bamboo. Movement corridors in mountainous regions are severely channelized by extremely rugged terrain with dense undergrowth forest. Cross-country movement is limited to foot troops, and then only along existing trails, stream valleys or ridgelines. Routes 9 and 926 are capable of handling vehicular traffic, however, interdictions may be encountered along both roads. Units utilizing corridors will be highly susceptable to ambush. The western half of the Vietnamese Salient is fair to poor for foot movement during the wet season, while eastern halfits poor to unsuited for foot movement. Overlay #3 depicts major trails the enemy probably utilizes. CONCLUSIONS:

- 1. The optimum weather period for operations in this area is approaching (mid-Oct to Feb).
  - 2. The enemy will probably avoid major contacts whenever possible.
- 3. Enemy offensive action will probably be limited to attacks by fire and small unit ground assaults.
- 4. The enemy will take every possible advantage of Allied troop movements to employ mines and booby traps/thus inflicting casualties on Allied personnel with a minimum of risk to his own personnel.

1. Purpose. To promulgate information and guidance relative to preparation for typhoons and heavy weather within I CTZ.

#### 2. Background

- a. Reference (a) currently under revision, contains information as to the general characteristics of the severe weather and flooding conditions which are likely to occur in the I Corps Tactical Zone, and establishes a system for timely warning to all U. S. units therein.
- b. Reference (b) provides policy and guidance for participation in natural disaster relief by units of III MAF, other FWMAF and U. S. Government Agencies in I Corps Tactical Zone.
- c. Enclosures (1) through (h) contain information, based on lessons learned, which is expected to be helpful to commanders at all levels. It is emphasized that such a list is by no means all-inclusive, nor should this instruction be construed as an intrusion on the responsibilities and prerogatives of commanders to take appropriate measures to safeguard lives and property under their charge.



3. Action. Commanders at all levels are enjoined to take all timely and prudent precautions in preparation for heavy weather.

#### OPERATIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

- 1. Effect on Readiness. Rain, high winds and floods associated with monscons and typhoons/tropical storms degrade readiness and combat effectiveness. They cause increasing difficulties to movement, and increasing likelihood of non-battle injury to personnel and loss/damage to vital equipment and supplies. To lessen the disruptive effect, commanders should:
- a. Make contingency plans based on predictable conditions which affect the enemy as well as ourselves. Example: Floods.
- b. Review techniques for gathering intelligence during relatively short periods of floods, and breaks in the weather.
- c. Ensure thorough understanding by subordinate commanders of the effects of heavy rain and typhoon conditions on movement, control and communications, troop safety and efficiency, intelligence gathering, protection of equipment, and resupply.
- d. Provide guidance to subordinate commands to counter the effects of typhoons and heavy weather.
  - e. Commence preparation well ahead of the monsoon season.

#### 2. Precautionary Measures


- a. The inability to transport men and supplies with regularity restricts the size of the operating area and the distance from the supply point where units may operate. To counter this situation, several moves may be indicated.
- (1) Establish OP'S and fire support bases on lower ground so as to observe impacts and permit resupply by air under reduced visibility. Mountain-top bases normally become fog-shrouded.
- (2) Shorten lines of supply. Since overland resupply may prove difficult or impossible, and air may not be able to operate for significant periods, outlying bases should be moved closer to land or water LOC's, and stock levels increased.
- (3) Rotate infantry units to fire bases. Sustained operations in wet conditions lower troop efficiency. Frequent rotation to some location where troops can get relatively dry will help.
- b. The effects of heavy rains on soil trafficability, cross country movement, and ground and air operations will vary depending on the terrain in local operating areas. Regardless of area, however, high water will often cause damage to roads, bridges and culverts. Route reconnaissance is mandatory under these conditions. There are

three basically different operating areas in ICTZ. They are:

- (1) Coastal Plains Region. During the northeast monsoon and during typhoons most of the region will be flooded. An overlay showing flooded areas is contained in Annex A to this Enclosure. Movement by foot will be five to six times slower than during the dry season. Water in flooded rice paddies is about 1.5 meters deep, over ankle-deep mud. Walking on dikes permits more rapid movement, and APC's can usually negotiate this terrain. Streams, rivers and canals are too deep to be forded, however. As a result of typhoons, flooding will be even higher. High seas and swells dam the estuaries of the drainage channels causing the channels to rise and flood the lowlands. In contrast, trafficability improves over sand when it is wet. This region experiences heavy cloud coverage about twenty days each month, with visibility It to 6 miles. Minimum visibility occurs in early morning.
- (2) Piedmont Region (low hills). Because of good water drainage, movement remains relatively unrestricted. The ground becomes very slippery, however, slowing movement. With the rains, more streams will be encountered. Visibility is restricted due to rain and fog. The heaviest rain is from August to October, slackening during November. Low ceilings (less than 1000 ft) and visibility of less than lt miles during early mornings will restrict heavy weapons and close air support, as well as resupply by air. APC's and other tracked vehicles may take five or six times as long to traverse the area.
- (3) Highlands Region (mountains). The rainfall pattern is similar to the Piedmont region. Numerous streams are generated by the rain. Ceilings below 1000 ft. are common in the night and early morning hours, often remaining low throughout the day. Restricted visibility persists in the morning and occasionally throughout the day. Except over all-weather roads, vehicular traffic will stop.
- 3. Effect on Alertness. Poor visibility affords both friendly and enemy with concealment. For this reason, listening posts and surveillance means, assume greater importance. Personnel should be rotated more frequently to maintain a high state of alertness.
- 4. Effects on Safety and Speed of Movement. Flooding and heavy rains increase the likelihood of battle casualties from drowning, falls, cave-ins, immersion-foot and the like. These safeguards tend to slow movement, but are necessary
  - a. Ropes should be used when crossing streams.
  - b. Minimum personnel should be on bridges at any given time.
- c. Personnel should use caution when climbing, descending and driving.
- d. Caution should be exercised around electrical leads and outlets. ENCLOSURE (1)



