NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of August the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to FMF WestPac Forces:

a. The Baggage Facility received 4661 pieces of personal baggage for storage, while shipping out 8585 pieces. There remains at present a total of 80,261 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 13,178 measurement tons and 124 short tons of incoming cargo, an aggregated decrease of 27.2% from previous months total; 7,447 measurement tons and 1,389 short tons were shipped, constituting an increase of 14.3% from July 1968.

c. Total incoming and outgoing Message Center traffic was 12,280 messages, 493,271 Autodin Cards and 1,692 Autodin Messages.

d. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 287,678 miles, hauled 15,871 short tons of cargo, and transported 17,019 personnel. Commercial Transportation hire cost was \$11,180.97.

e. Maintenance operations for the month of August commenced with 5498 work requests on hand. There were 3,078 work requests received during the month and 3320 work requests completed.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period 1-31 August 1968, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the regimental logistic mission.

a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 12,280 messages. 493,271 autodin cards and 1,692 autodin messages.

b. Headquarters and Service Battalion Vehicles traveled 113,774 miles, hauled 15,871 short tons of cargo, and transported 17,019 personnel. During the previous month of July, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 105,060 miles, and hauled 16,177 short tons of cargo, and transported 14,958 personnel. Commercial transportation hire cost was \$11,180.97.

c. The Baggage Facility received 4,661 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 8,585 pieces. There remains a total of 80,261 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

d. The Shipping and receiving Platoon receipted for 13,178 measurement tons and 124 short tons of incoming cargo, an aggregate decrease of approximately 27.2% under previous month's totals. 7,447 measurement tons and 1,389 short tons were shipped, constituting an increase of 14.3% from July 1968.

e. There were 87.9% forklifts available per day as compared to 90.3% in July. During August forklifts were dispatched a total of 18,961.5 hours and were utilized 8134.6 hours, a utilization rate of 42.9%. During the month of July, the utilization rate was 44.6%. Commercial rental cost was \$16,412.21.






