(a) On 12 September 1965, Detachment #1, 1stFSR arrived on Okinawa with 23 Marine Officers, 800 Marine Enlisted men, 1 Navy Officer and 6 Navy Enlisted men. These personnel were absorbed into the units of this command and the detachment was officially deactivated.

(b) On 8 November 1965, Bulk Fuel Company dropped ~~to 00 strength~~ and all personnel were assigned to Ration Company.

(c) On 20 November 1965, a total of 170 enlisted personnel in various Occupational Fields were transferred to the 3d Marine Division/1st Marine Air Wing to fill billets in those units vacated by the transfer of 17 year olds and personnel in basic MOS's not eligible for duty in the Republic of Vietnam.

(2) Administration

(a) On 14 September 1965, DPP #25 (1stServBn, 1stMarDiv) augmented DPP #31, 3dFSR. Platoon consisted of 1 WO, 21 enlisted and data processing equipment.

(3) Intelligence. Subversive propaganda received by a member of this command on 25 November 1965 was forwarded to the Naval Counterintelligence Support Unit, NAF, Naha, Okinawa on 27 November 1965. Item received was Vietnam Day Committee Form 2017-J dtd 160ct65.

(4) Training

(a) Training program is slanted toward Vietnam Operations, with emphasis on the tactics and techniques employed by the Viet Cong.

(b) Training in Occupational Fields 2500 (Field Wire Course, Field Radio Course) and 2300 (Basic Ammunition Technician Course) is being conducted in schools operated by the 1st Marine Division.

(a) On 20 August 1965 operational control of 3d Force Service Regiment was transferred to CG FMFPac vice CG 3dMarDiv.

(b) On 20 August 1965 Sub Units #1, 2, and 3 of H&SCo, H&SBn, 3dFSR were activated in the Republic of Vietnam. Personnel in these Sub Units are under the administrative control of 3dFSR, but are under the operational control of the Force Logistic Support Group, III MAF. 3dFSR is responsible for rotations and replacements of these personnel.

(b) 9766 work orders were received by Maintenance Battalion during the reporting period with 9361 work orders completed.

(c) On 29 August 1965 the contractor broke ground on what is to be the new DPI/Stock Account Building, marking the beginning of the construction originally scheduled for FY 1965 within the "H" Area, Camp Sukiran. At the end of this reporting period, 31 December 1965, the FY65 MCon Project, expansion and construction in the "H" Area, Camp Sukiran is 1.3% completed.

(d) On 1 September 1965 the CO 3dFSR became a Planning Estimate Holder from CG FMFPac rather than an OPTAR holder from CG 3dMarDiv. Also at this time the CO 3dFSR became an OPBUD holder from CG FMFPac rather than an OPBUD holder from CG 3dMarDiv.

(e) On 14 September 1965 DPP#31, 3dFSR acquired a second 1401 computer system.

(f) On 1 November 1965 a 1401 computer system was exchanged between DPP #25, 1stMarDiv and DPP #31, 3dFSR. DPP #31 assumed responsibility from DPP #10, DA NANG, RVN of four 026 card punches located on island at Stock Account, Baggage Center, Fiscal, and Disbursing.

(a) On 31 August 1965 the Little League project under the direction of SgtMaj POLETE was completed with six teams of the original eight playing. Mr. SHIMABUKURO, principal of the Kitatama Primary School expressed his appreciation for the uniforms and equipment furnished the schools.

(b) Fifty wooden stools were built by 3dFSR for the Kitatama Primary School in September.

(c) Two loads of scrap lumber was provided in October to the village of Chatan-Son for use by the schools in the construction of stools and tables.

(d) As a continuing project, Maintenance Battalion has been working with the people of Hamahiga Island on the repair and maintenance of schools in the village of Hama and Higa. They are also working on the replacement of power poles and rewiring of the islands power distribution system. CWO-2 CORBETT, the OIC for this project is also working with the doctor on the island to provide assistance to him in obtaining medicines through private means to help combat skin diseases prevalent among the children on the island.

(e) On 18 December 1965, LtCol BURGER and 107 of his Maintenance Battalion Marines held a Christmas Party for about 700 children on the island. A picnic lunch was served and gifts were distributed to 200 of the smaller children. Battery powered portable PA Systems and pump organs were purchased by the Battalion and presented to the island schools.

(f) The Ryukyus Exchange gave a number of tricycles to the Chaplains office to be given to Okinawan children. Five of these were given to people on Hamahiga Island in connection with the Christmas party that was being planned by 3dFSR. Four were given to Mrs. SHIZUKO SHIROMA who cares for a number of orphaned children. Two were given to the Protestant Chaplain at NAF, Naha, Okinawa to be given to children of two needy families with which they were working.

(g) At Christmas the Protestant Chapels took a special offering (\$124) to be sent to the 3d Marine Division Chaplains in Vietnam for helping Vietnamese families.
