NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of July the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to FMF WestPac Forces:
 - a. The Baggage Facility received 4,913 pieces, and released 7,436 pieces. A total of 75,151 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.
 - b. Shipping and Receiving received for 8,246 measurement tons and 228 short tons of incoming cargo; 9,810 measurement tons and 630 short tons were shipped.
 - c. Total incoming and out going Message Center Traffic was 12,664 Narrative Messages and 3,462 Card Messages.
 - d. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 185,272 miles, hauled 57,568 short tons of cargo and transported 12,787 personnel. This includes Commercial vehicles and vehicles moved for SCR.
 - e. Maintenance operations for the month of July were 2,381 work requests received during the month and 1,853 work requests completed.
 - f. The Fleet Stock Account processed 22,341 demands and made 22,848 Issue/Obligation releases. There were 9,523 receipts processed during this month.
 - g. Supply Operations for the month of July commenced with 2,216 issue mats on hand. There were 13,750 issue mats received during the month and 12,278 issue mats were processed, leaving a balance of 2,596 issue mats on hand at the end of the month.

 - d. ISSA #5H-AT6508-2128-9 which provides common items of supply except for self-service and medical type items has been finalized.
 - e. ISSA #5H-AT6508-2006-9 which provides Class II, IV, and IX supplies to Marine Corps elements in Vietnam has been finalized.
 - f. ISSA #5H-AT6508-2009-9 which provides common supplies (Dry Cell Batteries for MO/MOA has been finalized.
