NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of May the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained logistical support to all FMF WestPac Forces from Okinawa:

a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 17,982 messages, 548,568 autodin cards and 3,364 autodin messages.

b. In support of Logistic demands, Regimental vehicles traveled 119,835 miles, hauled 18,732 short tons of cargo. During the previous month of April, vehicles traveled 108,260 miles and hauled 22,524 short tons of cargo. Commercial Transportation hire cost was \$10,284.74.

c. The Baggage Facility received 11,532 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 8,213 pieces. There remains a total of 81,241 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

d. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 17,476 measurement tons and 276 short tons of incoming cargo, an aggregate increase of approximately 37.3% over previous month's totals. 14,917 measurement tons and 1,583 short tons were shipped, constituting an aggregate increase of 63.8% from April 1968.

e. Maintenance Battalion Operations for the month of May commenced with 5077 work requests on hand (Elect, Engineer, Motor Transport, Ordnance Maintenance). There were 3580 work requests received during the month and 3958 work requests were completed. There were a total of 841 man-days devoted to contact and technical inspection teams in support of units in RVN.

The spraying of insecticide of the area was commenced the latter part of the month. This spraying should have started as soon as mosquitos started breeding. The late start allowed many personnel to be affected enough to require sick call.

A move was initiated to turn in all 782 gear except that required for training. All Battalions will retain enough gear for rifle re-qualification, PRT, etc.

Unauthorized self-help programs are slowly being stopped. There is a pressing need for repainting, repairing and over-all modifications of most of our living and working buildings.

It was determined that the 81 units available at MCAF Futema would be utilized by Third Force Service Regiment Officers on a purely voluntary basis.

The calibration schedule of weight lifting equipment was firmed for June 1968. This testing will include all of Third Force Service Regiments weight lifting equipment.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period 1-31 May 1968, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the Regimental logistic mission.
 - a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 17,982 messages, 548,868 autodin cords and 3,364 autodin messages.
 - b. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 119,835 miles, hauled 18,732 short tons of cargo, and transported 18,732 personnel. During the previous month of April, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 118,260 miles, hauled 20,524 short tons of cargo, and transported 19,160 personnel. Commercial hire cost was \$10,384.74.
 - c. The Baggage Facility received 11,632 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 8,213 pieces. There remains a total of 31,271 pieces of personal baggage in storage.
 - d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 17,476 measurement tons or 276 short tons of incoming cargo, an aggregate increase of approximately 37.3% over previous month's totals. 14,917 measurement tons and 1,583 short tons were shipped, constituting a decrease of 63.8% from April 1968.
 - e. There were 94.4 forklifts available per day as compared to 93.6 in April. During May, forklifts were dispatched a total of 20,364.0 hours and were utilized 9,205.7 hours, a utilization rate of 45.2%. During the month of April, the utilization rate was 45.6%. Commercial rental cost was \$17,240.00.
