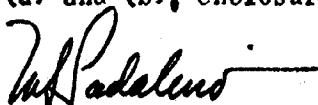

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. On 26 June 1968 Colonel M. J. PADALINO assumed command of 3d Force Service Regiment.
2. Colonel J. P. TREADWELL, Force Inspector, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, headed a Force Inspection Team which conducted an inspection of 3dFSR from 18 June 1968 through 21 June 1968.
3. During the month of June the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained logistical support to all FMF WestPac Forces from Okinawa:
 - a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 15,256 messages, 545, 878 autodin cards and 3,069 autodin messages.
 - b. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 229, 710 miles, hauled 22,534 short tons of cargo, and transported 19,169 personnel. During the previous month of May, Regimental vehicles traveled 119,835 miles, hauled 15,816 short tons of cargo, and transported 16,654 personnel. Commercial transportation hire cost was \$9,285.10.
 - c. The baggage facility received 9,166 pieces of personnel baggage for storage while shipping out 9,089 pieces. There remains a total of 84,388 pieces of personal baggage in storage.
 - d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 20,735 measurement tons and 215 short tons of incoming cargo, and aggregated decrease of approximately 15.6% over previous month's totals. 9,201 measurement tons and 1,735 short tons were shipped, constituting a decrease of 33.8% from May 1968.
 - e. Ammunition Platoon handled a total of 10,210 tons of Class V and Class VA material. A restowage program is now approximately 60% complete.
 - f. Maintenance Operations for the month of June commenced with 4699 work requestes on hand. There were 3193 work requests received during the month and 2986 work requests were completed.
4. A 3d Force Service Regiment Safe Driving Council was appointed and assigned the mission to develop a safe drivers' program.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. The FY-69 Rebuild Program contains approximately fifty-one different types of USMC and USN Section "M" equipment. These types of equipment will be composed of quotas totaling 1034 units from WestPac combat forces. Generally, the FY-69 Program will consist of end items having in-country densities large enough to support fast turn around time. Equipment will be rebuilt at three facilities which are PMX, Yokosuka, 3d FSR and OTCen, Port Hueneme. Yokosuka will be the primary rebuild facility for generators where 3d FSR will absorb the bulk of the motor transport and engineer type equipment. Port Hueneme will handle specific items generally of low density type. The FY-68 Program had approximately 60 day-type different type items. Although in comparison, the FY-69 Program would appear to be a cut back it is in fact an increase as evidenced by the total units in the FY-69 schedule. The quota for FY-69 is set at 1034 units represents a 21 percent increase over FY-68 production, 853 units. The items on hand at facility where there is a quota for a like item in the FY-69 program will be held for completion and charged against FY-69 quotas. Those items at the facility where there is no like item in the FY-69 program, but can be completed by 1 September 1968 will be completed. Advance discussion has commenced with the Headquarters, VMFPac to consider wash-out of those items at facility that cannot be completed by 1 September 1968 and where there is no like item in the FY-69 Program. Problems have occurred during FY-68 which were primarily caused by inadequate availability of repair parts/manuals. It is felt that these problems will be reduced to the minimum low density items in the Rebuild Program. Because of the above problems some items have remained at facility in excess of eighteen months. In March 1968 a purge of the rebuild facilities was initiated for those items. Another purge took place in May 1968 and a final purge is intended for July 1968. It is expected that this will reduce items on hand at facility without completion date in sight to a six month time frame.

b. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 108,260 miles, hauled 22,524 short tons of cargo, and transported 19,169 personnel. During the previous month of May, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 134,424 miles, hauled 15,816 short tons of cargo, and transported 16,654 personnel. Commercial hire cost was \$9,285.10.

c. The Baggage Facility received 9,166 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 9,039 pieces. There remains a total of 84,303 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 20,735 measurement tons and 215 short tons of incoming cargo, an aggregate decrease of approximately 15.6% over previous month's totals. 9,201 measurement tons and 1,735 short tons were shipped, constituting a decrease of 33.8% from May 1968.

e. There were 95.4% forklifts available per day as compared to 94.2% in May. During June, forklifts were dispatched a total of 18,313.4 hours and were utilized 8,353.7 hours, a utilization rate of 45.6%. During the month of May, the utilization rate was 44.4%. Commercial rental cost was \$16,182.76.

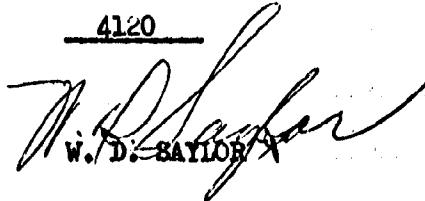

Part IINarrative SummaryReconciliation of Organic T/E Equipment2nd Through 5th Echelon

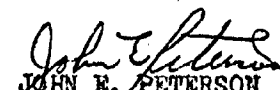
