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PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. OPERATIONS/TRAINING

a. During the period of this report the 3d Combined Action Group continued to participate in action against the Communist ⁹Aggressors in Thua Thien Province, Republic of Vietnam. In accordance with III Marine Amphibious Force Order 3121.4B a total of 4337 man hours of formal training was conducted for USMC elements of the CAPs and 5534 man hours of formal training was conducted for the Popular Force Soldiers. During the month of November the Group accounted for 13 VC/NVA KIA, 8 POW, 32 Detainees, 6 Infrastructure, 4 Hoi Chanh, and 18 weapons captured while suffering only 2 USMC WIA(N/E).

b. Combined Action Company 3-5 was activated by splitting Combined Action Company 3-2 in half. Combined Action Company 3-5 now occupies the northwestern half of Phu Loc District, to the Houng Thuy District line, along the major route of communication, Highway 1. Five additional platoons were activated. One in Huong Tra District, two in Phu Vang District, and two in Houng Thuy District. Platoons were activated from existing assets. It was not necessary to request additional personnel to fill these units.

2. LOGISTICS SECTION

a. The significant events during the month of November included the coordination of the construction of a bridge in CAP 3-1-6's area in Houng Thuy District, allowing adequate access to CAP 3-1-6 and 3-1-8 for a bridge was constructed for 3d CAG by the 3d Bridge Company, 3d Marine Division. Also during the month, logistical support was provided (coordination, transportation, and ammunition) in order for all CAPs, Marines and Popular Force Soldiers, to FAM fire their organic weapons at rifle ranges.

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b. The transition from Marine to Army logistical support continued.

The receipt of Class IV supply support from the Army 1002 Supply and Service Co., 26th General Support Group commenced.

c. On 10 November, the Marine Corps Birthday, nine birthday parties were planned and accomplished, allowing all CAPs and Headquarters to participate in the ceremony and refreshments. Refreshments; cake, ice cream, ice, etc., were provided by MAG-36 and FLSG-A. All organic vehicles were utilized for a two day period, delivering refreshments and moving Marines to the ceremony sites on a coordinated schedule which allowed either the CO, XO, or S-3 to visit one of the parties.

3. On 7 Nov68 a church at Loc Dien, CAP 3-5-4 at coord YD974056 was repaired through continued efforts of villagers and CAP personnel.

4. On 071930H Nov68 at coord ZD141001 CAP 3-2-2 while on patrol made contact with 3 VC.

Results: 1 VC KIA, 1 AK-47, miscellaneous equipment.

5. On 9 Nov68 the villagers of Duong Pham located at coord YD799194 constructed with the help of Marines from CAP 3-1-7 constructed a dispensary.

6. On 10 Nov68 at coord ZD041023 CACO 3-5 was activated.

7. On 11 Nov68 at coord YD190240 CAP 3-1-6 was activated.

8. On 112000H Nov68 at coord YD915106 CAP 3-1-5 while starting to set in ambush, sighted 40 to 50 VC. Small arms were exchanged.

Results: 1 VC KIA, 1 AK-47

9. On 112230H Nov68 at coord YD905110 CAP 3-1-3 ambushed 2 VC.

RESULTS: 1 VC KIA, Miscellaneous equipment.

10. On 111315H Nov68 at coord YD881188 CAP 3-1-1 found, destroyed several bunkers and mortar positions. One PF and 1 USMC were wounded by shrapnel 1 in the process of destroying the above mentioned emplacements.

RESULTS: 1 PF WIA(N/E), 1 USMC WIA(N/E)

11. On 112000H Nov68 at coord YD915106 CAP 3-2-1 ambushed an unknown number of VC.

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RESULTS: 1 VC KIA, 1 PF WIA(N/E), 1 AK-47

12. On 112040H Nov68 at coord YD849309 CAP 3-3-4 spotted a boat which came to shore at 3-3-4's ambush site. Two persons were apprehended as detainees. Boat was searched.

RESULTS: 2 Detainees, later released.

13. On 120630H Nov68 at coord YD980053 CAP 3-5-4 picked up 1 Hoi Chanh.

RESULTS: 1 Hoi Chanh, 1 AK-47

14. On 120800H Nov68 at coord ZD087004 CAP 3-2-1 1 Hoi Chanh rallied to CAP 3-2-5.

RESULTS: 1 Hoi Chanh, 1 AK-47, 3 AK-47 magazines, 75rds 7.62MM.
2 Demolition Kits.

15. On 121910H Nov68 CAP 3-3-5, ambush received 2 incoming grenades.

RESULTS: 1 USMC WIA(N/E)

16. On 13 Nov68 a landing zone was built for the dispensary at CAP 3-2-1 in the village of Cau Hai at coord ZD085008

17. On 130630H Nov68 at coord YD962109 CAP 3-5-2 received report of 3 VC bodies. Patrol picked up same and the mother of one of the dead VC.

RESULTS: 3 VC KIA, 1 Detainee, later released.

18. On 132025H Nov68 at coord YD785236 CAP 3-1-6 ambushed 1 VC.

RESULTS: 1 VC KIA, 1 M-16, 3 satchel charges, 1 M-26 grenade.