- e. Troops should stop frequently to dry feet, etc.
- 5. Effect on the Enemy. Flooding creates problems for the enemy too. It drives him out from underground and causes him to seek refuge in villages. If he remains on "island" high ground, he can be surrounded and captured or destroyed. A part of nearly every day of the monsoon season can be used for aerial reconnaissance to spot him.

#### 6. Traffic control

- a. Commands responsible for AU's will need to inform traffic control and Armed Forces Police in their areas of the following:
  - (1) Expected force of winds.
  - (2) Expected amount of precipitation.
  - (3) Expected direction of the storm.
  - (4) Locations of blocked streets (downed trees, wire, etc.).
  - (5) Location of washouts in roads, culverts, and flooded streets.
  - (6) Location of wrecked vehicles and other obstructions.
- b. As weather conditions change, and driving conditions become dangerous, driving should be restricted to main arteries insofar as possible, and only essential driving permitted.
- 7. <u>Intelligence Collection</u>. Emphasis should be placed on ground surveillance assets, to include Hoi Chanhs and PW's during weather which negates the use of aerial means. Immediately after a storm, aerial means should be used to the maximum as the enemy attempts to regain his previously occupied lowland areas from the hinterland mountains, and populated areas.
- ANNEX A: (Overlay) Areas of Likely Flooding During Typhoons and Heavy Rainfall.
  - NOTE: Parallel hatching covers those areas normally subject to flooding during monsoons.

    Crossed hatching covers those areas where flooding is occasional, usually as a result of a typhoon.

#### LOGISTICS CONSIDERATIONS

1. Protection of Equipment and Material. The following type efforts are suggested:

#### a. Trucks

- (1) Not expected to be operated:
- (a) When trucks are not expected to be operated, canvas, loose seats, gas cans and other unsecured items should be stowed in an area best suited to prevent loss or unnecessary damage.
  - (b) Windshields should be lowered.
- (2) When trucks are to be kept readily available for operation, bed canvas should be removed and cab tops of 3/4 ton and larger trucks properly installed with door glass operable and slightly vented. Windshield wipers should work and canvas on 1/4 ton vehicles should be removed.
- (3) If prime movers are not available for trailers, this type equipment should be secured to heavy objects or other equipment. A 6-foot picket driven firmly in the ground with top bent may be used to secure equipment with rope and chain. Circling of vehicles not expected to be operated is a suitable protective method. This is accomplished by selecting the best area available for protection from the storm and resultant flooding and parking the smaller trailers in the center surrounded by larger trailers, then by smaller vehicles with the larger vehicles around the outside perimeter. The latter vehicles may be utilized as required. Several small groups of vehicles are frequently more appropriate.
- (4) Sand bags may be used to add additional weight to STATIC/NONMOVING light equipment.

#### b. Tentage

- (1) If available, a sandbag wall should be erected around each tent and the wall of the tent should be fortified with 6 or 8 foot pickets.
  - (2) All tent ropes should be secured by serviceable tent pegs,
- (3) The erection of drying tents in platoon and company sise patrol bases is an excellent accommodation when the tactical situation permits. Yukon stoves can provide ample heat for drying clothes and warming personnel.


#### c. Generators

- (1) Each generator should be placed on a wooden pallet with a sandbag wall circling the generator. Overhead cover may be secured with sandbags.
- (2) Electrical wires should be placed underground where possible and when suitable conduit is used.

#### d. Weapons and Small Arms Ammunition

- (1) Small arms, magazines and crew served weapons should be cleaned and inspected on a daily basis.
- (2) Weapons should be lubricated and oiled to the extent required to prevent rust and corrosion. Excessive lubrication and oil in the operating mechanisms will permit the accumulation of dirt, sand, etc., thereby causing malfunctions and sluggishness in weapon operation.
- (3) Mortar tubes should be capped at all times unless actually being used in the conduct of fire missions. Prior to the conduct of fire missions, the tube should be visually inspected for the presence of water.
- (4) Small arms and machine gun ammunition should be carried in waterproof metal ammunition cans until required for use. Machine gun ammunition will met be carried draped across the body, "Poncho Villa" style. In addition, ammunition should be removed from magazines, cleaned and wiped dry as required.
- (5) The moisture seal on packing containers of mortar ammunition should not be broken open until actually required for use to prevent moisture contamination of propellent increments. Increments contaminated by moisture will result in short rounds with probable friendly casualties.
- (6) Firing mechanisms of 3.5 inch rocket launchers should be tested daily to ensure that electrical firing mechanisms (magnetos) are in operable condition.
- (7) Shotgun ammunition should be inspected daily and those cases exhibiting swelling due to moisture contamination disposed of as Grade III ammunition.
- (8) Care should be exercised that hand grenades of all types are not accidently lost in mud in and around fighting holes, bunkers and cantonments. These lost items will represent a hazard to personnel walking through the area. Further, all types of ammunition and explosive devices that are lost and not recovered, provide the enemy with an excellent supply source for future operations.

e. Showers. All locally constructed showers should be checked for stability. Showers should be taken down or secured with rope and stakes.

#### 2. Flood Control Measures

- a. Construction of living/fighting/administrative bunkers should be examined prior to and following storms to ensure stability and reliability for the safety of the troops. (See enclosure (3)).
- b. Ditching to provide proper drainage is important in all areas, but especially in messhall and latrine areas to ensure that such drainage is properly diverted away from quarters and food preparation/wash rack areas.
- c. Equipment and food stores should be stored eff the ground. Proper and secure overhead cover is important.
- d. Units operating messes and drawing subsistence supplies from ration issue points should ensure that vehicles have adequate protection for the transportation of subsistence items.
- e. Supplies, equipment and repair parts should be stowed in water proof wrapping and kept in areas receiving good protection from storm damage.
- f. Vehicle Operators. Vehicle operators should be instructed and frequently cautioned concerning the hazardous conditions frequently encountered when driving during storm conditions.

#### 3. Medical (Personnel)

- a. All personnel should wear dry socks in order to prevent immersion foot. Wet socks when carried next to the body under outer clothing soon dry to a satisfactory degree. At least 1-2 pairs of socks should be in a plastic bag.
- b. Lightweight gloves should be utilized for trench digging because wet and puffed hands will get extremely raw under daily abuse.
  - c. Feet should be aired at least 1 hour per day.

#### 4. Modical

- a. Immunisation of civilians in flooded/flooding areas is authorized.
- b. Commands should continue to stress malaria chemoprophylaxis and personal protective measures from mosquitoes. Malaria is still a hasard in cool monsoon weather.
- c. Command emphasis should continue on required immunisations, especially for plague, cholers and typhoid. Chances of contacting

plague, cholera, typhoid and infectious hepatitis increase in monsoon weather, thus increasing the need for gamma globulin prophylaxis.

- d. Commanders should be prepared to evacuate patients to other medical facilities outside the storm danger area, and maintain a MedEvac capability for all others.
- e. Medical units should make maximum use of ground ambulances in their areas of operation.

#### 5. Material and Services

- a. Water. Supplemental resupply points should be established and operated as required.
- b. In the event troops are unable to utilize their regular mess, displaced troops will eat in the nearest U.S. Forces mess facility.
- c. Air Drop. Air drop may be utilised for resupply as weather permits, IAW MACV Dir 55-4.
- d. Selected monsoon materials are force-fed to units according to operating commitments. It is mandatory that all possible steps be taken to reclaim and preserve monsoon materials. Separate instructions and reporting procedures have been promulgated concerning proper repacking and care of these critical items. CG III MAF SpdLtr on the subject, dated 17Mar68, refers.
- e. Commanders should store a minimum of 48 hours! supply of water upon notification of an approaching storm.
- f. Waterproofing materials from incoming shipments should be used to best advantage.
- 6. Ammunition Storage. A minimum loss of ammunition both in ASP's and on-position storage sites can be ensured only through initiative and judgement on the part of individuals and commanders at all levels. The following are to serve as guidelines for the storage of ammunition.
- a. Ammunition should be stored above the expected high water level that may be created by monsoon rains.
- b. Adequate drainage should be provided ammunition stacks to ensure that the bottom level is not submerged in water or mud during prolonged wet periods.
- c. Proper drainage should be provided for on-position storage bunkers and dug-in modules.
- d. The minimum quantity of ready ammunition should be broken out ENCLOSURE (2)



of its packing containers and stored on-position. This ammunition should be protected in every way possible from the elements.

- e. Corrective action should be taken by all concerned to correct any unsatisfactory conditions.
- f. Commanders should inspect on-position assets of ammunition daily to ensure that unsatisfactory conditions are rectified.
- 7. Reports. The following types of events should be reported to the next higher command:
  - a. Cargo deliveries and reason for any delay.
  - b. Water level in flooded areas.
  - c. Road conditions (to include washouts, slides, soft spots, flooding).
  - d. Abutment failures/bridge washouts.
  - e. Culverts damaged or washed out.
  - f. Bunker conditions.
  - g. Generators damaged or destroyed.
  - h. Equipment lost, destroyed, or damaged.
- i. Stock levels of all classes of supply. Ensure all shortages are reported in days of supply.

#### ENGINEER CONSIDERATIONS

#### 1. Engineer Resources

- a. General. Engineer resources utilized to supplement routine unit preparations for typhoons and heavy weather will normally be those organic, attached, or in direct support of major commands subordinate to III Marine Amphibious Force. These resources should be used to the maximum before requesting additional engineer support.
- b. Engineer resources within the I Corps Tactical Zone <u>not</u> in the categories cited in the preceding paragraph are generally under control of the Commanding General, III Marine Amphibious Force (CG, III MAF), or the Commander, Naval Forces Vietnam, Representative, Danang (COMNAVFORV REP Danang), or Commander, Naval Support Activity (COM NSA). Requests for engineer support by these forces are submitted to this Headquarters for evaluation, approval, and appropriate tasking.
- c. Technical guidance not involving the commitment of engineer forces, equipment, or materials required in the accomplishment of typhoon and heavy weather preparations may be provided on a direct liaison basis with engineer units located in the general vicinity of the unit requiring such assistance. For this purpose, a listing of these engineer units by geographical area is set forth as follows:

- (4) Construction Battalion Maintenance Unit 301 (CBMU-301) (USN) maintains detachments at Dong Ha, Quang Tri, and An Hoa.
- (5) NSA Public Works Activities are located in Chu Lai, Danang, Phu Bai, Quang Tri, and Dong Ha.

