NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of November the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to FMF WestPac Forces:

a. The Baggage Facility received 3,993 pieces, and released 6,768 pieces. A total of 78,082 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.

b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 16,686 measurements tons and 78 short tons of incoming cargo: 3,913 measurement tons and 1,166 short tons were shipped.

c. Total incoming and outgoing Message Center Traffic was 15,773 messages and 351,937 Autodin Cards.

d. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 228,982 miles, hauled 13,289 short tons of cargo and transported 17,683 personnel. Commercial transportation cost was \$7,476.63.

e. Maintenance operations for the month of November commenced with 4,963 work requests on hand. There were 2,403 work requests received during the month and 4,101 work requests completed.

f. The Fleet Stock Account processed 32,380 demands and made 29,942 Issue/Obligations released. There were 13,209 receipts processed during this month. To date, for FY-69, 269,732 transactions have been processed.

g. Supply Operations for the month of November commenced with 5,800 documents on hand. There were 30,101 documents received during the month and 31,876 documents were processed, leaving a balance of 4,025 documents on hand at the end of the month.

2. 25-30 Nov - Regimental Commander's inspection of Maintenance Battalion was conducted in, logistics, administration, supply, ordnance, communication/electronics, engineer, safety/fire prevention, motor transport, training, and personnel.

3. Third Force Service Regiment was directed to participate in the Mechanized Embarkation Data System (MEDS); implementation will commence by 31 December 1968. Personnel attended the Fleet Marine Force Pacific Embarkation School at Camp Hansen to obtain instruction in the MEDS reporting procedures.







NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period 1-30 November 1968, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the Regimental logistic mission.

a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 15,773 messages, 351,937 autodin cards and no autodin messages.

b. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 90,779 miles hauled 13,289 short tons of cargo, and transported 17,683 personnel. During the previous month of October, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 94,289 miles, and hauled 13,847 short tons of cargo, and transported 29,719 personnel. Commercial transportation hire cost was \$7,476.63.

c. The baggage facility received 3,993 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 6,678 pieces. There remains a total of 78,082 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 16,686 measurement tons and 78 short tons of incoming cargo, and aggregate increase of approximately 50.3% over previous month's totals. 3,913 measurement tons and 1,116 short tons were shipped, constituting a decrease of 53.0% from October.

e. There were 99.8% forklifts available per day as compared to 95.5% in October. During November forklifts were dispatched a total of 16,054.3 hours and were utilized 7,189.1 hours, a utilization rate of 44.8%. During the month of October, the utilization rate was 45.6%. The Commercial rental cost was \$16,845.94, which includes the new contract for the T/G 35, MK-2 Warehouse Tractors and Trailers.







1. In compliance with references (a) and (b), the subject report is submitted herewith as enclosure (1) for the period 26 Oct 68 to 29 Nov 68.

2. In an effort to add clarity to Section "B" of enclosure (1), the following definitions are used by this organization:

a. Awaiting Shop Space - TERO's listed in this category are those for which repair parts and maintenance personnel are available to effect repairs, but for which adequate shop space is not available.

b. Awaiting Man-Power - TERO's covering items for which repair parts are on hand and shop space available, but sufficient maintenance personnel are not available to effect repairs.

c. Awaiting Repair Parts - TERO's covering items that have been accepted into the maintenance cycle for which appropriate inspections have been conducted, required repair parts determined and requisitioned, and item is, in fact, awaiting receipt of repair parts in order to commence or resume repair.

d. Repairs in Progress - TERO's covering items of equipment that are actually under repair.

e. RPA/ISSA - TERO's covering all items of equipment for which repair is being accomplished at facilities other than organic shops. Equipment in this category is frequently re-inducted into organic shops upon completion of this phase of repair.

f. Awaiting Inspection - TERO's covering items of equipment that are normally inspected as part of the induction phase into the repair shop cycle, and such inspection has not been completed.

g. Awaiting Induction - TERO's covering items of equipment (mostly components) that are NOT normally inspected prior to induction into the maintenance cycle, i.e., power train components, brakes and chassis components, fuel/electronic components, and end items scheduled for rebuild.

h. Awaiting Disposition Instructions - TERO's covering items of equipment that have been reported to the ICP under the Recoverable Items Program.

3. In amplification of the above definitions, it is realized that as the repair cycle progresses, the category of the work order changes. It is appropriate then, to retain a given work order in the appropriate age category regardless of its progressive status change, i.e., from "Awaiting Repair Parts" to "Awaiting Shop Space". For example, if a work order progresses to the 30-60 day age category while "Awaiting Repair Parts" and the repair parts are received during the 30-60 day period, the work order should remain in the 30-60 day period, but move to "Awaiting Shop Space" - "Awaiting Man Power" - or "Repairs in Progress", whatever the case may be. The workload age distribution tells only how old the work order (TERO) is and what its present status is for a given reporting period.

4. With respect to the actual numbers provided in this report, each number represents a separate work order (TERO) regardless of the like items consolidated on one work order.

5. Due to proposed changes in the internal reporting procedures of this Battalion, it is requested that the reporting period request contained in reference (c) be cancelled. It is requested that authorization be granted to change the reporting period to cover the period from the first through the last day of each month commencing January 1969.


