

1-30 Apr 1968: Approximately 250 pounds of ecclesiastical gear was received for distribution to Chaplains in RVN.

Approximately 2800 pounds of gear was shipped to RVN. A total of 6 shipments.

1-30 Apr 1968: During this period, Truck Company continued it's daily supporting activities by providing an average of 12 M-36 Trucks, 6 M-35 Trucks, 1 M-55 Truck, 16 M-52 Tractor-trailer Semis, 48 M-38A1 Jeeps, 7 M-37 Personnel Carriers, 3 Buses, and 1 Miller Bus.

During this period, Truck Company continued to maintain operational control of 3 Buses and 1 Miller Bus. The buses provide a daily transportation service for 3d FSB personnel to and from places of duty and on and off post.

1-30 Apr 1968: The contract for PPEP was submitted for some changes and approval.

Relocation of Medical and Dental personnel was arranged. Both units will be in building 1163. Two (2) vans are presently being used for storage. The lower center portion of the building is being revamped for office and storage.

The signs for the two (2) Battalions and the Regimental CP were approved and placement started.

A study of the warehouse requirements at Camp Hansen was submitted to Camp Butler. A request for two (2) new warehouses were included.

A request from Camp Butler to cease all self-help programs in the Camp Foster area was received.

Nine (9) trucks 3/4 Ton, 4x4, M-37, were shipped to RVN, that were drawn from 3d Force Service Regiment Organic assets.

A study of buildings in use by 3d Force Service Regiment units located at Camp Hauge was submitted to Camp Butler with a request for changes of assignments.

A request for 8,000 Square Feet of storage space in the REX Area, Camp Courtney was submitted. This request cannot be honored at this time. Some other arrangements will be made.

Air conditioning units were approved for 1138 and 1141. These will be installed the first of May.



PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period 1-30 April 1968, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the Regimental logistic mission.

a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 14,578 messages, 546,662 autodin cards, and 4,029 autodin messages.

b. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 108,260 miles, hauled 22,524 short tons of cargo, and transported 19,169 personnel. During the previous month of March, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 95,766 miles, hauled 18,830 short tons of cargo, and transported 15,052 personnel. Commercial hire cost was \$8,907.38.

c. The Baggage Facility received 13,949 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 8,184 pieces. There remains a total of 82,192 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 12,690 measurement tons and 209 short tons of incoming cargo, an aggregate decrease of approximately 24.8% under previous month's totals. 7,946 measurement tons and 1,696 short tons were shipped, constituting a decrease of 12.0% from March 1968.

e. There were 93.6 forklifts available per day as compared to 92.5 in March. During April, forklifts were dispatched a total of 19,597.7 hours and were utilized 8,974.8 hours, a utilization rate of 45.6. During the month of March, the utilization rate was 42.8. Commercial rental cost was \$14,400.36.





Narrative Summary

Lieutenant General V. H. KRULAK, Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, visited Maintenance Battalion on 1 April 1968 and was given a briefing on Maintenance Battalion Operations as part of a 3d FSR Command Briefing.

Brigadier General C. T. HORNER Jr., USA, Commanding General, 2d Logistics Command, visited various shops and facilities in the Camp Foster area on 4 April 1968 and was given a briefing on Maintenance Battalion Operations as part of a 3d FSR Command Briefing.

During the month of April, Maintenance Battalion was visited by the FMF Pac Manpower/Management Survey Team, headed by LtCol K. N. MUELLER. The purpose of the visit was to examine the personnel needs of the Battalion in relation to the recommended T/O dated 26 June 1967.

Maintenance Battalion Operations for the month of April commenced with 5055 work requests on hand. There were 3713 work requests received during the month and 3691 work requests were completed. There was a total of 315 man-days devoted to contact and technical inspection teams. For the first time in this Units history Motor Transport Maintenance Company rebuilt two hundred automotive engines and twenty M-37 vehicles during a one month period. The Motor Transport Rebuild Program also produced seven M-36 cargo trucks. Engineer Maintenance Company rebuilt two PU 608/G and one PU 648/M generators during this month. Ordnance Maintenance Company, under the Howitzer Rebuild Program, produced seven 105mm Howitzers.