#### 2. Roads

- a. While upkeep of roads is primarily an engineer function, at times it may not be possible for engineers to cope with all adverse conditions. This is especially true during the monsoon and tropical storm season. At such times all units should render assistance in maintaining roads within their respective areas, particularly secondary, access and interior roads. In addition, even under normal conditions, all units are responsible for filling potholes and maintaining local drainage on roads through and adjacent to their areas.
- b. Such internal road net maintenance and repair include all measures designed to keep the road surface, shoulders, ditches, slopes, and drainage structures in a serviceable condition. Some of these essential maintenance duties include:

- (1) Cleaning out drainage facilities such as ditches and culverts. This includes removing all debris, rocks, and accumulated silt, sand, and earth in order to allow maximum drainage flow.
- (2) Mowing or cutting grass or weeds in or around drainage structures.
  - (3) Repairing minor washouts and potholes and washboarding.
- ( $l_i$ ) Keeping road shoulders properly shaped and clear of debris.
- (5) Conducting frequent thorough inspections of road conditions, reporting to higher headquarters any need for repair work beyond the unit's capabilities.
- c. Additional traffic control may be required on roadways that are severely rutted or otherwise damaged during periods of water saturation. Limiting such roads to only essential traffic permits use of the roadway for a longer period before major repairs have to be effected and the passage of traffic becomes severely impeded.

#### Facilities

a. General. All unit/base/facilities commanders should conduct a program of continuous inspection, maintenance, and repair of structural facilities within their respective areas of responsibility, to ensure that these facilities will withstand typhoons and heavy weather and to minimize the magnitude of protective measures that must be accomplished upon receipt of a storm warning. Self-help programs should be utilized to the maximum degree possible.

#### b. Buildings and Other Structures

- (1) Periodic inspections for structural failures, damage, or other potentially hazardous conditions should be made.
  - (2) Repairs should be effected expeditiously.
- (3) Plans should be prepared and adequate drainage ditches, culverts, and berms constructed as required.
- (4) Roofing materials (tiles, sheeting, etc), windows, shutters and doorways should be secured.
  - (5) All debris within and around the camp areas should be removed.
- (6) Waterproofing materials, such as plastics, canvas, and roofing tars should be employed whenever available.

(7) Loose items that may be notential hazards in high winds and/or flooding should be secured.

#### c. Maintenance and Storage Areas


- (1) Maintenance and storage areas should be properly constructed to permit rapid water run-off during heavy rains.
- (2) Proper drainage facilities around and leading away from these areas should be installed and maintained.
- (3) Consistent with the availability of materials, commanders should strive to stabilize parking, working, and storage areas and protective berms with petroleum products, crushed rock, or other suitable materials.
- d. Field Fortifications. Particular emphasis should be placed upon the proper construction and maintenance of shelters, trenches, where, observation towers, and other such field fortifications as may become hazards to personnel safety during heavy storms. FM-5-15, "Field Fortifications" and other similar publications set forth proper procedures and techniques for construction. Improper construction and inadequate waterproofing has proven to be the most significant cause of failure due to collapsing and flooding. Set forth in the following subparagraphs are some "check-off" items pertaining to sandagging, bunkers, and towers that, if utilized, may help to prevent damage or failure due to heavy storms.

#### (1) Sandbagging

- (a) Sandbags should be filled to only about 3/4 capacity.
- (b) Sandbag revetment face should have at least a 1 to 4 slope.
- (c) Sandbags should be placed so that the planes between layers have the same pitch as the foundation, i.e., at right angles to the slope of the revetment, with the side seams on the stretchers, and choked ends on headers, turned toward the revetted face.
- (d) The bottom row of sandbags should always be placed as headers.
- (e) Additional rows should be alternate rows of stretchers and headers with joints broken between courses.
- (f) Inspection and replacement of rotted or ruptured bars should be a continuing task.

#### (2) Bunkers

- (a) Footings should be adequate to carry the load of the completed bunker including earth fill or sand bag cover. If excessive settling has occurred, the bunker should be reconstructed.
- (b) Drainage, both exterior and interior, should be adequate to prevent flooding during periods of heavy rain.
- (c) Where there is evidence of dry rot, noticeable bows or bulges, excessive weather checking or other indications that timbers or sheathing may be of substandard quality, the bunker should be reconstructed using proper materials.
- (d) Cuts should be square and joints of structural members should fit properly.
- (e) Drift pirs of the length required by the specifications should be used.
  - (f) Bracing should be adequate.
- (g) Retaining walls should be included for all entrance ways.
- (h) Roofing paper or similar material should be used as a moisture barrier.
  - (i) Structural members should be properly fastened.
- (j) Posts should be large enough and properly spaced to carry the load of the roof and sandbags.
- (k) Stringers or roof joists of the proper size should be used and spaced correctly to carry the roof load.
- (1) Adequate sandbagging or earth fill should be provided on the sides and roof.
  - (m) Apertures, if required, should be properly placed.
- (n) If damaged by enemy action, repairs should be effected expeditiously.

