NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of July the Third Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to all FMF WestPac Forces:

a. The Baggage Facility received 7,282 pieces of personal baggage for storage, while shipping out 7,481 pieces. There remains a total of 84,184 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 18,110 measurement tons and 129 short tons of incoming cargo, an aggregated decrease of approximately 12.5% from previous months total; 6,485 measurements tons and 1,824 short tons were shipped, constituting a decrease of 24.1% from June 1968.

c. Total Incoming and Outgoing Message Center traffic was 13,380 messages, 486,003 Autodin Cards and 2,612 Autodin messages.

d. Regimental vehicles traveled 268,068 miles, hauled 16,177 short tons of cargo, and transported 14,958 personnel. During the previous month of June, vehicles traveled 229,710 miles, hauled 15,816 short tons of cargo, and transported 16,654 personnel. Commercial transportation hire cost was \$11,180.97.

e. Maintenance operations for the month of July commenced with 4898 work requests on hand. There were 3,157 work requests received during the month and 2557 work requests completed.

2. Fiscal Year 1969 Rebuild Program Outlook:

a. The FY-69 Rebuild Program contains fifty-one different type line items and 1034 items are to be rebuilt at three facilities. The rebuild facilities are Public Works Center, Yokosuka, Third Force Service Regiment, and Construction Battalion Center, Port Hueneme, California. Previously, some equipment remained at rebuild facilities in excess of six months. This impaired the efficiency of using units by causing them to do without the use of their equipment. During FY-69, whenever an item of equipment is not rebuilt within six months, it will be recommended for washout.

b. In comparison FMFAC FY-68 Rebuild Program contained eighty-nine different type line items and 853 items of equipment were rebuilt.

## PART III

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. The FY-69 Rebuild Program contains approximately fifty-one different types of USMC and USN Section "M" equipment. These types of equipment will be composed of quotas totaling 1034 units from WestPac combat forces. Generally the FY-69 Program will consist of end items having in-country densities large enough to support fast turn around time. This equipment will be rebuilt at three facilities which are PSC, Yokosuka, 3d FSR and CBCom, Fort Huene. Yokosuka will be the primary rebuild facility for generators where 3d FSR will absorb the bulk of the motor transport and engineer type equipment. Fort Huene will handle specific items generally of low density type. The FY-68 Program had approximately eighty-nine different type items. Although in comparison, the FY-69 Program would appear to be a cut back it is in fact an increase as evidenced by the total units in the FY-69 schedule. The quota for FY-69 is set at 1034 units represents a 21 percent increase over FY-68 production, 853 units. The items on hand at facility where there is a quota for a like item in the FY-69 program will be held for completion and charged against FY-69 quotas. Those items at the facility where there is no like item in the FY-69 program, but can be completed by 1 September 1968 will be completed. Advance discussion has commenced with the Headquarters, FMFPac to consider wash-out of those items at facility that cannot be completed by 1 September 1968 and where there is no like item in the FY-69 Program. Problems have occurred during FY-68 which were primarily caused by inadequate availability of repair parts/manuals. It is felt that these problems will be reduced to the minimum low density items in the Rebuild Program. Because of the above problems some items have remained at facility in excess of eighteen months. In March 1968 a purge of the rebuild facilities was initiated for those items. Another purge took place in May 1968 and a final purge is intended for July 1968. It is expected that this will reduce items on hand at facility without completion date in sight to a six month time frame.

1. During the period 1-31 July 1968, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the regimental logistic mission.

a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 13,380 messages, 486,003 autodin cards and 2,612 autodin messages.

b. Headquarters and Service Battalion Vehicles traveled 105,060 miles hauled 16,177 short tons of cargo, and transported 14,958 personnel. During the previous month of June, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 104,424 miles, hauled 15,816 short tons of cargo, and transported 16,654 personnel. Commercial transportation hire cost was \$11,180.97.

c. The baggage Facility received 7,282 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 7,481 pieces. There remains a total of 84,184 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon received for 18,110 measurement tons and 129 short tons of incoming cargo, an aggregate decrease of approximately 12.5% under previous month's totals. 6,485 measurement tons and 1,824 short tons were shipped, constituting a decrease of 24.1% from June 1968.

e. There were 90.3% forklifts available per day as compared to 95.4% in June. During July forklifts were dispatched a total of 18,992.7 hours and were utilized 8,591.9 hours, a utilization rate of 44.6%. During the month of June, the utilization rate was 45.6%. Commercial rental cost was \$17,573.59.




