


PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. OVERVIEW

On 1 June, the 3rd Marine Division (Rein) was conducting four major operations and extensive reconnaissance in two separate recon zones. In the east, the 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry (Mech), USA continued Operation Massachusetts Bay. The 4th and 9th Marines, under OPCON of Task Force Hotel, continued Operation Herkimer Mountain, northwest of VCB and Operation Cameron Falls, southwest of VCB, respectively. The 3rd Marines continued Operation Virginia Ridge north of Cam Lo and the Mai Loc TAOR. Reconnaissance teams operated in each operation and throughout the two Division recon somes.

There were three significant changes in the operating areas during the month. On 12 June, Operation Utah Mesa (indicated by broken line)



commenced in the western AO. On 18 June, Operation Massachusetts Bay was terminated, and immediately thereafter, Operation Iroquois Grove commenced in the same AO with the identical mission. Then, on 23 June, Operation Cameron Walls was terminated.





2. COMMAND RELATIONS

Command relations with supporting, adjacent and subordinate units and with higher headquarters remained the same during June as in May. OPCON changes are included, chronologically, in Part III, Sequential Listings of Significant Events. Coordination between the 3d Marine Division (Rein), the 101st Abn Div (AM), and the 1st ARVN Division was maintained through the exchange of liaison personnel. An ARVN liaison team located at Vandegrift Combat Base coordinated all of the ARVN activities in the western and southern portion of the 3rd Marine Division (Rein) AO. MACV Advisory Group performed liaison functions between RVNAF and US Forces. All air, artillery and naval gunfire missions are coordinated in the 3rd Marine Division FSCC and DASO. Through direct communications with supporting units.

3. MISSIONE ASSIGNED

3d Marine Division (Rein) FMF, in cooperation and coordination with 1st and 2nd ARVN Regiments, conducts offensive operations to destroy NVA/VC main forces, VCLF, and VCI within AO, and to interdict enemy LOC's and neutralize enemy base areas within AO, conducts surveillance and interdiction of DMZ and Laotian border; assists GVN forces in the defense of Pong Ha and Quang Tri Cities; provides support for the Pacification Development Plan, other civil activities, and the GVN resources control and denial program within the AO; is prepared to provide forces in support of CIDG and resettlement areas within the AO; and is prepared to assume 101st Airborne Division (AM) task as Corps Reserve on order.





4. OPERATIONS SUMMARY

GENERAL

The Third Marine Division (Rein) continued to conduct offensive operations during June. As a result several large enemy forces took heavy casualties as Marine and Army units found them before they could strike. Only one fixed installation was hit by a ground assault during June. On 17 June the 33rd NVA Sapper Battalion, screened by the 6th Battalion, 270th NVA Regiment, attacked C-1 (YD 2167) and was repulsed by elements of 1st Battalion, 2nd ARVN Regiment with a loss of 58 men and 6 PCW's. There were only 4 friendly WIA(E).

The 3d Marine Regiment continued to operate below the central portion of the DMZ on operation Virginia Ridge. Contact was continuous throughout the month and the number of mining incidents on Poute "9 increased.

The 1th Marine Regiment continued Operation Herkimer Mountain in the northwestern sector of the Division AO. Contact with the enemy was light throughout the month.

Elements of the Minth Marine Regiment participated in four major operations during June. 2nd and 3rd Bn, 9th Marines operated in the Cameron Falls AO until the operation terminated on 232400 June. 1st Bn, 9th Marines and a task force from 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Div (Mech) commenced Operation Utah Mesa on 120001 June. The mission was to conduct offensive operations west to the Khe Sanh plain to spoil significant enemy build-ups which endangered friendly installations and lines of communication. 1st Pn, 9th Marines was relieved on 23 June by 3rd Bn, 9th Marines and moved to VCB where they stood down and prepared for embarkation to Okimoved to VCB where they stood down and prepared for embarkation to Okimawa. Elements of the 9th Marine Regiment operated throughout the month around VCB in Operation Herkimer Mountain and two companies of 2nd Bn, 9th Marines operated for one week with 3d Bn, 3d Marines in Operation Virginia Ridge.

lst Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mech) continued to operate in the eastern portion of the Division AO. Operation Massachusetts Bay was continued until its termination at 182400 June 69. It was replaced by Operation Iroquois Grove which commenced 190001 June 69 and continued throughout the month. Also, a task force under 1st Bn, 61st Infantry (Mech) operated in the Utah Mesa AO during the later half of June.

Attacks by fire remained at the same level in June as in May. There were 13h incoming incidents totaling 1622 rounds in June compared to 13h incidents for 1671 rounds in May. Again, as in May, the majority of enemy rounds, 71 incidents for 1123 rounds, fell in the northwestern portion of the Division AO.





3rd Reconnaissance Battalion operated throughout the entire 3rd MarDiv AO, but primarily in (1) the Western Recon zone, an area bordering Laos in the western portion of the Division AO, and (2) the eastern Recon zone between Task Force Hotel and 1st Brigade, 5th Inf Div (Mech) operations.

The 9th Marine Regiment Landing Team began its preparations for redeployment to Okinawa. 1st Bn, 9th Farines (Rein) is scheduled to embark on or about 15 July, 2nd Bn, 9th Marines (Rein) on or about 1 August, and 3rd Bn, 9th Marines on or about 15 August.

OPERATION MASSACHUSETTS BAY

The 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mech) continued operation Massachusetts Bay during the first half of June. Contact was light throughout the month, consisting mainly of ambushes and ranger team contacts.

1st Bn, 11th Infantry (Mech) operated from FSB Sharon and conducted search and clear operations to the southwest. Also from 12 June to 18 June, D/1/11 operated on the north bank of the Cua Viet River. A recon team from 1/11 made contact on 14 June at YD 367475 when a small enemy force detonated one of the team's claymore SFD's. The team swept the area under illumination and found 4 enemy KTA and 1 AK-47.

1st Bn, 61st Infantry (Mech) operated in the vicinity of FSB Tombstone (YD 3958) and Wunder Beach (YD 4856) and conducted search and clear operations southwest of FSB Nancy and on the north bank of the Cua Viet River. On 12 June, B/1/61 and C/1/61 returned to FSB Sharon and on 14 June, along with B/1/77, commenced moving west to the Khe Sanh plateau to operate in conjunction with the 9th Marine Regiment on Operation Utah Mesa.

1st Bn, 77th Armor operated from FSB Sharon and FSB Nancy and A/1/77 operated southwest of FSB Nancy with C/1/11.

A Troop, bth Squadron, 12th Cay operated west of RSB Tombstone until 6 June when they moved to Cus Viet. On 12 June they were relieved by D/1/11 and moved to FSB Nancy where they continued to operate until Massachusetts Bay terminated.

OPERATION IROQUOIS GROVE

1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mech)(-) commenced Operation Iroquois Grove on 190001 June 69. It was a follow up to Operation Massachusetts Bay having the same mission of preventing energy for an from entering into or egressing from populated areas, and to deny the enemy food by destroying his rice gathering force.

Friendly forces were deployed as follows. A/1/11 and B/1/11 operated from FSB Nancy, and 1/1/11 operated on the north bank of the Cua Viet River. A/1/61 and A/1/77 conducted search and clear operations southwest of FSB Nancy, while C/1/77 operated southwest of FSB Sharon.

On 21 June, C/1/11 relieved 4/1/77 southwest of FSB Nancy. At 0720, while C/1/11 mounted on tanks, was moving on a trail at YD 365372, a mine command detonated 200 meters to their front. The infantry dismounted and then received 3 RPG rounds and SAF. One tank was demaged by an NPG. There was 1 WTA(E) and 3 WTA(M). The area was searched with negative results.


Most of the contacts during the month were made by ranger teams. On 231651 June, at YD 309430, a ranger team from 1/5 ambushed 2 NVA along a trail resulting in 2 NVA(C). Both were dressed in uniforms and wore pith helmets. The team was extracted after the contact.

OPERATION VIRGINIA RIDGE

The 3d Marine Regiment continued to operate south of the DMZ and along Route #9 during June. On 1 June, 1st Bn; 3rd Marines operated from Cam Lo, A-4 (YD 1170), C-2 (YD 1364), Hill 37 (YD 08878) and C-3 Bridge (YD 1460). 3d Fn, 3d Marines operated in the northwest portion of the "irginia Tidge AC with one company at FSB Fuller (YD 0159). Search and clear operations were run continuously to prevent enemy infiltration into populated areas and to minimize attempts to interpretable to the continuously.



on? June the first encounter with enemy forces was made at YD 052628 by H Co, 2nd Bn, 3d Mar. After receiving resupply, the company moved northwest and made contact with a well dug-in enemy force. The company withdrew and called in artillery and air missions. Modevae aircraft were unable to land due to incoming mortar fire. Sporadic contact was maintained throughout the night and the wounded were brought out at first light. There were 2 MR KIA, and 12 VIA(E) as a result of this action.

on 7 June, 2nd Bn, 3d Marines conducted a holoborne assault in the vicinity of LZ Junior (YD 016h) to exploit an Arc Light mission. One POH was captured soon after the first wave landed and several groups of NVA bodies were found during the day. On 12 June, 7/2/3 at 065000 made contact with an unknown size enemy force and received incoming days rounds. After an artillery prep fire, the company assaulted the enemy position, killed 8 enemy, and captured 1 3PG launcher and 1 82mm mortar. Friendly casualties were 2 KTA and h WIA(E).


3d On, 3d Mar moved to VCB on 14 June, then to A-2 (YD 2174) on 16 June to operate within a temporary boundary extension in the 2d ATVN AC. The battalion pushed west from Route "1 during the night. At 0605, the first contact was made with elements of an NVA battalion which was withdrawing to the north after an unsuccessful attack on C-1 (YD 2167). There the enemy had lost 59 killed and 6 PCW's. I/3/3 was the first company to make contact, but soon all of the 3d Bn was in contact. At first the enemy was in small groups of 3-10 men, but by late afternoon they had consolidated and groups of 75-100 MVA were spotted by aerial observers. At 1530, the division reaction company, 6/2/9 was committed. Tater, 7/2/9 was helilifted into the area and A Co and D Co, 3d Tanks were enployed. As a blocking force to the north, 3d Dn, 3d Marines assaulted through several dug in enemy positions. Air strikes, artillery, and Naval gunfire missions were utilized throughout the day preventing a rapid enemy withdrawal and accounting for 64 MVA(6). By late evening contact was broken. The casualties sustained by 3d Bn, 3d Marines were 19 KTA, 28 WIA(P), and 13 WIA(H). They inflicted 60 NVA KTA, 31 INC, 7 CSWC, and h PCV upon the enemy for a total of 12h NVA(C). The 3d on, 3d Mar continued to search the area until 21 June, when they moved to Cua Viet for rehabilitation. F/2/9 and C/2/9 operated from C-2 and A-4 until 25 June when they moved back to YCB.

lst Pn, 3d Mar operated in the morthern portion of the AC from 26 June until the end of the month. 2d Bn, 3d Mar moved south to operate from FSB Fuller, Khe Gio Bridge, and conducted search and destroy operations north of Route 49. On 25 June, 3d Bn, 3d Mar moved from Cua Viet to operate from A-4, C-2, Cam Lo and C-3 Bridge.

The number of mining incidents along Route #9 increased during June 60.

15 vehicles were damaged by mines resulting in 3 KIA, 18 WIA(E) and 4 WIA(E).

On 4 June a 2½ ton truck was ambushed resulting in 1 KIA and 1 WIA(E). Several incidents of vehicles receiving sniper fire were reported during the month.

OPERATION HERKYMER MOUNTAIN

The 1th Marine Regiment continued to operate in the northwestern portion of the Division AO in Operation Herkimer Mountain during June. All three battalions participated with elements of the 1st Em. 9th Turnins and 2nd Em. 9th Marines also operating in the AO.