#### (3) Towers

- (a) Towers should be checked for evidence of splitting or cracking of structural members or bracing.
  - (b) All structural members should be bolted.





- (c) If the tower is leaning, it should be replaced.
- (d) If the decking is not level, the tower should be checked to determine the cause.
- (e) If there is any evidence of erosion that could affect the structural soundness of the tower immediate repairs should be made.
- (f) Ladders should be checked for safety. All steps should be secure.
- (g) Any damage by enemy action should be repaired exreditiously.

#### 4. Reports

- a. Recurring failures in structures of standard or emproved design should be reported to this Headquarters through normal command channels in order that necessary modifications or redesign may be accomplished.
- b. Any observations of inadequate drainage or possible failure of bridges, culverts, by-passes, etc. on roads other than local access and internal came roads should be reported as expeditiously as possible through command operational channels in accordance with current directives.





#### COMMUNICATIONS CONSIDERATIONS

#### 1. Radio

- a. All units should be prepared to switch to radio nets and come up on the designated nets in their senior's communication plan in the event of cable and wire communications systems failure.
- b. There should be an adequate supply of batteries on hand for portable radios.
- c. An adequate supply of waterproofing equipment should be on hand.
- d. All communications equipment that may be exposed to the weather should be waterproofed, including equipment used indoors where leaking and flooding is possible.
- e. Turing heavy weather, antenna guy wires and stakes should be checked hourly.
- f. Large radio antennas should be taken down prior to the onset of high winds, if they can be replaced by short tactical antennas.
- g. Correct key lists and authenticators should be available for standby radio communications.
  - h. Ovens may be used to dry out equipment exposed to the weather.
  - i. Drip loops should be used on all antenna lead-ins.
- j. Covered, dehumidified protection for electronics equipment should be constructed for proper storage.
- k. Watertightness of terminal strips, cable entries, doors, and windows should be checked.
- 1. "Ground rods" and "lightning arrestors" should be installed on all structures and equipment as required (see appropriate technical manuals).
- m. Filaments should be kept "on" in all equipment not in immediate use or storage.
- n. Equipment in storage should be inspected frequently for accumulation of moisture or its effects.
- o. Personnel should be kept away from radio vehicles while transmitting. Clearly marked barriers should be erected around all high powered antennas.

- p. All hands should be alert for broken power lines during high winds. Panger areas should be roped off and broken power lines handled only by qualified personnel.
- q. Antennas should be erected in accordance with the equipment's TM. Antennas should never be erected in a location where storm action may bring them in contact with power lines, wires, or cables.
- r. Radio circuits should be restored in accordance with published restoration priorities. Common user telephone and teletype systems may be **preempted** for high priority tactical radio circuits.
- s. MINIMIZE may be imposed during heavy weather to reduce the communications load. All message releasing authorities should comply with MINIMIZE regulations.
- t. Generators, not in daily use, should be exercised by running them twice a week for a period of from one to four hours, depending on the type generator.


#### 2. Wire

- a. External overhead wiring should be checked for firm supports which will not wash away.
- b. Hot lockers should be made for tools. Also, tools should be coated with oil, WD-40, or similar protective agents.
- c. Poles and supports that are beginning to wash away should be reported to the appropriate agency. If unknown, the information may be reported to III MAF G-6 office.
- d. Areas where erosion has begun should be repaired immediately, before they become a problem.
- e. All telephone poles should be properly set before anyone attempts to climb them.
- f. Personnel effecting repairs should ensure that power lines are securely fixed before climbing poles.
- g. Ground rods and lightning arrestors should be installed on equipment as required. See appropriate technical manuals.
- 3. Padar. Information pertaining to the maximum wind loads which radar radomes and parabolic reflectors associated therewith can withstand is available in applicable system Technical publications. Disassembly of these radar/antenna systems will require, in some cases, four to six hours of effort by an experienced crew to secure and stow the equipment to preclude storm damage. The decision to secure these equipments should be made far enough in advance of the arrival



Operation Scotland/Nanking

Task Force Hotel was assigned the mission of conducting a search, fin, and dectroy operation against the 246th Independent NVA Regiment look test in the vicinity of Khe Senh. To accomplish this task, Task Force Motel wood the 4th Marine Regiment and two battalions of the 2nd ARVM Regiment to seize various objectives in the vicinity of Khe Sanh and beng Vei.

On the 4th of October, K/3/4 conducted a helicopter assault into an LZ and catablished fire support base Nanking. Later that day I/3/12 with 6 105 howitzers inserted and FSB Nanking became operational.

E/3/9 and 1 platoon of G/2/9 along with 4 X 155 howitzers were meved into LZ Hawk, and FSB Hawk was established. F/2/9 with an 8" gun platoon was trucked to FSB Stormy and there a fire support base was established.

on October 5 (D-Day), 2/4 and 3/4 (-) simultaneously made a helicopter assault west of objectives 1 and 2. While 3/4 (-) seized objective 1, 2/4 attacked and seized objective 2. Both objectives were secured with neither ground contacts with the enemy nor enemy artillery or mortar attacks having taken place. On the 6th of October, 1/4 was helilifted into the vicinity of the objective 8. 1/4 attacked and secured objective 8 with no ground contact with the enemy. Later during the day, M/3/12 landed on objective 8 to provide artillery support. While the 4th Marines were securing their objective, they uncovered several groves containing MVA bodies. The 3rd and 4th Battalions of the 2nd AVV Regiment were helilifted into LZ Mallard, and they attacked and abcoured objectives such as Hill 881 south and 558 with no contact with the LVA.

on the 7th of October 3/4 continued to attack and seize objective 4, and 3/4 (-) seized and occupied objective 5. While the 4th Marines were seizing objectives in their zone of action, 2nd ARVII Regiment attacked and seized Hill 881N and 861 with no resistance from the enemy. In the vicinity of Hill 689, M/3/4 found 2 skeletens and parts of a third along with 2 U.S. I.D. tags and 1 inoperable AK-47. The skeletons were believed to be those of Americans. I/3/4 found 3 NVA bodies along with over 30 grenades, 20 60mm mortar rounds and 6 RPG rounds. Meanwhile, 11/2/4 uncovered 2 BARS, 1 30 caliber MG and 1 light machine gun.

On the 8th of October at 0030 in the morning, B/1/4 received a probe from an estimated squad of NVA. Contact lasted 1 hour with enemy casualties unknown. Friendly casualties were 3 KIA and 2 WIA(E). Later that day 1/4 was helilifted to the vicinity of objective 6 which they seized with no enemy resistance. However, 1/4 did find over 30 NVA bodies, over 160 morter rounds, 60 cases of .50 caliber ammunition, 25 AT mines, and 1 B-40 rocket launcher. Meanwhile, 3/4 and 2/4 continued the attack and seized Hill 552 and objective 11 with no contact with the enemy.

on the 9th and 10th of October, the 4th Marines continued to operate from Mill 549, objective 11, and objective 552. They continued to be supported by artillery from the various fire support bases with light contact with the enemy. At 1040 on 10 Oct., C/1/4 received small arms fire from an estimated 10 NVA. Fire was returned and artillery and mortar missions were called. Upon sweeping the area 7 NVA bodies were four. Priendly casualties were 1 VIA(E). Later during the day B and C 1/4 discovered 4 more NVA bodies and they discovered large quantities of U.S. ordnance, over 100 rounds of 82mm mortars, 140 grenades, 60 gas

masks, 26 MPG s and 1 AK-47. Meanwhile, G/2/4 uncovered a grave containing 50 MVA bodies about 4-5 months old as well as over 30 mortar rounds.

in the 11th of October 3/4 attacked to the northwest to operate in the vicinity of FEB Gurkha while 2/4 conducted patrols in the vicinity of the Khe Sanh combat base and 1/4 attacked to the south. From the 11th of October, E/2/9 provided security for Fire Support Base Gurkha while 3/4 (-) continued to attack to the northwest toward the Division objective at long Suat. Meanwhile the 2 battalions of the 2nd ARVN Regiment continued to attack to the Northwest from Hills 861 and 558. From the 11th of October thru the 16th of October, there was only one significant ground contact when elements of L/3/4 spotted an NVA and took him under fire with small crass resulting in 1 NVA(C) and 1 IWC. On the 16th of October the 3rd Battalian, 2nd ARVN Regiment found 5 complete 122mm rockets. On the previous day, H/2/9 received 15 rounds of mortar from an unknown position resulting in 6 WIA(E) and 3 WIA(M).

Subject: Special Landing Force Employment

#### I. GENERAL:

Marine Special Landing Forces in West Pac since 1963, have provided ready forces to assist U.S. Forces ashore in South East Asia. Since U.S. Forces were committed to SVN in 1965 the SLF's have conducted numerous amphibious assaults in wide spread areas of South Vietnam. Since spring of 1967 with the large build up of NVA in the I Corps area one or both of the SLF's have generally been committed ashore reinforcing 1st or 3d Marine Division.

#### II. CURRENT STATUS/FORECAST:

The BLT portion of Special Landing Force Alpha (BLT2/26) has been operating ashore since mid-September. The BLT portion of SLF "B" also spent considerable time ashore in the 3d Divsion AO during the first half of CY 1968.

Combat operations in which the SLF participated ranged from the Cua Viet to the Lactian border south of Khe Sanh with particular attention to the DMZ. SLF helicopter squadrons have continued to support the BLT's and the Division either from shipboard or ashore.

The enemy capability for rapid buildup of forces in and south of the DMZ, which necessitated the constant ext committeent ashore of SLF's, has been largely countered by the highly mobile posture attained in the 3d Marine Division since May 1968. This posture, which entails maintaining a minimum of forces defending fixed positions, thereby freeing infantry units for constant and sustained offensive thrusts to find and fix the enemy, has enabled the Division to search out the enemy in more widespread areas than previously possible. Maximum use of supporting arms from mobile fire bases to reduce the enemy once fixed has been the essential element for success of this posture.

Special Landing Forces afloat with their inherent

quick reaction capability could conduct limited amphibious operations of brief duration along the littoral of SVN and still be readily available to exploit major contacts made by forces should additional force be required.

