PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY
OPERATIONS

1. GENERAL

The 3d Marine Division, under OPCON to CG, XXIV Corps, operated in Quang Tri Province, Republic of Vietnam. The Province is south of the DMZ, bounded by the Gulf of Tonkin to the east and Laos to the west. The 1st ARVN Regiment and 101st Airborne Division (USA) operate to the immediate south. The 2d ARVN Regiment operates in conjunction with 3d Marine Division (Rein) units and in an AO north of Dong Ha Combat Base encompassing Route 1 to the DMZ.

The Division's combat activities consisted of major operations and small unit patrolling within regimental areas of operations. Major operations were: (1) Operation DEWEY CANYON, conducted until mid-month in the southernmost portion of the AO, north of the A Shau Valley by the 9th Marines; (2) Operation MAINE CRAG, which commenced in mid-month in the southwestern portion of the AO by the 3d Marines; (3) Operation PURPLE MARTIN, conducted in the northwestern portion of the AO by the 4th Marines; and (4) Operation MONTANA MAULER, which commenced the last few days of the month by the 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mech) USA, north of FSB Fuller. Areas of operations were the 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mech) AO in the eastern portion of Quang Tri Province and organic regimental AO's in the central areas of the Province.

2. COMBAT ACTIVITIES WITHIN AO'S

a. 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mech)

In March, the 1st Brigade deployed units to several areas within the 3d Marine Division (Rein) AO. The 1st Bn, 11th Infantry and 1st Bn, 61st Infantry (Mech) maintained operations bases at FSB Sharon (YD 3449). From there, 1/11 conducted search and clear operations in Base Area 101, vicinity FSB Anne (YD 2940), and areas SW of FSB Sharon. 1/61 operated in the coastal area between Cua Viet (YD 3469) and Wunder Beach (YD 4389), though, there were elements in the area of C-2 (YD 1364) temporarily. 1st Bn, 77th Armor operated in the vicinity of FSB Nancy (YD 4439) and supported other elements of the Bde. A Troop, 4/12 Cavalry worked in the area of C-2 and, during the latter part of the month, also operated in the vicinity of FSB Nancy. The 3d Squadron, 5th Cavalry (-) conducted search and clear operations west of C-2 and vicinity of A-4. The 1st Amtrac Bn, under OPCON of the Bde, conducted security missions from Cua Viet, C-4 (YD 3068) and Oceanview. From 13-22 March, the 3d Bn, 3d Marines were OPCON to the Bde and operated from A-4 (YD 1170), C-2, the Mai Loc TAOR, and Cam Lo (YD 1259). 3/3 also provided security for land clearing operations east of C-2.

The Bde was plagued with many mining incidents in their AO. One of the more significant mining incidents in the coastal area occurred 9 March at YD 361444. A B/1/77 tank, carrying infantry troops, hit an A/T mine, resulting in 3 WIA(E) and 2 WIA(M).

On 15 March in the 1st Amtrac portion of the AO, elements of B/1/77 helped extract a recon team on a special operation north of Oceanview (YD 2974). Tanks and artillery in support resulted in 10 NVA/KIA.

On 16 March, B/3/5 Cav (-) made contact at YD 155689 with 2 NVA platoons. B/3/5 Cav (-) was reinforced by the remainder of B/3/5 Cav and moved into the enemy area. Supporting arms were heavily utilized. A search of the area of contact yielded 8 NVA/KIA.

b. 3d Marines

In March, the Third Marine Regiment began staging for Operation Maine Crag. On 8 March, the Third Marine C.P. moved to Vandegrift Combat Base. The commencement of Maine Crag depended on the weather and retrograde from Operation Dewey Canyon. 2d Bn, 3d Marines in the meantime closed on LZ Hawk on 10 March and moved south to FSB Snapper (XD 842346) on 13 March. 3d Bn, 3d Marines operated mainly in the C-2/A-4 area, Cam Lo and Mai Loc TAOR.

On 9 March, a patrol ambush of K/3/3 at YD 129514, opened fire on 15 NVA and sighted an additional 15 NVA. The patrol called in artillery and was reinforced by another platoon and tanks. The enemy broke contact and fled. K/3/3 searched the area and found 21 NVA/KIA, 15 AK-47's and 1 POW. There were 3 WIA(E).

c. 4th Marines

The 4th Marine Regiment operated in the northwestern section of the Third MarDiv AO. The 2d Bn, 4th Marines operated from FSB Neville (XD 823574) north of the Rockpile and from FSB Russell (XD 910592).

On 3 March at XD 973615, L/3/4 with C/1/4 was attacked by an unknown size enemy force using mortars, automatic weapons, and grenades. There were 13 friendly KIA, 22 WIA(E) and 20 NVA/KIA. Contact was sporadic in the area for several days.

On 13 March at XD 950621, M/3/4 encountered light contact and at 0300 the next morning an estimated NVA company attacked their position. The attack was preceded by 82mm mortar fire. A flare ship was called on station and the attack was repulsed. Casualties for 13 and 14 March were 6 KIA and 34 WIA(E). Seven NVA/KIA were reported.

At the end of March, 3/4 moved north and west and conducted extensive search and clear operations along the DMZ north of FSB Russell. 2/4 continued to operate extensively in the vicinity north of FSB Neville.

d. 9th Marines

In the 9th Marine Regiment portion of the Third MarDiv AO, following

Operation Dewey Canyon, 2d Bn, 9th Marines conducted security missions from locations near Vandegrift Combat Base (YD 0048) at FSB Cates (XD 9243), Hill 691 (XD 9244), Elliott Combat Base (XD 9854) and Khe Gio Bridge (YD 1256). 3d Bn, 9th Marines operated from Vandegrift Combat Base and Ca Lu (YD 0145). 1st Bn, 9th Marines spent several days R&R at Cua Viet, then resumed operations in the Mai Loc TAOR, C-2, A-4 and Cam Lo.

3. OPERATION DEWEY CANYON

In early March, the 9th Marines commenced withdrawing units from the operation. On 8 March, 2/9 had withdrawn from the AO, and FSB Erskine (YD 163107) was closed. 3/9 (-) closed FSB Cunningham (YD 183135) on 17 March and helilifted to VCB. 1/9 and I/3/9 withdrew on 18 March to close FSB Turnage (YD 252090) and terminate the operation. The withdrawal of troops had been hampered severely by overcast weather, but was completed by 18 March 1969.

There were several significant contacts during the last few days of the operation. On 15 March at YD 238042, C/1/9 made contact with a reinforced NVA squad supported by 60mm mortars. Gunships and supporting arms were utilized. At the end of the day's contact there were 4 WIA (E), 3 WIA(M) and 17 NVA/KIA. As late as 15 March, FSB Cunningham received NVA artillery, causing 7 WIA(E). Even as 1/9 helilifted out on 18 March, there were NVA attacks by fire which resulted in 18 WIA(E). NVA losses on 18 March were 37 KIA by artillery, air strikes and ground fire.

The Operation was deemed a huge success in virtually every respect. NVA supply routes and lines of communications were interdicted and numerous supply caches were uncovered.

4. OPERATION PURPLE MARTIN

Operation Purple Martin had commenced on 27 Feb 1969 when the 1st Bn, 4th Marines were assigned to clear the northwestern portion of the Third MarDiv AO. Beginning on 10 March, B and C/1/4 closed on FSB Alpine (XD 755830) followed by heliborne artillery. F and G/2/4 moved briefly into the area to sweep from FSB Alpine east into the Fourth Marines AO.

On 20 March, D and CP/1/4 conducted a heliborne assault into FSB Argonne (XD 675572). Upon landing D/1/4 received heavy small arms fire, then assaulted the NVA positions and secured the FSB. There were 4 KIA, 7 WIA(E) while the enemy lost 15 KIA, 1 RPD machine gun, 2 AK-47's and 2 RPG launchers. Later that day, while attempting to eliminate an NVA sniper who was firing on FSB Argonne, a patrol from D/1/4 received heavy automatic weapons fire and small arms fire from a bunker complex. The patrol withdrew due to darkness. During an 82mm mortar attack that night the Battalion Commander was killed.

A/1/4 lifted to FSB Alpine on the 20th of March to provide a reinforced reserve. A and C/1/4 helilifted south of FSB Argonne on 21 March to relieve some of the pressure on the CP and D/1/4. On 23 March, B/1/4 (-) lifted to vic XD 969565 to establish FSB Greene (XD 742605) and to start opening up the northern part of the AO. On 25 March, FSB Greene was opened. At the end of March, 1/4 (-) planned to lift north to operate in the vicinity of FSB Greene.

5. OPERATION MAINE CRAG

The operation commenced officially on 15 March. 2d Bn, 3d Marines was located at FSB Snapper (XD 841347). On 17 March, scout elements of C/1/77 moved from Ca Lu west on Route #9. They were followed by C/1/77 and B/1/61, under Task Force Remagen. On 18 March, D & C/1/3 lifted to

SECRET

FSB Saigon, and on the following day A and B/1/3 lifted to LZ Passport. On 21 March, Task Force Remagen had progressed into the AO from the Khe Sanh Plateau and supported the operation on the west. The operation's mission was to interdict Route 926, running E-W from the Laotian border on the west to the Laotian Salient jutting up from the south. On 20 March, 3/2 ARVN helilifted into LZ Torch (XD 906278). Task Force Remagen reached Route 926 on 26 March. On 27 March 2/3 found a large rice cache which netted 736 tons of rice.

Elements of 3/3 were deployed as security elements at various LZ's. At the end of the month, CP, I and K/3/3 were operating from FSB Cates, Hill 691, Hill 950 (XD 8445) and vicinity.

On 18 March G/2/3 sighted 2 enemy 2 1/2 ton trucks moving northeast on Route 926 loaded with rockets and small arms. The second truck was ambushed and destroyed. There were 7 NVA/KIA and only 1 WIA(E).

6. OPERATION MONTANA MAULER

On 23 March, the operation commenced as 2 platoons of D/1/11 with A and B/3/5 Cav made heavy contact during a mechanized thrust northward of the Che Chua Valley. The contact was north of FSB Fuller (YD 018592) with elements of the 27th NVA Regiment. As it intensified, eventually all of Task Force 1/11 was committed. Then on 29 March, I/3/9 helilifted in to further exploit the contact centered around Hill 208 (YD 042643). On 30 March, 1/2 ARVN helilifted in to block enemy exit routes north of Hill 208. The results from the operation for the month of March were:

COMMAND CHRONOLOGY
FIRE SUPPORT COORDINATION

1. COMMAND EMPHASIS

a. The coordination of air, artillery and naval gunfire throughout the 3d Marine Division AO continued in accordance with established procedures.

b. The Supporting Arms Section of the Tactical Surveillance System was established during March. The Supporting Arms Section records and displays on maps and charts the Supporting Arms situation and significant events as they occur. Unobserved artillery and naval gunfire missions and planned TPQ targets are displayed nightly.

c. A courier system to acquire fire reports from the direct support artillery battalions was implemented during the month of March. However, all significant missions continue to be reported to the Supporting Arms Section of the Tactical Surveillance System immediately upon completion of firing.

d. Additions to the target inventory continued as part of the Arc Light contingency plan.

5. COLLECTIONS AND REPORTING:

(3) A total of 3,237 immunizations were given for plague and 5 for tetanus. There had been several cases of bubonic plague in the area with 25 cases being reported for March. Immunizations were given through GVN and US forces as quickly as the vaccine was available. Public interest was outstanding in that the people understood the need for the inoculations. An attempt is being made to instruct the people that the only way to halt the disease is through proper sanitation and control of rats.

(4) A total of 37 nurses received training at unit MedCaps and at the Dong Ha Children's Hospital.

b. Educational Efforts

(1) A total of 3,841 people attended 162 English classes.

(2) In addition, 186 people attended vocational training classes.

c. Individual Donations. A total of \$449.00 was received by 3d Marine Division commands for donations for hospitals, orphanages and scholarships.

d. Distribution of Commodities. During March over 60 tons of supplies were issued by G-5 to 3d Marine Division units for distribution in civic action projects. This total includes 114,000 pounds of cement, 5,600 pounds of soap, 1280 pounds of rice, 600 school kits, 200 cases of various medical supplies, 29 civic action kits, 31 cases of instant breakfast and 3,400 pounds of lumber.

e. Civic Action Projects

(1) During March 500,000 \$VN FMF AFK Funds and 200,000 \$VN AFK Funds for XXIV Corps were spent by 3d Marine Division units.

f. There were 12 movies shown for 7 hours and 30 minutes. Themes used were: Cartoons, New Life For Our Hamlet, Drama #1, 4, 5, and 8, Health Spots, Peter and the Wolf, the Wound Vietnam, Magic Feather, Prowlers of the Everglades.

g. There were 114,500 leaflets, posters, and Free South newspapers distributed in Quang Tri Province.

h. Forty-nine VC/NVA rallied through the Chieu Hoi Program in Quang Tri Province.

i. This month ground broadcast teams have been on eight operations with 4th Marines and 1st Brigade, 5th Mech.

j. The NVA campaign was supported with NVA oriented leaflet drops throughout Quang Tri Province. In addition, Rally and Surrender Appeals were dropped on NVA locations and infiltration routes.

k. The Quang Tri Armed Propaganda Teams were deployed throughout the 3d Marine Division AO with CAG and 2d ARVN units. The APT's were being used to conduct face to face propaganda, identify VC, gather intelligence information and provide security for Quang Tri City.

e. Food Services. During the month of March 1969 the 3d Marine Division Food Service Program consisted of 46 operational messes supported by 408 occupational field 33 Personnel. Of the total messes in operation, 31 are semi-permanent field messes housed in TFCS structures and the remaining 15 are temporary field messes. 8. Duel Blade

During March the revised CY69 construction schedule was submitted to III MAF. ARVN engineer forces made liaison and are to start construction of II generation bunkers during early April at A-2. The 11th Engineer Battalion completed the 50' alum towers at A-2 and A-1. Construction of the 54 bunkers at Vandegrift Combat Base is 99% complete. A meeting hosted by the 2d ARVN Regiment was held in early March in which they requested general engineer and material support. As a result of the meeting it was requested that they submit specific request to the 3d Marine Division in order that we may determine the extent of support we can render.

