

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of October, modification of projects, fire protection and traffic safety were primary areas of concern.

The 3d Force Service Regiment is fulfilling its mission to provide sustained logistical support to all FMF WestPac Forces from Okinawa, while conducting comprehensive internal training programs.

1-31 Oct 1967: Regimental Chaplain conducted eight counselling sessions with Marines.

14 men were trained by the Data Processing Platoon in SPS programing language, RPG programing language, and COBOL programing language.

3 Oct 1967: 6 Marines completed a course of instruction on first and second echelon maintenance for field generators.

6 Oct 1967: 137 personnel qualified on the Rifle Range.

14 Marines from III MAF completed the Basic Ammunition Technician Course.

16 Marines completed the Regimental $\frac{1}{4}$ -2 $\frac{1}{2}$ -5 Ton Drivers School.

13 Oct 1967: 20 Marines completed the Regimental Commercial Forklift School.

20 Oct 1967: 8 Marines completed the Basic Computer Concepts School.

2 Marines completed the Report Program Generator I and II Schools.

20 Marines completed the Regimental Commercial Forklift School.

18 Marines from III MAF completed the Basic Infantry Weapons Repair Course.

9 Marines from III MAF completed the Basic Ammunition Technician Course.

123 personnel qualified on the Rifle Range.

2 Marines completed Vietnamese Language School.

25 Oct 1967: 2 Marines completed COBAL I and II School.

5 Marines completed NCO Leadership School at Camp Hansen.

b. Command Relations and Visits

12 Oct 1967: Major General R. L. MURRAY, G-3, Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps visited 3d Force Service Regiment.

c. Equipment, Maintenance and Construction

1-31 Oct 1967: Approximately 40 hours of IBM Engineering Changes were installed on the System 360 Computer.

d. Logistics

1-31 Oct 1967: Approximately 791 pounds of ecclesiastical gear was received for distribution to Chaplains in RVN.

Approximately 2,292 pounds of gear was shipped to RVN. A total of 4 shipments.

1-31 Oct 1967: This Command has been authorized to perform 5th echelon rebuilding of small arms in response to demands from Southeast Asia. Operations are established in existing facilities but will not meet the levels of efficiency and quality desired until additional equipment procedures and facilities are developed. Assistance has been requested to obtain copies of the U.S. Army Weapons Command Depot Maintenance Work Instructions for overhaul of the following weapons:

Rifle, 7.62mm, M-14
Rifle, 5.56mm, M16A1
Machine Gun, 7.62mm, M-60

In addition, data is needed on permanent Proof Firing Facilities to test fire these weapons and Targeting and Accuracy Facilities utilized to insure quality assurance in both these areas.

It has been requested that two (2) Butler Buildings be erected and butted to the east end of the Preservation, Packaging and Packing Facility, building T-126, "H" Area, Camp Foster to allow for expansion of subject facility. The adverse effects of climatic conditions on supplies and equipment requiring storage in the Republic of Vietnam has increased the need for a Care-in-Storage program. The requirements of this section have more than doubled since initial planning for the facility began. The average number of items processed monthly through this facility is 22,000 - 25,000 small items and 700 - 800 heavy pack type items. These items vary in size from engines for heavy tracked vehicles to bayonets carried by the individual Marine.

1-31 Oct 1967: The current entrance to the Camp Foster "H" Area off Stilwell Drive consists of a makeshift temporary approach up and over the existing curb onto a temporary coral topped roadway into the area. As a result of this entrance being used by 3d Force Service Regiment trucks, including semi-trailers on an around the clock basis for the movement of materials between "H" Area locations and outside storage lots on the northside of Stilwell Drive, movement to and from the Motor Pool plus use by contractor vehicles this entrance has become the most heavily used of all entrances to the "H" Area. To date, only minor accidents have resulted from this condition, but corrective action is badly needed to assist in an orderly flow of traffic and minimize the accident potential at this point. It has been requested that consideration be given to widening Stilwell Drive at that point sufficiently to provide a left hand turn lane while allowing through traffic to pass on the north side. It has further been requested that the curbing be removed and replaced with asphalt leading into the "H" Area off Stilwell Drive.

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period of 1 - 31 October 1967, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the Regimental logistic mission.

a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 13,539 messages, 253,432 autodin cards, and 2,481 autodin messages.

b. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 84,297 miles, hauled 18,144 short tons of cargo, and transported 15,313 personnel. During the previous month of September, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 125,003 miles, hauled 35,133 short tons of cargo, and transported 32,656 personnel. This obvious differential is attributable to the utilization of the Oruku Trucking Company on a commercial hire basis. As a result Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 33 percent less in October than in September; they transported 53.1 percent less personnel and hauled 48.4 percent less tonnage. Gross tonnage, however, (including that hauled by the Oruku Trucking Company) increased from 35,402 short tons in September to 50,137 short tons (est.) in October, an overall increase of 39 percent.

c. The Baggage Facility received 7,121 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 7,998 pieces. There remains a total of 68,235 pieces of personal baggage for storage. These figures are generally constant. Baggage procedures, however, are continually being reviewed.

d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon received for 10,977 measurement tons and 167 short tons* of incoming cargo on 22 ships and shipped 6,281 measurement tons and 1,138 short tons* of outbound cargo on three ships during the month. For the previous month of September the Shipping and Receiving Platoon received for 7,147 measurement tons of incoming cargo on 12 ships, and shipped 10,948 measurement tons of outbound cargo on five ships. In October Shipping and Receiving received for 54 percent more gear, and shipped outbound cargo 43 percent less than in September. Increased receipts may be attributed to MUMMS.

* Short tons refer to that cargo shipped by air and parcel post.