#### III. RECOMMENDATIONS:

- A. That the Special Landing Forces be maintained afloat for special amphibious operations throughout the costal littoral, conducting amphibious raids and attacks of limited duration on enemy concentrations of personnel, supplies and facilities.
- B. That Special Landing Forces be committed ashore to exploit major contacts made by in-country forces but so remain ashore only so long as lucrative targets exist.
- C. That consideration be given to embarking LVTH-6's as the organic artillery support which, along with the 4.2 inch battery would provide increased flexibility in providing early employment ashore to BLT artillery in across the beach landing as well as providing the helicopter lifted 4.2's at helicopter landing zones.
- D. That procedures for committment be streamlined to realize more rapid response of SLF when need to exploit enemy contact arises.
- E. That both SLF's be provided with CH 46's and HUlE gunships to enhance vertical assualt capability.

Subject: Positive self destruct anti-personnel device

#### I. GENERAL:

During the siege of KHE SANH an anti-personnel mine known as GRAVEL was employed in the KHE SANH area. The life expectancy of this mine was to be about 17 days. In actual use however a number of the mines lasted a considerably longer time than was anticipated.

#### II. CURRENT STATUS/FORECASTS

A number of anti-personnel mines have been developed, the most recent is WAAPM (Wide Area Anti-Personnel Mine). This is a very sophisticated mine capable of setting its trip lines automatically and with a supposedly self-destruct capability. Unfortunstely the self-destruct is not fool proof and a small percentage are lethal after normal life cycle. WAAPM at present is only employable from aircraft as is GRAVEL and DRAGON TEETH. This problem of self-destruct is being worked on for each type of mine. Even with a greatly improved mine the employment at present is limited to aircraft delivery. The combination of aircraft and mines in one weapon system is excellent for a wide area distribution but does not fulfill the needs of a ground commander who may need only a 500-800 meter area seeded and who may be required to enter the area shortly after seeding has taken place.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS:

That an anti-personnel mine be developed that can be employed by ground troops. This mine should have the capability to arm, disarm and destroy itself on command and a self-destruct capability that is dependable. A possible command input to the mine could be the ground commander's tactical radio system. The mine could be constructed with a small audio device on prearranged frequencies.

### Summary of IMZ Operations 17 Sept - 17 Oct

1. BACKGHOUND. During the first half of Heptember 1968 the Third
Marine Division conducted a series of operations into suspected
enemy base areas to the west of the Rock Pile and maintained pressure
against an apparent build up of enemy forces morth of the Cam Le River.

1

As the operations to the west of the Rock Pile continued to uncover wast enemy cache complexes in the Mui Tia Pong area the scope of the operation was shifted northward to the vicinity of LZ Winchester. Simultaneously units of the Third Harines extended their operations northward with the establishment of LZ's Mack, Amy and Helen.

On 16 September 3 Arc Lights were employed to prepare the DMZ for the forthcoming operation. On 17 September, 6 more Arc Lights were employed.

2. On 17 September the Third Marine Division initiated a new phase of the operation by conducting a helicopter-berne assault into the DMZ with two battalions. These two battalions (1/4 and 1/9) moved south toward elements of two regiments (3/9, 2/26 and 2/3) moving merth and north east to provide a harmer and anvil effect. Large enemy caches were discovered by the two battalions moving south. (1/4 and 1/9).

By the 23rd of September there were indications that major enemy forces were attempting to extricate themselves by moving to the east and west. In order to continue pressure against the enemy forces legated south of the Ben Hai and to attempt to destroy these forces, the two helicopter-borne battalions shifted the direction of their

attack to the east and weet. This norement was compled with an attack on 26 September from the east by 1/11, 1st Ede, 5th Inf Biv (Nech) and 2 ARVH battalions. Elements of 1/11 moved rapidly westward from the vicinity of A-4 to a series of objectives in the DMZ. After clearing one large bunker complex, this force moved to within visual sighting distance of elements of 2/26 which had assumed the eastward movement along Rto 1022 from 1/4 on 1 October. The ARVH battalions were withdrawn on 29 September and 1/11 returned to its operating bases on 5 October after missions had been accomplished with me significant centact reported.

The USS New Jersey en 4 October fired on GS 988704 at 1440, controlled by Smitty Charlie (Div AO), expended 28 rounds of HC. BDA - 2 read outs, 2 bunkers destroyed, 2 bunkers damaged, NVA routed from area, 4 probable KIA.

2/26 centinued to search Rte 1022 in DMZ and found several artillery firing positions with 152mm Arty rounds, two artillery tracters and bunker areas. Speradic centact was encountered and centinued until their extraction on the 16th. 1/3 relieved 2/26 on that date and continues to cut trees and creater Rte 1022.

To the west 1/9, was relieved by 2/3 which continues to move west along a trail complex that generally parallels the couthern DHZ boundary. 3/3 mans FSB to supporting 1/5 and 2/3.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS FOR THE PERIOD 11 - 18 OCT

- 1. During the period significant ground contacts were limited to the Eastern DMZ area. On 11 Oct B/1/61 had a day long contact with an estimated enemy platoon north of A-4 which resulted in 3 KIA, 10 WIA, and 26 NVA KIA. On 16 October elements of the 2D ARVN regiment made contact with an estimated two NVA companies North of A-1. This contact lasted most of the day and resulted in 5 KIA, 22 WIA, 75 NVA KIA. One other contact was reported by 2/3 on the 13th when E Co made contact with an estimated NVA platoon in bunkers. This contact resulted in 2 KIA, 3 WIA and 6 NVA KIA and 1 POW.
- 2. Significant OPCON changes during the period were as follows:
- a. Trp A/4/12 Cav from 1st Bde to CG 101st ABN Division for indefinite period on 13 Oct.
- b. On 16 Oct 1/3 relieved 2/26 on Rte 1022, 2/26 closed Napoleon/Saline at 1855 OpCon to AmTracs.
- c. On 16 Oct 1/4 commenced relieving 2/9 units on FSB's West of CaLu.
- d. BLT 2/26 will chop to 79.4 at completion of embarkation estimated 181800H.
- e. Movement of 3P APVN Bris from Nanking commenced of time of completion 1800 today.