Due to mechanical problems at the MCB-7 asphalt plant no additional asphalt paving was accomplished during March on Routes #1 and #9. Bridge 9-14, which is being rebuilt, was damaged on 20 March 1969 by enemy action, work continues. It is scheduled to be completed 1 April 1969. The 11th Engineer Battalion continues to upgrade Route #561. MCB-7 commenced work on the approaches for the new bridge at Cam Lo.

Well drilling was resumed in March by MCB-7 at A-4 and by 31 March 1969 had reached a depth of 105 feet.

b. The second edition of the Division magazine, "Northern Marine," was delivered to Lieutenant RICHERT at Atsugi Naval Air Station, Japan on 26 March. Everything possible is being done to get the magazines to Dong Ha as soon as possible.

c. The Radio/TV section produced and forwarded to Headquarters, Marine Corps, 10 tape recorded radio features. Additionally, that section produced and forwarded to Fleet Home Town News Center, Great Lakes, Illinois, 148 tape recorded Mothers Day messages per request from Fleet Home Town News Center.

d. The Informational Services Personnel provided support (briefings, escorts, transportation and billeting) to 29 civilian news media representatives who visited the 3d Marine Division during March.

e. The ISO's Combat Artist produced and forwarded to CIB, III MAF for transportation to Headquarters Marine Corps, five pieces of art including pen, pencil and water color sketches as the Division's contribution to the Marine Corps Combat Art Program.

10. Staff Judge Advocate. During the month of March 1969 the Office of the Staff Judge Advocate reviewed 21 special courts-martial and 12 summary courts-martial. Seven Judge Advocates were assigned as counsel for respondents at Administrative Discharge Boards; 57 for special courts-martial; nine to act as Government and defense counsel and Invest-

igating Officers in Article 32 investigations; and three to conduct special fact-finding investigations. The Legal Assistance Officer handled 163 cases and three battalions were inspected. 2. Informal Schools: On-the-job training and contact team instruction continued to be the primary means of accomplishing technical training within the Division. The M-16 Contact Team presented 14 hours of instruction to 158 division personnel. Another 10 hours of instruction was presented on the LAAW, 81mm and 60mm mortars to 53 personnel in 4th CAG units. 2. DISEASE AND PREVENTIVE MEDICINE:

a. There were a total of 314 cases of malaria for the Division with a malaria incidence rate of 14.95/1000/month or 179/1000/year.

b. A total of 117 cases of venereal diseases were reported by the medical sections for a total incidence rate of 5.6/1000/month or 67.2/1000/year. Breakdown revealed 109 cases of Gonorrhea, 8 cases of Chancroid, 0 cases of Syphilis, and 0 cases of Lymphogranuloma Venereum.

3d DENTAL COMPANY

The 3d Dental Company provides dental support throughout the TAOR of the 3d Marine Division to personnel of the Division. In addition, it provides dental prosthetic treatment and dental repair preventive maintenance services to Navy and Marine personnel of NSA, 1st MAF and MCB units in the TAOR. Assistance to Graves Registration is provided in identification of the dead. Company personnel provide support to the Marine Memorial Children's Hospital at "D" Medical facility, Dong Ha. DENTCAPS were somewhat curtailed during the month due to increased enemy activity and mining incidents of the post-TET offensive, particularly in the Combined Action Platoons area. Active Fire Support Base support activity was continued with favorable troop response to the program. The Company was inspected by a team from Field Supply Analysis Office Three during 16-18 March. Force Dental Officer, FMFPAC, arrived in-country for annual inspection of III MAF Dental Companies on 31 March. A double-length SEAsia tropical hut was constructed at Quang Tri Combat Base CP area during the month. Upon completion of plumbing, wiring and internal finishing, this building will house an enlarged prosthetics laboratory and two operatories. Plans for construction of an additional dental facility at Elliot Combat Base were dropped and the bunker assets were diverted to Vandegrift Combat Base. This additional bunker at VCB will permit expansion of that facility in support of forward maneuver battalions.
