NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of May the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to FMP WestPac Forces;

a. The Baggage Facility received 8,484 pieces, and released 6,239 pieces. A total of 76,119 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.

b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 5,559 measurement tons and 189 short tons of incoming cargo; 5,598 measurement tons and 1,274 short tons were shipped.

c. Total incoming and out going Message Center Traffic was 12,384 Narrative Messages and 3,649 Card Messages.

d. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 223,555 miles, hauled 12,519 short tons of cargo and transported 13,855 personnel. Commercial type USMC vehicles traveled 33,522 miles.

e. Maintenance operations for the month of May were 1,878 work requests received during the month and 1,973 work requests completed.

f. The Fleet Stock Account processed 22,147 demands and made 19,647 Issue/Obligation releases. There were 10,496 receipts processed during this month.

g. Supply Operations for the month of May commenced with 9,675 issue mats on hand. There were 9,848 issue mats prepared during the month and 16,713 issue mats were processed, leaving a balance of 2,810 issue mats on hand at the end of the month.





1. A Facilities Review and Planning Board meeting was held on 26 May 1969, and was the initial meeting of the Board. Of the 24 agenda items discussed, nine items were recommended for approval, two were disapproved, and the remaining items will be reviewed at the next meeting of the Board.
2. A request was submitted to Camp Butler for prefabricated modular units that would provide 3,600 square feet of climatically controlled space for use as a temporary calibration facility, for Maintenance Battalion. This is an interim solution pending approval and construction of a calibration facility under MCON.

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3. Maintenance Battalion was requested to submit requisitions to Stock Account for 15 M109A3 Vans as replacement for gas M109s. The multifuel replacements were issued as follows: 14 to Ordnance Maintenance Company, 1 to Motor Transport Maintenance Company.

4. All Battalions submitted list of overages and shortages and internal redistribution has been completed. Battalions were then directed to submit request for Modification of Allowance by 30 June 1969 for excess items considered mission essential. Other excesses will be disposed of and requisitions submitted for shortages.

5. MEDS cards and Print outs were submitted to FMFPAC as initial submission to place the Regiment under the MEDS program.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of May 1969, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the regimental logistic mission.
 - a. The Baggage Facility received 8,484 pieces of personal baggage for storage and released 6,239 pieces. A total of 76,119 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.
 - b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 5,559 measurement tons and 189 short tons of incoming cargo. There was 5,598 measurement tons and 1,274 short tons shipped.
 - c. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 88,411 miles hauling 12,679 short tons of cargo, and transported 20,811 personnel.
2. Two members of the Regimental Guard completed On-The-Job-Training with RAFF for accident investigation.
3. On 3 May 1969, the first instructor candidate class for Defensive Drivers School graduated personnel which included two Air Force enlisted men from Kadena Air Base.
4. On 5 May 1969, six men from Engineer Support Platoon commenced renovation operations at Combat Skills School, Northern Training Area. Operations have been hampered by inclement weather and at the conclusion of this reporting period only 35 percent was completed.
5. On 22 May 1969, operations commenced to move 1,000 measurement tons of Class V (LFORM) from ASP-2 to White Beach for loading aboard the USS IWO JIMA and USS CLEVELAND. Operations began at 1300 and were concluded at 0315, 23 May. Personnel involved were from Engineer Support Platoon, Truck Company and supervisory personnel from this Headquarters (S-4). All hands received a "Well Done" from the Commanding General, 9th Marine Amphibious Brigade.
6. On 22 May 1969, a drill of the Emergency Reaction Force was held. This drill uncovered certain problems which were subsequently addressed and resolved.
7. Due to a stevedore and longshoreman strike at Naha Port our Battalion (S-4) has been coordinating the supply of ten forklift operators to the 2nd Logistical Command since 24 May. This commitment was increased to include a 17 man longshoreman party on 31 May: 5 from H&SBn; 6 from Supply Bn; and 6 from Maintenance Bn. Both of these requirements were extended at the months end for an indefinite period.
8. Ration Credits for May ran about 89% of those in March. We believe our program of troop education concerning the new messhall accounting procedures has been successful.







NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period 1-31 May 1969, no significant personnel changes were experienced. Normal operations were conducted smoothly and all commitments assigned were met. The Defensive Driving Course conducted under this sections supervision graduated 74 students, 12 of which attended a Candidate Instructor Course. Eight of the candidate instructors are presently engaged in further training qualifying as instructors.

On 5 May, six men from Engineer Support Platoon commenced renovation operations at Combat Skills School, Northern Training Area. Operations have been hampered constantly by inclement weather and at the conclusion of this period was only 35 percent completed.

On 22 May, we began operations to move 1000 measurement tons of class V (LFORM) from ASP-2 to White Beach for loading aboard the USS IWO JIMA and USS CLEVELAND. Operations commenced at 1300 and were concluded at 0315, 23 May. Personnel involved were from Engineer Support Platoon (forklift operators and mobile crane operators), Truck Company (M52s w/M127 trlrs, M36s, M54s and drivers), and supervisory personnel from this Section. All hands received a "WELL DONE" from CG. 9th MAB.

Due to a stevedore and longshoreman strike at Naha Port we have been supplying ten forklift operators to the Army's 2d Logistical Command since 24 May. This commitment was increased to include a 17 man longshoreman party on 31 May. Both of these requirements were extended at the months end for an indefinite period




