PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. During the month of October the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Legistical support to FMF WestPac Forces:
- a. The Baggage Facility received 7.066 pieces, and released 7.521 pieces. A total of 80.567 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.
- b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 8,308 measurement tens and 127 short tens of incoming carge: 8,350 measurement tens and 1,317 short tens were shipped.
- c. Total incoming and outgoing Message Center traffic was 15,338 messages and 984,822 Autodin Cards.
- d. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 226,414 miles, hauled 13,847 short tons of cargo and transported 29,719 personnel. Commercial transportation cost was \$10.052,15.
- e. Maintenance operations for the month of October commenced with 4.574 work requests on hand. There were 2.768 work requests received during the month and 2.379 work requests completed.
- f. The Fleet Stock Account precessed 33,693 demands and made 40,509 Issue/Obligations releases. There were 19,934 receipts processed during this month. To date, for FY-69, 245,575 transactions have been precessed.
- g. Supply Operations for the month, for the month of October, commenced with 5,256 documents on hand. There were 34,864 decuments received during the month and 34,350 documents were processed, leaving a balance of 5800 documents on hand at the end of the month.
- 2. The issue of M-151Al vehicles has been accomplished. Presently these vehicles are undergoing acceptence inspection and appropriate maintenance. Also, necessary driver instruction will be provided.
- 3. A review of FMFPac Repair/Rebuild Program excesses has been completed by the Stock Account and Shop Stores. Excess pepair parts have been effered to CG. 1st Marine Air Wing.
- 4. On 7 October 1968, Regimental Combat Skills School (Block Training) was initiated at the Okinawa Northern Training Area. This training is for Sergeants and below, and includes all military subjects required by MCO 1510.2E, and requalification firing. Training is for three weeks.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period of 1-31 October 1968, the Force Logistics Support Section performed the following significant operations in the performance of its external support mission:

a. Supply/Service Support Unit:

- (1) The issue of M151 vehicles has been accomplished. Presently these vehicles are undergoing acceptance inspection and appropriate maintenance, also necessary driver instruction be provided. The M-38Al vehicles will not be turned in until such time as the above has been completed.
- (2) An inspection of the organic account of Supply Battalion was conducted and the result was considered satisfactory with discrepancies. Due to the short time internal between this inspection and the recent FSAO inspection in August, primary emphasis was placed on those areas noted as discrepancies by the FSAO Team. As a result of this inspection it is apparent that corrective action has been initiated, however, in some cases this action is considered insufficient, requiring a more vigorous approach to the problem areas.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. During the period 1-31 October 1968, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the Regimental logistic mission.
- a. The total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 15,338 messages, 984,822 autodin cards and no autodin messages.
- b. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 94,289 miles, hauled 13,847 short tons of cargo, and transported 29,719 personnel. During the previous month of September, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 127,887 miles, and hauled 11,489 short tons of cargo, and transported 13,475 personnel. Commercial transportation hire cost was \$10,052.15.
- c. The baggage facility received 7,066 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 7,521 pieces. There remains a total of 80,567 pieces of personal baggage in storage.
- d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 8,308 measurement tons and 127 short tons of incoming cargo, and aggregate decrease of approximately 12.2% under previous month's totals. 8,350 measurement tons and 1,317 short tons were shipped, constituting a increase of 18.9% from September 1968.
- e. There were 95.5% forklifts available per day as compared to 91.5% in September. During October forklifts were dispatched a total of 18,622.4 hours and were utilized 8,492 hours, a utilization rate of 45.6%. During the month of September, the utilization rate was 45.7%. Commercial rental cost was \$16,118.62.


