NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period 1-31 March 1968, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the Regimental logistic mission.

a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 16,037 messages, 484,484 autodin cards, and 3,264 autodin messages.

b. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 95,766 miles, hauled 18,830 short tons of cargo, and transported 15,052 personnel. During the previous month of February, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 111,481 miles, hauled 16,444 short tons of cargo, and transported 15,227 personnel. Commercial hire cost was \$11,630.77.

c. The Baggage Facility received 10,907 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 7,959 pieces. There remains a total of 76,427 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 16,924 measurement tons and 149 short tons of incoming cargo, an aggregate decrease of approximately 11.8% under previous month's totals. 9,158 measurement tons and 1,800 short tons were shipped, constituting a decrease of 13.3% from February 1968.

e. There were 92.5 forklifts available per day as compared to 87.4 in February. During March, forklifts were dispatched a total of 17,773 hours and were utilized 7,669.4 hours, a utilization rate of 42.5%. During the month of February, the utilization rate was 58%. Commercial rental cost was \$14,400.36.





Narrative Summary

Major General F. C. THARIN, Deputy Commanding General, FMF Pac, was given a tour of the Camp Foster and Camp Hansen facilities of Maintenance Battalion on 25 March 1968 and was later given a briefing on Maintenance Battalion Operations as part of a 3dFSR Command Briefing.

Maintenance Battalion operations for the month of March commenced with 5657 work requests on hand. There were 3927 work requests received during the month and 4529 work requests were completed. There were a total of 114 man-days devoted to contact and technical inspection teams. The Motor Transport Rebuild Program produced five M-36, nine M-37, and one M-43 rebuilt vehicles during the month, while the Engineer Generator Rebuild Program produced a total of four rebuilt generators.

On 23 March 1968 Staff Sergeant D. R. FORD of Electronics Maintenance Company reenlisted for six years and received the highest recorded Variable Reenlistment Bonus in 3dFSR - \$9,675.00. Staff Sergeant Ford is currently serving as a radar technician and has chosen a one year retention on station with Maintenance Battalion as one of his reenlistment options.

Engineer Maintenance Company had a 99% participation in the U.S. Savings Bond Program, marking the fifth consecutive month that the company has maintained over 90% participation.


