NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of June the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to FMF WestPac Forces:

a. The Baggage Facility received 9,838 pieces, and released 5,581 pieces. A total of 77,780 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.

b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 6,244 measurement tons and 171 short tons of incoming cargo; 10,363 measurement tons and 854 short tons were shipped.

c. Total incoming and out going Message Center Traffic was 13,925 Narrative Messages and 4,202 Card Messages.

d. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 191,597 miles, hauled 57,568 short tons of cargo and transported 14,552 personnel. Commercial transportation traveled 32,890 miles.

e. Maintenance operations for the month of June were 2,997 work requests received during the month and 3,028 work requests completed.

f. The Fleet Stock Account processed 27,167 demands and made 21,571 Issue/Obligation releases. There were 10,559 receipts processed during this month.

g. Supply Operations for the month of June commenced with 3,570 issue mats on hand. There were 28,376 issue mats received during the month and 29,730 issue mats were processed, leaving a balance of 2,216 issue mats on hand at the end of the month.







NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of June 1969, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the regimental logistic mission.

a. The Baggage Facility received 9,838 pieces of personal baggage for storage and released 5,581 pieces.. A total of 77,780 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.

b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 6,244 measurement tons and 171 short tons of incoming cargo. There was 10,363 measurement tons and 854 short tons shipped.

c. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 126,597 miles hauling 57,568 short tons of cargo, and transported 14,553 personnel.

2. On 5 May 1969, six (6) men from Engineer Support Platoon commenced renovation operations at Combat Skills School, Northern Training Area. These operations were hampered throughout May and June by inclement weather but at the end of this reporting period these operations have been completed.

3. The National Safety Councils course on defensive driving continued to be presented weekly and 71 students completed the course during this reporting period. It was decided that based upon the positive results gained from the Defensive Driving School by Headquarters and Service Battalion the program should be expanded to include Supply and Maintenance Battalions. On 23 June a Candidate Instructors Course on Defensive Driving was convened with four students from Headquarters and Service Battalion, four from Maintenance Battalion and four from Supply Battalion. Materials to support the presentation of the course within the two battalions were requisitioned on 30 June 1969. Gunnery Sergeant D. J. DOHERTY was appointed Agency Representative vice Captain G. POOL, who was detached 25 June 1969.

4. On 11 June the stevedore and longshoreman strike at Naha Port ended and the forklift operators and working party, supplied by this regiment during the interim period was terminated. This command supplied ten (10) forklift operators and a seventeen (17) man working party to augment Army elements.