  0800 18 Octa Second Bright to be moved on 19
- f. The 1st Plt of Co B, 1st AmTrac Bn will chop Opcon to 3d MarDiv from 1st MarDiv on the 20th.
- g. Command less OpCon of 3d Bridge Co was passed to 11th Eng Bn on the 14th by 1st MarDiv.

- 3. During the period there was a trend towards increased enemy mining activity. On 11 Oct a 2½ ton truck was damaged by a mine on Rte 558. On the same day 2 tanks and a 5 ton truck were damaged by mines on the road between A-3 and pel. On 17 Oct two LVT hit mines vic YD 275749 and one was completely destroyed with 1 MIA ENR. Two tanks from C/3/TK hit mines in this area also. Two tanks and 1 LVT recovered.

- enemy threat area of I Corps) has requested employment of SLF Alpha in the "critical area" (Rocket Belt) after a "short rehat at sea". Message also recommended delaying backload of SLF Bravo until 4 Nov. COMUSMACV AND COMSEVEN FLT have approved MAF's request.
- 7. The U.S.S. New Jersy came back on station to support the Division on the 16th and 17th and fired 82 sixteen inch rounds on four missions. She has departed now and isn't expected to return until after 1 Nov.

- 8. A Corps message states present condition of CIDG Camp at Mai Loc is such that it could be converted to an RF Camp with RF units relieving CIDG units of their assigned mission. COMUSMACV approves as do Generals Troung and Lam. This would mean the TSAR would become an AO which would permit additional flexibility.
- 9. Bde plans an attack into DMZ with Bn size task force for one day period. Originally scheduled for the 18th, the attack is now delayed until the 22nd. ARVN attack NW of A-3 is planned in support of Bde opn N of A-4.

A request for defoliation of a strip one thousand meters wide and running parallel to the Provisional Military Demarcation Line, and then along the Laotian/Vietnamese Border, and starting basically on Route 561 and ending on Route 9 has been fowarded to XXIV Corps.
- 12. An additional request for re-seeding of the recently discovered Ben Hai River crossing sites with MK-36 Destructor Bombs has been fowarded to Corps.

1. BACKGROUND. During the first half of September 1968 the Third

Marine Division conducted a series of operations into suspected

enemy base areas to the west of the Rock Pile and maintained pressure

against an apparent build up of enemy forces north of the Cam Lo River.

As the operations to the west of the Rock Pils continued to uncover vast enemy cache complexes in the Nui Tia Pong area the scope of
the operation was shifted northward to the vicinity of 12 Winchester.
Simultaneously units of the Third Marines extended their operations
northward with the establishment of 12 mack, Any and Helen.

On 16 September 3 Arc lights were employed to prepare the INZ for the forthcoming operation. On 17 September, 5 more Arc lights were employed.

2. On 17 September the Third Marine Division initiated a new phase of the operation by conducting a helicopter-bonne assault into the DMZ with two battalions. These two battaliens (1/4 and 1/9) moved south toward 2/26 and 2/3 moving north and northeast to provide a hammer and anvil effect. Large enemy caches were discovered by the two battalions moving south. (1/4 and 1/9).

By the 23rd of September there were indications that major enemy forces were attempting to extricate themselves by moving to the east and west. In order to continue pressure against the spent, forces located south or the Ben Hai and to attempt to destroy these forces, the two helicopter-borne battalions shifted the direction of their attacks to

the east and west. This movement was coupled with an attack on 26 September from the east by 1/11, 1st Bde, 5th Inf Div (Mech) and 2 ARVN battalions. Elements of 1/11 moved rapidly westward from the vicinity of A-4 to a series of objectives in the DMZ. After clearing one large bunker complex, this force moved to within visual sighting distance of elements of 2/26 which had assumed the eastward movement along Rte 1022 from 1/4 on 1 October. The ARVN battalions were withdrawmon 29 September and 1/11 returned to its operating bases on 3 October after missions had been accomplished with no significant contact reported.

The USS New Jersey on 4 October fired on GS 988704 at 1440, controlled by Smitty Charlie (Div AO), expended 28 rounds of HC. GDA - 2 road cuts, 2 bunkers destroyed, 2 bunkers damaged, NVA routed from area, 4 probable KIA.

2/26 continued to search Rte 1022 in DMZ and found several artillery firing positions with 152mm Arty rounds, two artillery tracters and bunker areas. Sporadic contact was encountered and continued until their extraction on the 16th. 1/3 relieved 2/26 on that date and continued to cut trees and crater Rte 1022 until their extraction from the DMZ on 22 October.

To the west, 1/9. was relieved by 2/3 which continued to move west along a trail complex that generally paralleled the southern DMZ boundary, until they were returned to Camp Carroll on 23 October. 3/3 manned FSB's supporting 1/3 and 2/3 until their extraction from the DMZ on 22 and 23 October.
