

- 1-30 Sep 1967: During this period, Truck Company continued its daily supporting activities by providing 14 M36 Trucks, 5 M35 Trucks, 1 M55 Truck, 15 M52 Tractor-trailer Semis, 46 M38A1 Jeeps, 8 M37 Personnel Carriers, 1 A160 Shuttle Bus, 3 Buses, and 1 Miller Bus, while accomplishing the following:

During the month of September 1967, Truck Company continued to provide 1 A160 Van for the 3d FSR Shuttle Bus Service; throughout the month, the Bus carried a daily average of 52 personnel.

During the month of September 1967, Truck Company continued to fulfill the ammunition transporting requirements of 3d FSR.

1-30 Sep 1967:

Present planning is to move the Regimental Headquarters (less CommO, S-3 and S-4), Headquarters and Service Battalion Headquarters and Supply Battalion Headquarters on Saturday afternoon and Sunday, 25-26 November 1967, or 2-3 December 1967. Final date to be announced as soon as established. Planning dates for movements of the other elements are tentatively planned as follows:

The completion of buildings 1138, 1142 and 1128 and subsequent occupancy by 3d Force Service Regiment functions now resident in buildings 1148 and 1149 will leave the latter two (2) buildings partially vacant and available for other use. It is the intention of this Command to utilize these buildings fully as follows:

Building 1148

Lower deck, east end - Clothing Cash Sales; adjacent to Clothing Cash Sales, an area for the offices of the Regimental S-2/3 and S-4 and the Regimental Police Sergeant; the remainder of the lower deck, for use by Fleet Stock Account. Upper deck - conversion to Staff NCO quarters.

Building 1149

Upper deck, east end - Camp Foster Amateur Radio Station, 1,333 square feet. Lower deck, east end - Camp Foster Correctional Custody Unit, 1,669 square feet. Remainder of building, both floors - conversion to Staff NCO quarters. Liaison with Camp Smedley D. Butler Public Works Officer indicates that \$10,000 is purposed for increased lavatory/head facilities in building 1149. No funds are earmarked for other conversion work in either building.

1-30 Sep 1967:

It has been requested from the Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific that authorization be granted for open purchase of a commercial Shoe Refinisher, for installation in the General Supply Maintenance Shoe Repair Shop, building 1126, Camp Foster. The subject item is essential to the mission of this Command for the proper operation of a Depot type shoe repair facility. This repair facility will service all Marine Units permanently based on Okinawa and will be more economical and practical for overall day to day operations than a tactical mobile unit.

- 1-30 Sep 1967: Maintenance Battalion presently has on backorder one shoe repair shop, trailer mounted, FSN 3520-251-6983. This shop when received, will be utilized to service all rotating BLT's while they are on island. This means of service will be more expeditious for servicing BLT'S in that the shop can be moved to any on-island location necessary to perform shoe repair. During the three month period prior to 1 July 1967, the General Supply Maintenance Shoe Repair Shop repaired approximately 2,100 pairs of shoes and boots. When a BLT is on-island the work load is tripled and present facilities will prove inadequate.
- 1-30 Sep 1967: The assignment of building 1130, Camp Foster, to Maintenance Battalion for use as a calibration laboratory is approved, subject to exigencies of the 3d Force Service Regiment at the time of the reassignment. At the present time, it is anticipated that the reassignment may be made approximately 15 January 1968. This date is based to enable the Data Processing Installation to complete all year-end computer action prior to the relocation of the computers.
- The Packing, Packaging and Preservation Section of Supply Battalion and the Office Machine Repair Section of Maintenance Battalion, 3d Force Service Regiment uses Trichloroethylene and Perchloroethylene as degreaser solvent in their cleaning and preservation operations. The use of these compounds presents a potential health hazard to the operators of the degreasers. The operators currently are equipped with respirators, rubber gloves and aprons. It has been requested that the services of the Camp Butler Safety Officer and the Camp Butler Preventive Medicine Officer be enjoined to conduct a joint survey to provide a technical evaluation and recommendations to enable this Command to correct and eliminate health and safety hazards that may exist.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 15,835 messages, 272,915 Autodin cards, and 2,765 Autodin messages.
2. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles travelled 125,003 miles, hauled 35,133 short tons of cargo, and transported 32,656 personnel.
3. The baggage facility received 4,931 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 7,018 pieces. There remains a total of 66,372 pieces of personal baggage for storage. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 665.7 measurement tons of incoming cargo on 12 ships and shipped 7,388.8 measurement tons of outbound cargo on five ships during the month.