1st Pn, 4th Marines began the month operating from FSB Neville "XD 8357) and LZ Catapult (XD 8261). While two companies operated from these positions the other two companies conducted company size search and clear operations in the area. On 8 June B/1/4 moved north to LZ Beaver (XD 862648) and extracted a recon team which, due to heavy enemy automatic weapons fire, could not be extracted by air. Four helicopters were shot down in two days in the area.

2nd Bn, 4th Marines (-) operated from VCB, FSB Cates (XO 9243) and Hills 691 (XD 9244) and 950 (XD 8445) until 5 June when they helilifted to join 0/2/4 at FSB Russell (XD 9159). The three companies then began to search and clear the surrounding areas, E/2/4 to the west, E/2/4 to the east, and E/2/4 to the northern side of FSB Russell.

3d Bn, 4th Marines operated from VCB, and Elliott Combat Base, and on 5 June relieved M/2/4 at FSB Cates. The battalions operated out of these positions for the remainder of the month. 1st Bn, 9th Marines also operated out of VCB with two companies operating in vicinity of FSB Pete (XD 9758) until 12 June, when the battalion helilifted into Operation Utah Mesa. They were replaced by 2nd Bn, 9th Marines who arrived at VCB on 15 June.

The contacts made in the AO were all with small size enemy forces. H/2/4 at XD 951630 was probed twice on 15 June and suffered 1 FR KTA and 9 WIA(T). On 181038 June, at XD 9376-7, an OP from H/2/4 spotted 2 NVA moving toward their position and engaged them at 150 meters. Results were 2 NVA(C) and 3 AK-47's captured. That afternoon, H Co made contact with 5 additional NVA. Results were: 1 NVA KIA and 1 AK-47 captured.

On 21 June, the 1st Bn, 4th Marines began to move back to VCB. By 30 June the entire battalion was operating in and around VCB.

CAMERON FALLS

Operation Cameron Falls, which commenced 291000 May continued throughout most of June. 3rd Bn, 9th Marines operated at and around FSB Shepnerd (XD 9341), and 2nd Bn, (-), 9th Marines operated from Whisman (XD 9733) while one co-pany operated from Ca Lu (YD 0145).

The beginning of the month saw the most significant contacts of the operation. On 010215 June, FSB Whisman, with G Co, 2nd Bn, 9th Marines defending, was attacked by an estimated NVA Company. The attack commenced with a volley of NO fire followed by a heavy volume of RPG, rifle grenades, and satchel charges. G Co returned fire with organic weapons and artillery. As the contact broke, a G/2/9 platoon pursued the enemy. Later at 0315, an alert LP opened fire on an estimated 10 enemy who were returning for their dead. The action resulted in 3 KIA, 9 WIA(2), while the enemy lost 19 NVA(C), 1 PCW, 1 Chieu Hoi, 12 AK-17's, 2 RPD MG's, 2 RPG launchers and 1 RPK IMG.

On 5 June, K Co, 3d Bn, 9th Marines joined the rest of the 3d Bn which continued to operate around FSB Shepherd.

At 1450, on 5 June, H Co, 2nd Bn, 9th Marines initiated contact with an unknown size enemy force. This contact, at YDO20364, was the biggest contact of the operation. The company began to maneuver and killed 1 NVA. At 1530, the lead platoon came upon 2 NVA in a bivouac site and engaged the enemy, killing 1 NVA. H/3/9 then searched the area and at 1700, made contact with a large enemy force estimated at company strength using MG's, RFG's and snipers. Turing the initial contact 1 NVA was killed. At 2027, a CH-46 was shot down attempting to lift medevacs cut. All personnel were rescued, except for a gunner whose body was recovered several days later. The company, consolidating on the high ground, was probed continuously throughout the night. On the morning of 6 June, E Co, 2nd En, 9th Harines lifted into the contact area and commenced clearing operation to the northwest. H Co remained in moderate contact during the day. The totals for the contact were 11 KIA, 39 WIA(E), 27 WIA(M), 34 NVA(C), 13 IWC and 1 CSWC.

On 11 June, the CP and 2nd Bn, 9thMar lifted into FSB Henderson, which had been secured by the overland movement of H Co, 2nd Bn, 9thMar. After several days 2ndBn, 9th Mar were lifted to VCB.

3rd Bn, 9th Marines continued to operate south of WSB Shepherd until 23 June, when they were lifted into Operation Utah Mesa to relieve 1st Bn, 9th Marines.

OPERATION UTAH PESA

Since mid-May, sensor reports, aerial observers and reconnaissance patrols gave indications that substantial energy forces had mayed into and through the Khe Banh plateau. Joint Wask Group Guadaleanal, consisting of the 1st Bn, 9th Marines, and Pask Force Mustang from 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Fiv (Mech), along with 2nd and 3rd Bn of the 2nd ARVN Regiment, was deployed to interdict them.

Operation With Mosa commenced on 120001 June with the helilift of 1st Bn, 9th Marines into LZ Bison (XD 9346) and FSB Cates (XD 9243) and 3d Bn, 2nd ARVN Regiment into FSB Quantico (XD 8742). The mission was to conduct offensive operations west to the Khe Finh plain in order to locate, cupture and/or destroy the enemy, his supplies, equipment and material; to secure the west flank of the 3rd arrive it; to speil a significant enemy build-up which endangers the security of fixed installations and vital lines of communications within the 3rd harrive AO. The 2nd APVN Regiment operated in a securate AG, generally to the north of the W.S. forces while the Facine/Pray units, gradually moved southwest.

On 13 June, 2nd 3n, 2nd ARVN Regiment, lifted into LZ Cokava (YD 90h9) and began to operate be the west. On 15 June 0/1/9 moved to LZ Horn (XD 89h8) to guard the flank of Task Force Hustang, a lst Brigade, 5th Inf Div mechanized infantry and armor column, which woved west on Route "9. By 16 June, TF Mustang, consisting of 0/1/61, 7/1/61 and 8/1/77, was operating from LZ Horn to the area south-west of the Sanh.

The enemy reacted to this thrust by conducting a series of night attacks against allied units, the first being on 18 June. Between 0335-0530, B/1/61, in their night defensive position at XD 837379, was



attack d by an estimated 80-100 MVA. The attack commenced with a heavy volume of SAF and 60mm mortars from the west. This was followed by TPO fire and a ground attack. The enemy broke through the perimeter and B/1/61 became involved in heavy close combat. At 0430, air support arrived and by 0530 the enemy had withdrawn leaving 11 bodies inside the wire and 30 outside. One POM was captured. A sweep of the area produced 7 FVC, 5 CS.E, and 100 lbs of satchel charges. B/1/61 lost 11 KTA and 15 WIA(E) as a result of the action.

On the same day at 1030, a squad size recon patrol from 3 %, 1st Bn, 9th Mar engaged an entrenched, camouflaged, and well armed Mar unit. The enemy initiated contact with a .50 cal MG and killed 3 Marine a and wounded 3 immediately. The patrol aggressively assaulted the postern, knocked out the gun, and killed 1 MVA. The enemy began to outflank and squad, which withdrew while the remainer of the platoon retrieved the dead and wounded. Soon the entire platoon was under fire and the rest of the company assaulted the enemy position. After the objective was secured the company was taken under fire from the nouth. Fir and articlery were used to silence the enemy fire. The action resulted in 9 KTA, 9 WIA(E), and 5 WIA(M), while the enemy lost 35 MVA(C).

On 20 June, 1st Bn, 9th Marines operated in the vicinity of LZ Snapper (XD 8h3h), 2d Bn, 2d A2VI Regt operated north of Khe Sanh, and 3d Dn, 2d A2VI Regt operated from LZ Teal (XD 80hh). B/1/61 and 1/1/9, in coordinating operations at XD 827385, were hit by 3 ground attacks during the morning hours. All three were repulsed with the help of gunships, air strikes, and artillery. Casualties were 2 KIA, 12 WIA(E), 27 NVA (C) and 2 PCV.

on 23 June, 3d on, 9th Marines relieved 1st on, 9th Marines and made contact during the night. K/3/9, at XD 868361, was attacked by an estimated 2 MVA platoons. A search at first light revealed 29 MVA(*) 13 AX-17's, 2 MTP MO's and 1 RPC. Wriendly casualties were 3 MTA and 11 MVA(*). K/3/9 was attacked again on the night of 26 June and this time there were no friendly casualties, while the enemy suffered 12 killed, 6 AX-17's, 2 SKS's,1 RPD, 1 RPC and 2 flame throwers captured.

B/1/61 began to operate from LZ Snapper on 25 June and C/1/61 and B/1/77 continued to move south until they reached LZ Saigon (XD 8127). On 26 June with 3d On, 9th Marines (-) operating east of LZ Snapper, B/1/61 and I/3/9 moved to FSB Tenaru (XD 8235). At 270600 June, FSB Tenaru was attacked from three directions by 2 NVA Companies. The enemy used mortars, RTG's, MG's and SAF. Friendly casualties were 3 KIA, 17 WIA(E), while the enemy lost 22 NVA(C), 1 POW, 9 RPG's, 1 RTG, 20 NVA-1/7's, 1 SKS and 1 Russian radio captured.

There were several mining incidents during the month. A total of 4 tanks and 2 APC's hit mines and resulted in 2 KTA's and 15 WIA(T).

The contact was heavy throughout the month. The enemy initiated many of the contacts by attacking night defensive positions, but only once did they penetrate beyond the defensive wire.

6. INTELLIGENCE SUMMARY

1. General Enemy Situation

- as the previous month. These units, the 126th Naval Sapper Regiment, the 33d Sapper Battalion, the 138th, 31st, and 270th Independent Regiments in the Eastern DMZ; the 88th and 36th Regiments of the 308th Division and the 27th Independent Regiment in the Central DMZ and the 246th Independent Regiment in the Western DMZ remain confirmed. There remained indications that the 102d Regiment, 308th Division had moved into the area of the Central DMZ. Supporting these units are at least three (3) Artillery Regiments, the 84th (-), the 164th, and possibly the 204th.
- b. Operations CAMERON FALLS and UTAH MESA confirmed the 24th Regiment and the 20th Sapper Battalion, 304th Division in the west central and southwestern portion of the Division AO.
- c. In the Coastal Lowlands, the 7th Front, composed of the 6th Battalion, 812th Regiment, the 808th and 811th Battalions and elements of the K-10 Sapper and K-32 Rocket/Mortar Battalions, continues to operate in the vicinity of Base Area 101.

2. Enemy Activity

- a. General. During the month the enemy conducted 16 ground attacks, 3 probes, 4 ambushes, and 20 attacks by fire. The enemy expended 1,163 rounds against 3d Marine Division units. Of these 160 were rocket rounds, with 112 being directed at fixed U.S. installations (i.e. QTCB, DHCB, VCB). Friendly units operating just south of the IMZ continued to bear the brunt of enemy mortar fire by receiving approximately 646 of the 983 fired, while the majority of the enemy ground attacks were directed at allied forces operating in the southwestern portion of the AO.
- b. Enumeration. On 1 June 1969, G/2/9, in defensive positions at FSB Whisman, vicinity XD 972333, was attacked by an estimated company size unit composed of elements of the 5th and 6th Battalions, 24th Regiment. Enemy losses in this action were 19 KIA, 1 POW, and 1 Chieu Hoi. The next day a Marine Reconnaissance Team operating about 6 kilometers south of Khe Sank made contact with elements of the 4th Battalion, 24th Regiment. On 5 June 1969, in the vicinity of YD 019365, H/2/9 made contact with a company size enemy unit. Contact continued through the 6th culminating in a company size attack by the enemy.
- c. Also on the 5th of June, a Division Aerial Observer sighted numerous rockets in a firing position in the vicinity of YD 249752, 48 140mm rockets were destroyed. In the same general area and on the same day elements of the 2d ARVN Regiment captured 35 140mm rockets.

- d. Attacks by fire during the first half of June were less than that experienced during the latter part of May or the latter half of June. The most significant rocket attack during this period occurred on the 6th of June when Vandegrift Combat Base received 17 107mm rockets followed by 8 more 107mm rockets on the 7th.
- e. Enemy ground attacks, which had decreased after the contact on the 6th, increased in intensity with an enemy attack on C-1 on 17 June. This attack and the related contact emperienced by units of the 3d Marine Regiment was the heaviest of the month. At approximately 0100M on 17 June elements of the 33d Independent Sapper Battalion attacked C-1. The attack was a complete failure with the enemy suffering 59 KTA and 6 PW's. Slightly to the north, units of the 3d Marines made contact with elements of the 6th Battalion, 270th Regiment and in a day long series of contacts accounted for 138 enemy KTA and 4 PW's. Air and artillery accounted for 64 of the total KTA's.
- f. Enemy initiated attacks continued with a sapper attack on elements of B/1/61, vicinity XD 837379, on 18 June/and again on 20 June. These two attacks cost the 20th Sapper Battalion, 304th Division a total of 66 dead and 1 PW.
- g. Meanwhile on 21 June, the 2d Battalion, 1st ARVN Regiment made contact with an estimated enemy size company in Base Area 101. A subsequent search of the area of contact produced 13 enemy bodies and 14 weapons.
- h. Attacks by fire during the later part of June were highlighted by Vandegrift Combat Base and adjacent units receiving 33 rockets during the period 20-28 June. Other in allations receiving rocket fire during the last half of June were (ang Tri Combat Base-3, and Dong Ha Combat Base -23.



2. TRAINING:

- a. A special sensor emplacement and readout school was conducted by the Ground Surveillance School from 10-13 June 1969 for one officer and five enlisted men of CTE 194.1.5.1. The training was required to prepare personnel for sensor operations in the Da Nang Area.
- b. The Ground Surveillance Section conducted a five day Surveillance Equipment Operators Course from 15-20 June 1969 for fifteen Marines and Soldiers.

3. LIAISON:

5. COLLECTIONS AND REPORTING:

- a. Electronic Surveillance Teams
- (1) Surveillance Team Alpha detected five enemy personnel targets and fired four missions, expending 90 rds 81mm, 80 rds 105mm, and 50 rds 40mm with unknown results.
- (2) Surveillance Team Bravo detected six enemy personnel targets and fired four missions expending 18 rds 81mm, 10 rds 90mm, and 9 rds 4.2mm with unknown results.
- (3) Surveillance Team Charlie detected fourteen enemy personnel targets and fired eight missions expending 128 rds 105mm, 128 rds 5m, 40 rds 61mm, resulting in three secondary explosions.



- (4) Surveillance Team Delta detected six enemy personnel targets and fired six missions expending 168 rds 105mm, 171 rds 81mm, and 220 rds 40mm, resulting in eight secondary explosions.
- (5) Surveillance Team Echo detected one target with negative clearance to fire.
- (6) Surveillance Team Foxtrot detected sixteen targets and fired fifteen missions expending 169 rds 81mm, 6 rds 60mm, 4 rds 105mm with unknown results.

6. SENSOR OPERATIONS:

- (1) In the DMZ during June, sensors detected 112 targets and 47 missions were fired in response. The fire missions included 700 rounds 105mm, 169 rounds 155mm, and 2 air strikes. Battle damage assessment was not obtained from sensor fire missions in the DMZ.
- (2) In the Duel Blade area of the 3rd Marine Division AO, sensors detected 413 targets and 137 missions were fixed in response. The fire missions included 1063 rounds 105mm, 149 rounds 4.2mm, 325 rounds 175mm, and 316 rounds 155mm. Battle damage assessment for the month included seven enemy probable KIA who were detected by sensor string 107 on 27 June. An AO called to the location of the movement adjusted the artillery fire on the enemy troops and also reported the assessment.
- (3) Elsewhere in the Duel Blade Area the 2nd ARVN Regiment sensor string 105 detected one platoon and one squad sized target on the night of 16 June 1969. Later that evening the enemy force, which was detected earlier by sensors, was picked up by radar and night observation devices as it prepared to attack C-1. The attack was thoroughly defeated with 59 NVA KIA (C) and only four ARVN troops slightly wounded.
- (4) In the Duffel Bag Area, 265 targets were detected and 79 fire missions cleared for fire with 429 rounds 175mm, 66 rounds 155mm, 12 rounds 105mm, and 10 rounds 4.2mm fixed in response. Results are unknown, however, Reconnaissance Team "CHURCHVIALA", inserted on 5 June to verify sensor activity along Route 926, made contact with 12 NVA, killing 4 (C). The team was extracted with negative casualties.



10. FIRE SUFFORT COORDINATION

A. Ceneral

- (1) The coordination of air, artillery, and naval gunfire throughout the 3d Harine Division continued in accordance with established procedures during June 1967.
- (2) Target analysis and fire planning efforts were concentrated in the south western portion of the Davisian AC and the area contiguous to the central and eastern DMZ because of operations and significant enemy activity in these areas.

- (1) Air. A total of 2339 serties dropped 5646.5 tons of ordnance in support of the 3d Marine Division.

- d. Food Service. During the month of June 1969 the 3d Marine Division Food Service Program consisted of forty-eight (48) operational messes. Of the total messes in operation, thirty-one (31) are semipermanent field messes housed in TFCS structures and the remaining seventeen (17) are temporary field messes varying in size from seventy-five (75) to one-thousand (1000) man capacity. Subsistence provided Army, Navy and Marine Corps personnel of this command at Dong Ha and Quang Tri areas averaged 28,497 rations daily, while support for Vandegrift and Elliot Combat Base averaged 5,277 rations. Vandegrift and Elliot Combat Base receive support for two "R" ration type meals daily. The Meal, Combat, Individual is utilized only where operational requirements preclude serving the III MAF Master Menu.
- e. Supply. The high incident of Malaria during the month created an urgent requirement for Malaria Control items such as insect repellent and mosquito nets. The insect repellent is now readily available in substantial quantities. The shortage of polaroid cameras and M-60 machine guns was alleviated to a great extent by receipts of twenty-three (23) polaroid cameras and fifteen (15) M-60 machine guns during the month. There were also one-hundred-sixteen (116) 13" typewriters received which filled all T/E deficiencies for that item.



Widening and placing rock base continues. 48,334 cubic yards of laterite fill, 7,171 tons of rock, 1,400 gallons of soil binder and 2,100 gallons of asphalt were placed on Route #1 from YD353512 to the border. The redecking of bridge 1-1 completed. General maintenance to entire road net continues. Bridge and culvert repair was accomplished as required.
- b. Maintenance and Upgrading of Route #9. The maintenance and upgrading of Route #9 continues. A total of 13% miles of asphalt has been laid on Route #9 up to 30 June 1969. Mine damage has been repaired as required. Culverts damaged due to enemy action repaired or replaced. Bypasses repaired and improved as required.
- c. Maintenance/Upgrading of Route #561. Maintenance and upgrading of Route #561 is continuous. Upgrading work on Route #561 was halted during the month of June due to higher priority assignments. Only required maintenance was accomplished.



- d. Upgrading of Route #560. The upgrading of Route #560 to a class 30, single lane all weather road with turn outs from Quang Tri YD335337 to BeBang YD332628 and a class 30 two lane all weather sand cement road from BoBang to Cua Viet YD339682 has been tasked to the 14th Engineer Battalion (U.S. Army).
- e. Land Clearing. Land clearing operations from C-4 to Oceanview was completed during the month of June.



b. Discase and Preventice Medicine

- (1) There were a bottal of 617 cases of malaria for the Division during the member of June with a malaria incidence rate of 28.35/1000/month or 340.20/1000/year.





- f. There were 34 movies shown for 23 hours. Themes used were: Cartoons, New Life for Our Hamlet, Drama #1, 4, and 8, Health Spots, Peter and the Wolf, The Wound, Vietnam, Magic Feather, Prowlers of the Everglades.
- g. There were 25,359 lebilots, posters, and Free South Newspapers distributed in Quang Tri Province.
- h. Fifteen NVA/VC rallied through the Chieu Hoi Program in Quang Tri Province.

- j. The NVA campaign was supported with NVA oriented leaflet drops throughout Quang Tri Province. In addition, Rally and Surrender Appeals were dropped on NVA locations and infiltration routes.
- k. The Quang Tri Armed Propaganda Teams were deployed throughout the 3d Marine Division (Rein) AO with 4th CAC and 2d ARVN Regiment units. The APT's were being used to conduct face-to-face propaganda, identify VC, gather intelligence information and security for Quang Tri City.

Addendum to G-5 Input to Command Chronology for June 1969 taken from the Quang Tri Province Report for the Month.

1. Overall Status of Pacification Effort: The level of enemy activity in the populated area of Quang Tri Province remained low during the month and the general climate for pacification continued to be favorable as, it has been the past several months. Enemy initiated incidents during the reporting period in the populated eastern portion of Quang Tri totalled 22. War casualties among civilians, were 14 KTA and 33 WTA, and an additional one (1) NBC (K) and seven (7) NBC (W).

It was noted that a few hamlets formerly completely abandoned, now have a few residents again who have returned of their own volition. The increasing confidence of the people was also demonstrated by several farmers and fishermen, in their willingness to unearth their savings and to exchange them for hard goods such as irrigation pumps, tractors, and boat motors. Another small but noteworthy change is that the curfew in Quang Tri City has been moved up from 2000 hours to 2100 hours.

The announcement of the redeployment of the 3d Marine Division's 9th Regimental Landing Team, was received calmly by Quang Tri GVN officials. Most officials say that the people are concerned, as they themselves are, that infiltration from North Vietnam will increase.

On 27 June, at a ceremony at Province Headquarters, the Province Chief distributed 43 checkbooks to all the Deputy Village Chiefs for Administration in the Province from Class B villages. The remaining 28 Class A villages whose Commissioners for Economy and Finance are not yet certified, expect to receive their checkbooks sometime in July. The Province Chief also distributed fifteen boat motors at Xuan Khanh fishing hamlet in Gio Linh District (near Cua Viet) on 28 June.

The remains of 101 victims of Viet Cong terrorism murdered during Tet 1968, were uncovered in a series of shallow graves near the Gia Dang resettlement area between 27 May and 19 June. A large reburial ceremony was held on 20 June which was attended by the Province Chief and several hundred friends and relatives of the victims. Coffins, burial cloth, and related items were provided by the GVN. The ceremony was filmed and televised by the Hue TV station on 22 June.

MAT's continue to be assigned as stated in the May report. MAT personnel status is two officers and four NCO's understrength. Another three MAT team members are due to depart within thirty days.

The following awards were returned from FMFPac approved: one Navy Gross, 13 Silver Star Medals, one Distinguished Flying Gross, five Navy and Marine Gorps Hedals, 37 Bronze Star Medals, two Air Medals, 42 Navy Gommendation Hedals, and 54 Navy Achievement Medals. Additionally 570 Purple Hearts were issued.

- 2. Informal Schools. On the job training and contact team instruction continued to be the primary means of accomplishing technical training within the Division. B. TASK FORCE HOTEL OPERATING PROCEDURE

Test force Botel is organized with a light operating headquarters to include the G-1, G-2, G-3, G-4, PSOS, Air Idaison Section, Communications officer and a DAN in direct support. 21. DOWN IN BASE COCKDINATOR

A. General Overview

- 1. The office of the Base Coordinator, Dong Ha Combat Base, is organized into two principal sections, Base Facilities and Base Defense. The duties of both sections remain unchanged.
- 2. The major events having an effect on Dong Ha Combat Base during the period of 1-30 June have been the embarkation of the first increment of RLT-9 and the initial planning and movement for the consolidation of the Division CP, Dong Ha Combat Base.
- 3. Three men assigned to RIT-9 from the Base Coordinator's TO resulted in the loss of the Transient Center NCO and the Combat Base Range NCO. The deployment of RIT-9 resulted in the movement from Dong Ha Combat Base of all, or elements of "C" Co., 3rd SP Bn.; 12th Marines; 11th Engr Bn. and FLSG-B. This movement made facilities available and initiated the movement of elements of Ho Bn and 3d Marines to come aboard the base.
- 4. The Base Coordinator exercises operational control through the Base Defense Coordinator of the defense of the combat base. The defense is accomplished by dividing the base perimeter into ten sectors. Daytime patrols are utilized within the base area of operations.

The Base Reaction Force for the month of June was made up of two plateons totaling 80 men from FLSG-B, two quad .50 trucks, four .40mm dusters and an 18 man plateon from 1/44 Artillery, USA.

5. At least ten patrols have been run each week throughout IMCB AO. The patrols have been without incident. Vietnamese nationals in the area are checked for proper ID and the terrain is carefully inspected regularly to detect possible enemy activity. The Provisional Rifle Squad has been providing additional security at the Dong Ha Boat Ramp.


D. Fire Support

During the period 1-30 June 1969 155mm Fire Support was obtained from the 4th Bn, 12th Marines, located in grid square YD 2159. All fires were coordinated through the Base Defense bunker and under the supervision of the watch officer. A minimum of 12 night defensive fires are employed every night to give the base maximum coverage. Also the Seabee unit located on base provides organic support with an 81mm mortar. Besides these fires, M-79 and small arms are used to H & I and are under the supervision of the sector commander with the permission of the watch officer at the base defense bunker. 40mm H & I was fired 5 times during this 30 day period. The dusters fired twice a night with an average of 50 rounds per firing. Illumination for the period was moderate.

E. Communications

During the month of June CommCo, HqBn supplied two OF-2511 s to man the switchboard 24 hours a day, thus providing complete communications at all times.

Base Defense supplemented the ground surveillance team with a PRC-25 when needed. A PRC-25 was provided for use of the various units that were conducting fam firing at the rifle range.

G. Incidents



232120 June 69 DHCB received three 107 rockets of which two hit "A" Co's area resulting in 3 WIA and one hit in "F" Btry, 26th Arty (Army) inflicting one WIA(E). A fire mission was called on YD 183549 and adjusted by a recon team in the vicinity.

291935H June 69 MCB-62 received one round of 107mm rocket which hit "A" Co without demage and two rounds of 107mm rocket hit two living huts; at CBMU-301 resulting in 3 WIA(E). The rockets were fired from the southwest.

The Communications Center experienced no significant communications problems during the month of June and supported operations within the Quang Tri Combat Base Area of Operations without difficulty.




During the reporting period 1535 personnel fired on the Quang Tri Combat Base Rifle Range.

CONTACTS AND INCIDENTS

- a. At 060515H June 1969, vicinity YD 271547, an ambush from 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mech), received automatic weapons fire from 5 enemy triggering the ambush. The ambush returned small arms fire and two APC's from 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mech) were sent to reinforce the ambush position. A sweep of the area produced 1 VC KIA (C), 1 AK-47, 2 RPG boosters, 1 B-40 rocket round, 2 ponchos, 3 60mm mortar rounds and 500 lbs. of rice captured. While searching the area a surprise firing device was detonated resulting in 3 WIA (E).
- b. At 092245H June 1969, vicinity YD 280552, a 40mm track vehicle in direct support of Juliet Sector firing H&I's accounted for two secondary explosions and three people were observed running from the area in a northwesterly direction. 4.2" missions were fired on suspected enemy withdrawal routes; 45 rounds illumination, 36 rounds high explosive and 2 rounds white phosphorous were expended. The area was swept the following morning with negative results.
- c. At 101700H June 1969, vicinity YD 280525, a security patrol for a survey team working west of the Ammunition Supply point observed 2 VC with 1 AK-47 while checking out a stream bed. One VC was washing his clothes at the time. The point man threw fragmentation grenales and reconned by fire. The enemy fled to the West. A search of the area produced 4 trenches between 20 and 75 meters long, estimated to be 3 months old, 1 wallet, 11 letters, 1 citation, 1 green uniform, 1 pair of sandals, 2 hammooks, and a small amount of tea and medicine. 4.2" morter missions were fired throughout the area during the night and the following night an ambush was employed in the area with negative results.

- d. At 10240CH June 1969, MAG-39 received five 122mm rockets resulting in 1 WIA (E), 2 WIA (M), two generators destroyed, one living but destroyed, and slight damage to the southwestern edge of the runway. Crater analysis confirmed rockets came from 3400 mils direction from Quang Tri Combat Base. Counter rocket fire was delivered with 223 4.2" mortar rounds and 241 150mm rounds expended. Condition 1 was set from 2400-0100H. At 0100H Condition III was set. Aerial Observer was on station throughout the night.
- e. At 120930H June 1969, vicinity YD 274543, a reconnaissance patrol from 3d Tank Battalion found 3 60mm mortar rounds, one 8x8' bunker and two trenchlines. The area appeared to have been used recently. The ordnance and bunker were destroyed by the patrol.
- f. At 121005H June 1969, vicinity YD 284522, a security patrol for a survey team found 1 60mm mortar round west of the base. Explosive Ordnance Disposal personnel were dispatched and destroyed the ordnance in place.
- g. At 121415H June 1969, vicinity YD 283523, a security patrol for a survey team, west of the base found the following gear: 2 ammunition cans of rice, 1 poncho, 1 shirt and trousers, 5 documents, 1 mortar fuse, 1 block of TNT, 12 blasting caps and 15 feet of detonating cord. The gear was brought to Base Defense Combat Operations Center. Ordnance was destroyed by Explosive Ordnance Disposal personnel.
- h. At 182044H June 1969, vicinity YD 265538, an ambush from lat Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mech) made contact with an estimated 6 VC, killing 1 VC, while suffering 1 WIA (E). Three AFC's and security plateon from 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mech) were sent to reinforce the ambush and 61mm illumination was fired in support of the medevac.
- i. At 18222CH June 1969, Quang Tri Combat Base received 3 rounds of 122mm rockets. The rounds impacted in an open area near Mobile Construction Battalion 128. Flashes were reported at 250 degrees at a distance of 10,000 meters. Counter rocket fire was delivered on YD 2048 from C-1, LZ Sharon, and Dong Ha Combat Base. Condition I was set. At 232CH, Condition III was set. There were negative casualties or damage.
- j. At 240930H June 1969, vicinity YD 271544, a reconnaissance patrol from 3d Tarks found the following gear: 1 RPG round, 1 utility trousers and 1 battle dressing. The gear was destroyed in place. Extensive 4.2" morter H&I's were fired in this area.





BASE DEPENSE DIPROVENENTS

- a. In all sectors, more fighting holes between bunkers and additional barriers of tanglefoot, triple concerting and double apron were constructed. Also, ald sundbags were replaced by new sandbags throughout the perimeter.
- b. At Sectors A, B, and C, RPG screens were emplaced in front of almost all bunkers. Also at Sector A, urinals were installed in the bunkers. The reactionary force bunker was rebuilt, the 60mm mortar pit was completed and new blast walls were constructed behind 4 bunkers at Sector B. In Sector D, the gates, leading through the wire were improved, a watch tower was constructed and a tripod for a starlight scope in the tower, was partially completed. Additional trip flares were employed and emplacements were built to keep the 60mm morter rounds in the rear of bunker #8. At Sector F, additional olaymores were employed and at Sector G, a new ammunition bunker was constructed. Urinals were installed in each bunker at Sector H. and a cable across the stream bed, reinforced with concerting wire to protect the bridge, was constructed at Sector I. In Sector K. barriers were constructed in the creek, and at Sector L, an amminition bunker was constructed near the C.P.

BASE FACILITIES IMPROVEMENTS

- a. On 17 June 1969, Construction Battalion Maint mance Unit 301 began repairs on the Quang Tri Combat Base air strip. The repairs included a 100 feet extension to the present runway and were completed on 22 June 1969.
- b. On 30 June 1969, the 3d Engineer Battalion completed a new access road through the Headquarters Battalion area to LZ Boss.

REACTION FORCE DRILLS

- During the reporting period two orientation drills and three reinforcing drills were conducted at Quang Tri Combat Base.
- (1) At 101630H June 1969, the 3d Engineer Battalion reaction force received an orientation briefing and tour of the entire MAG-39 area.
- (2) At 111805H June 1969, the 3d Engineer Battalion reinforced sectors Red and Blue at MAG-39.
- (3) At 121630H June 1969, Service Company, Headquarters Battalion, received an orientation briefing and tour of the entire MAG- 39.



- (4) At 13180 H June 1969, Service Company, Headquarters Battalion, reinferced sectors Red, Blue and Green at MAG 39.
- (5) At 262100H June 1969, the 3d Engineer Battalion reaction force reinforced sectors had and Blue at MAG-39.

DTILIZATION OF CS POWDER

a. At 090700H June 1969, vicinity YD 256536, fixed wing dropped CS powder in support of Quang Tri Combat Base. The chemical was employed on a known enemy position and to deny the enemy use of a stream bed west of quang Tri Combat Base.

HERBICIDE OPERATION

a. On 16 June 1969, Base Operations, Quang Tri Combat Base requested a herbicide operation to aliminate vegetation west of Quang Tri Combat Base and east of MAG-39, along the Song Thach Han.

The new post office on the old LSA was opened on 23 June.


D. Training

1. Personnel.

The Third Marine Division NBC Section is currently staffed with the following personnel:

Maj. J. E. DECOURSEY, OIC Magt. F. L. BAKER, NGOIC SSgt. J. H. NORRIS, NBCNCO Sgt. A. D. PHTRICKO, NBCNCO

The Section is located at the Third Marine Bivision Headquarters (Forward) within the G-3 Section at Dong Ha Combat Base, Republic of Vietnam.

2. Operations.

Through the efforts of MSgt BAKER, SSgt NORRIS and Sgt PETRICKO, the Division had a 100 gal. field expedient herbicide spray apparatus constructed for use in helicopter operations. This apparatus will be employed in controlling vegetation growth and defoliation operations in and around defense positions, combat bases and those areas where increased observation and ground clearence is a military necessity. A helicopter operation is planned for the Vandergrift Combat Installation area in early July. This will be the first all Marine personnel herbicide operation conducted by the Third Marine Division.

a. General.

At all levels of command increased emphasis is being placed on use, control and maintenance of the Field Protective Mask, M-17, the employment of chemical agents and methods of searching and clearing tunnels and bunker pomplexes using chemical agents and the safety factors involved in such operations. Four accidental deaths have occured within the Division due to units not understanding the safety precautions necessary when working with ohemical agents in turnel and bunker searches.

b. Traildust.

The NBC Section continues to supervise and control Traildust missions within the Division AO. During this month all the Division's major target areas for Traildust operations were subtargeted by the Section to meet the new target boundary limitations established by higher authority. This subtargeting will allow for better coverage of target area. Although the Division is now limited to 5 priority targets per month, it is

receiving a higher percentage of actual missions flown than in the past few months.


3. Training.

a. General.

Units of the Division have increased instructional time allowed for presentations on NBC subjects. A 52 hour training period was conducted by Headquarters Battalion in gas chamber drill with 402 Marines of the Battalion participating. Momitor/Survey and Decontamination team instruction periods were held for team members of 3rd Engineer, 3rd Tanks, 3rd Shore Party and 3rd Reconnaissance Battalions during the month. Instruction covered team operations in survey, monitoring and decontamination, radiac equipment and operations and the Field Protective Masks, M-17. During Division units COATIP instruction periods, all newly assigned personnel received instruction on the Field Protective Mask, M-17. Such training has proven beneficial to these Marines by increasing their understanding of the importance of a proper fitting mask and its need of care and maintenence.

b. Contact Teams.

The Division NBC Contact Team continues to assist those units without NBC school trained personnel in all phases of instruction on NBC subjects. The team further assists all units by supervising the control, care, maintenence and inspection of all Division NBC equipment on both a formal and informal basis. A representative of the NBC Section is also a member of the G-3 Inspection team which conducts the Commanding General's Inspection of Division units.
