1. During the month of September the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to FMF WestPac Forces:

a. The baggage facility received 6845 pieces, and released 6086 pieces. A total of 81,018 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.

b. Shipping and receiving receipted for 19,928 measurement tons and 175 short tons of incoming cargo; 6,837 measurement tons and 862 short tons were shipped.

c. Total incoming and outgoing Message Center traffic was 11,691 messages and 259,847 Antedin Cards.

d. 3d ESR vehicles traveled 240,467 miles, hauled 15,871 short tons of cargo, and transported 15,475 personnel. Commercial transportation cost was \$6,737.11.

e. Maintenance operations for the month of September commenced with 5256 work requests on hand. There were 1,063 work requests received during the month and 2285 work requests completed.

f. The Fleet Stock Account processed 30,645 demands and made 19,564 Issue/Obligation releases. There were 16,427 receipts processed during this month. To date, for FY-69, 189,360 transactions have been processed.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period 1-30 September 1968, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the regimental logistic mission.

a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 11,691 messages. 259,847 autodin cards and no autodin messages.

b. Headquarters and Service Battalion Vehicles traveled 127,887 miles, hauled 11,489 short tons of cargo, and transported 15,475 personnel. During the previous month of August, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 113,774 miles, and hauled 15,489 short tons of cargo, and transported 17,919 personnel. Commercial transportation hire cost was \$6,738.11

c. The baggage facility received 6,845 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 6,085 pieces. There remains a total of 81,018 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 9,928 measurement tons and 175 short tons of incoming cargo, and aggregate decrease of approximately 24.7% under previous month's totals. 6,837 measurement tons and 962 short tons were shipped, constituting a increase of 11.7% from August 1968.

e. There were 91.5% forklifts available per day as compared to 87.9% in August. During September forklifts were dispatched a total of 17,167.7 hours and were utilized 7,446 hours, a utilization rate of 45.7%. During the month of August, the utilization rate was 42.9%. Commercial rental cost was \$14,865.52
