





NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of December the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to MCF WestPac Forces:

a. The Baggage Facility received 7,828 pieces, and released 10,355 pieces. A total of 75,655 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.

b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 7,315 measurements tons and 76 short tons of incoming cargo: 7,127 measurement tons and 1,389 short tons were shipped.

c. Total incoming and out going Message Center Traffic was 14,313 messages and 287,428 Autodin Cards.

d. 3d FSN vehicles traveled 262,502 miles, hauled 24,649 short tons of cargo and transported 16,376 personnel. Commercial transportation cost was \$6,805.50.

e. Maintenance operations for the month of December commenced with 3,265 work requests on hand. There were 1,975 work requests received during the month and 2,511 work requests completed.

f. The Fleet Stock Account processed 46,522 demands and made 44,060 Issue/Obligation releases. There were 12,173 receipts processed during this month. To date, for FY-69, 288,297 transactions have been processed.

g. Supply Operations for the month of December Commenced with 4,025 documents on hand. There were 23,113 documents received during the month and 11,800 documents were processed, leaving a balance of 5,338 documents on hand at the end of the month.

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. On 6 December 1968 an assignment inspection of building 1136 at Camp Foster was held by a representative of the Camp Foster Property Section, S-4 Section and a representative of the concerned unit. Building 1136 was found to be completely serviceable and in a satisfactory condition with only minor discrepancies as noted below.

- a. Building Master Telephone Connections not available.
- b. Hot Water Facilities not available.

2. On 9 December 1968 an assignment inspection of building 1010 at Camp Hauge was held by a representative of the Camp Hauge Property Section, S-4 Section and a representative of the concerned unit. Building 1010 was found to be completely serviceable and in a satisfactory condition with only minor discrepancies as noted below.

- a. Door and lock at North end unserviceable and should be replaced.
- b. Electrical wiring at the North end of building has been cut for the apparent purpose of removing an electrical fixture.
- c. One window pane cracked.

THE CONVERSION OF EXISTING WORKLOAD AND SUCCESSFUL IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SUPPORTED ACTIVITIES SUPPLY SYSTEM (SASSY), AND THE MAN-POWER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (MMS) WILL BE IN SERIOUS JEOPARDY UNLESS ADEQUATE NUMBERS OF S/360 COMPUTER OPERATORS AND PROGRAMMERS TRAINED IN THE IBM OPERATING SYSTEM REPORT ABOARD PRIOR TO 1 FEBRUARY 1969.
6. THREE FSR SENT FOUR DATA PROCESSING PERSONNEL TO HAWAII FOR A ONE WEEK TRAINING COURSE IN THE IBM OPERATING SYSTEM. ADDITIONAL PERSONNEL WILL BE

SENT THERE FOR TRAINING IF CURRENT WORKLOAD, FUNDING, AND CLASS SCHEDULING WILL PERMIT. A REVIEW OF OUR PERSONNEL SITUATION REVEALED AN OVERAGE IN OCCUPATION FIELD 25 (COMMUNICATIONS) AND AFTER TESTING AND SCREENING, TWELVE WERE SELECTED FOR ON-THE-JOB TRAINING IN DATA PROCESSING TO OFFSET PROJECTED LOSSES. OVERALL, THE PERFORMANCE OF DUTY OF THESE MARINES HAS BEEN OUTSTANDING. THIS RETRAINING WAS NECESSARY TO MAINTAIN THE 24 HOUR DAY, SEVEN DAY WEEK DATA PROCESSING OPERATION.



Commercial transportation hire cost was \$6,805.50.

b. The baggage facility received 7,928 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 10,355 pieces. There remains a total of 75,655 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

c. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 7,315 measurement tons and 76 short tons of incoming cargo, and aggregate decrease of approximately 56.2% over previous month's totals. 7,127 measurement tons and 1,389 short tons were shipped, constituting a decrease of 45.0% from November.

d. There were 89.3% forklifts available per day as compared to 99.6% in November. During December forklifts were dispatched a total of 17,124.7 hours and were utilized 8,115.2 hours, a utilization rate of 52.6%. During the month of November the utilization rate was 44.8%. The Commercial Rental cost was 18,739.06.
