

- 28 Jul 1967: 1 Marine completed Vietnamese Language School conducted by the Army at Camp Sukiran.
- 9 personnel from III MAF completed the Basic Ammunition Technician Course.
- 11 personnel from III MAF completed the Basic Infantry Weapons Repair Course.
- 29 Jul 1967: 137 personnel qualified on the rifle range.

29 Jul 1967: 5 personnel completed NCO Leadership School at Camp Hansen.

b. Command Relations and Visits

1-31 Jul 1967: There were no Command Briefings or Visits during this period.

c. Equipment, Maintenance and Construction

1-31 Jul 1967: Approximately 30 hours of IBM Engineering changes were installed on the System 360 Computer.

d. Logistics

1-31 Jul 1967: Approximately 2600 lbs of ecclesiastical gear was received for distribution to Chaplains in RVN.

It has been determined that sufficient facilities are not available at Camp Hauge for the Vehicle Storage Platoon of Supply Battalion to perform their present mission. A well designed and equipped motor pool, located adjacent to the REX Storage Area, is currently utilized by the Comm-Elec and Motor Transport Maintenance Companies of Provisional Service Battalion, 9th MAB. Continued observation of the area indicates limited use of the parking and shop areas within and adjacent to building # 4108. A reassignment of the lot and building to 3d Force Service Regiment would provide much increased utilization of the facility with the following specific advantages accruing to 3d Force Service Regiment:

a. Increased storage and exercise space for both Motor Transport and Engineer Equipment, plus access to a double wash rack and a double grease rack. Building #4108 would provide office space, a tool room, four large well lighted stalls, plus two additional stalls with doors which could be utilized as for the storage of OVE and OVM equipment. The Commanding Officer of Camp Butler is researching this request.

1-31 Jul 1967: It has been requested that a special project for building #2141, Camp Hansen, be accomplished to facilitate the use of the fuel injection test machines at Ordnance Maintenance Company, Camp Hansen. The Maintenance Officer's endorsement returned the work request, with the concurrence of the originators, for reconsideration, citing the amount and type funds required to accomplish the work. In view of the urgency of this requirement, it has been requested that this work request be given an emergency priority.

1-31 Jul 1967:

It has been requested that a special project be submitted from Camp Butler requesting that central air conditioning be installed in the new Regimental Headquarters building of this Command. Command and control of 3d Force Service Regiment is discharged through the Regimental Headquarters which operates from this building. The 3d Force Service Regiment functions in support of operations in the Republic of Vietnam and is capable of providing support for all WestPac ground forces. Supply and maintenance functions of this Command are conducted on a multi-shift, seven (7) days a week basis, with supporting services as required. Therefore, it has been requested that action requested be accomplished as expeditiously as possible.

It was requested and granted from Camp Butler that this Command be assigned building #T-401, Camp Hauge. This facility would be used as a training facility for the training of personnel attached to this Command from units deployed in the Republic of Vietnam.

It has been requested that a traffic signal be installed at the exit gate on Highway #1, "H" Area, Camp Foster and that it be controlled by the Marine sentry on duty at this post. There are approximately 79,891 registered motor vehicles on the island excluding military vehicles. This figure is increasing at the rate of 1,050 vehicles per month.

e. Budget and Finance

8 Jul 1967:

Captain M.C. CLINE, Assistant Comptroller, FMFPac, who was here for the purpose of acting as HQAC/FMFPac Liaison in developing and assisting in implementing necessary revisions to financial procedures (as related to operations of WestPac Units, 3dFSR Fiscal Office and 3dFSR Data Processing Platoon) returned to FMFPac Headquarters.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Total incoming and outgoing Message Center traffic was 29,759 messages, 653,033 AUTODIN cards and 6,993 AUTODIN messages.
2. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles travelled 146,562 miles, hauled 36,201 short tons of cargo, and transported 21,661 personnel.
3. The Baggage Facility received 5,478 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 6,626 pieces. There remains a total of 69,221 pieces of personal baggage for storage. The shipping and receiving platoon receipted for 12,157.7 measurement tons of incoming cargo on 13 ships and shipped 9,135.8 measurement tons of outgoing cargo on 5 ships during the month.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY
