d. Logistics

1-31 Jan 1968: Approximately 800 pounds of ecclesiastical gear was received for distribution to Chaplains in RVN.

Approximately 200 pounds of gear was shipped to RVN. A total of 2 shipments.

1-31 Jan 1968: During this period, Truck Company continued it's daily supporting activities by providing an average of 12 M-36 Trucks, 6 M-35 Trucks, 1 M-55 Truck, 16 M-52 Tractor-trailer Semis, 48 M-38A1 Jeeps, 7 M-37 Personnel Carriers, 1 A160 Shuttle Bus, 3 Buses, and 1 Miller Bus.

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1-31 Jan 1968: During this period, Truck Company continued to provide 1 A160 Van for the 3d FSR Shuttle Bus Service; throughout the month, the Bus carried an average of 54 personnel.

1-31 Jan 1968: Increased demands to store vehicles has exhausted the improved open storage capacity assigned to this Command. Present requirements beyond capacity include the following programs:

Truck, $\frac{1}{4}$ ton Replacement Program, 1442 trucks, $\frac{1}{4}$ ton M-151's are stored for a period of two (2) to four (4) months.

Maintenance Balance Program. Approximately 300-400 items of equipment are being retrograded from the Force Logistics Command for repair and return to Vietnam. Future requirements include the Major End Item Remote Storage Concept. Under this concept, a requirement to store an additional 250 items of equipment may be imposed.

In view of the requirements set forth above and the desirability of utilizing the REX Area space to meet these requirements, it is therefore requested that the area be assigned to this Regiment.

Insufficient warehouse facilities at the 3d Force Service Regiment creates an inability to store material in readily identifiable stock locations so that efficient requisition processing can be accomplished.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period 1-31 January 1968, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the Regimental logistic mission.

a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 15,569 messages, 366,852 autodin cards, and 2,729 autodin messages.

b. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 92,510 miles, hauled 19,325 short tons of cargo, and transported 17,809 personnel. During the previous month of December, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 90,276 miles, hauled 18,190 short tons of cargo, and transported 19,489 personnel. Commercial hire cost was \$11,624.00.

c. The Baggage Facility received 16,082 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 9,116 pieces. There remains a total of 72,279 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon received for 11,728 measurement tons and 46 short tons of incoming cargo, an aggregate decrease of approximately 3% from previous month's totals. 13,576 measurement tons and 1,664 short tons were shipped, constituting an increase of 50% over December 1967. 4

e. There were 83.2 forklifts available per day as compared to 56.7 in December. During January, forklifts were dispatched a total of 15,924 hours and were utilized 7,429.7 hours, a utilization rate of 47%. During the month of December, the utilization rate was 53.9%. Commercial rental cost was \$13,420.00.


