

15 personnel from III MAF completed the Basic Ammunition Technician Course.

1 Marine completed 16MM Projection School at Camp Hansen.

113 personnel qualified on the rifle range.

5 Aug 1967: General Wallace M. GREENE, CMC, visited 3d Force Service Regiment.

1-31 Aug 1967: Approximately 15 hours of IBM Engineering changes were installed on the System 360 Computer.

d. Logistics

1-31 Aug 1967: Approximately 9230 pounds of ecclesiastical gear was received for distribution to Chaplains in RVN. Approximately 8043 pounds of gear was shipped to RVN. A total of 15 shipments.

1-31 Aug 1967: During the period of 1-31 August 1967, Truck Company continued its daily supporting activities by providing an average of 17 M36 Trucks, 7 M54 Trucks, 1 M55 Truck, and 18 M52 Tractor-trailer Semis, while accomplishing the following:

During the month of August 1967, Truck Company continued to provide 1 A160 Van for the 3d FSR Shuttle Bus Service; throughout the month, the Bus carried a daily average of 49 personnel.

On 29 August 1967, Truck Company discontinued the 3d FSR Taxi Service, as that service was taken over by Camp Butler Motor Transport.

During the month of August 1967, Truck Company continued to fulfill the ammunition transporting requirements of 3d FSR.

1-31 Aug 1967: The regular quarterly meeting of the Minor Construction Review Board met on Friday, 28 July 1967 and again on Monday, 31 July 1967. Only \$7,060 was initially available for projects for the first quarter (Jul-Aug-Sep) of this fiscal year; however, \$5,535.00 in two (2) previously approved projects deferred from FY67 were still pending and have now been funded. These two projects are:

(1) Construction of synchronization ramp at Ordnance Maintenance Company, Maintenance Battalion, 3d Force Service Regiment.

(2) Install fluorescent lighting and wall outlets and new circuits in M37/M43 Rebuild Shop, Motor Transport Maintenance Company, Maintenance Battalion, 3d Force Service Regiment.

1-31 Aug 1967:

3d Force Service Regiment Work Request #F-064-68 requested the installation of four (4) electric outlets for the battery chargers for electric forklifts. Commanding Officer, 3d FSR letter 4/RRP/jab 11014 of 3 July 1967 set fourth priorities of installation for sixteen (16) electric outlets that were requested on Work Request #S-216-67. Priorities are hereby established for the four (4) outlets requested on Work Request #F-064-68:

It has been requested and approved that a Test Firing Pit, building 2159, Camp Hansen be constructed. With the increase of small arms repair presently encompassing .50 caliber machine guns and the requirement to test fire all M-16A1 rifles prior to issue, it is urgently required that the proposed test firing pit, discussed during conference of 24 August 1967 between Maintenance Officer, Camp Butler and S-4, 3d Force Service Regiment be approved on a priority basis.

A redistribution of rented forklifts has been made to meet requirements in other areas. It is now intended to keep the subject vehicles in the following areas on a continuing basis:



1. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 11,416 messages, 258,836 Autodin cards, and 2,241 Autodin messages.
2. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles travelled 154,323 miles, hauled 40,166 short tons of cargo and transported 24,214 personnel.
3. The Baggage Facility received 6,685 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 9,465 pieces. There remains a total of 67,277 pieces of personal baggage for storage. The shipping and receiving platoon receipted for 3,286.1 measurement tons of incoming cargo on 12 ships and shipped 6,080.4 measurement tons of outbound cargo on eight ships during the month.

1. During the period of 1-31 August 1967, Truck Company continued its daily supporting activities by providing an average of 17 M36 Trucks, 7 M54 Trucks, 1 M55 Truck, and 18 M52 Tractor-trailer Semis, while accomplishing the following:
