1. During the month of July the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to FMF WestPac Forces:
  - a. The Baggage Facility received 4,913 pieces, and released 7,436 pieces. A total of 75,151 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.
  - b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 8,246 measurement tons and 228 short tons of incoming cargo; 9,810 measurement tons and 630 short tons were shipped.
  - c. Total incoming and out going Message Center Traffic was 12,664 Narrative Messages and 3,462 Card Messages.
  - d. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 185,272 miles, hauled 57,568 short tons of cargo and transported 12,787 personnel. This includes Commercial vehicles and vehicles moved for S&R.
  - e. Maintenance operations for the month of July were 2,381 work requests received during the month and 1,853 work requests completed.
  - f. The Fleet Stock Account processed 22,341 demands and made 22,848 Issue/Obligation releases. There were 9,523 receipts processed during this month.



NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of July, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the regimental logistics mission.
  - a. The Baggage Facility received 4,913 pieces of personal baggage for storage and released 7,436 pieces. A total of 75,151 pieces of personal baggage remained in storage.
  - b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 8,246 measurement tons and 228 short tons of incoming cargo. There was 9,810 measurement tons and 630 short tons shipped.
  - c. Headquarters and Service Battalion Vehicles traveled 102,113 miles, hauling 11,568 short tons of cargo, and transported 12,787 personnel.
2. The National Safety Council's Course on defensive driving that commenced during March 1969, continued to be presented up to 23 July 1969. There were 81 students completing the course during this reporting period. Classes were discontinued by Regimental S-3, however, they are scheduled to resume on, or about 11 August 1969.
3. Ration Credits for July ran about 95.6% of those in June.
4. During July Captain Sarver, the OIC of Combat Skills School was relieved due to expiration of RTD. 1st Lt. Roman was assigned as his replacement. Results of classes continue to be very high and no major problem areas have been encountered. The overall passing mark for July was 81.2%, with an average of 93.2% passing.





NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The battalion performed functions during the period relative to stock accounting, commercial contracting, receipt, storage, care-in-storage, and issue incident to supplying classes I, II, III, IV, V, V(A), VII, VIII and IX to FMP WestPac Forces. These functions further include:
