NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of March the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to FMF WestPac Forces:

a. The Baggage Facility received 9,004 pieces, and released 8,645 pieces. A total of 73,394 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.

b. Shipping and Receiving received for 6,790 measurement tons and 75 short tons of incoming cargo: 6,195 measurement tons and 1,158 short tons were shipped.

c. Total incoming and out going Message Center Traffic was 13,009 Narrative Messages and 3,032 Card Messages.

d. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 270,106 miles, hauled 18,342 short tons of cargo and transported 17,455 personnel. Commercial transportation cost was \$5,696.76.

e. Maintenance operations for the month of March were 5,337 work requests received during the month and 4,242 work requests completed.

f. The Fleet Stock Account processed 26,522 demands and made 25,879 Issue/Obligation releases. There were 12,686 receipts processed during this month.

g. Supply Operations for the month of March commenced with 5,630 issue mats on hand. There were 23,772 issue mats received during the month and 23,380 issue mats were processed, leaving a balance of 6,022 issue mats on hand at the end of the month.



## NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the reporting period supplies were shipped and couriered to Third Marine Amphibious Force, First Marine Division, Third Marine Division, First Marine Air Wing, and Force Logistics Command in Viet Nam; and supplies were provided for all Marine Commands in Okinawa.

Included in these shipments were: candles, altar linens, flags and pennants, altar vases, magnetic tape, tape recorders, chaplain's combat kits Catholic and Protestant, rosaries and cruciform medals, sacramental wine Christian and Kosher, candle sticks, charcoal and incense, organ electronic, Bibles and New Testaments, asserted church folders, hanging set-altar, bulletin boards, chairs with kneeler back, communion wafers, plastic flowers, Jewish Passover supplies, Catholic Sunday Missals, and sanctus bells. Totaling 4.24 tons.

During the reporting period supplies were received as follows: wine, New Testaments, cruciform medals, collection plates, Chapel Fund Req. forms, church pennants, communion set, Catholic Lay Leader Resource Guides, hymnal chests, and baptismal bowls. Totaling 0.86 ton.

In addition normal Chaplain's activities were carried on: Divine services; counselling; moral leadership lectures; hospital and brig visitation; visitation of 3d FSR units at Camp Hague, Rex area, Camp Hansen, and MTA; and administrative work.






