1-30 Nov 1967: Approximately 1,718 pounds of ecclesiastical gear was received for distribution to Chaplains in RVN.

Approximately 2,175 pounds of gear was shipped to RVN. A total of 11 shipments.

1-30 Nov 1967: During this period, Truck Company continued it's daily supporting activities by providing an average of 13 M-36 Trucks, 6 M-35 Trucks, 1 M-55 Truck, 13 M-52 Tractor-trailer Semis, 47 M-38A1 Jeeps, 8 M-37 Personnel Carriers, 1 A160 Shuttle Bus, 3 Buses, and 1 Miller Bus.

1-30 Nov 1967: During this period, Truck Company continued to provide 1 A160 Van for the 3d FSR Shuttle Bus Service; throughout the month, the Bus carried an average of 59 personnel.

1-30 Nov 1967: Third Force Service Regiment message 150345Z October 1967 requested authority to assist the Force Logistics Command by providing forty-seven (47) warehouse trailers, T/A No. 31765 plus four (4) warehouse tractors, T/A No. 31760 on a temporary loan basis for a period of 60 to 90 days. CG, FMFPAC message 180073Z October 1967, approved. Accordingly, it has been requested that the quantities of equipment be air shipped, priority 999, to Force Logistics Command, RUC 28301 upon receipt of this letter.

Authority was requested to close this Command's Clothing Cash Sales outlet in building 3618 located at Camp Schwab. In anticipation of a return of the rotating BLT's to Okinawa, it is requested that the subject building and fixtures be maintained in a standby status for the use of 3d Force Service Regiment, if and when future demands increase. The mobile van would prove inadequate in case of an influx of personnel of BLT proportions.

During a recent liaison visit between the Force Logistic Command, G-4 and representatives from this Headquarters (S-4), it was determined what excess organic equipment on hand at 3d Force Service Regiment was required to fill deficiencies for Force Logistics Command. A formal letter was submitted to Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific,

to transfer excess assets to Force Logistics Command and was approved. It has been Regimental policy that all shipments of 3d Force Service Regiment organic equipment be coordinated through this Headquarters (S-4). In order to maintain organic supply records and to provide proper justification for release of organic property for future reference, it is necessary for this policy to be maintained. Accordingly, Battalion Commanders have been instructed to obtain disposition instructions from this Headquarters (S-4) before loaning or invoicing to another organization, any item of equipment organic to this Regiment.

1-30 Nov 1967: The M series T/E authorized 3d Force Service Regiment twenty-eight (28) Y-40, 4,000 pound forklifts. Headquarters and Service Battalion, 3d Force Service Regiment, proposed T/E 3448 dated 3 July 1967 recommended an increase to fifty-eight (58). Thirty-five (35) forklifts are on hand at the present time.

The repair parts problem is directly related to the age and hours of usage. The maximum usage of forklifts is eight (8) years or 9600 hours of use. Six (6) Y-40 forklifts were manufactured in 1957 and are beyond the maximum years of utilization. Seventeen (17) rental 4,000 pound forklifts are now in use and augment the organic Y-40 forklifts in support of Regimental requirements.

Camp Butler Order P3000.1N establishes the Emergency Electrical Power Plan for natural disasters. Primary reliance is based on pre-installed emergency generators. Current construction in Camp Foster of buildings 1138, 1142, and 1144 fall within the requirements for buildings requiring pre-installed emergency power requirements for Camp Command Posts, Communication Facilities and refrigeration for Medical storage. It has been requested that action be taken to provide external switch boxes and hookup facilities for emergency power generators for buildings 1128, 1138, 1142, and 1144 into the current construction contracts if not now provided.

This Command has experienced considerable delay in receiving notification of changes in typhoon conditions. It was requested that a more expedient means of communication be found for dissemination of typhoon information. Lack of communications equipment is a very limiting factor in the Regiment at the present time. 3d Force Service Regiment at the present has four (4) PRC-25's, two (2) PRC-47's, four (4) MRC-38's and one (1) MRC-109. Loss of any of this equipment precludes effective communications.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period of 1-30 November 1967, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the Regimental logistic mission.

a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 12,647 messages, 249,369 autodin cards, and 2,056 autodin messages.

b. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 87,983 miles, hauled 18,232 short tons of cargo, and transported 17,655 personnel. During the previous month of October, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 84,297 miles, hauled 18,144 short tones of cargo, and transported 15,313 personnel. These figures are relatively constant.

c. The Baggage Facility received 10,087 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 8,148 pieces. There remains a total of 70,234 pieces of personal baggage for storage. These figures are generally constant.

d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 13,422 measurement tons and 215 short tons* of incoming cargo, and shipped 12,836 measurement tons and 1,615 short tons* of outbound cargo. For the previous month of October the Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 10,977 measurement tons and 167 short tons of incoming cargo and shipped 6,281 measurement tons and 1,183 short tons of outbound cargo. It received 18% more measurement tons and 22% more short tons of incoming cargo; shipped 51% more measurement tons and 27% more short tons of outgoing cargo than the previous month.

e. There were 76 Forklifts available per day as compared to 72 in October. During November, Forklifts were dispatched a total of 9256.1 hours and were utilized 5712.9 hours, a utilization rate of 61.7%. During the month of October the utilization rate was 50.3%.

* Short tons refer to that cargo shipped by air and parcel post.


