PART II - NARRATIVE SUMMARYOPERATIONS

1. Marshall Mountain. The 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mechanized) conducted operations during the month of February in the Marshall Mountain AO. The Bde operated principally from FSB Sharon (YD3439), FSB Nancy (YD4439), FSB Anne (YD2940), FSB Tombstone (YD3959), and Thunder Beach (YD4839).

The Bde conducted extensive patrols and search and clear operations throughout the AO in cooperation with the 1st and 2nd ARVN Regiments and local popular and regional forces. The Juang Tri Combat Provisional Rifle Co operated under the operational control of the Bde north of Trieu Phong District Hq and later in the month from Juang Tri City.

1st Bn, 11th Infantry (Mech) operated from FSB Sharon, Nancy, and Anne with effective ambushes and patrols throughout the AO. On 3 Feb at 1930, a sniper team from A/1/11 sighted 5 enemy moving north. The enemy tripped a claymore surprise firing device and the team called mortars in on the enemy. After the sniper team coordinated with another 1/11 ambush team in the vicinity, both teams then swept the area finding 8 enemy KIA and 2 pistols.

On 8 Feb, B Co 1st Bn, 61st Infantry (Mech) began operating in the Dong Ha panhandle area, east of Dong Ha Combat Base (YD2459). Later in the month they moved into the Juang Tri Combat Base AO and conducted patrols with a platoon of B Co, 1st Bn 77th Armor and a platoon of Marines from JTCB. This operation ended on 26 Feb as B Co returned to FSB Sharon.

On 26 Feb, the 1st Bde assumed operational control of the 1st AMTrac Bn, which operated in vicinity of Cua Viet (YD3469).

2. KENTUCKY. Task Force Bravo, with Headquarters at Dong Ha Combat Base conducted operations in the Kentucky AO until 18 Feb at 0800 when 3d Marine Regiment assumed control.

2nd Bn, 3d Marines and the 1st Amtrac Bn operated under control of Task Force Bravo. 2nd Bn operated from C-2 (YD1364), C-2 Bridge (YD1167), Cam Lo, and in the Mai Loc TAOR. H Co 2/3 worked with local popular forces in Cam Lo, while F Co 2/3 participated in similar operations in Mai Loc.

E Co 2/3 provided security for the 59th Engineer Co which conducted land clearing operations in the Leatherneck Square Area. A total of 8,364 acres were cleared by the U. S. Army engineer unit. Several bulldozers were damaged or destroyed by enemy emplaced anti-tank mines. On 8 Feb in the vicinity of YD1764 three bulldozers struck mines and were badly damaged. Three soldiers also suffered minor wounds. Also participating in the operation were the 3d Engineer Bn. and the 11th Engineer Bn who cleared 385 acres and 884 acres respectively. The operation was completed and secured at the end of the month.

There were also signs of increased enemy activity along the Cua Viet River. On 10 Feb at 0130, a River Patrol Boat sighted 4 enemy on the bank at YD270643. A 3d Recon Bn team in the vicinity was notified and they moved in behind the enemy and initiated contact with small arms fire. An exploitation force from 1st Amtrac Bn was sent in to search the area. Results were 4 VC KIA and 4 individual weapons captured.

From 11 Feb - 17 Feb, F Co, 2nd Bn, 4th Marines operated under the operational control of Task Force Bravo. F Co conducted search and clear operations north of Dong Ha Combat Base.

On 18 Feb at 0800, the 3d Marine Regiment, returning from Operation Taylor Common, took over operational control of the Kentucky AO and Task Force Bravo was deactivated.

The 3d Bn, 3d Marines was the first battalion to return to Kentucky. The Bn commenced operations from A-4 (YD1170), C-2, and in the Thi Ha area (YD2770). On 18 Feb, E and G Co, 2nd Bn, 3d Marines helilifted into FSB Erskine and Cunningham in Jewey Canyon. They conducted operations from these positions for the remainder of the month. On 21 Feb the 1st Bn, 3d Marines returned and commenced operations from VCB and Elliott Combat Base under the operational control of Task Force Hotel.

On 12 Feb C Troop, 3d Squadron, 5th Cavalry began operations in the Kentucky AO. On 25 Feb, the 101st Airborne Div unit was joined by the Hq & Hq Troop and B Troop. A Troop, 4th Squadron, 12th Cav operated with the 3d Squadron (-) north of Dong Ha Combat Base and in the vicinity of C-2 and A-4.

During the month of February there were no heavy enemy contacts, however, there were several mine incidents. On 24 Feb, an APC from B Troop hit an unknown type mine blowing off one road wheel and one track. There were also 3 WIA(E) and 5 WIA(M).

3. SCOTLAND II. During the month of February, combat operations in the SCOTLAND AO were conducted by the 4th Marine Regiment, under the operational control of Task Force Hotel located at Vandegrift Combat Base.

The 1st Bn, 4th Marines operated from FSB Neville (XD8357), FSB Russell (XD9195), FSB Fuller (YD0159) and Elliott Combat Base (XD9854). They conducted patrols and search and clear operations in their AO.

2nd Bn, 4th Marines conducted extensive squad size reconnaissance patrols along the DMZ, north of A-4. The battalion made several contacts with small enemy units and found numerous enemy bunker complexes.

The 3d Bn, 4th Marines operated from Ca Lu (YD0154), FSB Cates (YD9143), FSB Fuller, Elliott Combat Base, and Vandegrift Combat Base. The battalion conducted extensive patrols throughout their AO.

Enemy contacts early in the month were generally with small sized units, however later in the month units at FSB Neville and FSB Russell received heavy ground attacks by enemy sappers and infantry units.

At 2230 on 24 Feb, FSB Neville received light small arms fire. At about 0100 the position received RPG's and 82mm mortar incoming. The enemy ground attack commenced on the west side of the perimeter at 0300. Using satchel charges and heavy AK-47 fire, the enemy breached the defensive wire. By 0530 the area had been cleared of enemy and consolidation began. Several dead NVA were found with satchel charges strapped to their backs. There were 11 FR KIA, 29 WIA(E), 13 WIA(M), and 36 NVA(C). A similar attack was made against FSB Russell on 25 Feb at 0350. The base received a sudden mortar attack and was hit by an enemy ground attack. All major bunkers were hit in the first mortar barrage. The enemy penetrated the wire at 0400 and Marines

were pinned down inside their bunkers by enemy SAF. At 0545 one NVA signaled with a blinking light and the enemy began withdrawing. The Marines were then able to leave their bunkers and employed pursuit by fire which was responsible for the majority of the enemy kills. At 0605 consolidation began with only two officers and one staff NCO left from the original complement. Resulting casualties were 19 FR KIA, 50 WIA(C), and 25 EW KIA. The bases were reinforced and extensive patrolling was conducted in the area.

4. DEWEY CANYON. During the month of February, the 9th Marine Regiment continued Operation Dewey Canyon in the I Shau Valley. The 9th Marines operated from fire support bases conducting a three pronged sweep south towards the Laotian border.

The 1st Bn did not join the operation until 10 Feb, however A/1/9 did provide security for and operate from FSB Whirlwind (YD1026). When the remainder of the Bn joined the operation, it operated from FSB Erskine (YD1610) and southeast of that position. As the Bn swept south they operated south of LZ Pennsylvania (YD2109), and southeast of LZ Riverside (YD2307). There were several significant enemy contacts. On 23 Feb A/1/9 at YD204045 came under fire from an estimated NVA battalion in a bunker complex. The enemy employed 82mm mortars, RPG's, automatic weapons and small arms. A Co attacked the position, receiving a heavy volume of fire. Air, artillery and 81mm mortars were called on the enemy position and D/1/9 was committed to the attack. After contact was broken the area was searched finding 19 individual weapons, 4 light machine guns, 2 RPG launchers and assorted ammunition and gear, all of which was new. Enemy casualties were 105 WIA(C), while Marines reported 10 FR KIA, 51 WIA(W), and 10 EW KIA.

The 2nd Bn operated from FSB Razor (YD1410) and south of LZ Dallas (YD1011). During the second half of the month the Bn operated south of FSB Erskine. During the month the Bn had many encounters with the enemy. On 17 Feb at YD123039 the point element of C/2/9 was taken under long range fire by four NVA. As the company deployed and moved forward they received heavy small arms fire. C Co continued the attack and air strikes were run against the enemy position. The area was searched finding 39 WIA(C). During the contact, which lasted from 0830 to 1630, there were 4 WIA(W) and 9 heat casualties, of which one died.

