d. Logistics

1-29 Feb 1968: Approximately 2200 pounds of ecclesiastical gear was received for distribution to Chaplains in RVN.

Approximately 3100 pounds of gear was shipped to RVN. A total of 3 shipments.

1-29 Feb 1968: During this period, Truck Company continued it's daily supporting activities by providing an average of 12 M-36 Trucks, 6 M-35 Trucks, 1 M-55 Truck, 16 M-52 Tractor-trailer Semis, 48 M-38A1 Jeeps, 7 M-37 Personnel Carriers, 3 Buses, and 1 Miller Bus.

During this period, Truck Company continued to maintain operational control of 3 Buses and 1 Miller Bus. The buses provide a daily transportation service to 3d FSR personnel to and from places of duty and on and off post.

1-29 Feb 1968: There are ten messhalls in the Camp Foster area. These were built and equipped by the U.S. Army during the period 1954-1956 and were designed to be 120-man Company messes. There has apparently been no extensive renovation of these messhalls since they were built. One messhall has been temporarily closed due to a shortage of food service personnel. Seven are now feeding approximately 300 men each and two are feeding approximately 150 to 220 men each. Due to design, age and over-utilization, these facilities are now inadequate from the standpoint of sanitation, capacity and good food service practices. In addition to being in poor condition, plant account equipment is adaptable to modern food service practices and lacks capacity to support the number of troops now being fed. Plant account equipment cannot be replaced by modern equipment now being produced from Camp Butler messes because the design and layout of these small galleys is not compatible with the equipment being procured for larger messes. Utilities, especially electricity, are not adequate to operate higher capacity modern equipment. The structures are in need of painting and repairs to deck and walls as required.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period 1-29 February 1968, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the Regimental logistic mission.

a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 13,581 messages, 363,606 autodin cards, and 2,505 autodin messages.

b. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 111,481 miles, hauled 16,444 short tons of cargo, and transported 15,227 personnel. During the previous month of January, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 92,510 miles, hauled 19,325 short tons of cargo, and transported 17,807 personnel. Commercial hire cost was \$12,407.11.

c. The Baggage Facility received 7,865 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 5,719 pieces. There remains a total of 74,425 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 19,200 measurement tons and 144 short tons of incoming cargo, an aggregate increase of approximately 64% over previous month's totals. 10,808 measurement tons and 1,828 short tons were shipped, constituting a decrease of 24% from January 1968.

e. There were 87.4 forklifts available per day as compared to 83.2 in January. During February, forklifts were dispatched a total of 11,676 hours and were utilized 6,865.4 hours, a utilization rate of 58%. During the month of January, the utilization rate was 47%. Commercial rental cost was \$14,168.03.



Ammunition Company carried out routine operations and training during the month. Ammunition Platoon handled a total of 15,390 short tons of Class V and Class VA material, including one special sealift of 774 short tons. With the detachment of one officer and 27 enlisted (TAD from 9thMAB) and normal rotation of personnel, there has been a serious shortage of personnel in Ammunition Platoon.