19. On 140730H Nov68 at coord YD875182 CAP 3-1-1 picked up 1 Hoi Chanh.

After he refused to cooperate the District Chief classified him POW.

RESULTS: 1 VC POW

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20. On 151830H Nov68 at coord YD822311 CAP 3-3-3 picked up one person who allegedly stated that he had been in North Vietnam and would return there in six months.

RESULTS: 1 Detainee, later released.

21. On 152115H Nov68 at coord YD980060 CAP 3-5-4 1 PF and 1 Militiaman died when a claymore which they were standing in front of detonated. Interim report stated that a PF had knocked the firing device off a wall, causing detonation. The incident is being investigated by GVN Officials.

22. On 160700H Nov68 at coord YD915102 CAP 3-5-1 picked up 6 VCI. Turned them over to the National Police at Truoi Bridge.

RESULTS: 6 VCI

23. On 160800H Nov68 at coord YD934084 CAP 3-5-2 picked up 2 VCS.

RESULTS: 2 VCS still detained.

24. On 160800H Nov68 at coord ZD195013 CAP 3-2-2 1 Hoi Chanh rallied with weapon

RESULTS: 1 Hoi Chanh, 1 SKS, 100 Rds 7.62, and miscellaneous equipment.

25. On 160900H Nov68 at coord ZD182003 CAP 3-2-3 1 Hoi Chanh rallied with a weapon.

RESULTS: 1 Hoi Chanh, 1 SKS

26. On 161230H Nov68 at coord YD806204 CAP 3-1-7 Hoi Chanh rallied.

He would not cooperate and was reclassified.

RESULTS: 1 VC POW

27. On 161300H Nov68 at coord YD977075 CAP 3-5-3 was led by a village Official to 10 VCS.

RESULTS: 10 VCS, later reclassified innocent civilians.

28. On 17 Nov68 through the combined efforts of villagers and Marines of CAP 3-2-2 at coord ZD139009 a market place was reclassified as a village of Nuoc Ngot

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29. On 181200H Nov68 at coord YD804245 CAP 3-1-6 found 1000lb of rice in two bunkers. The rice and the bunkers were destroyed.

RESULTS: 1000lbs of rice, 2 bunkers destroyed.

30. On 192045H Nov68 at coord ZD145005 CAP 3-2-2 ambushed approximately 10 VC. Fired at the VC who were dragging 3 bodies away. Swept area.

RESULTS: 1 VC KIA, 1 AK-47, 3 AK-47 Magazines and miscellaneous equip.

31. On 20 Nov68 in the village of Pho Tay at coord YD783265 CAP 3-3-1 with the joint efforts of the villagers constructed a dispensary.

32. On 221030H Nov68 at coord YD809227 CAP 3-1-6 received sniper fire, searched and destroyed 2 bunkers, further search uncovered another bunker, with 4 VC.

RESULTS: 4 VC POW, 1 AK-47, 1 45 Cal Grease Gun, 1 B-40 Rocket Launcher, 3 B-40Rds.

33. On 221000H Nov68 at coord YD916100 CAP 3-5-1 picked up 4 VCI and the following items: 28 cans of liquid milk, 25 cans of sardines, 2 cans of salad oil, 20 packs of noodles, 20 lb of sugar, 2 rolls of water proof cloth, 100lb of rice.

RESULTS: 4 VCI

34. On 231030H Nov68 at coord YD805235 CAP 3-1-6 found 2500lb of rice.

RESULTS: 2500lb of rice sent to Huong Thuy District Headquarters.

35. On 24 Nov68 a village office in La Chu at coord YD686255 was repaired by villagers and Marines of CAP 3-4-2.

36. On 24 Nov68 at coord YD820250 CAP 3-3-8 was activated.

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37. On Nov68 in the village of Loc Son at coord YD933085 CAP 3-5-2, a market place was repaired with efforts of the villagers and Marines.
38. On 25Nov68 construction of a school was completed by CAP 3-2-2 at coord ZD139009 and the villagers of Nuoc Ngot.
39. On 251150H Nov68 at coord YD795233 CAP 3-1-6 was led to 1 US Carbine by a Hoi Chanh.

RESULTS: 1 US Carbine

40. On 27 Nov68 through combined efforts of Marines of CAP 3-5-2 at coord YD933085 and villagers of Loc Son construction of a school was completed.
41. On 271330H Nov68 at coord YD833237 CAP 3-1-8 made contact with 2 VC. Contact was broken and the area swept.

RESULTS: 2 VC POW, 1 US Carbine

42. On 291100H Nov68 at coord AT886967 CAP 3-2-5 in coordination with USA swept a new life hamlet. Seven persons^N~~al~~ fled in boats and were apprehended.

RESULTS: 7 Detainees, later released.

43. On 291530H Nov68 at coord YD885970 CAP 3-2-5 was given information by children which led to the discovery of 8 90mm rounds, and 2 booby traps.

RESULTS: 8 90mm Rds, 1 Claymore booby trap, 1 M-79 booby trap.

44. On 301205H Nov68 at coord AU856022 CAP 3-2-4 patrol discovered 19 one gallon cans of napalm, 1 Rd HE 82mm dud, 1 M-14 AP Mine, 2 90mm Rds.

RESULTS: All items taken to 3-2-4 for further disposition.