The 3d Bn operated from FSB Cunningham (YD1813) and as it swept south it operated southeast of LZ Montana (YD2011), while I Co operated from FSB Turnage (YD2509). Just as with the 1st and 2nd battalions, 3d Bn operations were marked with heavy enemy contact. On 16 Feb at 0845H, K/3/9 was hit while moving in the vicinity of YD215095. An estimated enemy platoon hit the front and rear of the column with small arms, automatic weapons, RPG's and 60mm mortars. Fire was returned with organic weapons, and supporting arms, including air strikes. Contact was broken at 1400 with 14 enemy KIA(C) and 5 individual weapons captured. Friendly casualties were 1 KIA and 18 WIA(E).

During the Dewey Canyon operation units received coordinated ground and mortar attacks on fixed positions by the enemy. On 17 Feb at 0405 FSB Cunningham was attacked from the north, south and west. The perimeter was penetrated by 13 sappers armed with satchel charges, RPG's, bamboo mines and grenades. The attack, in which the enemy employed small arms, automatic weapons and mortars, was broken at 0700. Resulting casualties were 4 KIA, 8 WIA(E), 38 WIA(M) and 37 EN KIA while 8 AK-47, 3 RPG launchers with 26 rounds, 2 radios and many grenades were captured.

The 9th Marines found several large enemy weapons and ordnance caches and staging areas. On 28 Feb, A Co and D Co 1st Bn, 9th Marines found a cache including 10,000 82mm mortar rounds, 19,000 60mm mortar rounds, 20,000 Chi-Com grenades, and 305 SKS rifles. On 20 Feb C Co attacked and seized an enemy bunker complex killing 71 NVA. Eight individual weapons were captured and 7 crew served weapons were captured, including two 122mm towed howitzers.

On 18 Feb the 2nd Bn 3d Marines (-) began operating from FSB Cunningham and FSB Erskine, allowing the 9th Marines to push farther south in pursuit of the enemy.

1. COMMAND EMPHASIS

- a. The coordination of artillery, air, and naval gunfire continued in accordance with established procedures.
- b. Planning commenced for establishing a Supporting Arms Section within the Division Tactical Surveillance System.
- c. Additions to the target inventory, particularly in the area of Operation Dewey Canyon, continued as part of the Arc Light Planning. A total of 43 targets were valid at the end of the period.
- d. During the period, special emphasis in fire planning and coordination was devoted to the Operation Dewey Canyon area, and special DMZ operations.

(2) A concentrated attack by air was conducted in support of Operation Dewey Canyon, particularly in areas beyond supporting artillery range. e. Food Services. During the month of February 1969 the 3d Marine Division Food Service Program consisted of 48 operational messes supported by 413 personnel of OF 33. Of the total messes in operation, 31 are semi-permanent field messes housed in TCFS structures and the remaining 17 are temporary field messes. Subsistence support provided Army, Navy and Marine Corps personnel of this command average 35,445 rations daily. Approximately 27% of the total rations fed daily consisted of Meal, Combat, Individual and approximately 73% were subsisted on the III MAF Master Menu. The III MAF Master Menu is based on MC0 P10110.17, Chapter 4. The Marine Corps III MAF Master Menu utilizes both perishable and non-perishable components. The Meal, Combat, Individual is utilized only where operational requirements preclude serving the III MAF Master Menu.

f. Supply

This has been largely due to the inability of units in the field to recover equipment from medevaced Marines and return it to the rear areas for re-issue. III MAF did not publish their final Duel Blade Plan in February as anticipated. Accordingly the Division plan is being held in abeyance.

In vertical construction the prototype bunker at Dong Ha was completed. Based on knowledge gained from its construction the construction schedule submitted to CG, XIV Corps in January is presently being reassessed in order to reflect a more realistic schedule for the CY69 season. Construction of the final 14 bunkers at Vandegrift Combat Base continues. III MAF tasked the 11th Engineer Battalion to erect a 50' alum tower at A-2 and work is scheduled to start early March.

PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

1. Personnel Administration

a. During the month of February 1969, 53 officers and 1804 enlisted personnel joined the Division. Personnel transferred by normal rotation included 57 officers and 1124 enlisted. Personnel transferred by service records due to medevacs were 11 officers and 551 enlisted. Other personnel transferred by service records include one officer and 20 enlisted.

b. A total of 23 Division Directives and four Sub-Zone Coordinator Directives were published during the month

c. Awards. Award recommendations submitted to FMFPac: 11 Silver Star Medals, three Legion of Merit Medals, 10 Distinguished Flying Cross Medals, one Navy & Marine Corps Medal, 109 Bronze Star Medals, 16 Air Medals, 110 Navy Commendation Medals and 839 Navy Achievement Medals. The following awards were returned from FMFPac approved: two Silver Star Medals, one Legion of Merit Medal, eight Distinguished Flying Cross Medals, seven Bronze Star Medals, 10 Air Medals, 23 Navy Commendation Medals and 126 Navy Achievement Medals. Additionally 749 Purple Heart Medals were issued.

d. Casualty. Casualties sustained during the month included 868 WIA, 161 KIA, 14 DOW, 17 NHD, 113 NHI and one MIA.

e. Congressional Interest. During the month 111 cases were received, 94 cases completed, 36 cases pending and 16 cases readdressed to other commands.

f. Welfare Reports. Fifty-four welfare reports were received, 22 completed, 40 readdressed to other commands and three are pending.

g. Discharges. During the month three Hardship discharges were approved and eight Hardship discharges were forwarded to CMC for decision. Three General discharges for unsuitability were approved.

h. Administrative Assistance Team

(1) Approximately 80 hours of administrative assistance were rendered to various units within the Division. Numerous units were contacted via land phone to correct errors in Personnel Accounting and advise on the Manpower Management System.

(3) Seventy-nine LNC's commenced work at Task Force Hotel, 40 at Dong Ha Combat Base and 29 at Quang Tri Combat Base on 22Feb69.

(4) IRO expended 33,300 Piasters of the daily hire AIK Fund in the Sandpit area on 27Feb69.

(5) A LNC woman died from natural causes at approximately 1700 27Feb69, enroute to home from work, in a Marine Corps Vehicle.

(6) As of 28 February 622 LNC's were employed.

2. Exchange Service

a. The Main Exchange complex located at Quang Tri Combat Base was officially opened 15 February 1969. The new exchange has been well received. The long P.X. line has been eliminated and the average stock of merchandise has been increased.

b. Portable snack bars selling canned snacks and soft drinks have been opened at the Dong Ha Combat Base Air Terminal and the Quang Tri Exchange Location. Both snack bars have been well received.

c. A new troop store was opened at the rock crusher site.

d. Requests have been made to the Danang Area Exchange Commander for a contract to operate exchange laundry and barber concessions.

3. Information Services

a. The Informational Services Office continued its coverage of the Division's activities. During the month of February 3,010 written Fleet Home Town news releases and 128 tape recorded Fleet Home Town radio interviews were prepared and forwarded to the Fleet Home Town News Center, Great Lakes, Illinois. In addition, a total of 65 news and feature articles supported by 45 photographs and 16 photo caption releases were also prepared and forwarded to CIB, III MAF for release and further dissemination. 10. Staff Judge Advocate. During the month of February 1969 the Office of the Staff Judge Advocate reviewed 16 special courts-martial and 22 summary courts-martial. NARRATIVE SUMMARY

3d Dental Company provides dental support throughout the TAOR of the 3d Marine Division to personnel of the Division. In addition, it provides dental prosthetic treatment and dental repair preventive maintenance services to Navy and Marine personnel of NSA, 1st MAW and MCB units in the TAOR. Assistance to Graves Registration is provided in identification of the dead. Company personnel provide support to the Marine Memorial Children's Hospital at "D" Medical facility, Dong Ha. DENTCAPS in conjunction with 1st Bde of the 1st (Mech) RF/PF forces cordon-and-search as well as Combined Action Platoons were conducted during the month. The Controlled Dental Care Program combined with the forward Fire Support Base program continues to decrease the number of dental casualty medevacs. Conversion to SEAsia tropical huts of three of the four hardback tents at Quang Tri Combat Base was completed during the month, considerably improving the weather protection for supply and mount-out sections.
